SUBJECT: THIRD QUARTER SUSPENSION/WEAPONS/EXPULSION
REPORT - 2008-2009

ASD Goal: Establish and maintain a supportive and effective learning environment by providing safe, caring, barrier-free schools.

PERTINENT FACTS:

Each quarter, information regarding suspensions and expulsions for various offenses, including weapons, is collected from the elementary, middle, and high schools, as well as from the charter schools. This information is shown in the narrative below and also as Attachments A-F.

The school board requested information on the percentage of students not suspended or expelled during a quarter. That information is shown below:

Elementary suspensions decreased from 373 suspensions during the third quarter last year to 311 suspensions during third quarter this year. There were four weapons violations that resulted in suspension this year compared to 11 last year. There were no firearms incidents during third quarter either year.

Middle school suspensions decreased significantly compared to third quarter last year. There were 464 students suspended during third quarter last year compared to 340 suspensions this year. This is less than half of the 687 middle school students suspended during third quarter 2006-2007. In the category of weapons other than firearms, there were three incidents during third quarter this year compared to two last year. There were no firearms incidents during third quarter either year.

High school suspensions decreased slightly during third quarter this year - from 670 last to year to 651 suspensions this year. Fights were down (84 to 67), as were discrimination/harassment/bullying sanctions (17 to 7), but threats (23 to 31) and assaults (18 to 23) were up.

Third Quarter Expulsions

A total of 13 students were expelled from the Anchorage School District during the third quarter of 2008-2009. Two middle school students were expelled for street drugs. Eleven high school students were expelled for the following reasons: drugs (4), alcohol (2), assault (1), criminal acts (3), and fighting/physical violence (1).

Discipline Reports

The elementary, middle school, and high school discipline summaries follow. These show elementary third quarter by school and category (Attachments A & B); middle schools third quarter by school and category (Attachments C & D); high school third quarter by school and category (Attachments E & F).

Elementary Schools

As compared to the 2007-2008 school year, elementary suspensions decreased during the third quarter of the 2008-2009. There were 373 recorded suspensions in 2007-2008 and 311 in 2008-2009. There were four weapons other than firearms violations that resulted in suspension during the third quarter; there were 11 reported weapons incidents during the third quarter of 2007-2008. There were no expulsions or findings of causality for the third quarter of the 2008-2009 school year

There were no drug and alcohol suspensions for the third quarter of 2008-2009 compared to one in 2007-2008. There were no sexual harassment suspensions compared to five last year. The largest area of increase was seen in willful disobedience, which increased by 10 suspensions. The largest area of decrease was seen in fighting/physical violence, which decreased by 16 suspensions, and discrimination/harassment/bullying, which decreased by 12 suspensions.

Four elementary schools had zero third quarter suspensions both in 2007-2008 and 2008-2009, while 15 elementary schools had one to three suspensions in both years. When comparing the number of suspensions third quarter this year to third quarter last year, eight schools increased suspensions by one to two, while 13 schools increased suspensions by three or more. Thirty-three schools had a decrease in the number of suspensions compared to last year, while six schools had the same number of suspensions in third quarter each year.

Middle Schools

The number of students suspended during the third quarter of the 2008-2009 school year for grade six (Mirror Lake and Begich), seven and eight was 340. This is a decrease of 124 suspensions compared to the third quarter of 2007-2008, and more significantly a decrease of 347, over 50 percent, compared to 2006-2007. Individual categories showing decreases were harassment/bullying, reckless & unsafe behavior and dangerous materials/actions.

High Schools

The number of high school suspensions for the third quarter of the 2008-2009 school year is 651, a decrease of 19 suspensions compared to the third quarter of last year when there were 670 suspensions.

There were 67 fighting incidents during the third quarter of the 2008-2009 school year and 84 fighting incidents the third quarter of 2007-2008 for a decrease of 17 suspensions for fighting. There were 31 incidents of threats during the third quarter of this year compared to 23 during the third quarter of 2007-2008.

For the third quarter of the 2008-2009 school year, there were 79 suspensions for drugs and 18 suspensions for alcohol compared to 55 drug suspensions and 12 alcohol suspensions during the third quarter of 2007-2008.

Charter Schools

There were no third quarter suspensions or expulsions at Aquarian, Family Partnership, Frontier, Rilke Schule, or Winterberry charter schools

Alaska Native Cultural Charter School suspended two students for stealing money out of a teacher's purse, and four students for fighting. There were no expulsions.

Eagle Academy had two one-day suspensions; one for willful disobedience/disruptive behavior and one for reckless/unsafe behavior. There were no expulsions.

Highland Tech High Charter School suspended four students during third quarter for the following: harassment (1), vandalism (1), disruptive behavior/disobedience (1), reckless behavior (1). There were no expulsions.
