SUBJECT: FIRST QUARTER SUSPENSION/WEAPONS/EXPULSION  
REPORT 2008-2009

ASD Goal: *Establish and maintain a supportive and effective learning environment by providing safe, caring, barrier-free schools.*

PERTINENT FACTS:

Information regarding suspensions and expulsions for various offenses, including weapons, is collected from the elementary, middle, and high schools each quarter. The information is shown in the narrative information below and as Attachments A-F. Suspension/expulsion information is also reported from the charter schools.

The school board requested information on the percentage of students not suspended or expelled during a quarter. That information is shown below:

**First Quarter Expulsion**

Seven students, including three middle school students and four high school students, were expelled by the school board during the first quarter of the 2008-2009 school year; no elementary students were expelled. This is ten fewer students than the 17 students expelled during the first quarter of 2007-2008. One middle school student was expelled for fighting/assault, one student was

expelled for drugs/alcohol and one for vandalism. High school expelled three students for drugs/alcohol and one for criminal acts.

**Discipline Reports**

The elementary, middle, and high school discipline summaries follow: elementary first quarter by school and category (Attachment A & B); middle school first quarter by school and category (Attachment C & D); and high school first quarter by school and category (Attachment E & F).

**Elementary Schools**

As compared to the 2007-2008 school year, elementary suspensions decreased during the first quarter of the 2008-2009. There were 170 recorded suspensions in 2007-2008 and 162 in 2008-2009. The 162 suspensions represent .six percent of the K-6 enrollment (25,215 students as of October 20, 2008). There was one weapons violation (a small pocket knife) which resulted in suspension during the first quarter; compared to seven reported weapons incidents during the first quarter of last year.

There were no drug and alcohol suspensions for the first quarter of 2008-2009 or 2007-2008. There was one sexual harassment suspension compared this year compared to none last year. The largest areas of increase were seen in reckless & unsafe behavior which increased by eight suspensions and disruptive behavior which increased by five suspensions. There were no expulsions or findings of causality for the first quarter of the 2008-2009 school year.

Seven elementary schools had zero suspensions both in 2007/2008 and 2008/2009, while 32 schools had one-three suspensions in both years. When comparing the number of suspensions in 2008-2009 to 2007-2008, 13 schools increased suspensions over the first quarter of last year by one-two, while eight schools increased suspensions by three or more. Twenty-eight schools had a decrease in the number of suspensions from the first quarter of last year, while 11 schools had the same number of suspensions in first quarter of 2008-2009 and 2007-2008.

**Middle Schools**

The number of students suspended during the first quarter of the 2008-2009 school year for grade six, (Mirror Lake and Begich), seven and eight was 267. This is an increase of 41 suspensions compared to the first quarter of 2007-2008. Students suspended for alcohol violations dropped from 10 to 0 for the first quarter as compared to 2007-2008. Discrimination/harassment/ bullying decreased from 17 to 10, threats/instigating from 13 to eight, and drugs-street from seven to three. Increases were seen in reckless & unsafe behavior, 19 to 32, and inappropriate sexual behavior from four to 12.

**High Schools**

The number of high school suspensions for the first quarter of the 2008-2009 school year is 533, a decrease of 3 suspensions compared to the first quarter of last year when there were 537 suspensions.

There were 58 fighting incidents during the first quarter of the 2007-2008 school year and 46 fighting incidents the first quarter of 2008-2009. There were four expulsions during the first quarter of the 2008-2009 school year compared to 15 during the first quarter of 2007-2008 school year.

For the first quarter of the 2008-2009 school year, there were 65 drug-related suspensions and 14 alcohol-related suspensions compared to 65 drug-related suspensions and 17 alcohol-related suspensions in the first quarter of 2007-2008 school year.

Repeat offenses would not necessarily be in the same category. A student who has been suspended on a first drug/alcohol violation, for instance, may later be suspended for a different infraction and be listed as a repeater. For first quarter there were 52 first-time repeaters, three second-time repeaters, one third-time repeater, and no fourth-time repeaters.

**Charter Schools**

There were no expulsions at any of the charter schools during the first quarter of 2008-2009. There were no first quarter suspensions at Frontier, Rilke Schule, and Winterberry charter schools. .

Aquarian suspended one student for assault and Family Partnership suspended one student for drugs during the first quarter of 2008-2009.

Eagle Academy had three suspensions first quarter; one for assault, one for dangerous materials/objects and one for fighting/physical violence.

Alaska Native Cultural Charter School suspended five students for the following reasons: hitting another student (2), smoking (1), threats (1), and bringing a paintball gun to school (1).
