SUBJECT: SECOND QUARTER SUSPENSION/WEAPONS/EXPULSION
REPORT: 2007-2008

PERTINENT FACTS:

Information regarding suspensions and expulsions for various offenses, including weapons, is collected from the elementary, middle, high schools and charter schools each quarter. The information is shown in the narrative information below and in Attachments A-F.

Second Quarter Suspensions

Total second quarter suspensions for the 2007-2008 school year increased in the elementary schools from 289 last year to 304 this year. Middle school second quarter suspensions decreased for the sixth year in a row (down from 797 suspensions in the second quarter of the 2002-2003 school year to 413 this year). High school second quarter suspensions decreased for the third year in a row (down from 835 suspensions two years ago to 646 suspensions this year).

Elementary Education saw increases in suspensions for dangerous actions/materials (16 to 30), general disruptive behavior (24 to 34), assault (9 to 25), and reckless/unsafe behavior (31 to 42). However, fighting incidents decreased from 34 to 24 and there were no drug/alcohol suspensions. Also, there were no firearm incidents in the elementary schools during second quarter this year. Middle schools showed their most significant decrease in the category of willful disobedience (60 to 26). One category that showed an increase from second quarter last year was dangerous actions or materials (38 to 60). There were two firearms incidents in the middle schools during second quarter this year. Although overall suspensions and most categories were down in the high schools, there were increases for excessive tardies (32 to 42), theft/robbery (12 to 21), accessory to an act (7 to 13), and forgery/cheating (6 to 16).

Second Quarter Expulsions

No elementary students were expelled during second quarter of the 2007-2008 school year, while a total of four middle school students were expelled during that time. One middle school student was expelled for firearms, one for weapons/other than firearms, and two for drugs/alcohol. Fifteen high school students were expelled for the following reasons: drugs (7), alcohol (2), assault (1), assault/staff (1), criminal acts (2), false alarm (1), and weapons other than firearms (1).

Discipline Reports

The elementary, middle, and high school discipline summaries follow. These show elementary schools second quarter by school and category (Attachments A & B), middle schools second quarter by school and category (Attachments C & D), and high schools second quarter by school and category (Attachments E & F).

In Discipline Reports (attachments B, D and F), "other" is the final category choice for recording offenses. At times, this descriptor has been used when a more definitive category would have been preferred. Instructional division leaders have committed to working with schools to restrict the use of the "other" category to times when none of the 13-19 specific labels are suitable.

Elementary Schools

As compared to the 2006-2007 school year, elementary suspensions increased during the second quarter of 2007-2008. There were 289 suspensions in 2006-2007 and 304 in 2007-2008. There were five weapons violations (five small pocketknives) that resulted in suspensions during the second quarter this year compared to three reported weapons incidents during the second quarter of 2006-2007. There were no expulsions or findings of causality for the second quarter of the 2007-2008 school year.

Elementary drug and alcohol suspensions were down from six in the second quarter of 2006-2007 to zero in the second quarter of 2007-2008. Sexual harassment suspensions were also down from seven last year to two this year. The largest increases were seen in the categories of reckless/unsafe behavior, which increased by 11 suspensions, and dangerous actions/materials, which increased by 14 suspensions.

Four elementary schools had zero second quarter suspensions both in 2006/2007 and 2007/2008, while 16 schools had one to three suspensions in both years. When comparing the number of suspensions in 2007/2008 to last year, eight schools increased suspensions by one to two, while 18 schools increased suspensions by three or more. Twenty-five schools had a decrease in the number

of suspensions, while nine schools had the same number of suspensions in second quarter of 2007-2008 as 2006/2007.

Middle Schools

The suspension rate for second quarter of the 2007-2008 school year reflects 413 suspensions for grades six (Begich and Mirror Lake), seven and eight, which is an overall decrease of 47 suspensions from the same quarter last year and 58 fewer suspensions than second quarter 2005-2006.

The categories showing the most significant reductions in suspensions were: drugs-street (12 to 4); willful disobedience (60 to 26); inappropriate sexual behavior (11 to 5); disruptive behavior/disobedience (29 to 18); and general disruptive behavior (25 to 17).

Fighting/physical violence has consistently dropped over the last three years from 120 in 2005-2006, to 84 in 2006-2007 and 79 this year. The remaining categories were fairly consistent with the exception of dangerous actions up from 38 to 60 and sexual harassment up from 9 to 17.

Polaris K-12

There were two suspensions for reckless/unsafe behavior during second quarter at Polaris K-12 School for the 2007-2008 school year. This represents a decrease of 12 suspensions as compared to the same quarter last year. There were no expulsions from Polaris K-12 School for the second quarter of 2007-2008.

High Schools

High school suspensions were down from 751 suspensions during second quarter last year to 646 suspensions this year, a decrease of 105 suspensions. Threats decreased from 30 last year to 20 incidents of threats during the second quarter of this year. Drug suspensions were down from 79 last year to 38 this year and alcohol suspensions were down from 22 last year to 12 suspensions this year

For second quarter there were 64 first-time repeaters, 6 second-time repeaters, 3 third-time repeaters, and 1 fourth-time repeater.

Charter Schools

Aquarian, Family Partnership, Frontier and Winterberry charter schools had no suspensions or expulsions during the second quarter of 2007-2008.

Eagle Academy Charter School suspended one student for two days for reckless/unsafe behavior during PE class. There were no expulsions.

Rilke Schule German School of Arts and Sciences suspended one student for two days for fighting/physical violence. There were no expulsions.

Highland Tech High Charter School had the following eight suspensions - fighting (2), smoking (2), threats (2), disruptive behavior/willful disobedience (2). They had no expulsions
