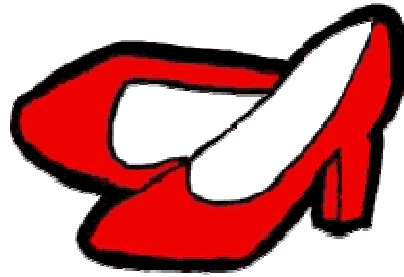


## What would you do?
