Of the students that applied, were approved, but did not attend at least one SES session: 76 students did not attend at least one session despite repeated efforts by the provider to contact the family. 13 students, despite being authorized for services with a provider, had a provider that indicated it was unable to provide services to the student and the family either did not return or want an alternative provider application. 15 students, after applying and being approved, withdrew from the ASD or an SES school prior to attending at least one session. And 3 students applied and were approved; however, the students' free and reduced-price lunch eligibility was rescinded before attending at least one session.
