SUBJECT: EVALUATION OF THE 2004-2005 SIX-YEAR INSTRUCTIONAL PLAN

*ASD Goal: Increase academic achievement using data to guide adoption of curriculum, methods, materials, and professional development specifically designed to ensure that each group as designated by No Child Left Behind and the Quality Schools Initiative makes adequate yearly progress.*

PERTINENT FACTS:

The Anchorage School Board adopted the Six-Year Instructional Plan at their meeting on May 10, 2004, and four additional department plans were added in 2005. One of the additions is devoted to cultural responsiveness, which will assist in addressing the new Board goal on diversity. Each of the plans is evaluated and presented to the Board for approval.

The design of the evaluation template for reporting on the progress made in the instructional plan follows the design of the plan itself. The objectives for each goal are listed, the measurement indicator is stated, and progress toward the goal is noted in the evaluation. The template's design allows for ease of reference back to the original Six-Year Instructional Plan.

Each department's report indicates progress made in the attainment of stipulated goals. The evaluation requires that departments consistently focus on their goals and be accountable for progress made in each area. The evaluation is part of an on-going process that not only results in a report of progress made in the attainment of goals, but also allows for revision and adjustments of goals and initiatives.
