SUBJECT: FOURTH QUARTER AND END OF 2004-2005 SCHOOL YEAR  
SUSPENSION/WEAPONS/EXPULSION REPORT

ASD Goal: *Establish and maintain a supportive and effective learning environment by providing safe, caring, barrier-free schools.*

PERTINENT FACTS:

Information regarding suspensions and expulsions for various offenses, including weapons, is collected from the elementary, middle, and high schools each quarter. This information, as well as year-end summaries by school and category for each Instructional Division level for the 2004-2005 school year, is shown in the narrative information below and in Attachments A - L.

In accordance with the School Board's adopted goal, all efforts were focused to provide safe and healthy schools. This goal has been supported by the employees at each school, as well as by the students and their parents and the business and general community. Again this year, the Anchorage Police Department was extremely supportive in its assistance to the schools. The attached discipline/suspension reports from the elementary, middle, and high schools show the statistics for the fourth quarter and the recently completed school year and the schools' efforts to address this important goal.

**Fourth Quarter Expulsions**

Fifteen middle school students and 17 high school students were expelled by the School Board during the fourth quarter of 2004-2005, for a total of 32 students. This compares to the 73 students expelled during the fourth quarter last year. Of the middle school students expelled fourth quarter this year, three were for theft/vandalism, two for assault, three for weapons other than firearms, and seven for drug/alcohol violations. Twelve high school students were expelled for drug/alcohol violations, two for fighting, two for false alarm/bomb threat, and one for assault.

## Expulsions During 2004-2005

A total of 140 elementary, middle school and high school students were expelled by the School Board for various reasons during the 2004-2005 school year. This compares to 153 students in 2003-2004 and 152 expulsions during the 2002-2003 school year. No elementary students were expelled during the 2004-2005 school year. One elementary student was expelled during the 2003-2004 school year, compared to none in 2002-2003,

### **Causality**

During the 2004-2005 school year, three recommendations for expulsion from middle school were not brought forward to the School Board due to a finding of causality by the IEP team. This compares to two students in 2003-2004, and nine students in 2002-2003. The incidents and causality are reflected below:

### Discipline Reports

The elementary, middle school, and high school discipline summaries follow; these are shown for fourth quarter and for the entire school year. Fourth quarter information by school and category for elementary schools is shown on Attachments A and B; elementary cumulative information is shown on Attachments C and D; middle school fourth quarter information by school and category is shown on Attachments E and F; middle school cumulative information is shown on Attachments G and H; high school fourth quarter information by school and category is shown on Attachments I and J; and high school cumulative information is shown on Attachments K and L.

## Elementary Schools

Suspensions involving weapons and drugs and alcohol, as well as suspensions that deal with fighting/assault, sexual harassment and/or harassment/bullying are compared in this narrative for the 2002-2003, 2003-2004 and 2004-2005 school years. There were no expulsions or findings of causality in the elementary schools for the fourth quarter of the 2004-2005 school year.

Elementary suspensions increased from 375 for fourth quarter of 2003-2004 to 410 suspensions in 2004-2005. There were 17 weapons violations (11 small knives, 3 toy guns/knives, 1 pellet gun, 1 BB gun and 1 small leatherman) that resulted in suspension during the fourth quarter of 2004-2005, compared to seven reported weapons incidents during the fourth quarter of 2003-2004.

There were three drug and alcohol suspensions for the fourth quarter compared to two during the fourth quarter last year. Sexual harassment suspensions increased from six last year to twenty this year. The largest areas of decrease were seen in fighting and assault. There were 26 fewer fighting suspensions and 14 fewer assault suspensions during fourth quarter for the 2004-2005 school year.

Six elementary schools had zero suspensions in the fourth quarter of both 2003-2004 and 2004-2005, while 15 schools had one to three suspensions. Nine schools increased suspensions over the fourth quarter of last year by one to two and 19 schools increased suspensions by three or more. Twenty-two schools had a decrease in the number of suspensions from the fourth quarter of last year, while the number of suspensions remained the same at 10 schools.

**Middle Schools**

The suspension rate for the fourth quarter of the 2004-2005 school year for grade six (Mirror Lake only), seven, and eight is 849 suspensions, a decrease from 916 in 2003-2004. Categories showing decreases are fighting/assault (168 to 159), tobacco (15 to 3), willful disobedience (90 to 73), harassment (56 to 51), sexual harassment (21 to 16), and weapons other than firearms (13 to 3). Increases are noted in drugs (17 to 22), and alcohol (2 to 5)

The suspension rate for 2004-2005 reflected a dramatic decrease of 477 suspensions. The Divisionwide effort by every middle school staff member to implement the Aggressors, Victims, and Bystanders (AVB) anti-bullying and school climate program showed

positive results that accumulated throughout the year. Middle school assistant principals and counselors used the vocabulary and concepts that are taught in the AVB program to help students evaluate their own behaviors. School Resource Officers have been visible and proactively worked with school staff and students.

**High Schools**

There were 866 high school suspensions for the fourth quarter of the 2004-2005 school year; an increase of 221 incidents over the number of suspensions for the fourth quarter of 2003-2004.

When comparing fourth quarter 2003-2004 to fourth quarter 2004-2005, suspensions for fighting increased from 53 to 79 and suspensions for threats increased from 12 to 30 Drug suspensions also increased (51 to 62) and alcohol suspensions increased from 20 to 25.

For the 2004-2005 school year, the number of suspensions increased by 312 as compared to last year. The greatest areas of increase in suspensions were in fighting (315) and threats (113). The number of incidents in fighting increased by 92 and the number of suspensions for threats increased by 33 compared to 2003-2004. For the third year in a row the High School Division has seen a decrease in the number of drug/alcohol related incidents. This year the total number of drug and alcohol suspensions decreased by 10, from 387 in 2003-2004, to 377 for the 2004-2005 school year.
