SUBJECT: FIRST QUARTER SUSPENSION/WEAPONS/EXPULSION REPORT 2007-2008

ASD Goal: Establish and maintain a supportive and effective learning environment by providing safe, caring, barrier-free schools.

PERTINENT FACTS:

Information regarding suspensions and expulsions for various offenses, including weapons, is collected from the elementary, middle, and high schools each quarter. The information is shown in the narrative information below and as Attachments A-F. Suspension/expulsion information is also reported from the charter schools

First Quarter Expulsion

Seventeen students, including two middle school students and fifteen high school students, were expelled by the school board during the first quarter of the 2007-2008 school year; no elementary students were expelled. This is eight fewer students than the 25 students expelled during the first quarter of 2006-2007. One middle school student was expelled for fighting/assault and one student was expelled for drugs/alcohol. High school expulsions included drugs/alcohol (12), assault (1), criminal acts (1), and theft/robbery (1).

Discipline Reports

The elementary, middle, and high school discipline summaries follow: elementary first quarter by school and category (Attachment A & B); middle school first quarter by school and category (Attachment C & D); and high school first quarter by school and category (Attachment E & F).

Elementary Schools

There were 45 fewer elementary suspensions during the first quarter of 2007-2008 than in 2006-2007 (215 to 170). These included seven weapons violations (three small pocketknives, one pen knife, one tool knife and two toy guns), which resulted in

suspension during the first quarter; there were five reported weapons incidents during the first quarter last year. There were no expulsions or findings of causality for the first quarter of the 2007-2008 school year.

There were zero drug and alcohol suspensions for the first quarter of 2007-2008 and 2006-2007. There were no sexual harassment suspensions first quarter this year compared to eight last year. The largest increases were seen in willful disobedience, which increased by 12 suspensions, and weapons, which increased by two suspensions.

Eleven elementary schools had zero suspensions both in 2006/2007 and 2007/2008, while 24 schools had one to three suspensions in both years. When comparing the number of suspensions in 2007/2008 to 2006/2007, eight schools increased suspensions over the first quarter of last year by one to two, while nine schools increased suspensions by three or more. Twenty-five schools had a decrease in the number of suspensions from the first quarter of last year, while 18 schools had the same number of suspensions in first quarter of both years.

Middle Schools

The number of students suspended during first quarter of the 2007-2008 school year for grade six, (Mirror Lake and Begich), seven and eight was 226. There were 319 suspensions during first quarter in 2006-2007. This is a decrease of 93 suspensions.

First quarter suspensions for fighting showed a significant decrease from 88 to 44. Two categories decreased by more than half; willful disobedience (25 to 7) and vandalism (9 to 2). Also showing considerable decreases were threats (25 to 13), disruptive behavior (14 to 7), and assault (11 to 6). Other suspension categories remained relatively constant or showed minor increases or decreases across the Division.

All middle schools are utilizing proactive procedures and interventions to reduce suspensions and unwanted behaviors. These interventions include the following:

- 1) Consistent implementation of the Aggressors, Victims and Bystanders (AVB) Programs.
- 2) Regular referrals to Prevention and Intervention Coordinators.
- 3) Collaboration with School Resource Officers (SROs).
- 4) Utilizing contracts or behavior plans for students demonstrating behavior concerns.
- 5) Facilitating reentry meetings with students and parents following five to nine day suspensions.

Polaris K-12

Polaris K-12 had four suspensions during the first quarter of 2007-2008, two for fighting/physical violence, and two for accessory to an act. They had no expulsions for the first quarter of 2007-2008.

High Schools

The number of high school suspensions for the first quarter of the 2007-2008 school year is 537, a decrease of 125 suspensions compared to the 662 suspensions in first quarter last year.

There were 58 fighting incidents during the first quarter of the 2007-2008 school year and 80 fighting incidents the first quarter last year. There were 15 expulsions during the first quarter of the 2007-2008 school year compared to 15 during the first quarter of last year.

For the first quarter of the 2007-2008 school year, there were 65 drug-related suspensions compared to 45 suspensions last year and 17 alcohol-related suspensions compared to 23 alcohol-related suspensions in the first quarter of 2006-2007 school year.

Charter Schools

Family Partnership Charter School suspended one student for being under the influence of alcohol during summer school at KCC. During the first quarter of the 2007-2008 school year, Highland Tech Charter School suspended ten students; one for disruptive behavior/disobedience, two for fighting, four for reckless behavior, one for sexual harassment, and two for smoking. Aquarian Charter School suspended one student for inappropriate touching. Winterberry suspended one student for bringing a toy gun to school. There were no expulsions at any of these schools.

Rilke Schule suspended five students during the first quarter of 2007-2008; two for dangerous actions/materials, one for inappropriate sexual behavior, one for fighting and one for harassment/bullying.

There were no suspensions or expulsions at Eagle Academy, Family Partnership, or Frontier charter schools during the first quarter of 2007-2008.
