SUBJECT: END-OF-MONTH MEMBERSHIP SUMMARY FOR  
APRIL 2001

PERTINENT FACTS:

The end-of-month membership report for April 30, 2001, is attached. The total active enrollment at the end of April was 48,810, an increase of 126 students over the April 30, 2000, total of 48,684. Table 1 compares the membership on April 30, 2001, with the totals from April 30, 2000. The comparison and official membership for April 30, 2000, vs. April 30, 2001, is shown on Attachment A.

The April 30, 2001, total of 48,810 was 710 less than the beginning of the year September 30, 2000, total of 49,520. This decrease can be compared against a decline of 628 for the same time period (September through April) during the 1999-2000 school year, and an average decline of 782 (September through April) for the 10-year historical average since the 1991-1992 school year.

The listing of elementary and secondary schools at or above 120 percent of program capacity is shown on Attachment B. There are three elementary schools at or above 120 percent of their program capacity. There were no changes from the previous month.

There is one secondary school (SAVE) at or above 120 percent of its program capacity. There were no changes from the previous month.

Pre-elementary, elementary, and secondary special education numbers are shown on Attachment C.
