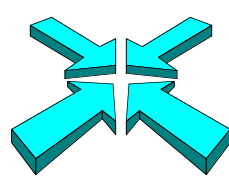


# Question-Answer Relationships

## In the Book QARs...

## In My Head QARs...



### Right There!

*Example: How many bears were there in the story of Goldilocks?*

The answer is in the text and usually easy to find. The words used to make up the question and the words used to answer the question are **Right There** in the same sentence.



### Author and Me!

*Example: What do you suppose the three bears did after Goldilocks left?*

The answer is not in the selection. You need to think about what you already know, what the author tells you in the text, and how it fits together.



### Think and Search!

*Example: What kind of trouble did Goldilocks cause for the bear?*

The answer is in the selection, but you need to put together different pieces of information to find it. Words for the question and words for the answer are not found in the same sentence. They come from different places in the text.



### On My Own!

*Example: Has anyone ever mistreated your property? Tell about it.*

The answer is not in the selection. You can even answer the question without reading it. You need to use your own experiences.
