SUBJECT: FOURTH QUARTER AND END OF 2007-2008 SCHOOL YEAR
SUSPENSION/WEAPONS/EXPULSION REPORT

ASD Goal: *Establish and maintain a supportive and effective learning environment by providing safe, caring, barrier-free schools.*

PERTINENT FACTS:

Information regarding suspensions and expulsions for various offenses, including weapons, is collected from the charter schools and elementary, middle, and high schools each quarter. This information, as well as year-end summaries by school and category for each Instructional Division level for the 2007-2008 school year, is shown in the narrative information below and in Attachments A-L.

In accordance with the school board's adopted goal, all efforts were focused to provide safe and healthy schools. This goal has been supported by the employees at each school, as well as by the students and their parents and the business and general community. Again this year, the Anchorage Police Department was extremely supportive in its assistance to the schools. The attached discipline/suspension reports from the elementary, middle, and high schools, show the statistics for the fourth quarter and the recently completed school year and the schools' efforts to address this important goal.

Fourth Quarter Expulsions

Thirty-seven students were expelled from the Anchorage School District during the fourth quarter of the 2007-2008 school year. Two elementary students were expelled for weapons violations (weapons other than a firearm); two middle school students were expelled (one for vandalism and one for assault); and thirty-three high school students were expelled by the school board during the fourth quarter. This compares to 34 students expelled during the fourth quarter last year. The high school students were expelled for the following violations: drugs (8), assault (5), fighting/physical violence (2), criminal acts (2), general disruptive behavior (1), harassment/bullying (2), misuse of

internet (1), reckless/unsafe behavior (1), prohibited organizations (1), weapons other than firearms (4), threats/instigating (3), threats to staff (2), willful disobedience (1).

Expulsions During 2007-2008

A total of 91 elementary, middle school and high school students were expelled by the School Board for various reasons during the 2007-2008 school year. This compares to 127 students in 2006-2007, 95 students in 2005-2006, and 140 students in 2004-2005. Two elementary students were expelled during the 2007-2008 school year. One elementary student was expelled during each of the last two school years and one elementary student was expelled during the 2003-2004 school year. There were no elementary expulsions in 2004-2005 or 2002-2003.

Causality

There were only two findings of causality during the 2007-2008 school year. This compares to past years when there were two students in 2006-2007 and 2005-2006, eight students in 2004-2005, eight students in 2003-2004, and 12 students in 2002-2003.

The decrease in Finding of Causality for the last three school years is reflective of the implementation of changes in the discipline policies of the reauthorization of IDEA. The new criteria more clearly defines that manifestation determinations find causality only when "the conduct was caused by a direct and substantial relationship to the child's disability or the conduct was a direct result of the school district's failure to implement the child's IEP." In addition to the more distinct policy, the decrease indicates that the Special Education Department is doing an excellent job of ensuring the student's IEP is accurately documented and appropriately implemented.

Discipline Reports

The elementary, middle school, and high school discipline summaries follow; these are shown for fourth quarter and for the entire school year. Fourth quarter information by school and category for elementary schools is shown on Attachments A and B; elementary cumulative information is shown on Attachments C and D; middle school fourth quarter information by school and category is shown on Attachments E and F; middle school cumulative information is shown on Attachments G and H; high school fourth quarter information by school and category is shown on Attachments I and J; and high school cumulative information is shown on Attachments K and L.

Elementary Schools

Elementary suspensions for the fourth quarter of the 2007-2008 school year were the same as in the fourth quarter last year - 380 suspensions each year. There were two expulsions for the fourth quarter of the 2007-2008 school year (both for weapons other than firearms) compared to no expulsions in the 2006-2007 school year.

There were 16 weapons violations (eight small knives, six air soft guns and two BB guns), which resulted in suspension during the fourth quarter of 2007-2008; compared to nine reported weapons incidents during the fourth quarter of 2006-2007.

There were no alcohol suspensions and one drug (street) suspension for the fourth quarter this year compared to three drug/alcohol suspensions during the fourth quarter last year. Significant decreases were seen in the following categories: fighting (108 to 92), dangerous actions/materials (46 to 25), and harassment/bullying (21 to 10).

When comparing fourth quarter last year to fourth quarter, increases were seen in assault (11 to 34) and reckless/unsafe behavior (30 to 60).

In comparing fourth quarter 2006/2007 to fourth quarter 2007/2008, 25 schools increased suspensions while 29 schools had a decrease in the number of suspensions. Six schools the number of suspensions remained the same.

Middle Schools

The suspension rate for fourth quarter of the 2007-2008 school year reflects 621 suspensions for grades 6 (Begich and Mirror Lake), 7 and 8, which is an overall increase of 21 suspensions from the same quarter last year.

The most noteworthy decreases from fourth quarter last year to fourth quarter this year were seen in general disruptive behavior (43 to 30), theft/robbery (23 to 11), and street drugs (13 to 3).

The most significant increases were seen fighting/physical violence (86 to 119) and disruptive behavior/disobedience (17 to 59).

The middle school overall suspension rate for 2007-2008 reflected a decrease of 347 suspensions. This decrease may be reflective of mid-level's emphasis on a proactive, multifaceted, and intervention-oriented approach toward student discipline and decorum. Some of these approaches include the following: a) focus on school climate and decorum; b) use of Prevention and Intervention Coordinators; c) ongoing implementation of the Aggressors, Victims and Bystanders (AVB) program; d) emphasis on early parent notification of concerns and the subsequent use of team collaboration time to meet with parents; e) collaboration with School Resource Officers; f) building level analysis of discipline data; and g) training of administrators in special education and behavior related strategies for intervention.

High Schools

The 728 high school suspensions during the fourth quarter of the 2007-2008 school year is an increase of 130 suspensions compared to the 598 suspensions for fourth quarter of last year.

Suspensions for fighting increased from 41 incidents during the fourth quarter last year to 76 fighting incidents during the fourth quarter this year. Threats also increased from 20 during fourth quarter last year to 27 incidents this year. Drug suspensions were up (39 to 93), but alcohol suspensions were down (29 to 23). The number of assaults during fourth quarter 2007-2008 was half the number of incidents in 2006-2007 (18 to 9) and excess tardies were down markedly (59 to 5).

For the 2007-2008 school year, the number of suspensions decreased by 299 as compared to last year. The number of incidents in fighting was 271, an increase by 20 from the 2006-2007 school year. The number of suspensions for threats was 99, a decrease of 9 from the 2006-2007 school year. High School Division has seen a decrease in the number of drug/alcohol related incidents. This year the total number

of drug and alcohol suspensions decreased by 86, from 340 in 2006-2007 to 254 for the 2007-2008 school year.
