1. Find your partner.

3. Trade objects with your partner. Be sure to tell them why the object you selected is so important. Tell them the story behind it.

5. To make these introductions a little more fun, decide on one "little lie" to include in your introduction.
6. As a class, we will listen to the introductions so we can get to know everyone. The challenge will be to **FIND THE FIB**.
7. And of course, you know you should never tell a lie!

Partner students up for interviews. Ask students to find out three truths about each other and make up one believable lie. Have partners introduce each other in front of the whole class. The audience should try to pick out the lie within each presentation.
