SUBJECT: FOURTH QUARTER AND END OF 2008-2009 SCHOOL YEAR
SUSPENSION/WEAPONS/EXPULSION REPORT

ASD Goal: *Establish and maintain a supportive and effective learning environment by providing safe, caring, barrier-free schools.*

PERTINENT FACTS:

Information regarding suspensions and expulsions for various offenses, including weapons, is collected from the charter schools and elementary, middle, and high schools, as well as charter schools, each quarter. This information, in addition to year-end summaries by school and category for each Instructional Division level for the 2008-2009 school year, is shown in the narrative information below and in Attachments A-L.

In accordance with the school board's adopted goal, all efforts were focused to provide safe and healthy schools. This goal has been supported by the employees at each school, as well as by the students and their parents and the business and general community. Again this year, the Anchorage Police Department was extremely supportive in its assistance to the schools. The attached discipline/suspension reports from the elementary, middle, and high schools, show the statistics for the fourth quarter and the recently completed school year and the schools' efforts to address this important goal.

The school board has requested information on the percentage of students not suspended or expelled during a quarter. That information is shown below:

Fourth Quarter Expulsions

Thirty-nine students were expelled from the Anchorage School District during the fourth quarter of the 2008-2009 school year compared to 37 expulsions during fourth quarter last year. Twenty-five high school students were expelled for the following violations: drugs (14), alcohol (2), assault (3), fighting physical violence (1), criminal acts (2), and one each for prohibited organizations, weapons/firearms, and threats/instigating. Fourteen middle school students were expelled for the following reasons: assault (3), drugs/alcohol (8), fighting/physical violence (2), and weapons/firearms (1). No elementary students were expelled during fourth quarter 2008-2009.

Expulsions During 2008-2009

A total of 81 elementary, middle school and high school students were expelled by the School Board for various reasons during the 2008-2009 school year. This compares to 91 students in 2007-2008, and 127 students in 2006-2007. No elementary students were expelled during the 2008-2009 school year compare to two elementary students during the 2007-2008 school year.

Causality

There were three findings of causality during the 2008-2009 school year. This compares to past years when there were two students in 2007-2008 and in 2006-2007.

The decrease in Finding of Causality for the last three school years is reflective of the implementation of changes in the discipline policies of the reauthorization of IDEA. The new criteria more clearly defines that manifestation determinations find causality only when "the conduct was caused by a direct and substantial relationship to the child's disability or the conduct was a direct result of the school district's failure to implement the child's IEP." In addition to the more distinct policy, the decrease indicates that the Special Education Department is doing an excellent job of ensuring the student's IEP is accurately documented and appropriately implemented.

Discipline Reports

The elementary, middle school, and high school discipline summaries follow; these are shown for fourth quarter and for the entire school year. Fourth quarter information by school and category for elementary schools is shown on Attachments A and B; elementary cumulative information is shown on Attachments C and D; middle school fourth quarter information by school and category is shown on Attachments E and F; middle school cumulative information is shown on Attachments G and H; high school fourth quarter information by school and category is shown on Attachments I and J; and high school cumulative information is shown on Attachments K and L.

Elementary Schools

As compared to the 2007-2008 school year, elementary suspensions increased slightly in the fourth quarter of 2008-2009. There were 380 recorded suspensions in 2007-2008 compared to 384 recorded suspensions 2008-2009. There were three weapons violations (three small knives), which resulted in suspension during the fourth quarter of 2008-2009; and 16 reported weapons incidents during the fourth quarter of 2007-2008. There were no expulsions for the fourth quarter of the 2008-2009 school year.

There was one drug (prescription) suspension, and no alcohol or street drug suspensions for the fourth quarter. There were 131 suspensions for fighting this quarter compared to 92 last year. The largest areas of decrease were seen in dangerous actions/materials, which decreased by 22 suspensions, and assault, which saw 30 fewer suspensions.

In comparing fourth quarter of 2007-2008 to fourth quarter of 2008-2009, three elementary schools had zero suspensions, while 19 schools had three suspensions or less.

For fourth quarter of 2008-2009, nine schools increased suspensions by one to two when compared to the same time period last year. Eleven schools increased suspensions by three or more. Twenty-eight schools had a decrease in the number of suspensions from the fourth quarter of last year, while at 12 schools the number of suspensions remained the same.

High Schools

There were 32 fewer suspensions for fighting during fourth quarter 2008-2009 (44) than fourth quarter last year (76). Decreases were also seen in drugs (38 to 30), alcohol (29 to 7), and dangerous materials/objects (27 to 3). Increases were seen in the following categories: discrimination/harassment/bullying (10 to 16), sexual harassment (0 to 5), obscenity/profanity (54 to 80), and disruptive behavior (36 to 58).

The number of high school suspensions for the fourth quarter of the 2008-2009 school year is 589 a decrease of 139 suspensions compared to the fourth quarter of last year when there were 728 suspensions.
