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A Word From The Authors

In looking at teen behavior in general, and specifically, the Youth Risk Behavior Survey (YRBS) data, it is natural to say, "Tsk, tsk, tsk, those bad kids!" When the eye falls across statistics that say, for example, that 34.9% of ASD high-schoolers have had at least one drink of alcohol in the last 30 days, or a person witnesses a teenager making a bad/risky/unhealthy choice, one of the first reactions is criticism of this behavior. What doesn't come to mind is the non-occurrences of this behavior: the positive side of things.

For example, if 34.9% of ASD 9th-12th graders say they have had a drink of alcohol in the last month, that is certainly frightening, but it also means that 65.1% of their peers did NOT have a drink of alcohol in the same time period. Perhaps we focus on the negative aspect of things because that is what we can control - we can set up programs to stop kids from drinking or engaging in other risky behaviors; whereas, good behavior is something we can encourage, but cannot/do-not control. In this case, it certainly makes sense to focus on the manageable bad behavior, and hope that the good behavior continues of its own accord.

But let us examine the potential effects of not paying attention to the positive side of things. Many myths abound in high schools about how many people are doing this-or-that, but most of these "statistics" are unfounded and (according to the YRBS data) incorrect. Telling teens these myths are wrong might have some effect; however, not as much as telling them the converse side of things. For example, if a teen believes that 70% of his/her schoolmates do marijuana – when the YRBS data shows that in 2009, only 18.9% of survey respondents said they had used the drug in the past 30 days – they can certainly be told, "No, it's not 70%, it's 18.9%." However, this still seems like a lot - after all, that means 1 out of every 5 students surrounding our subject has done marijuana in the last month! Perhaps a more positive way to state this is, "Well, you know, 81.1% of students DON'T do marijuana, so see how many people around you are making good choices like you?"

We believe the strength-based YRBS data report – showing the positive side of things – can:

- 1) Empower those who have good behaviors with the knowledge that there are many other students around them that choose to make the same good decisions;
- 2) Debunk some of the myths in high school about risky behaviors;
- 3) Make those who choose to make bad decisions realize they are not in the majority group; and
- 4) Focus efforts on encouraging and reinforcing positive youth behavior, thereby decreasing risky behavior.

And so...we encourage you to celebrate these positive reports of teen behavior, and The Strength Of Our Youth!

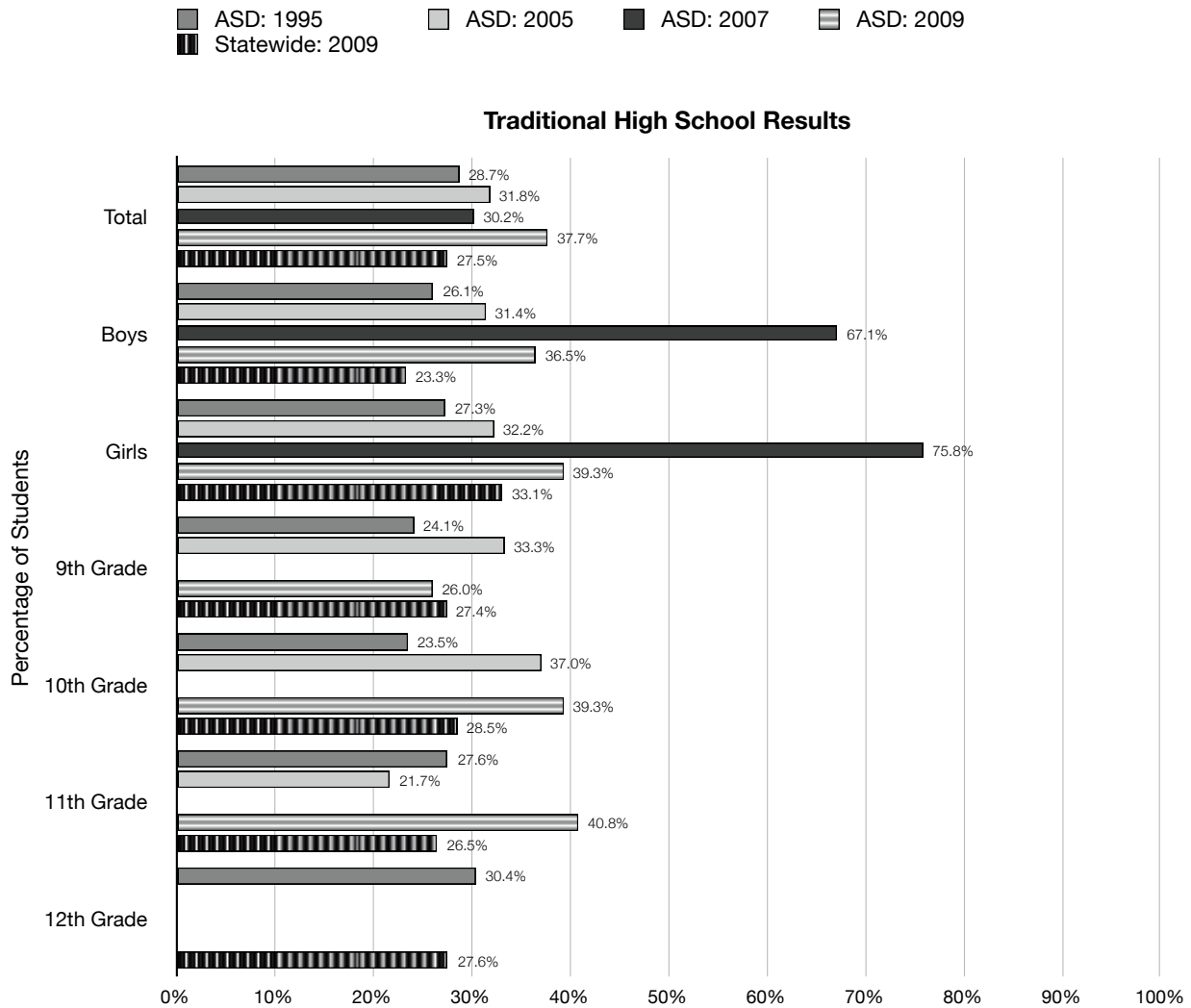

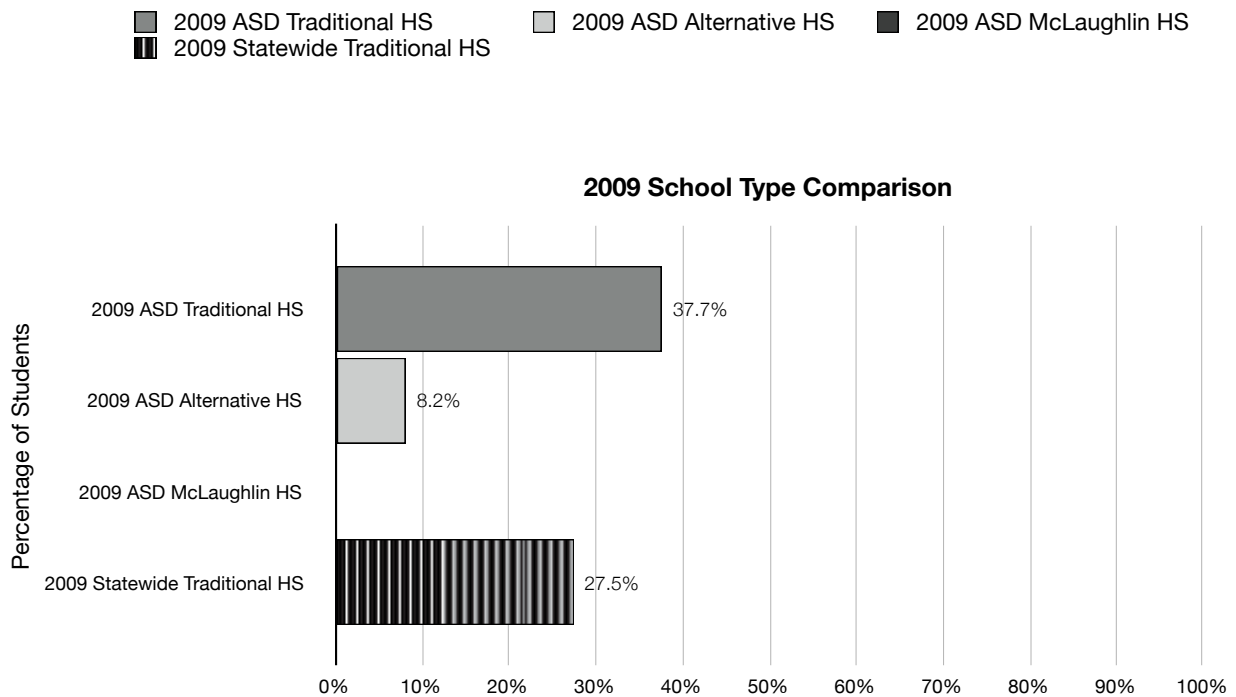
Question 9: When you rode a bicycle during the past 12 months, how often did you wear a helmet?

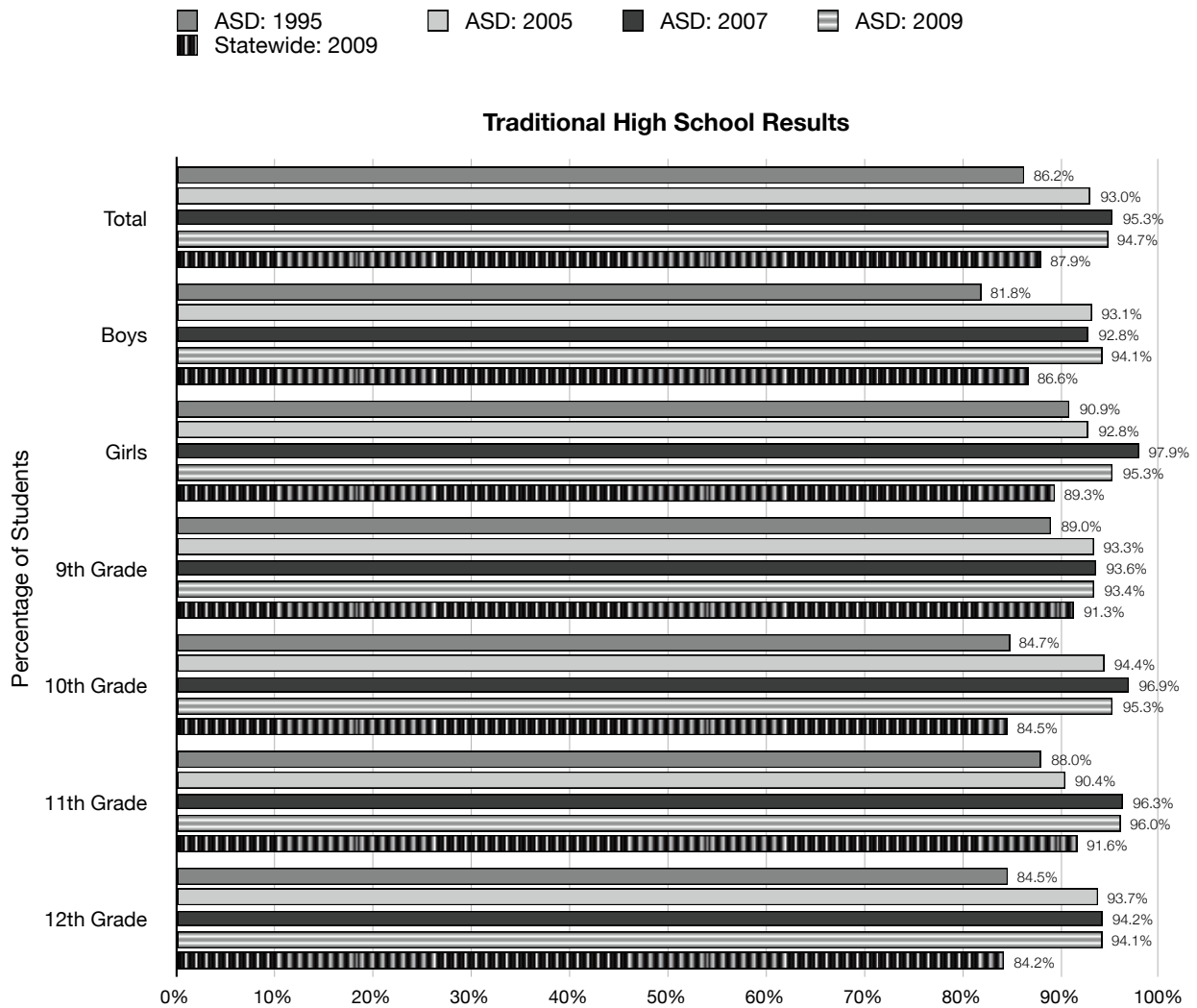

2. Percentage of students who sometimes, most of the time, or always wear a seat belt when riding in a car driven by someone else

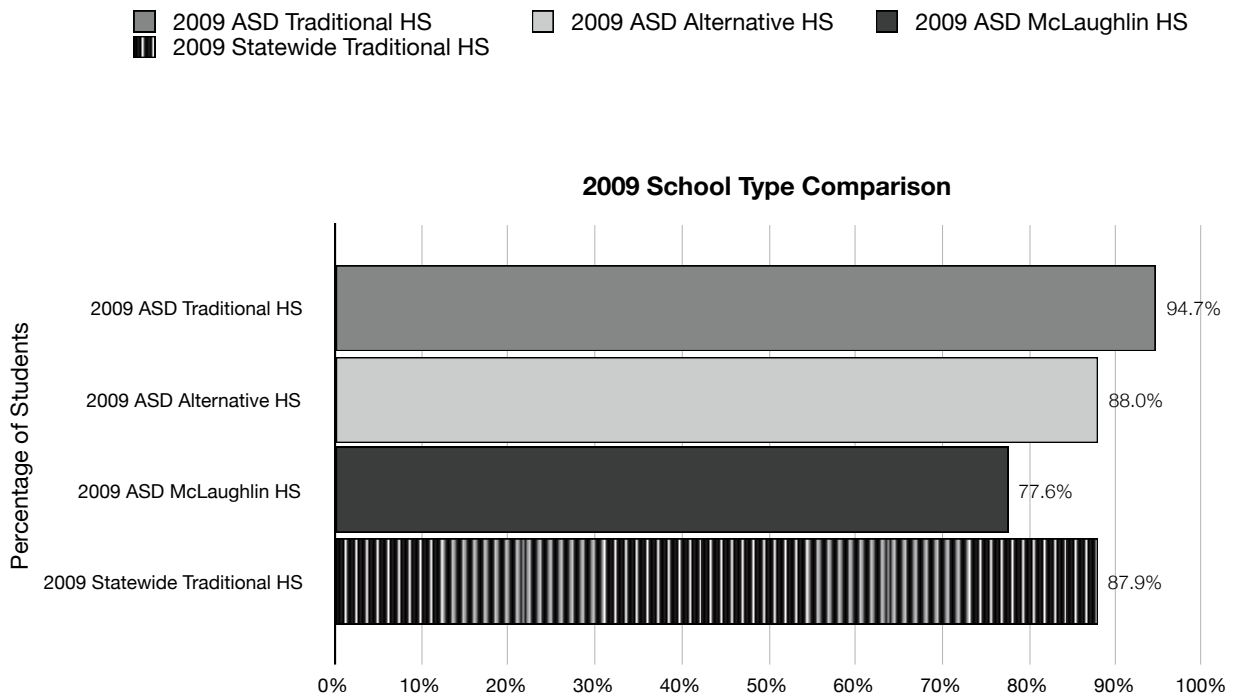

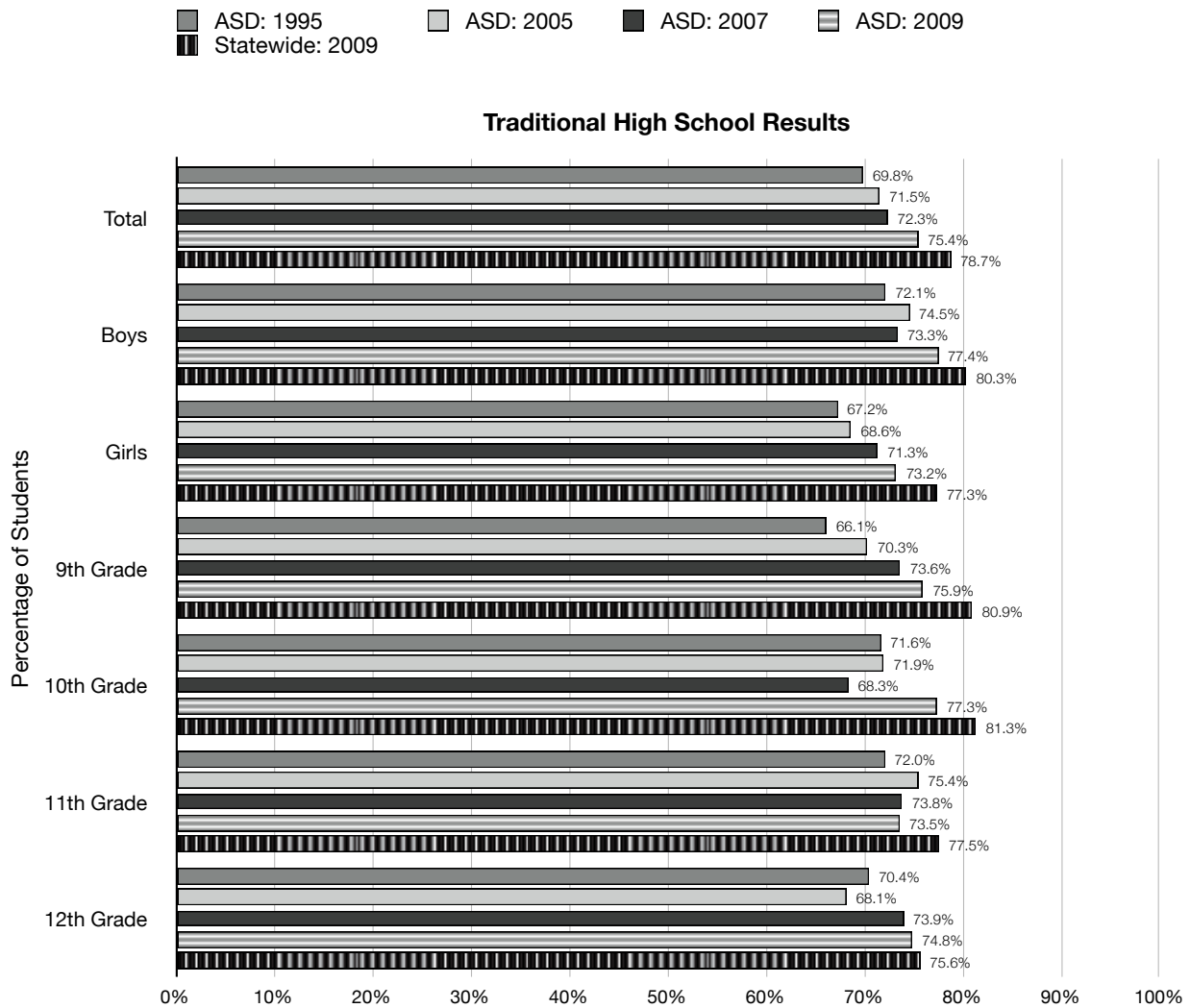

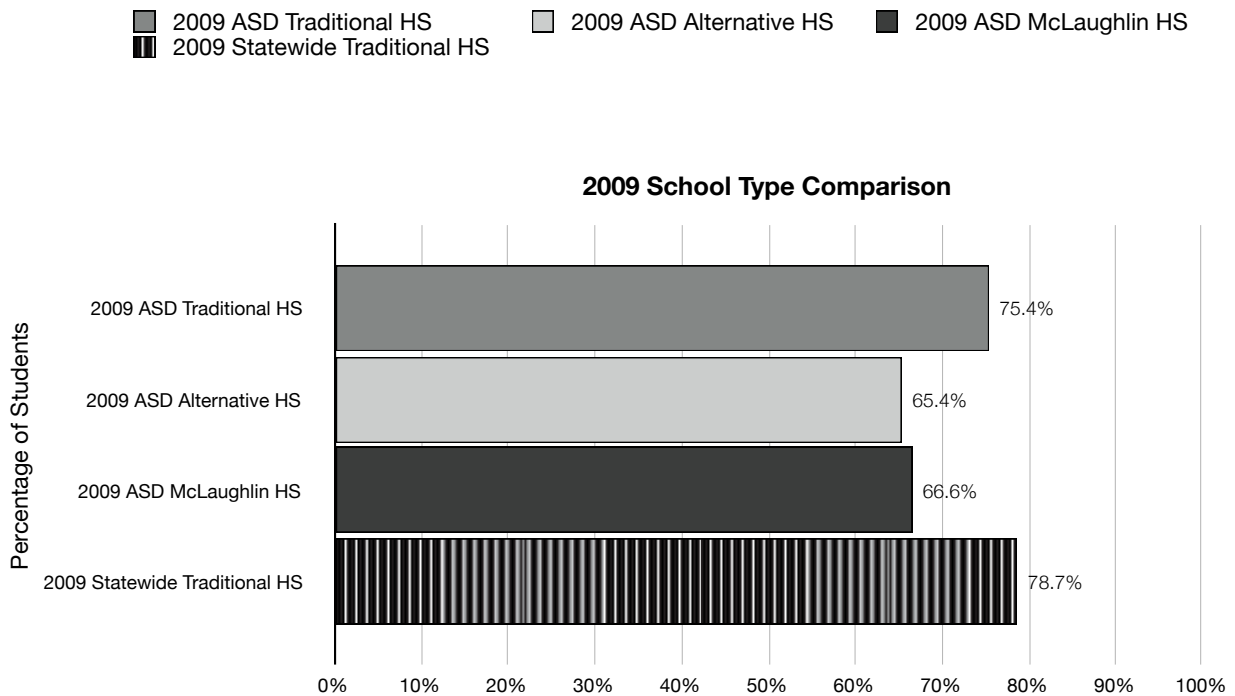
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4. Percentage of students who during the past 30 days NEVER drove a car or other vehicle when they had been drinking

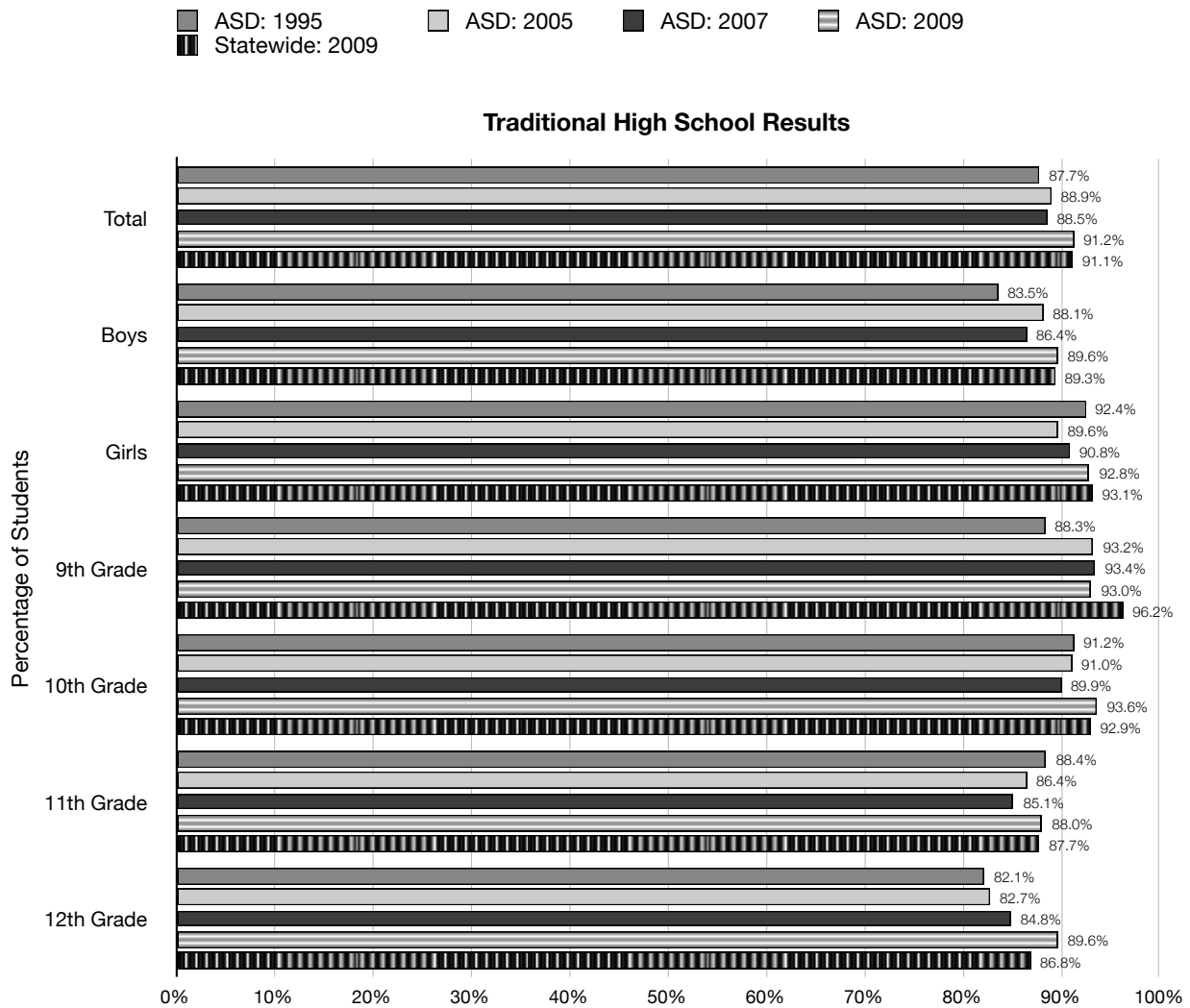

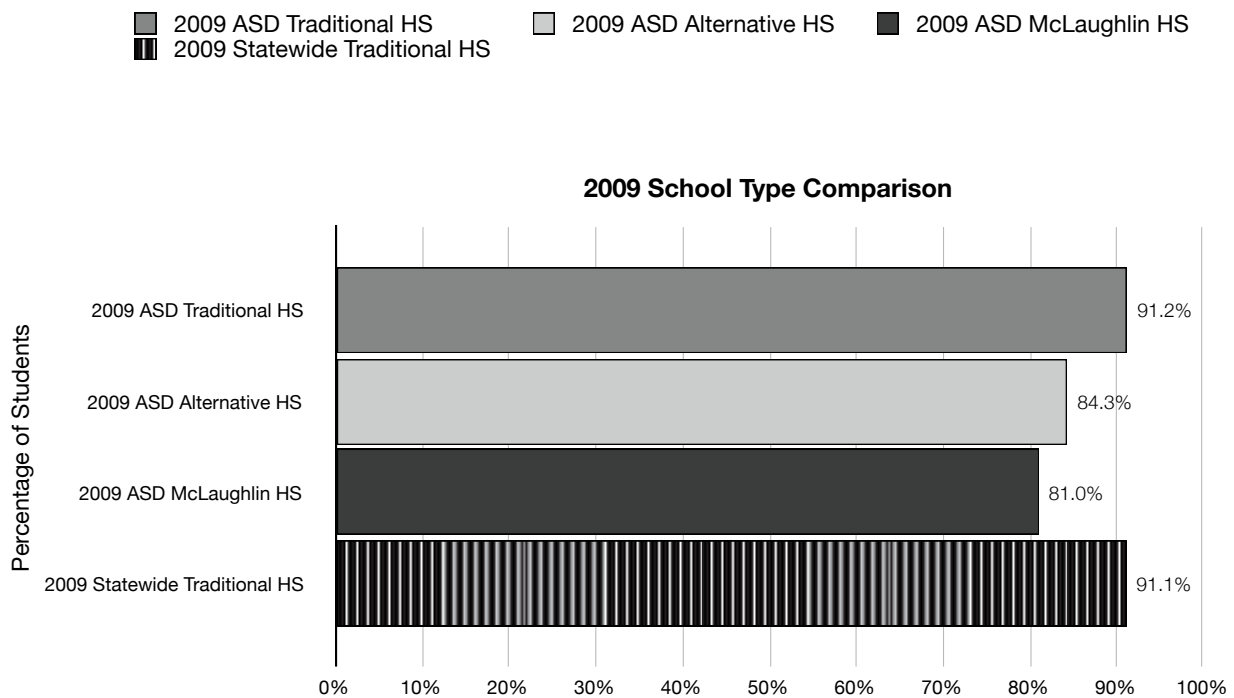

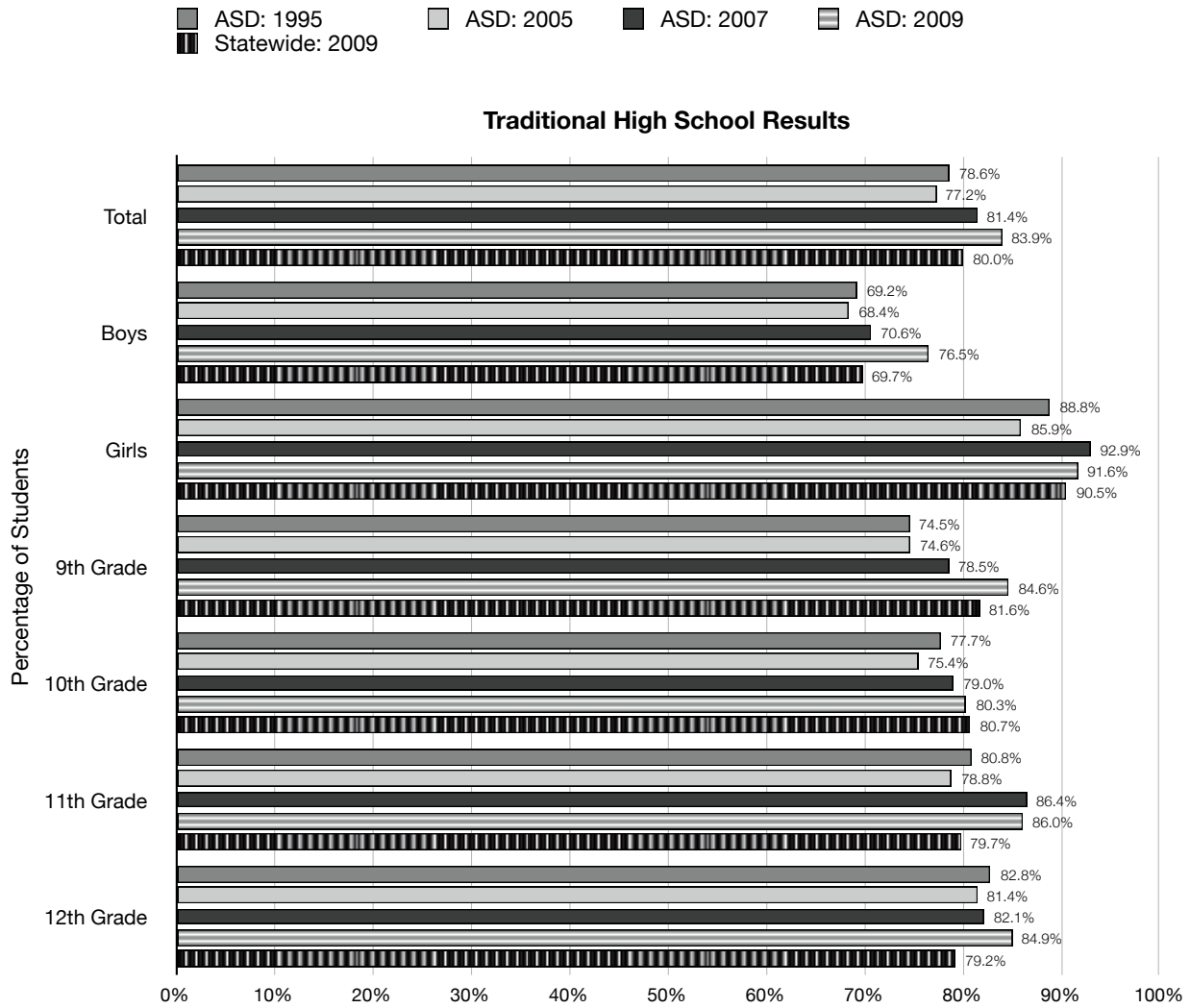

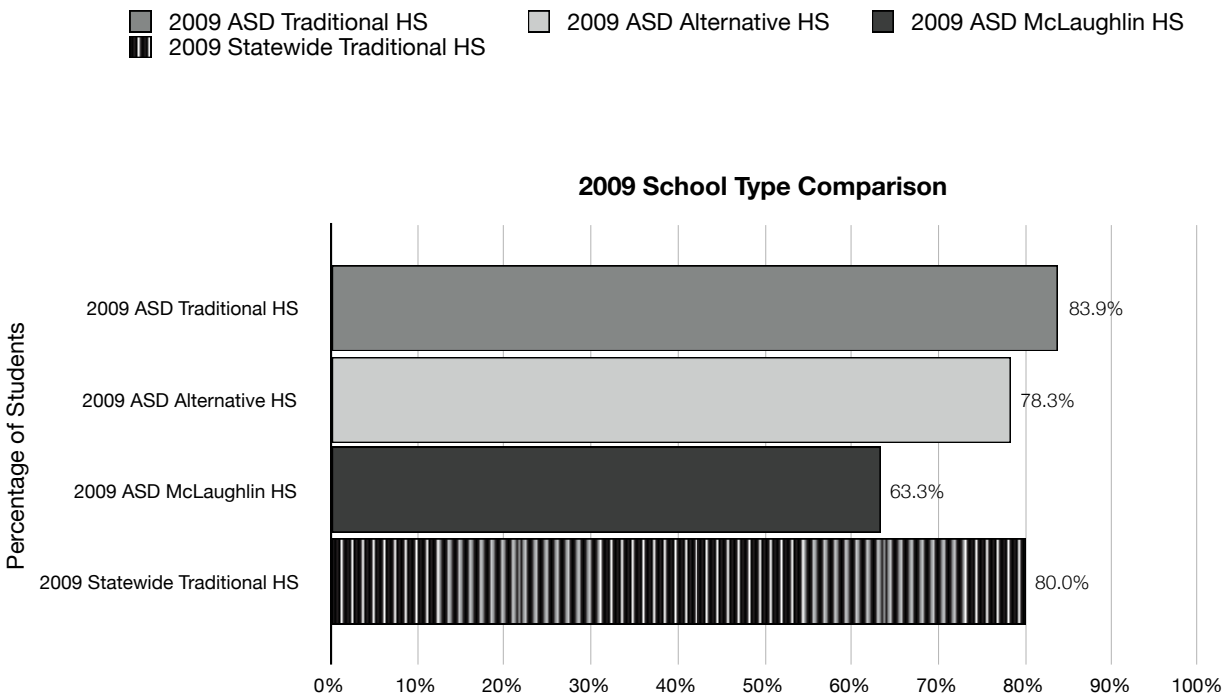

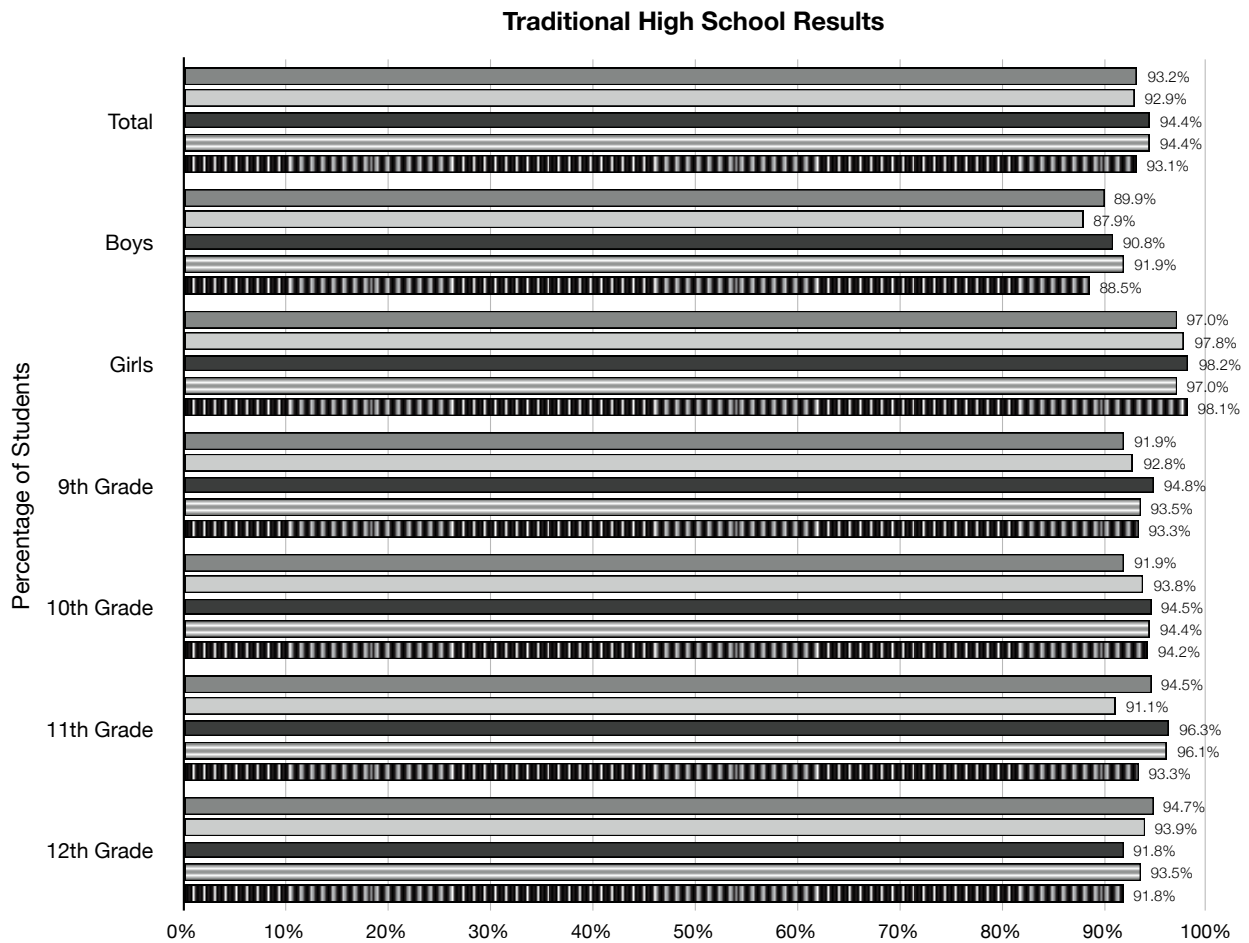

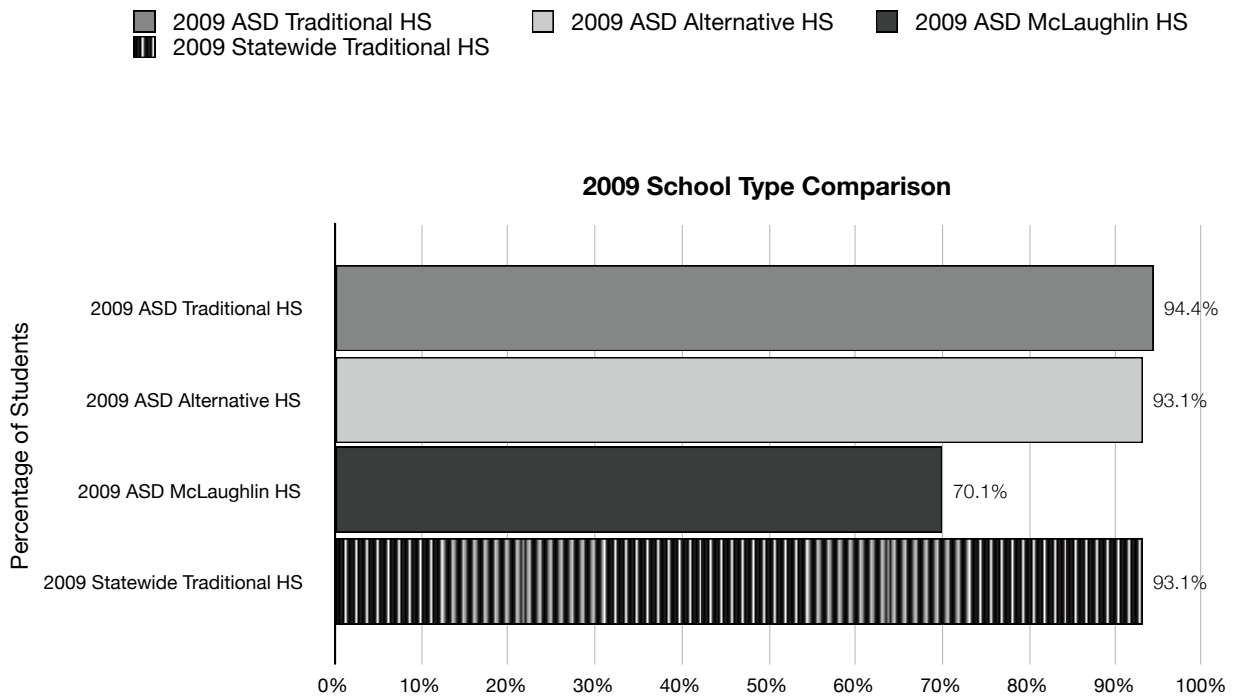

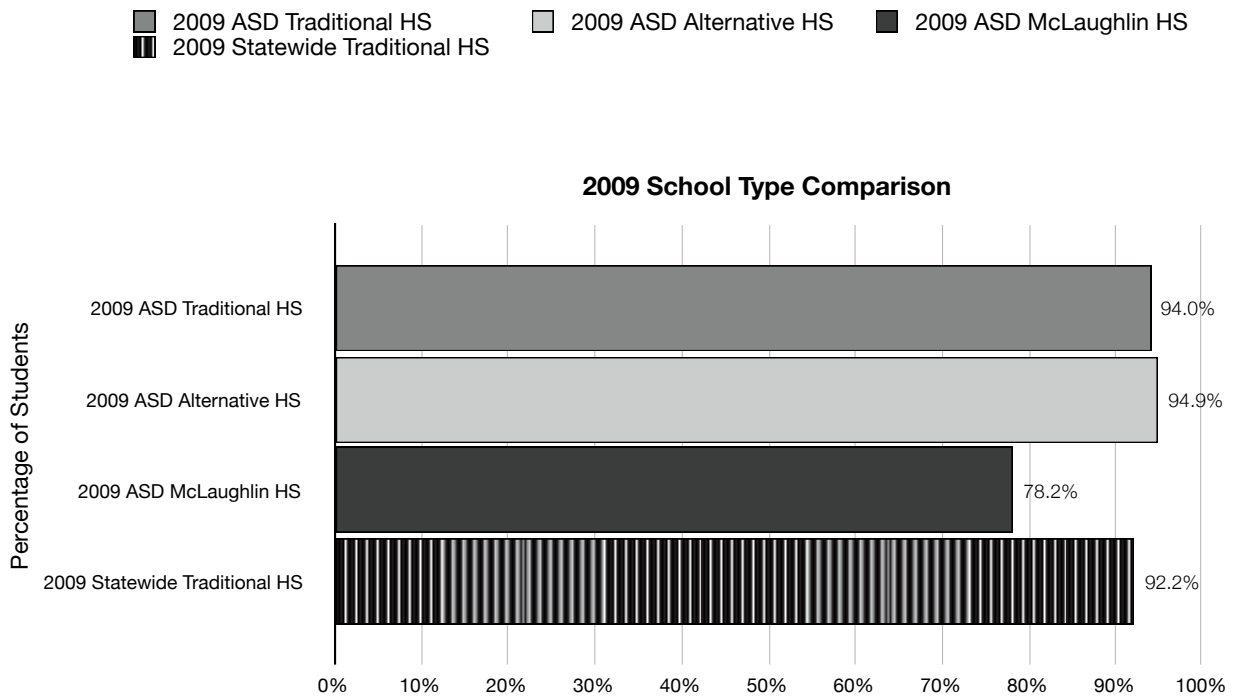

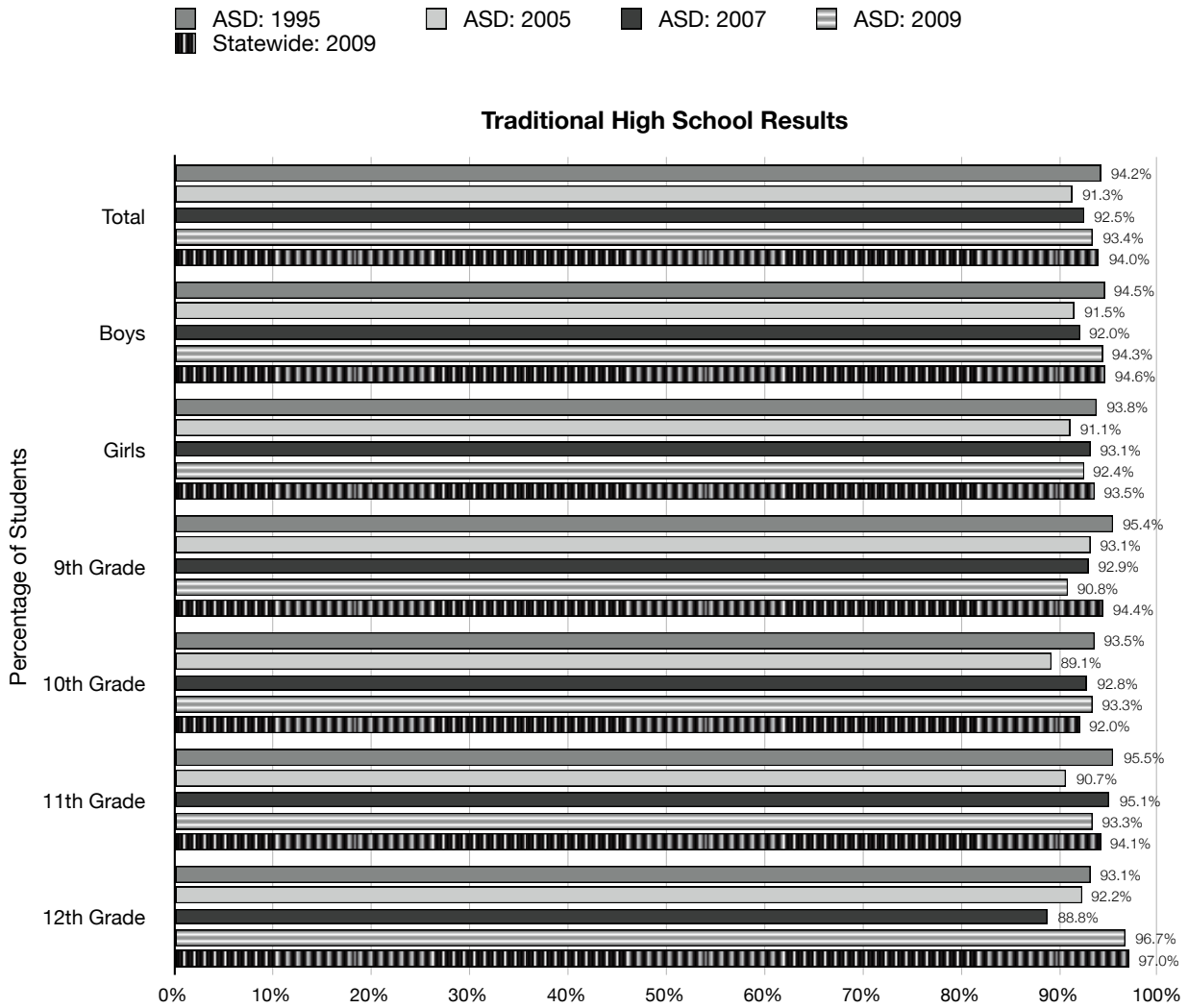

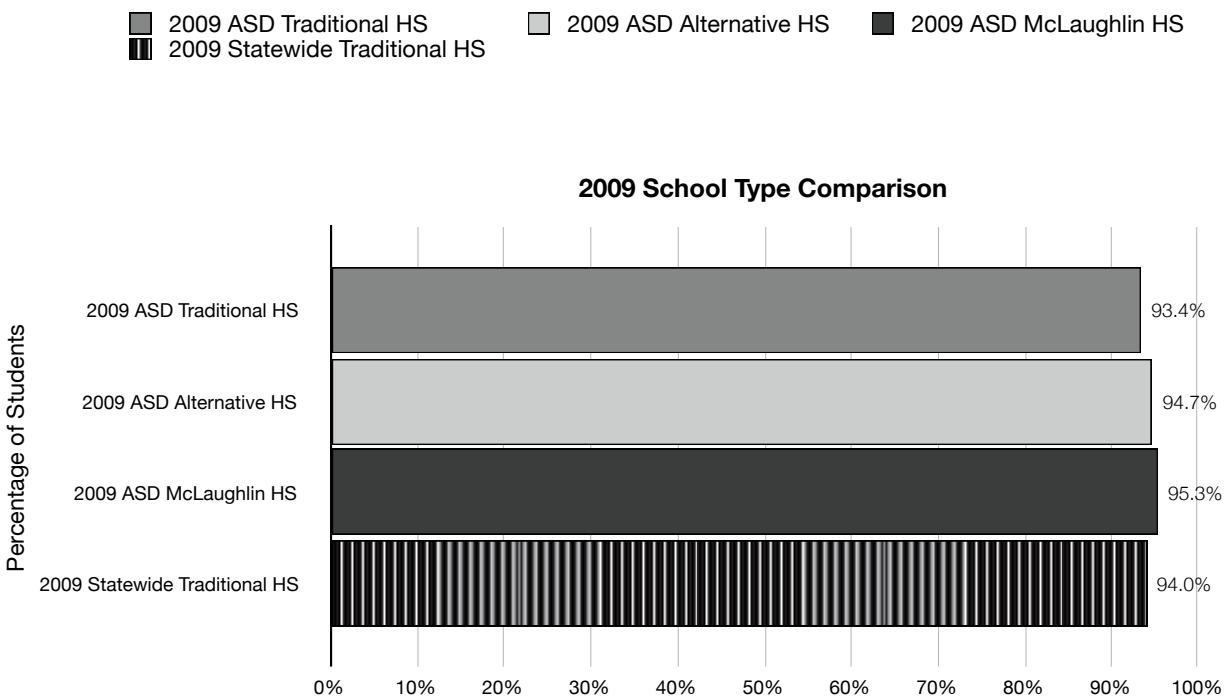
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9. Percentage of students who had NOT been threatened or injured with a weapon on school property EVER during the past 12 months

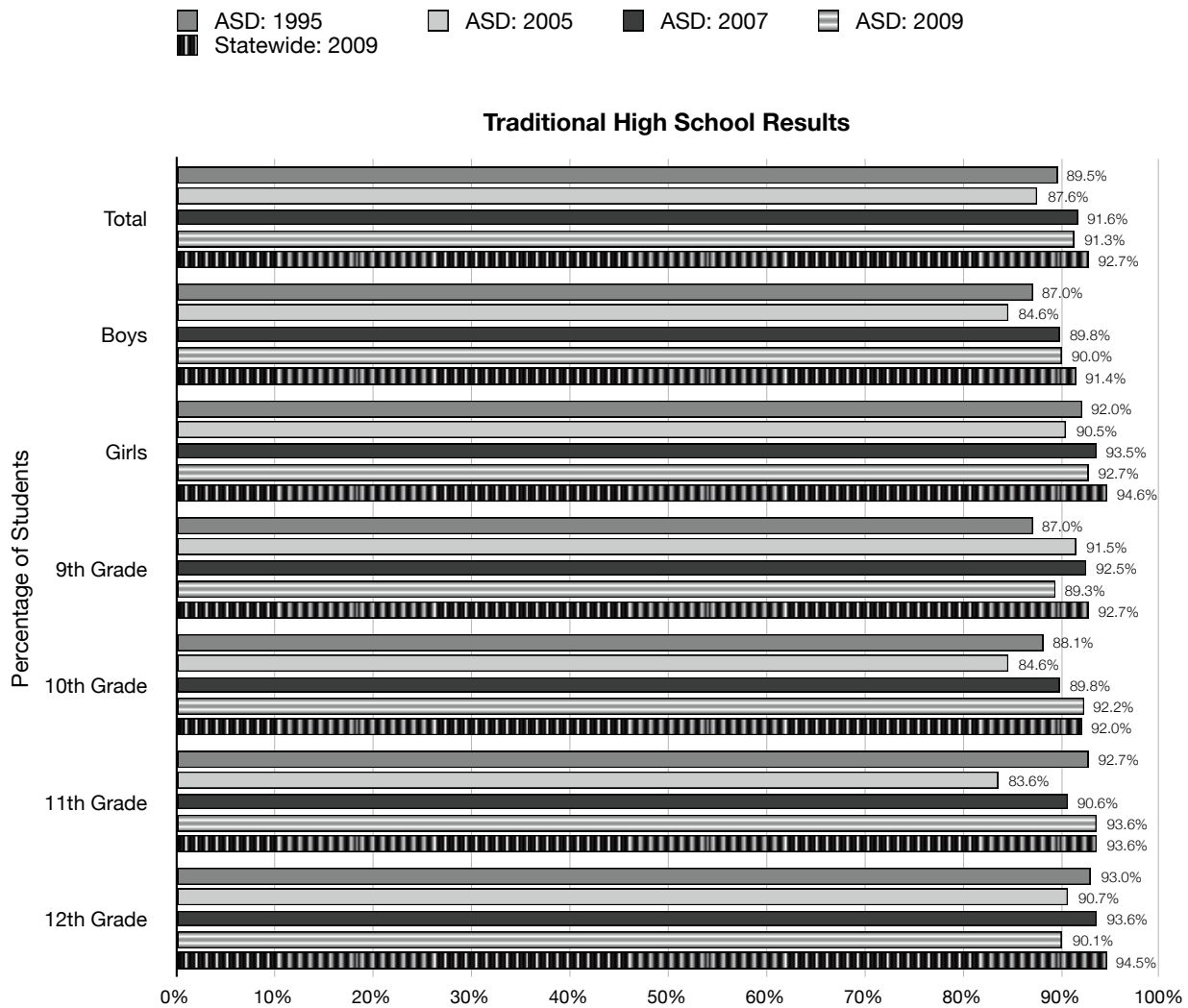

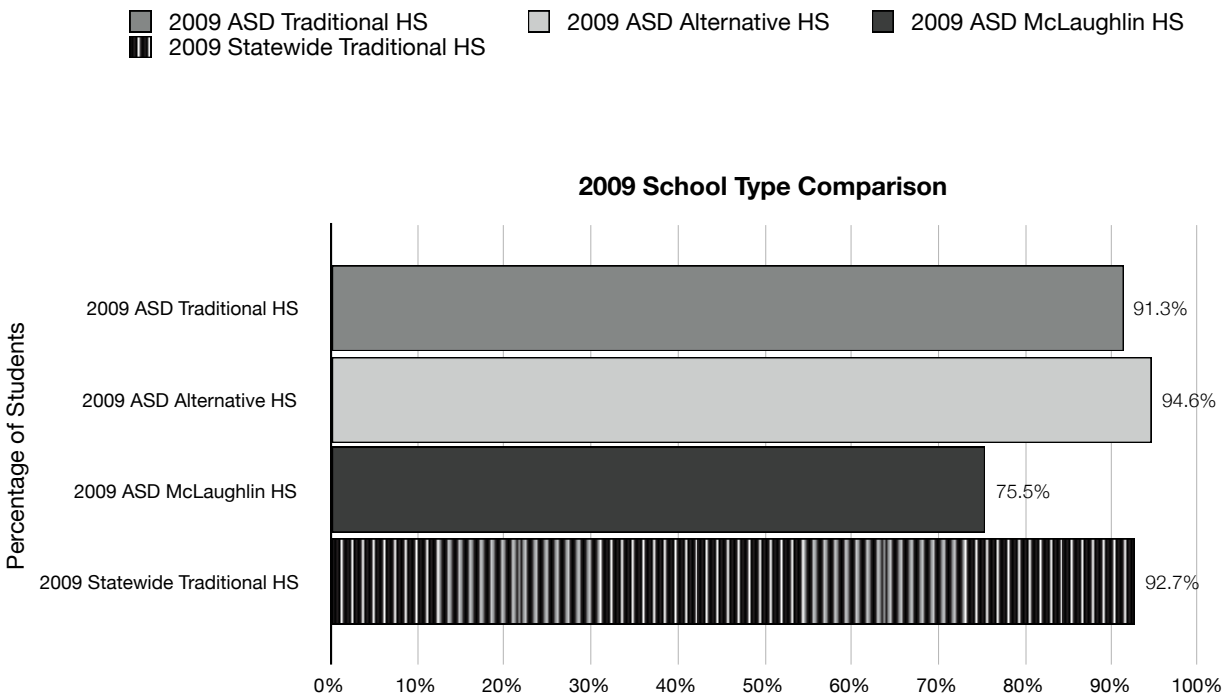
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10. Percentage of students who were NOT in a physical fight EVER during the past 12 months

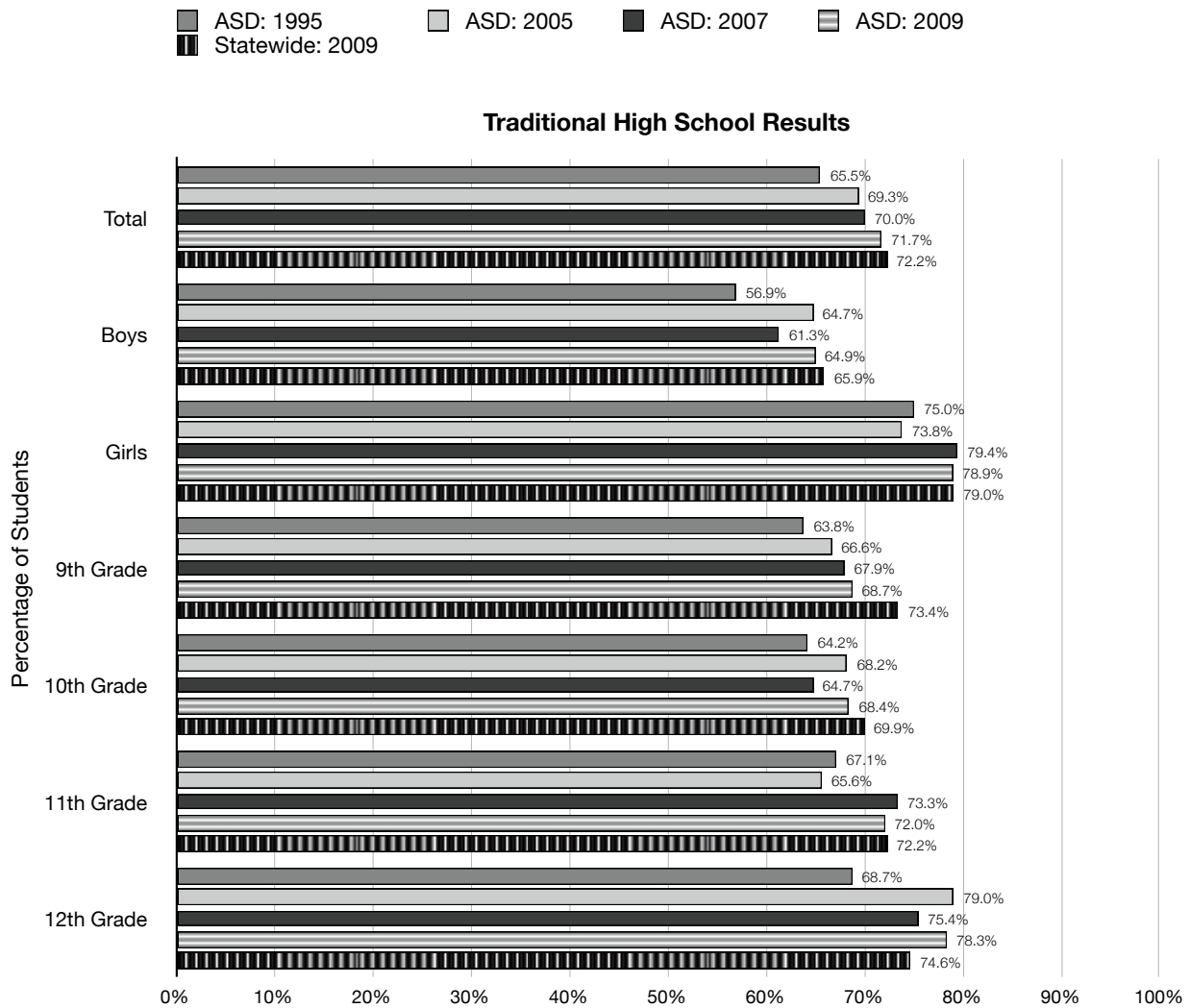

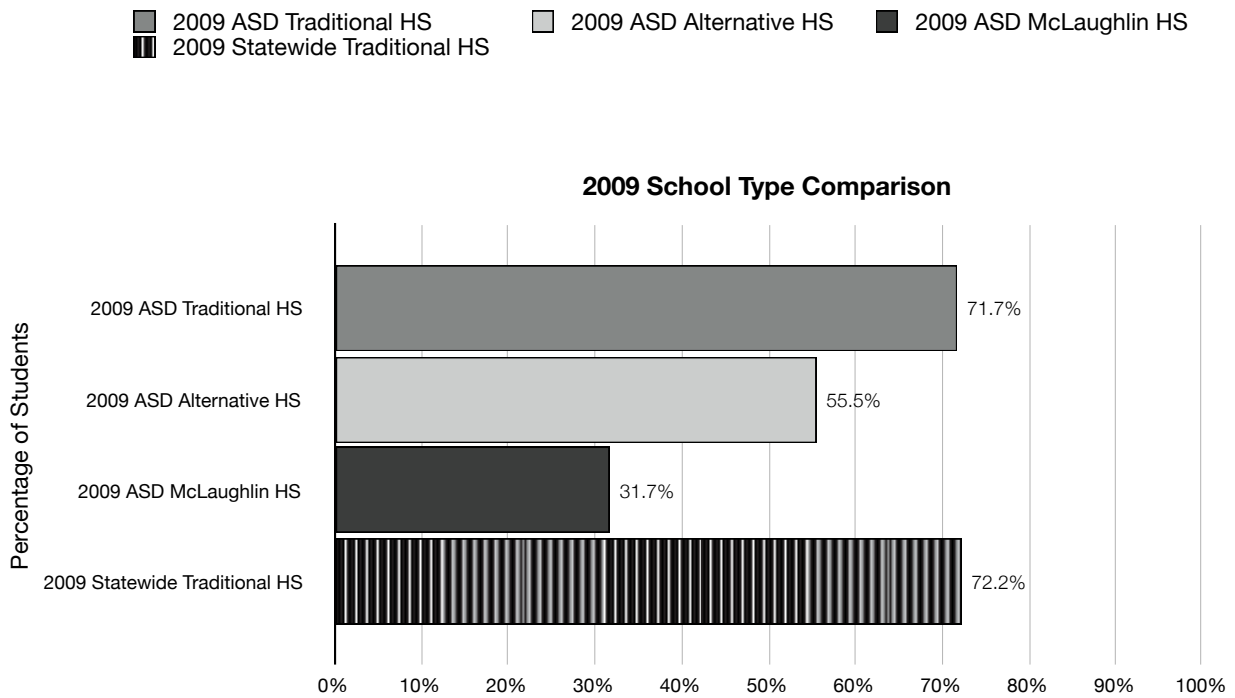
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Question 18: During the past 12 months, how many times were you in a physical fight?

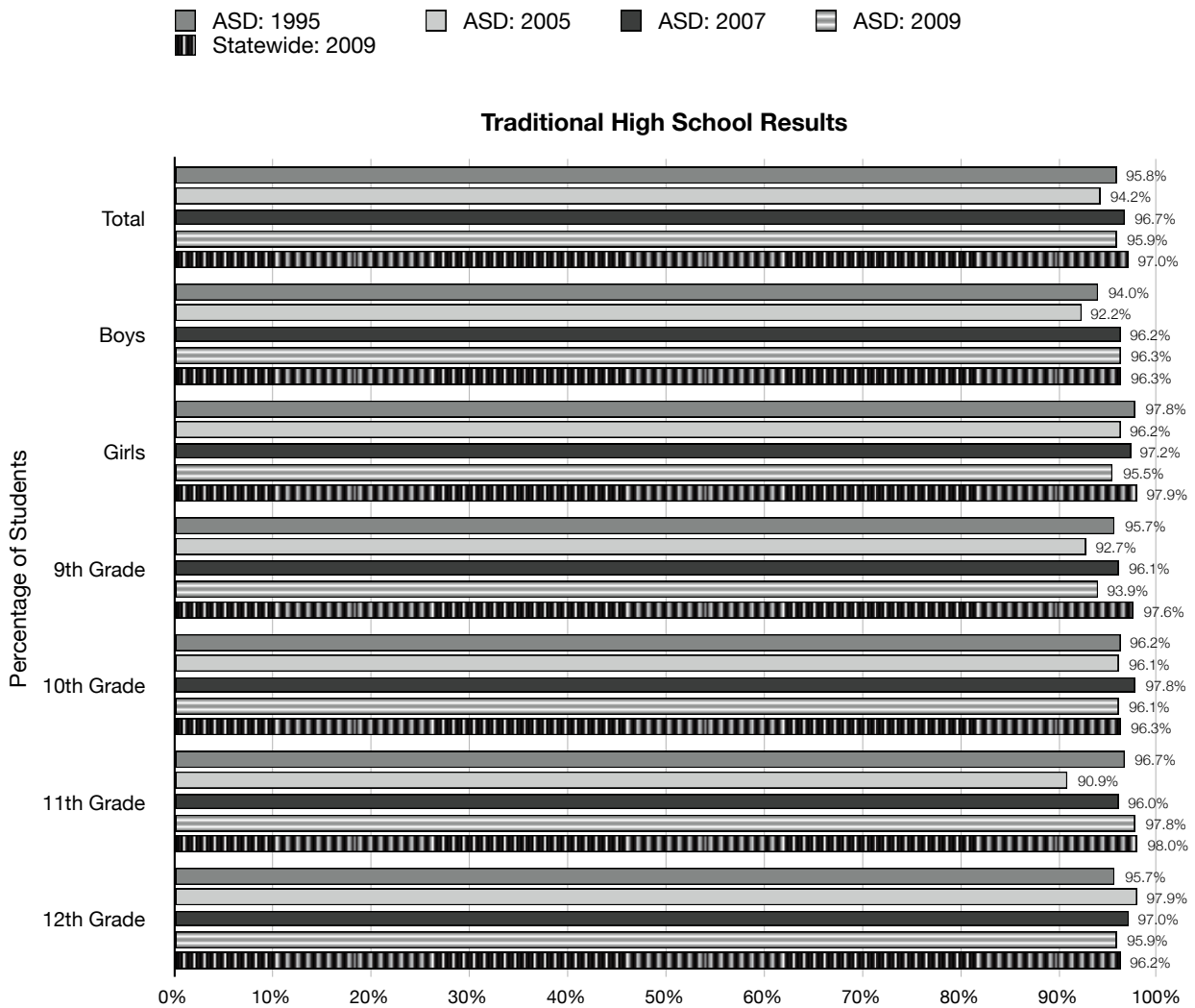

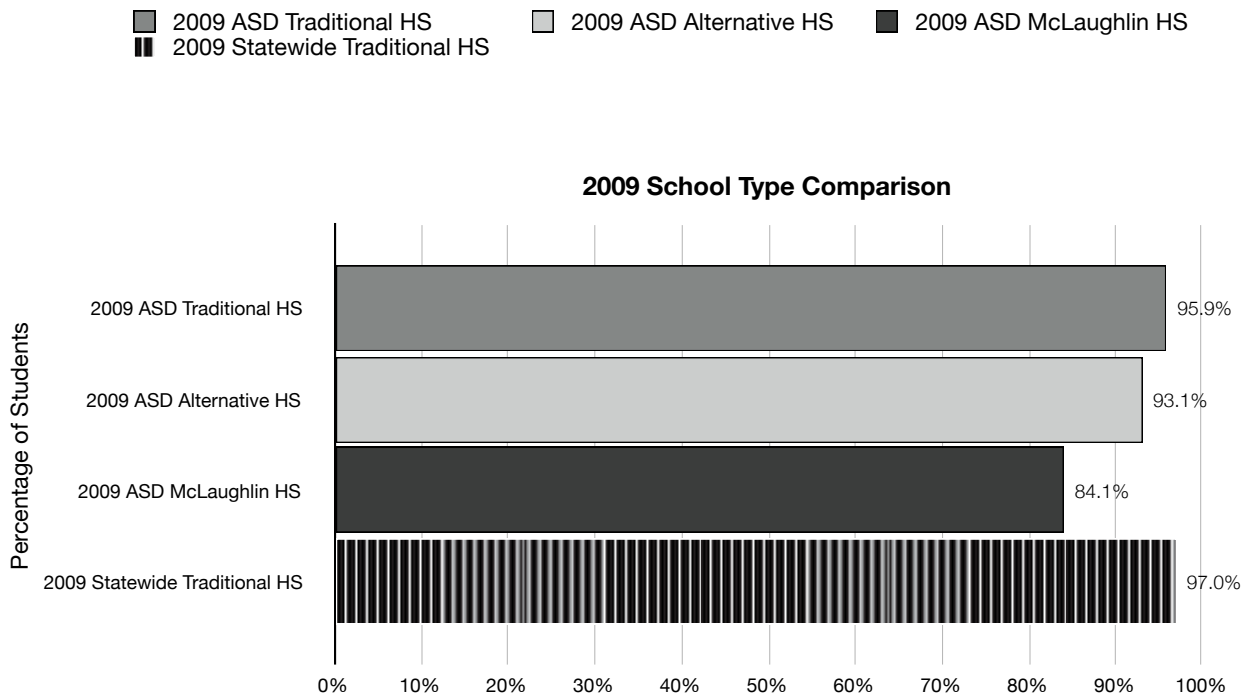
Question 19: During the past 12 months, how many times were you in a physical fight in which you were injured and had to be treated by a doctor or nurse?

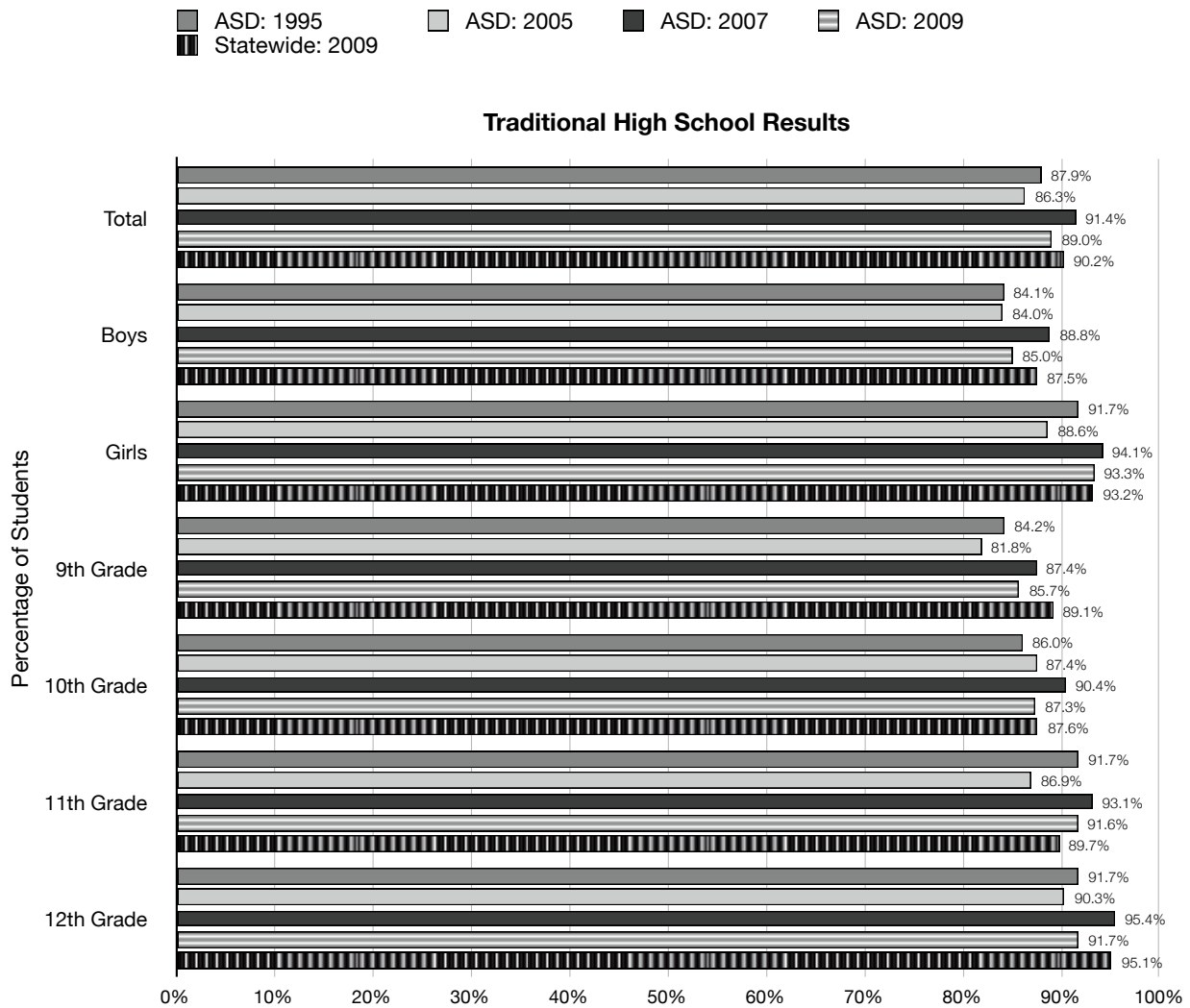

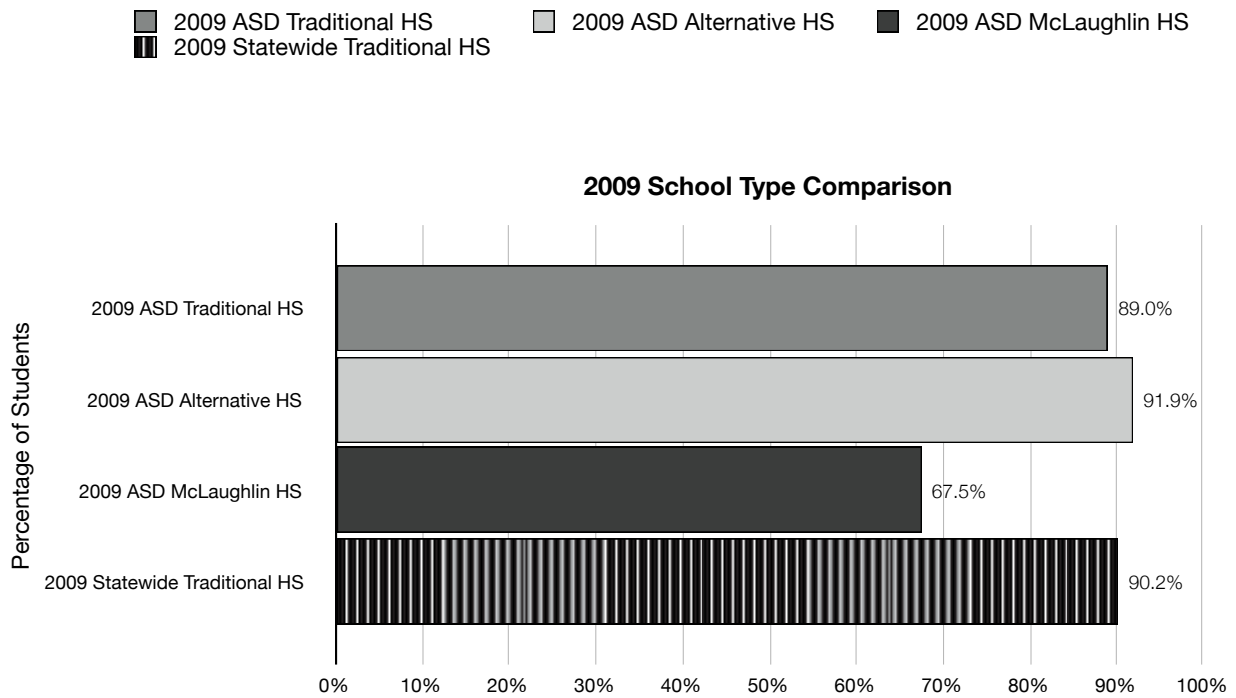
Question 20: During the past 12 months, how many times were you in a physical fight on school property?

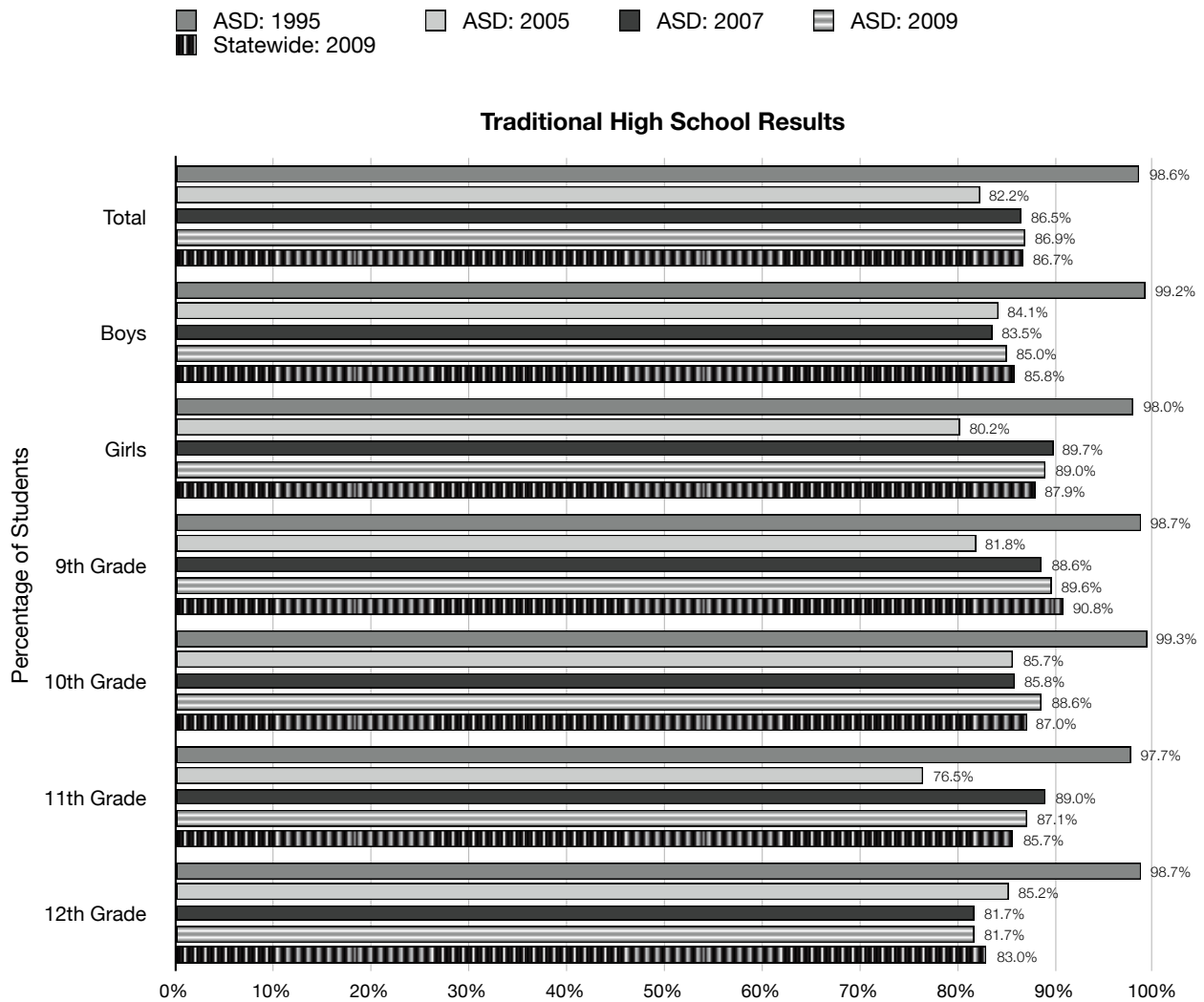

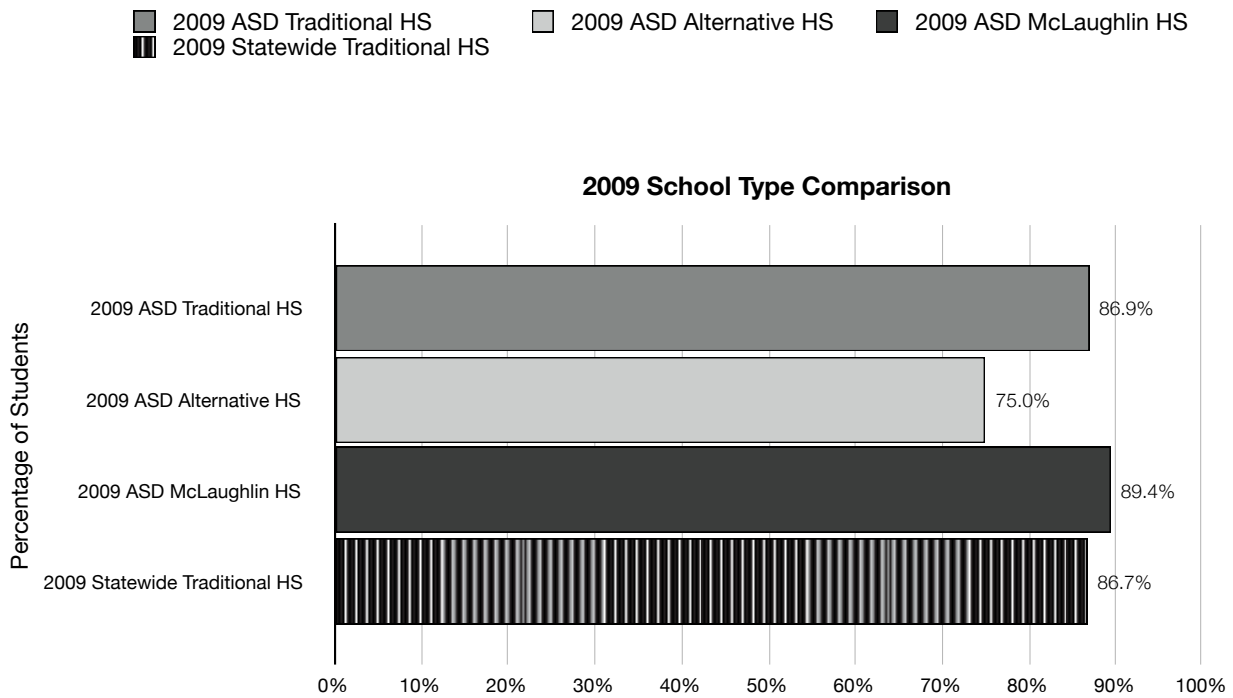
Question 21: During the past 12 months, did your boyfriend or girlfriend ever hit, slap, or physically hurt you on purpose?

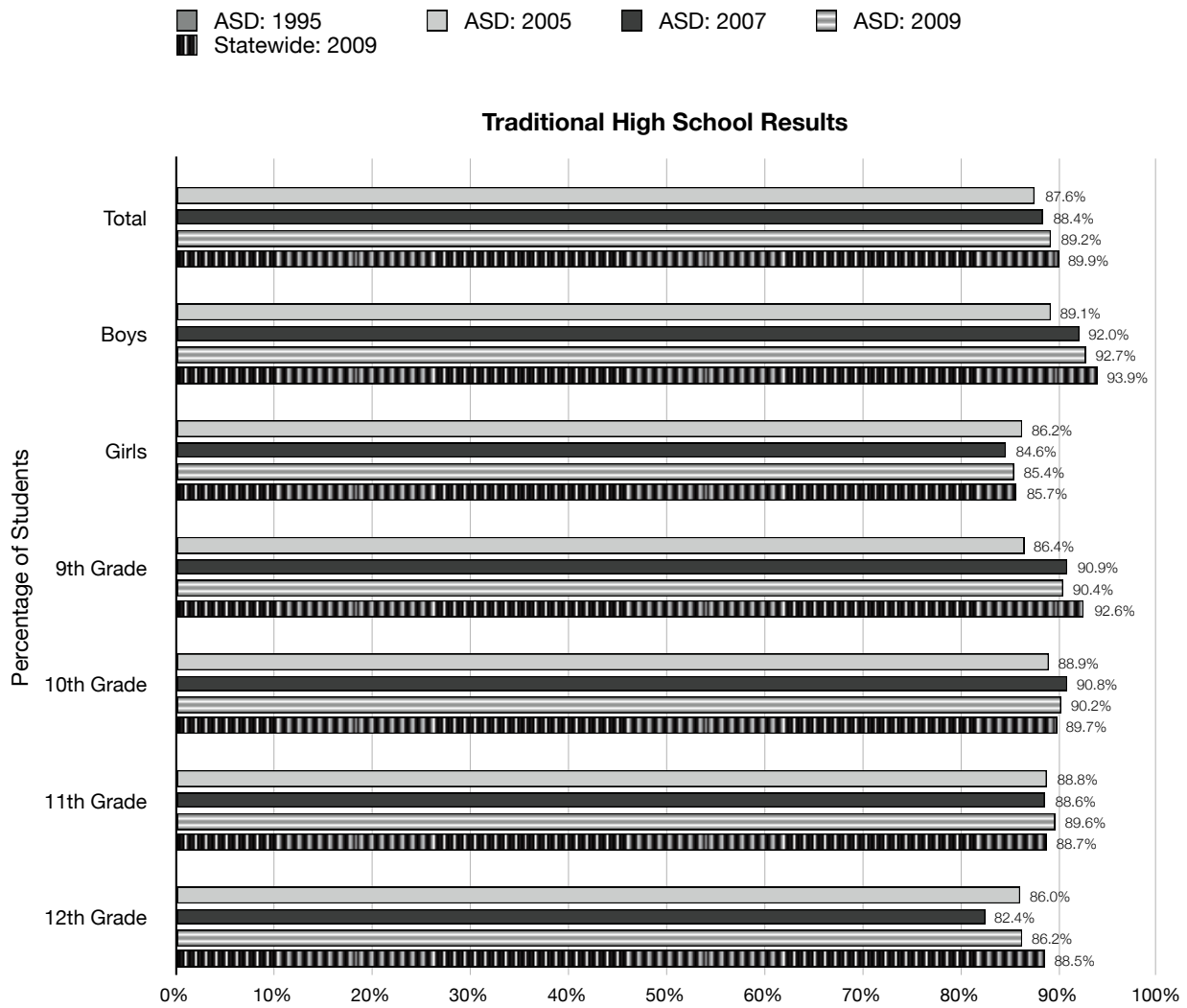

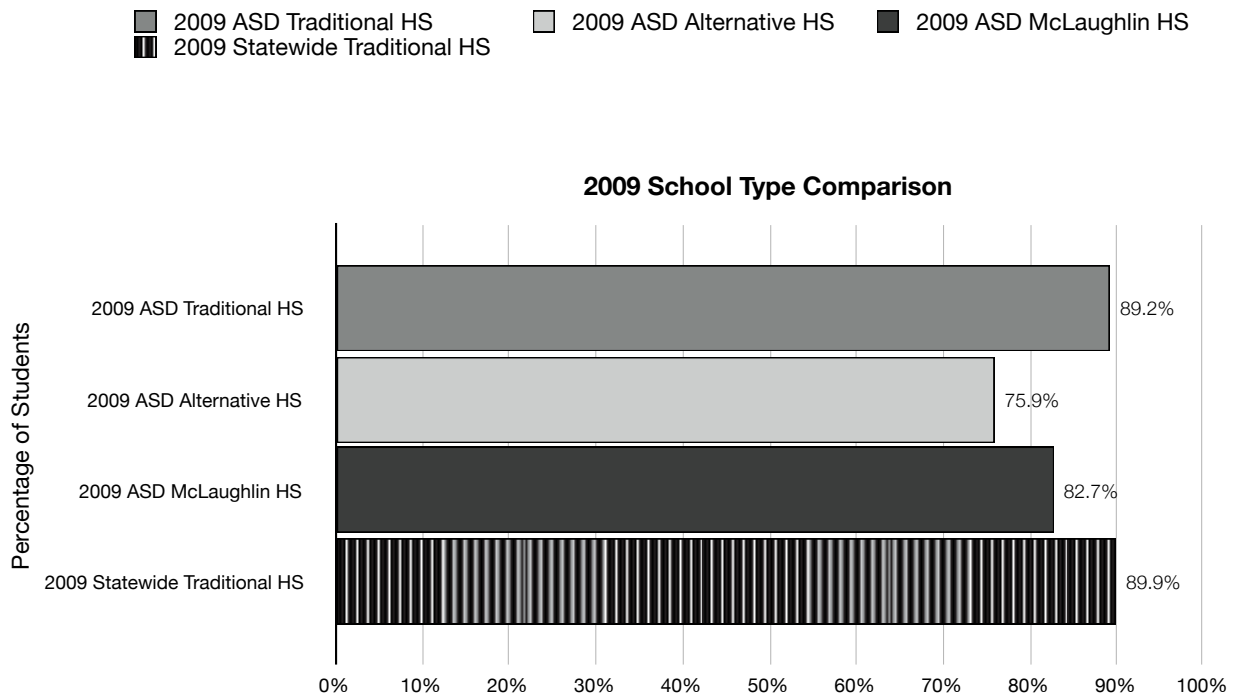
Question 22: Have you ever been physically forced to have sexual intercourse when you did not want to?

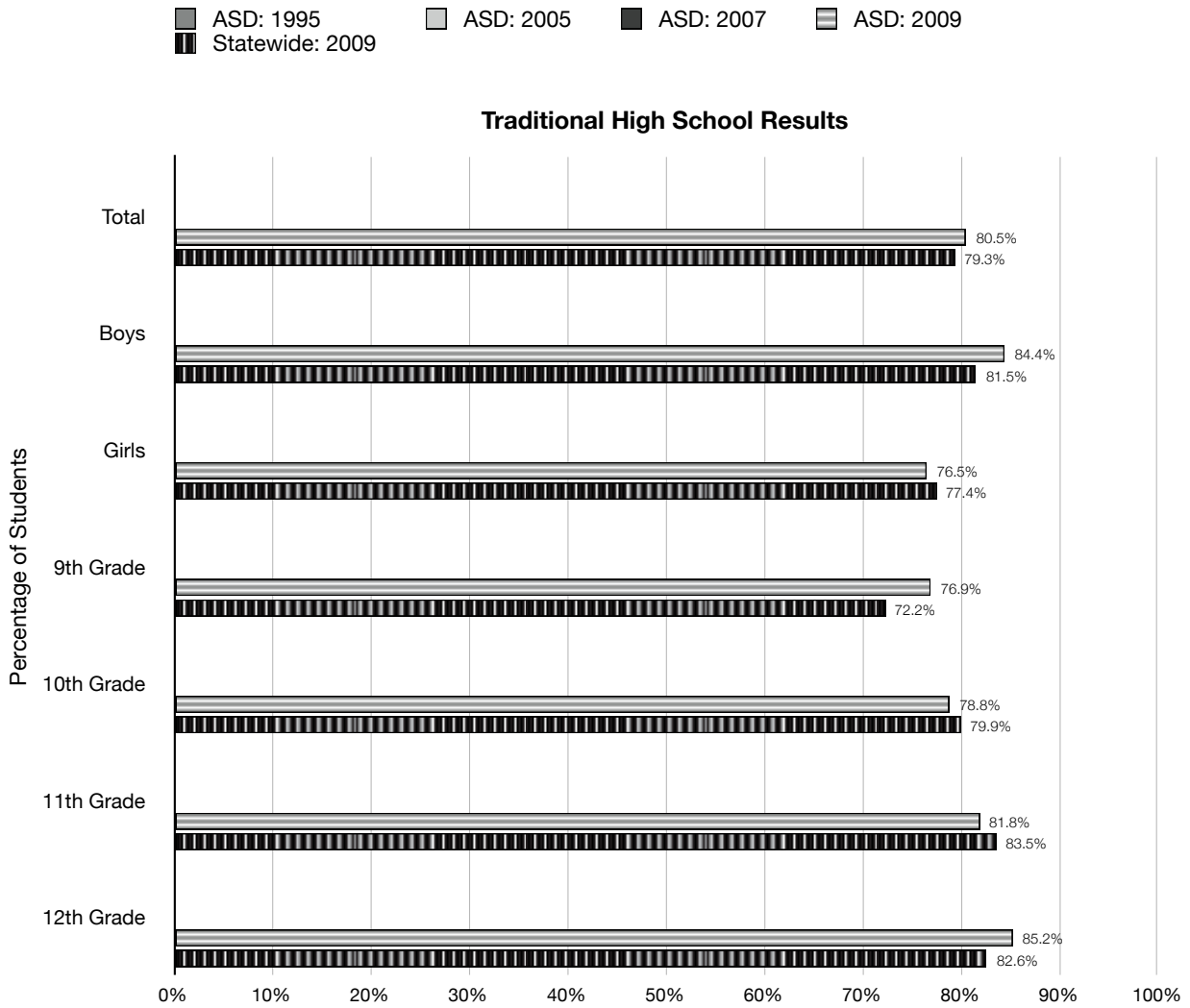

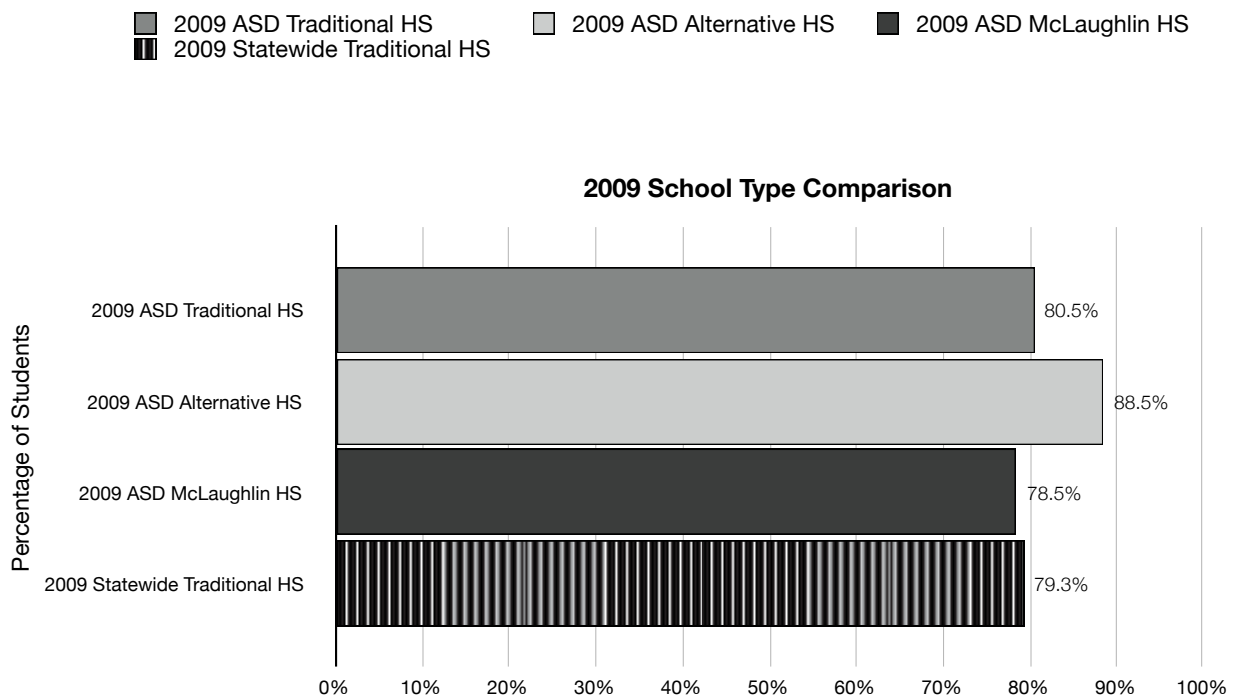
Question 23: During the past 12 months, have you ever been bullied on school property?

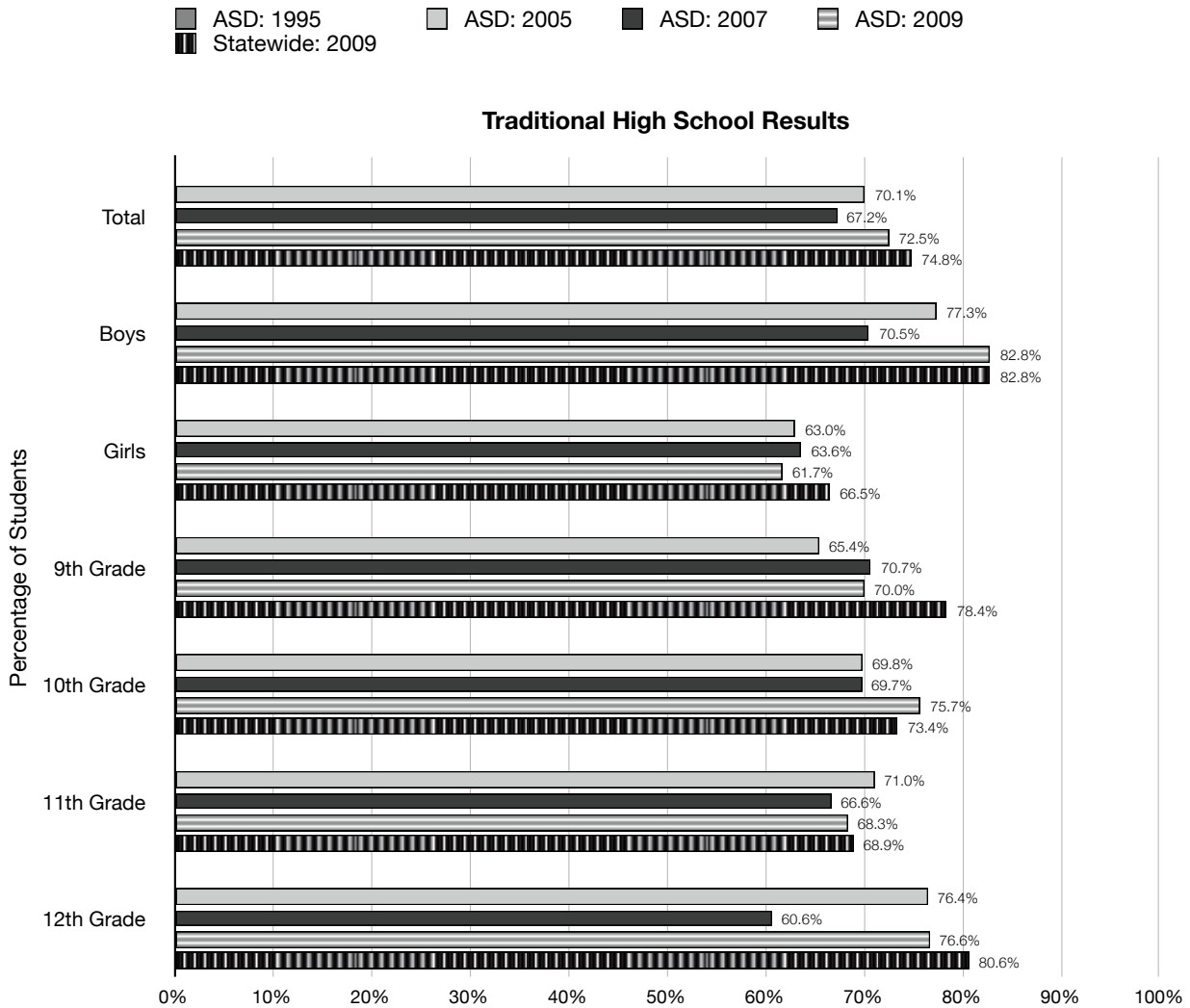

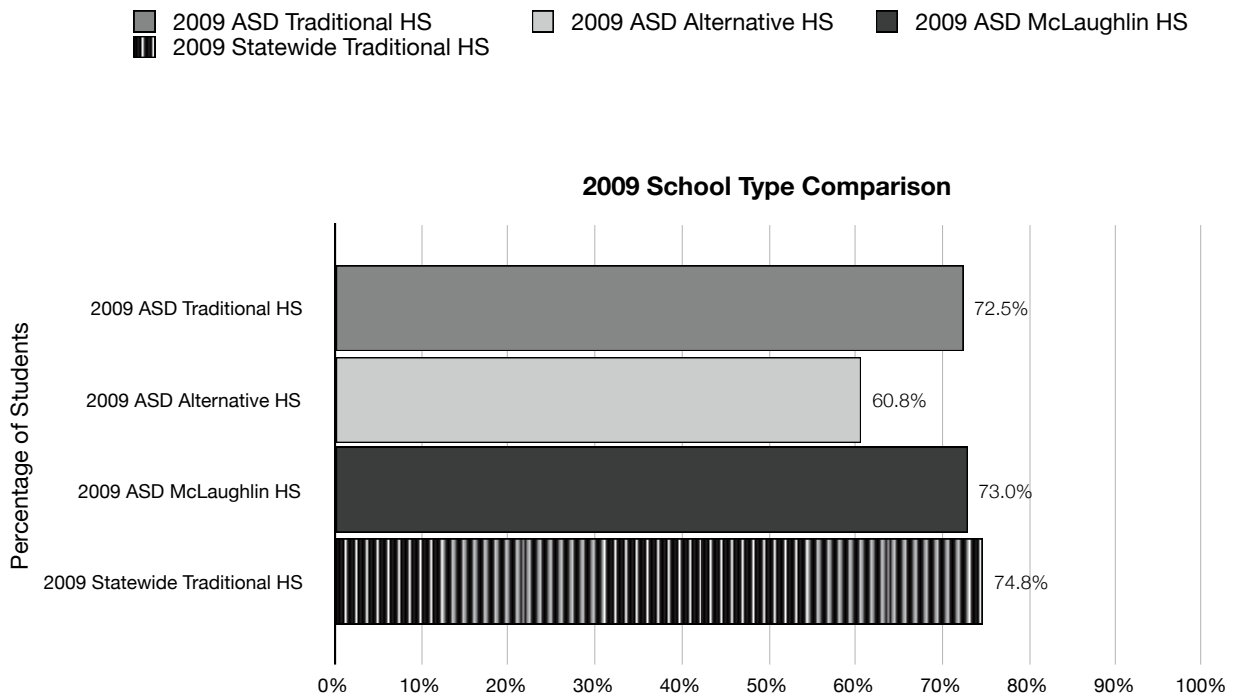
Question 24: During the past 12 months, did you ever feel so sad or hopeless almost every day for two weeks or more in a row that you stopped doing some usual activities?

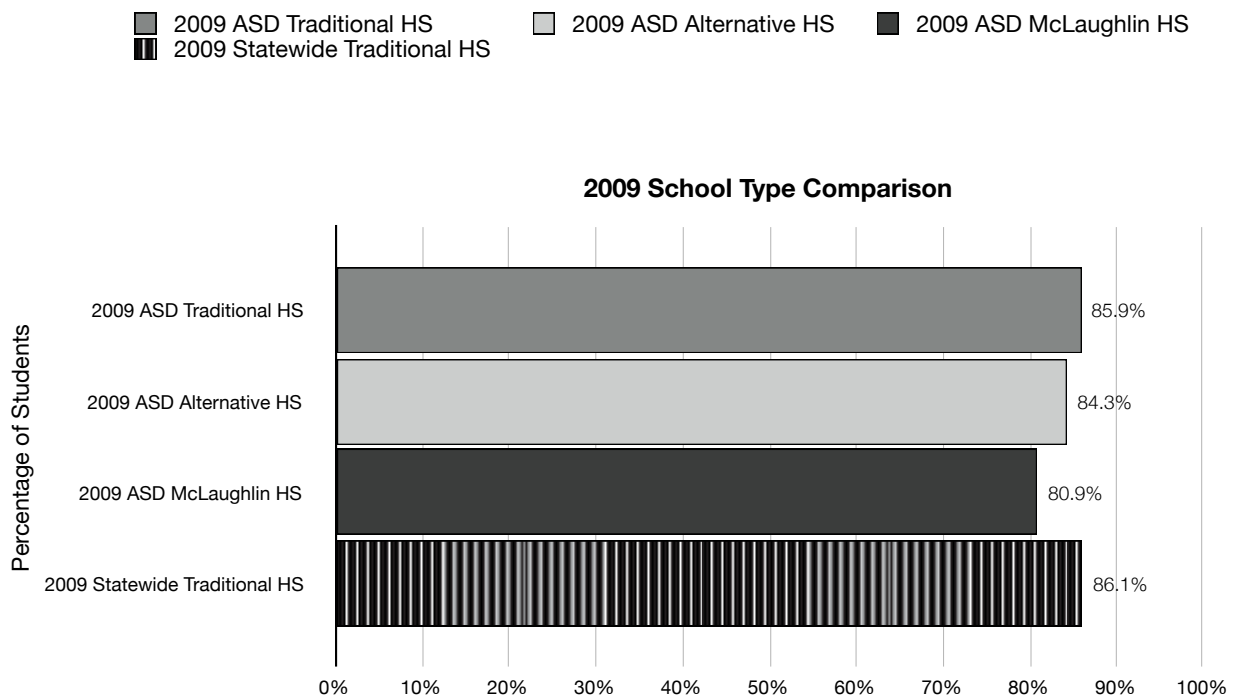

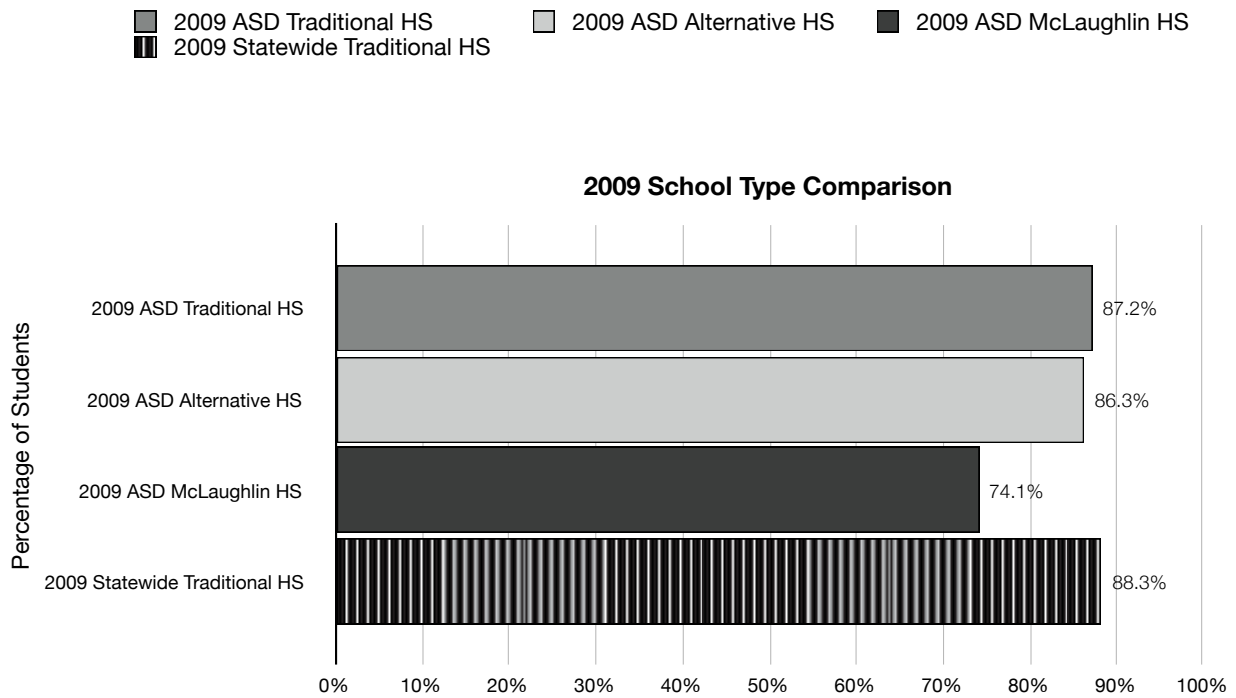

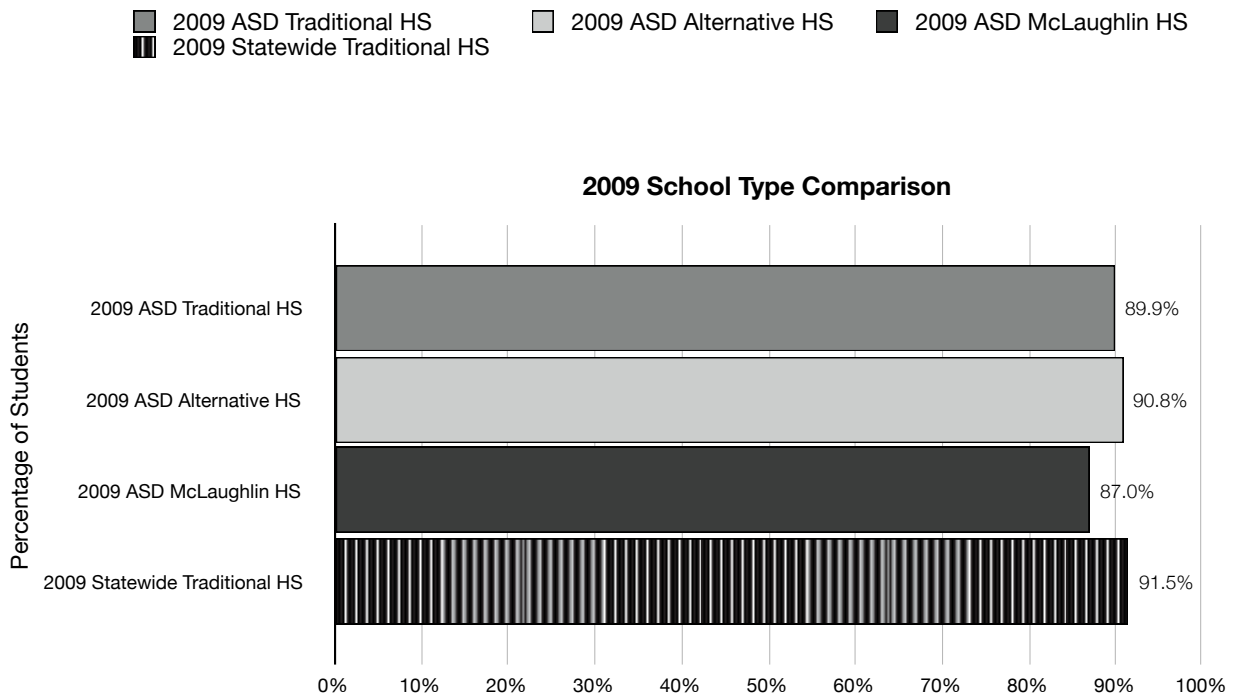

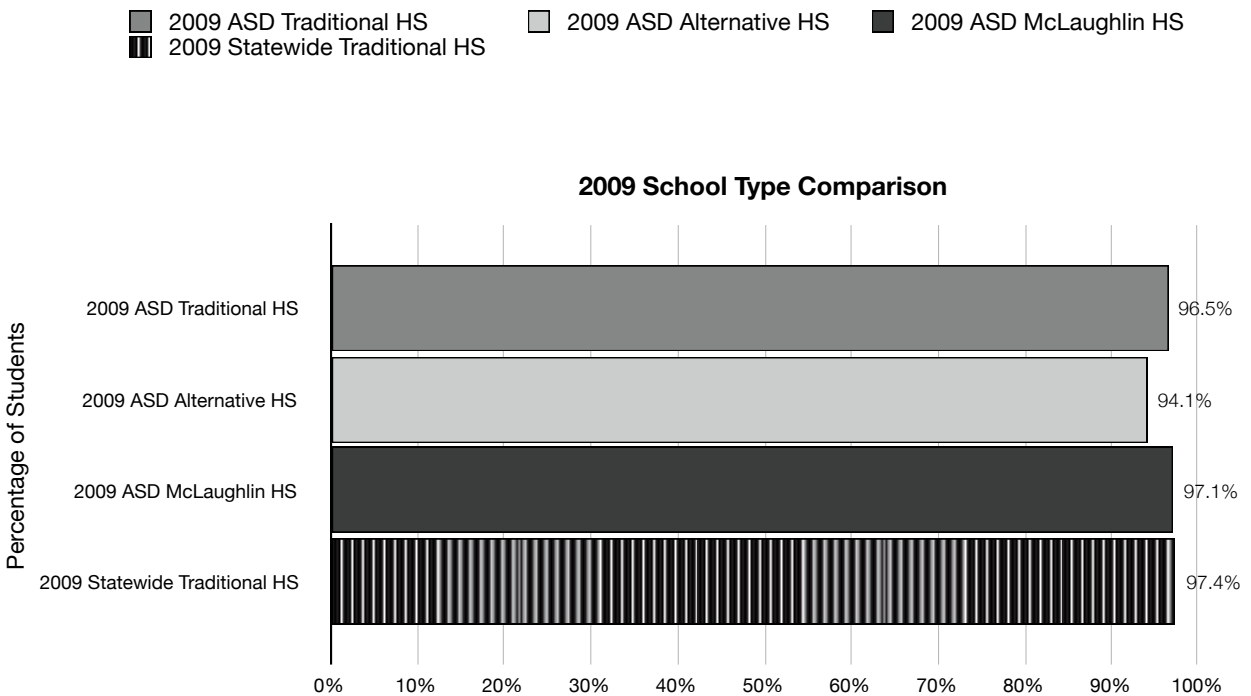

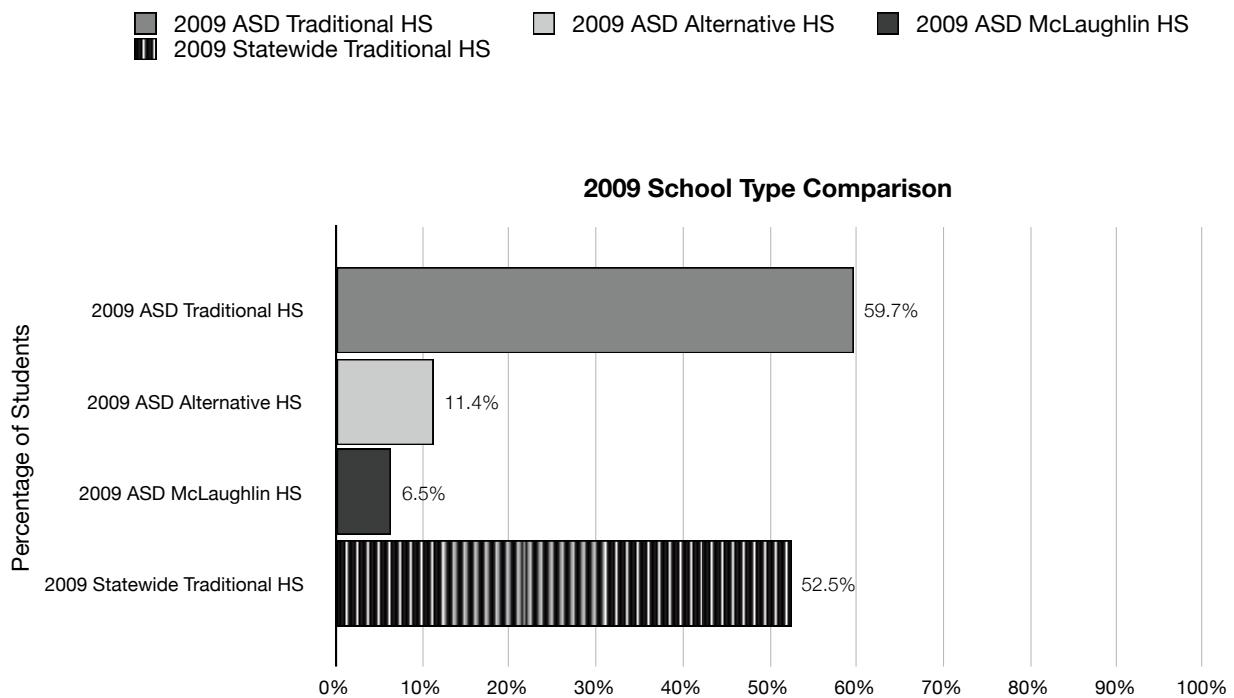

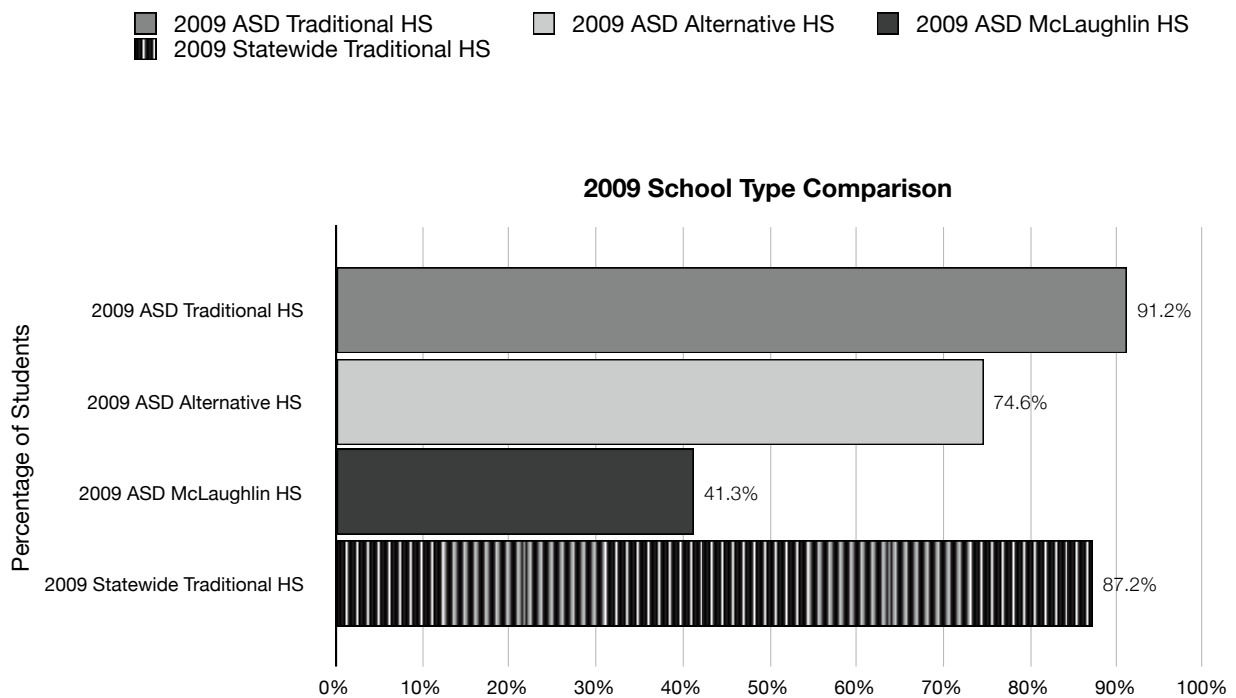

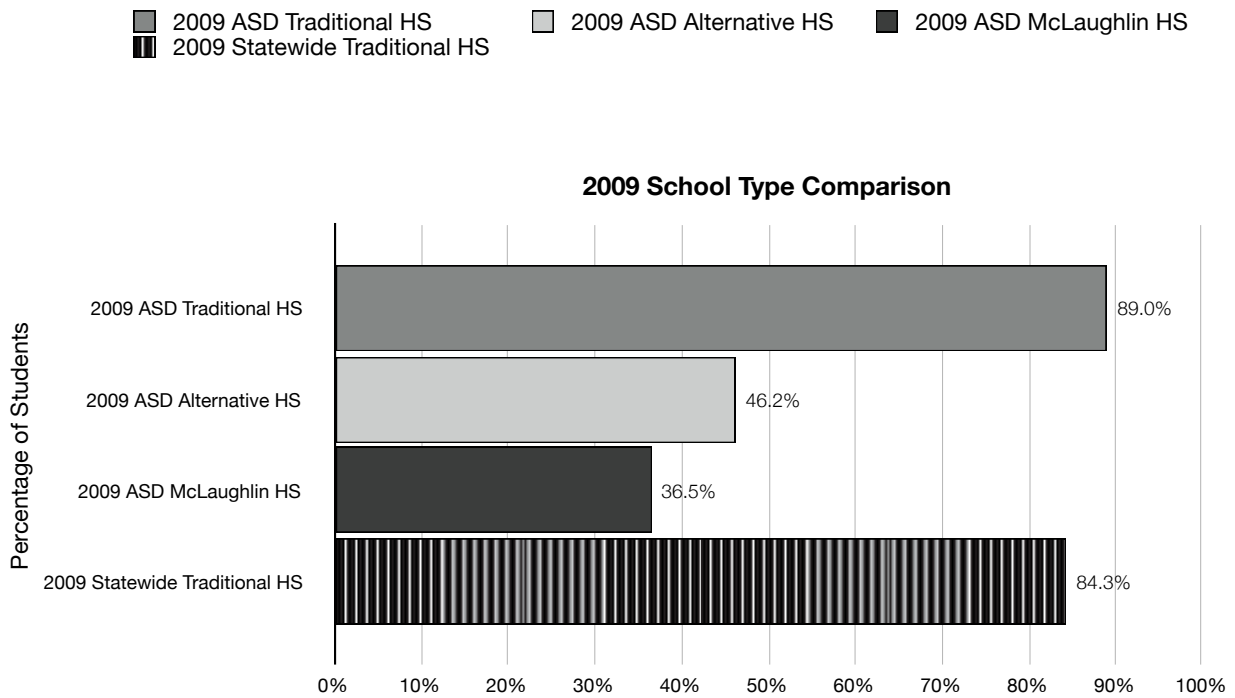

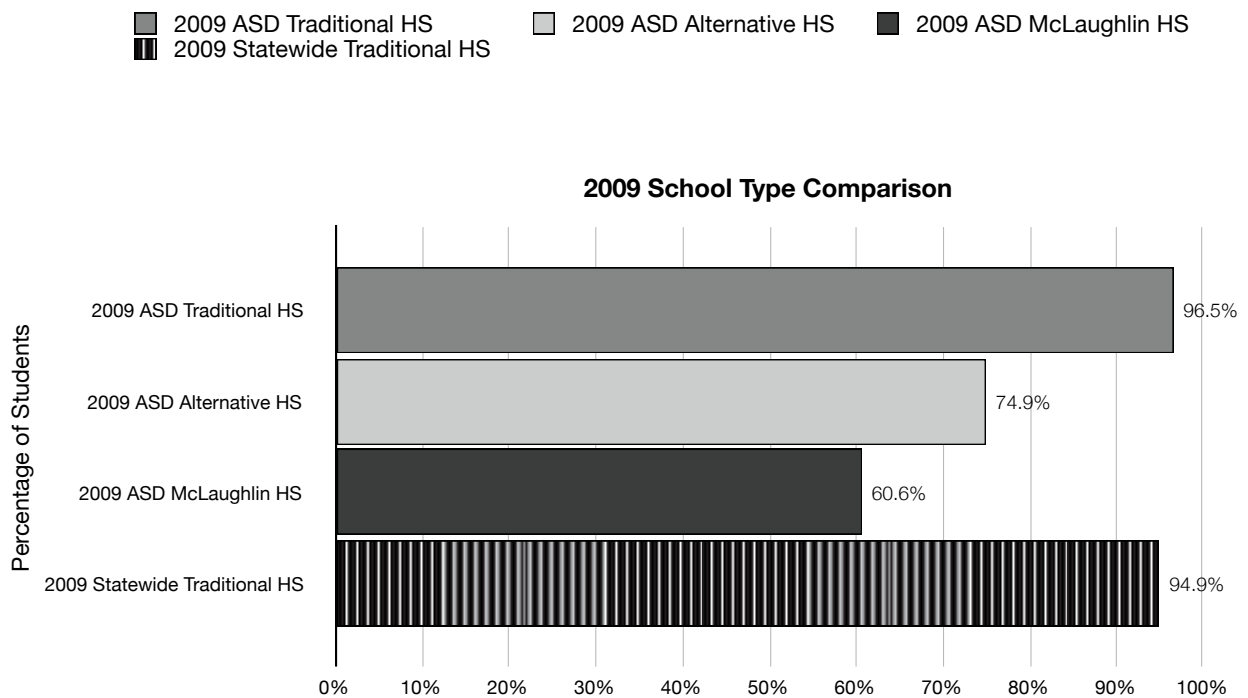

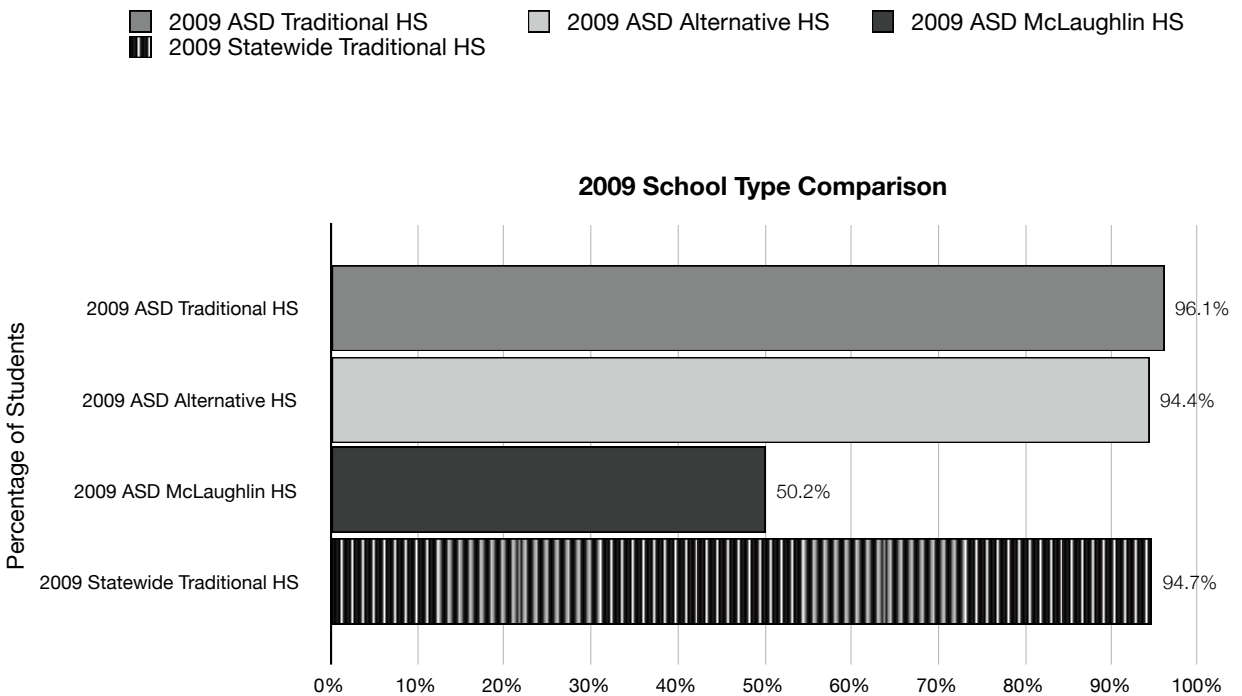

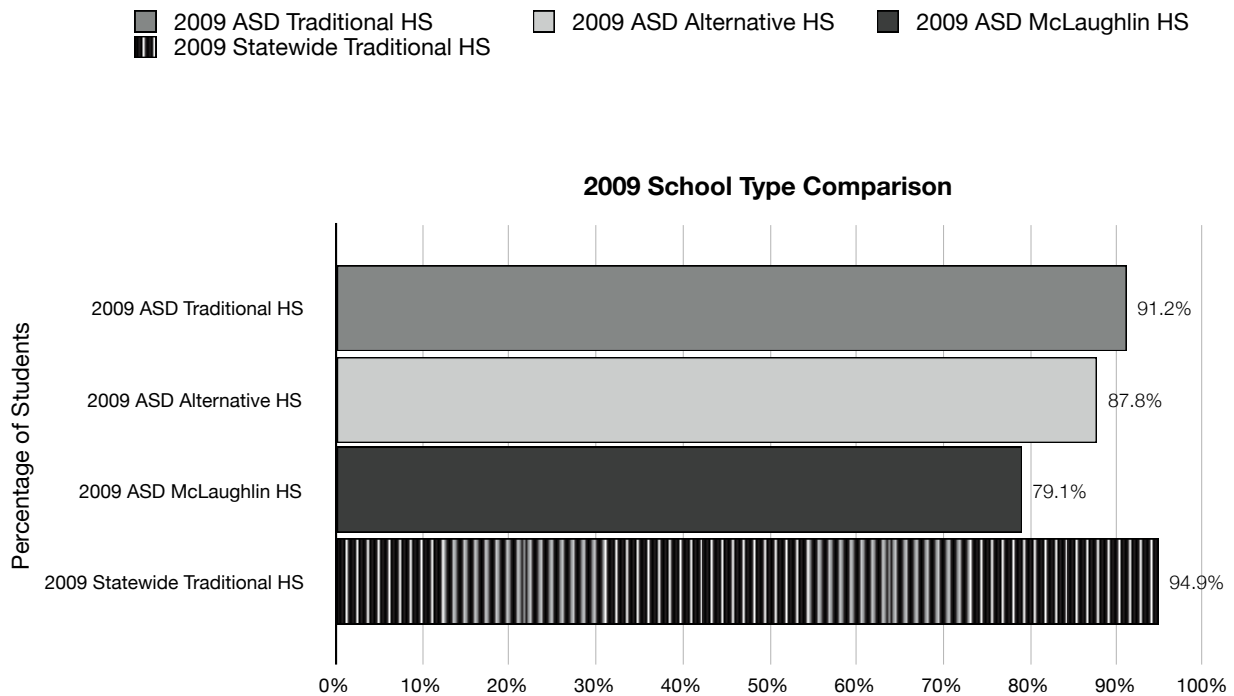

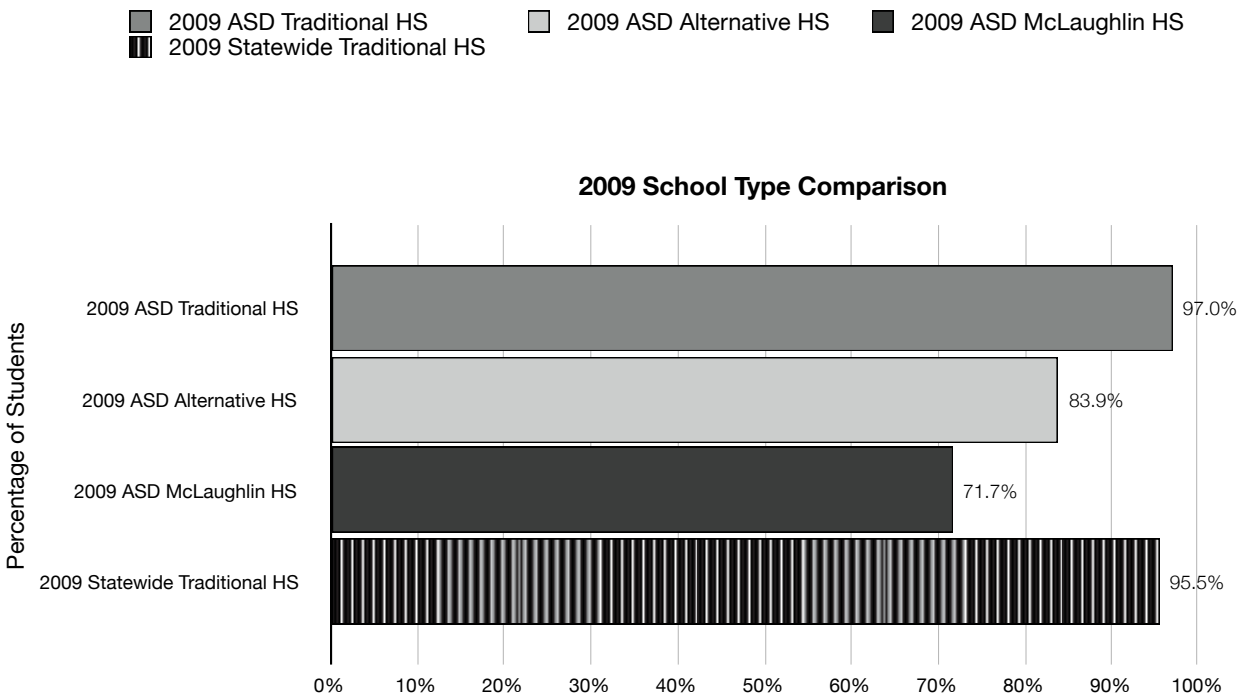

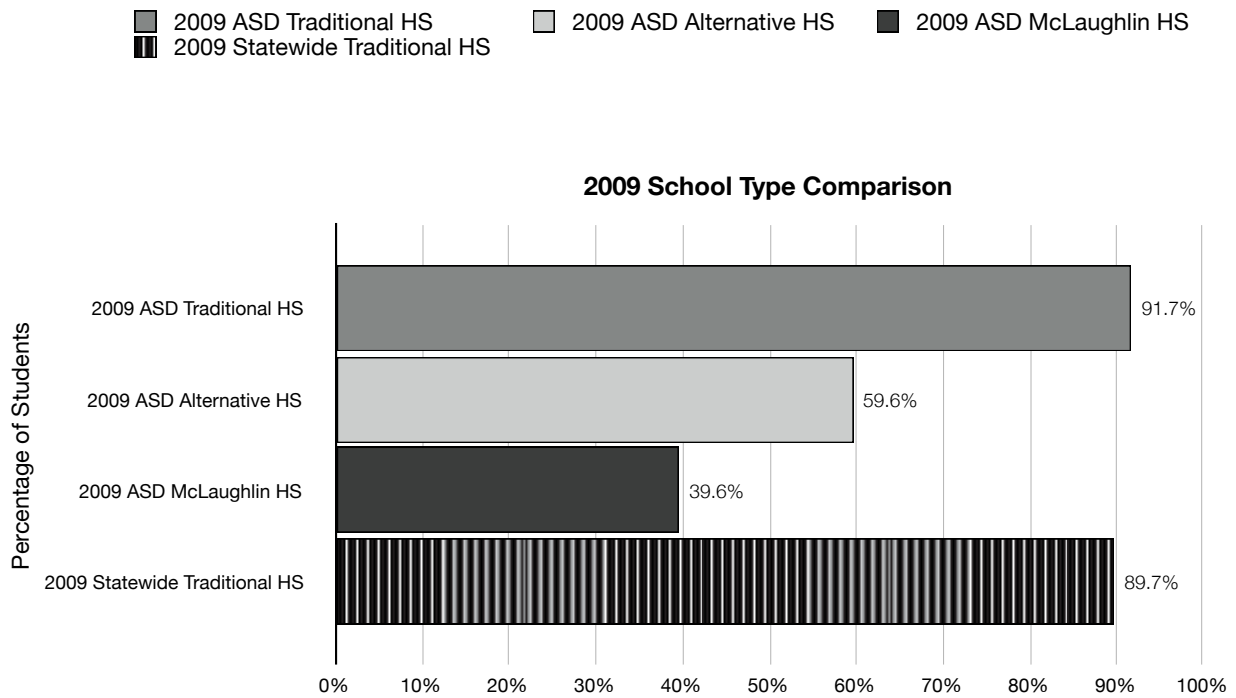

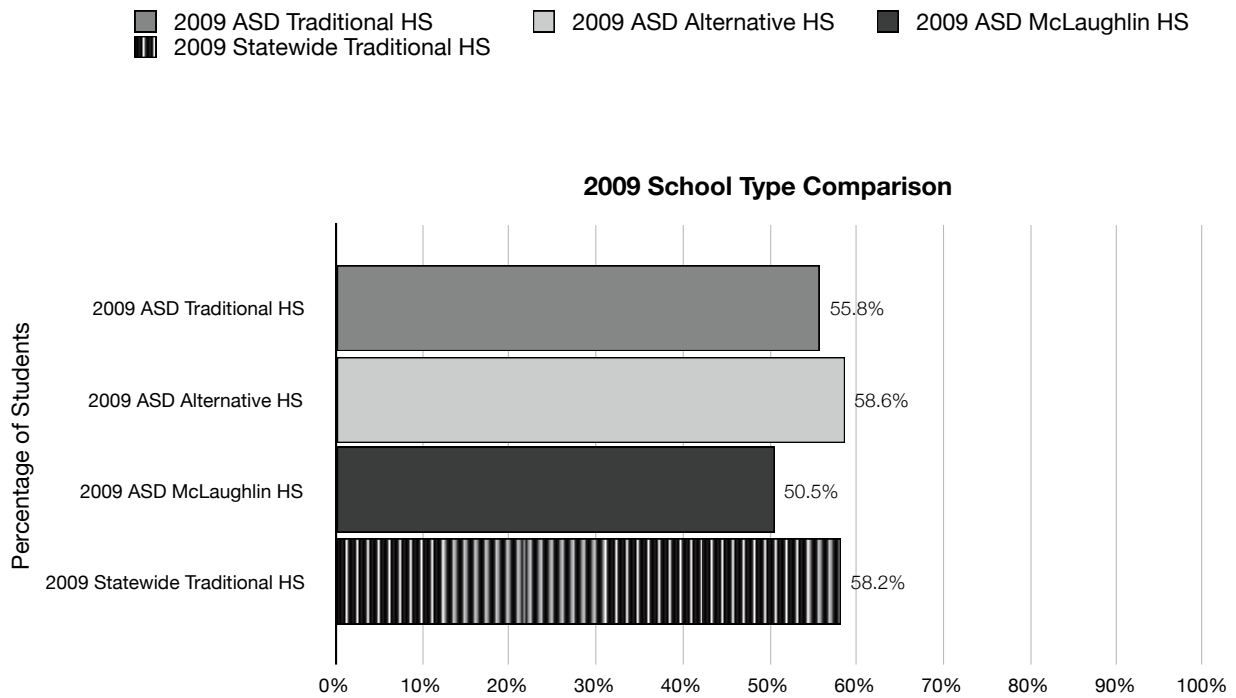

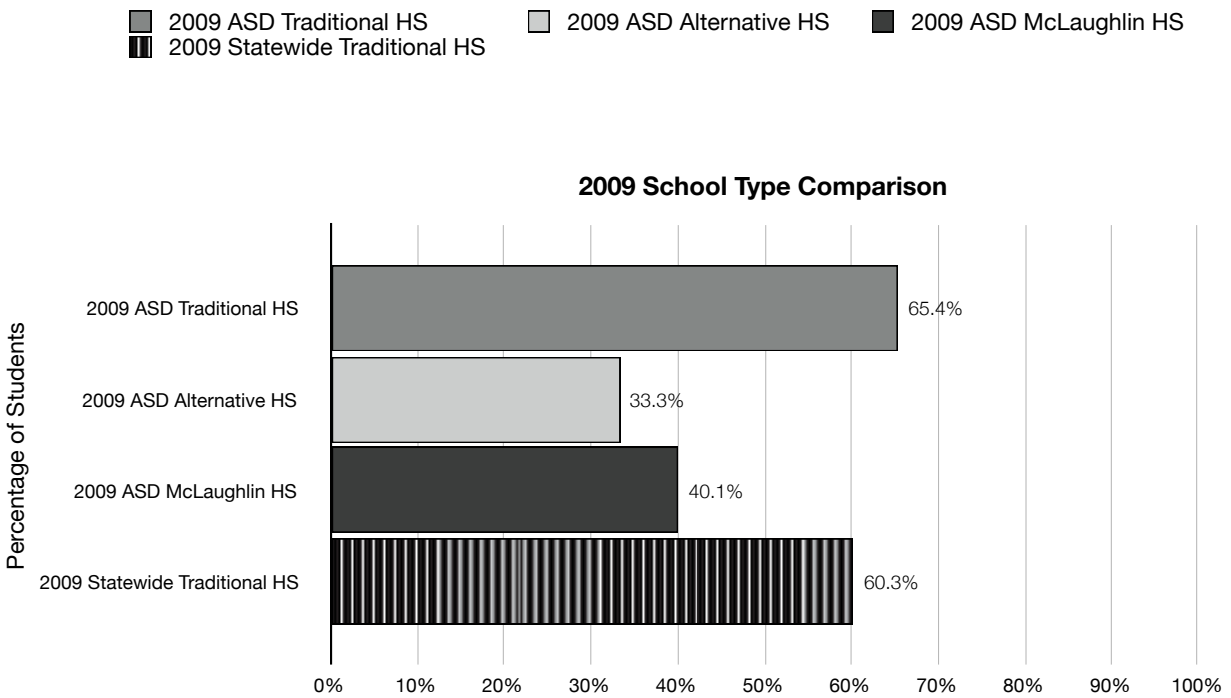

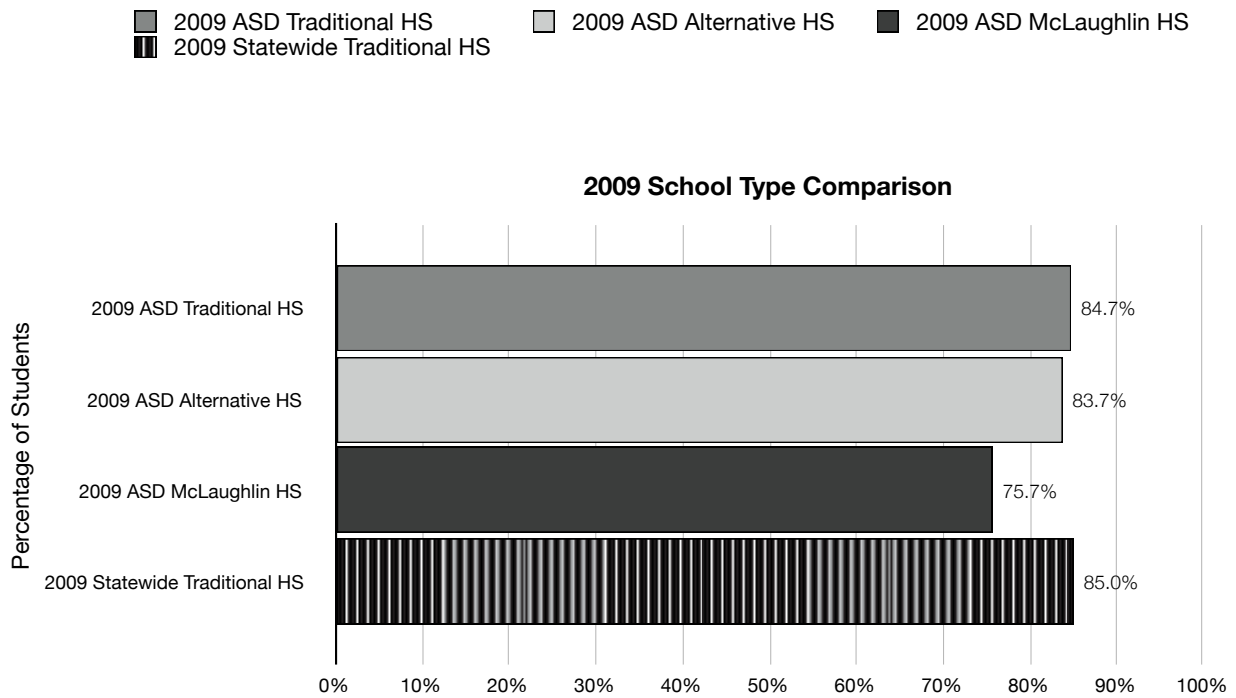

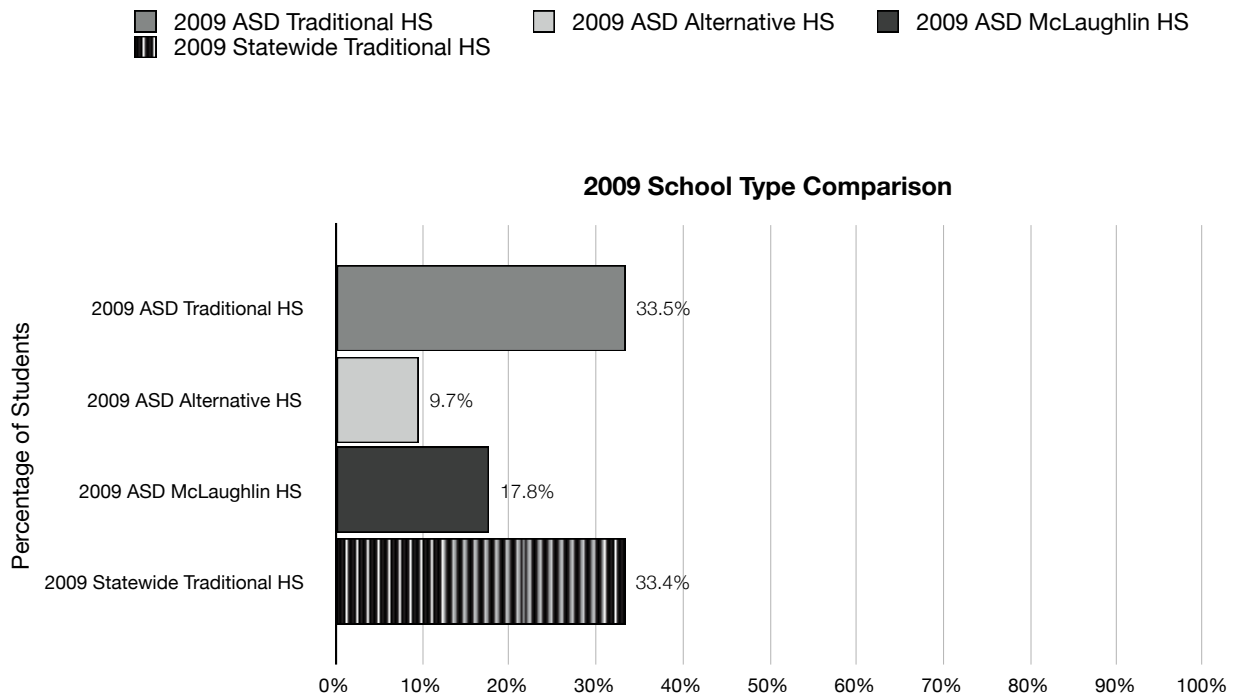

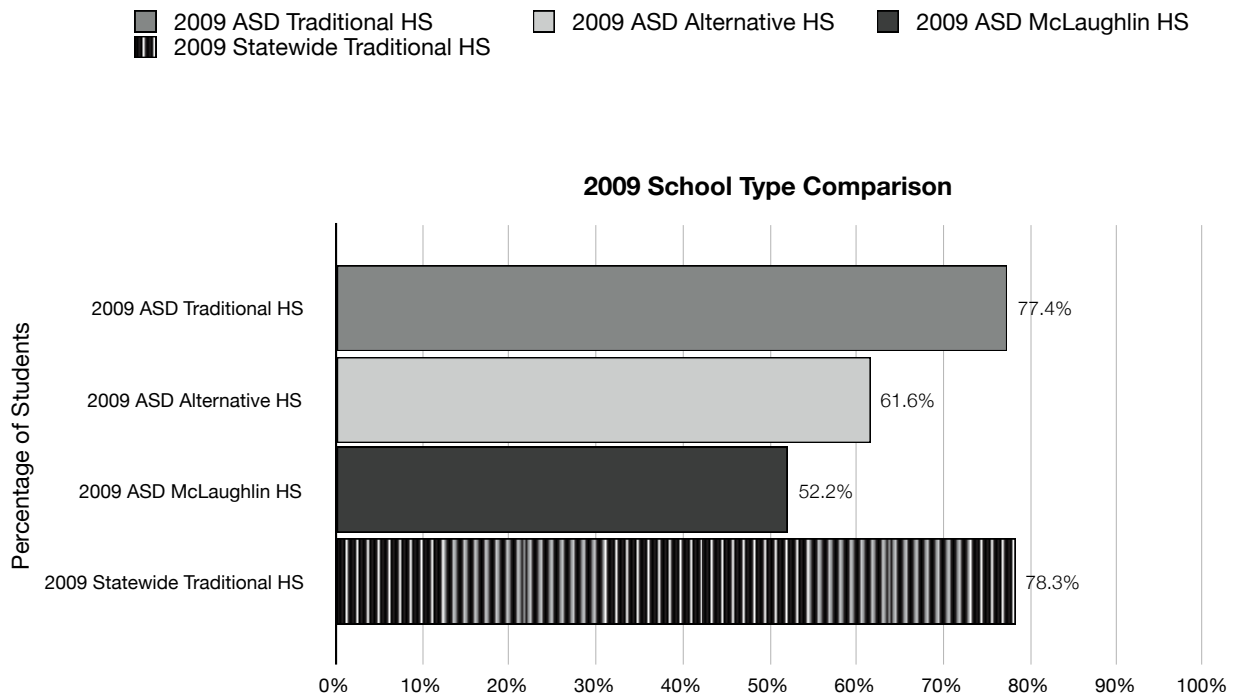

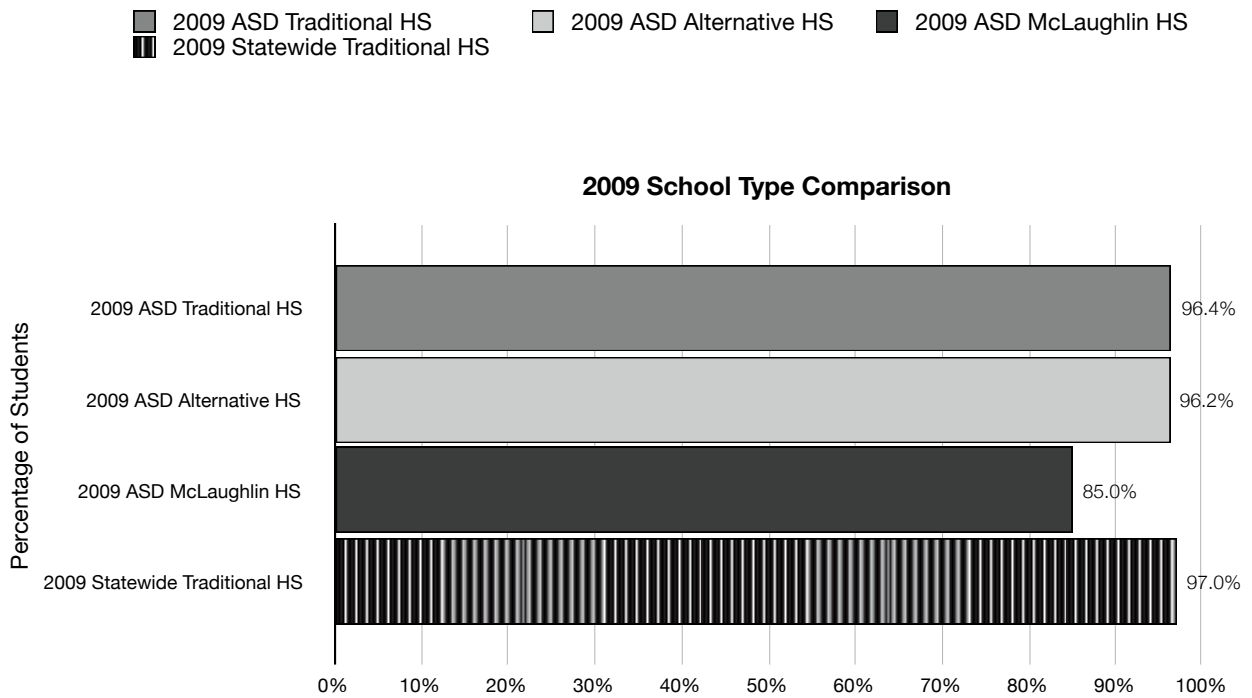

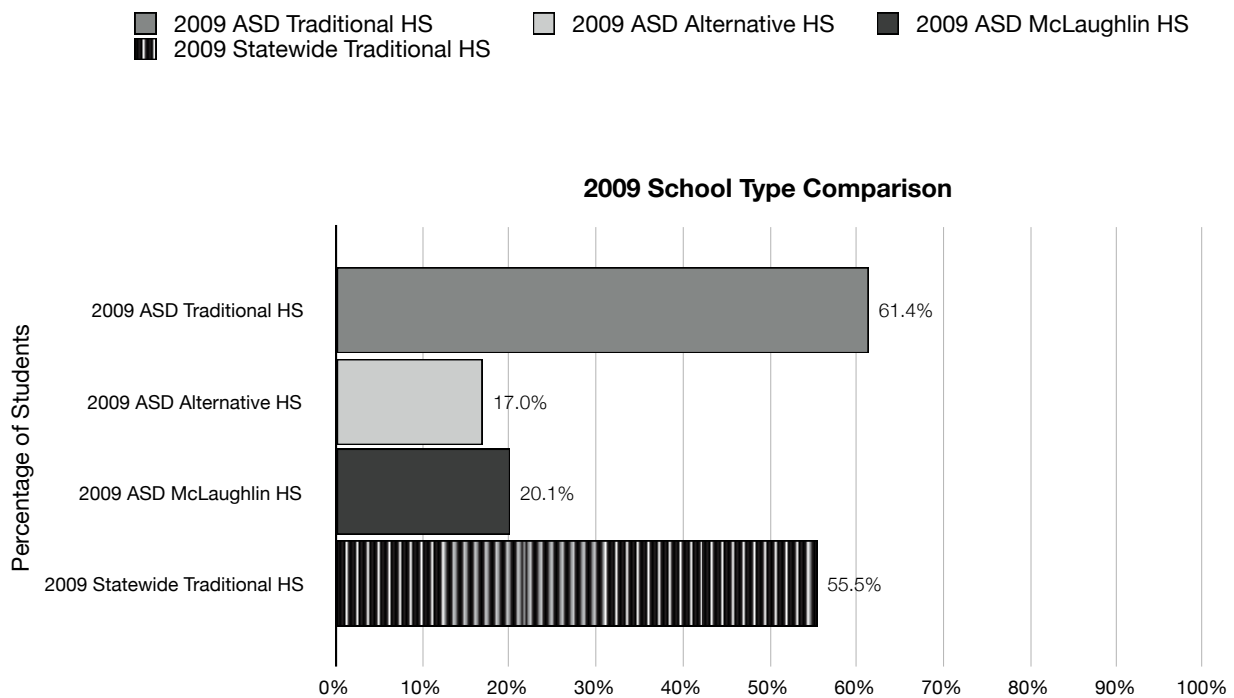

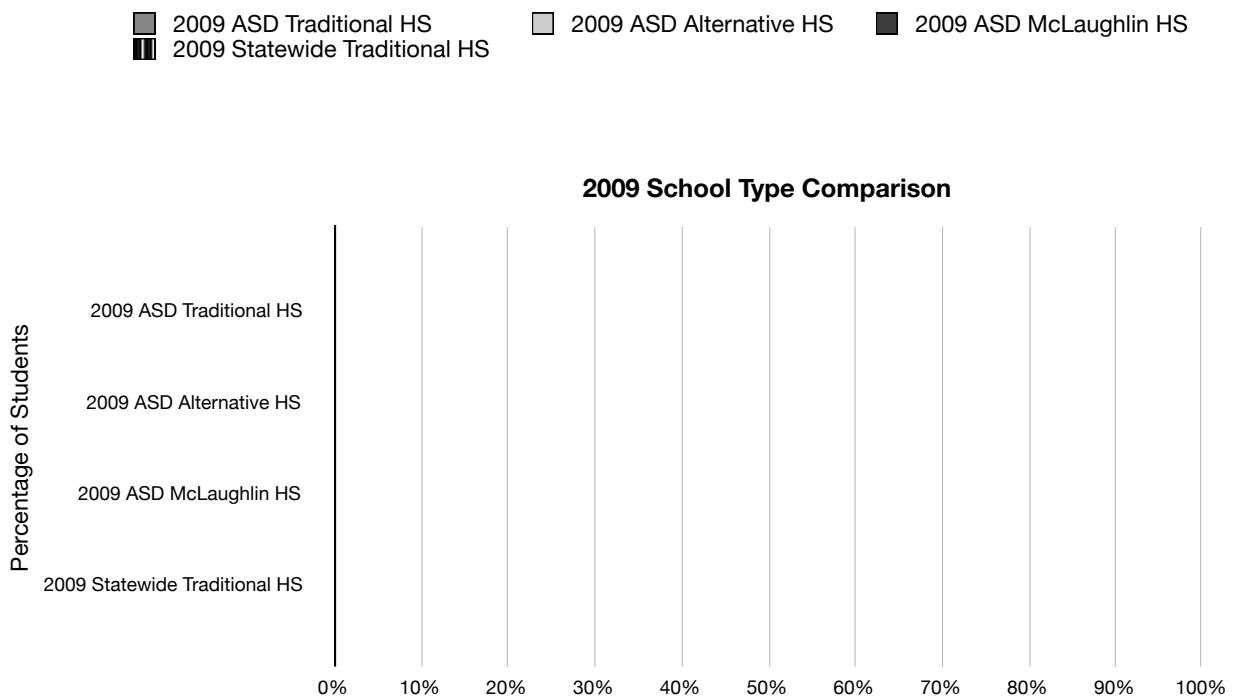

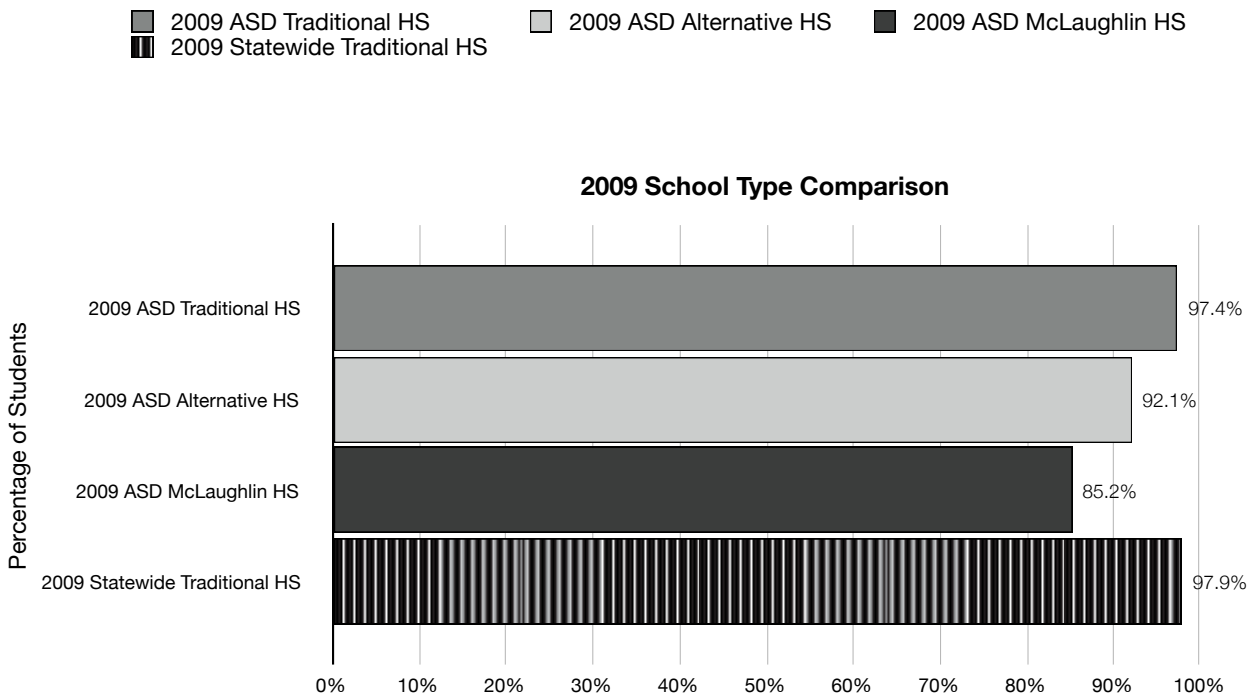

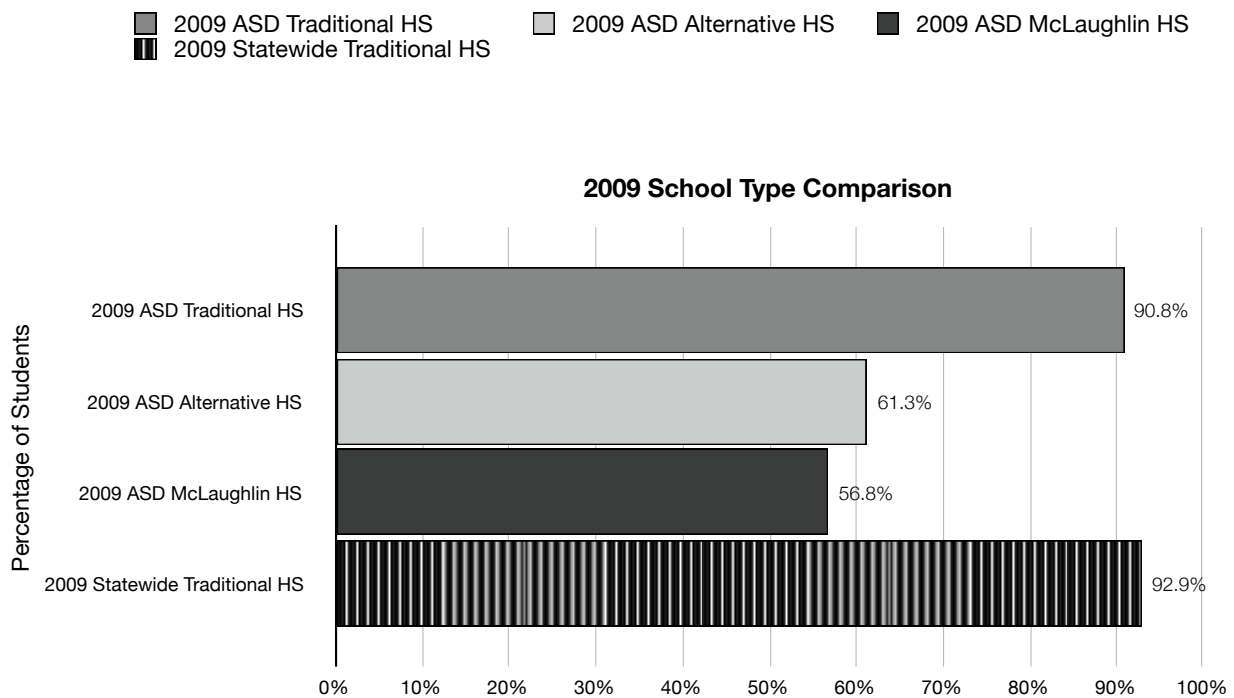

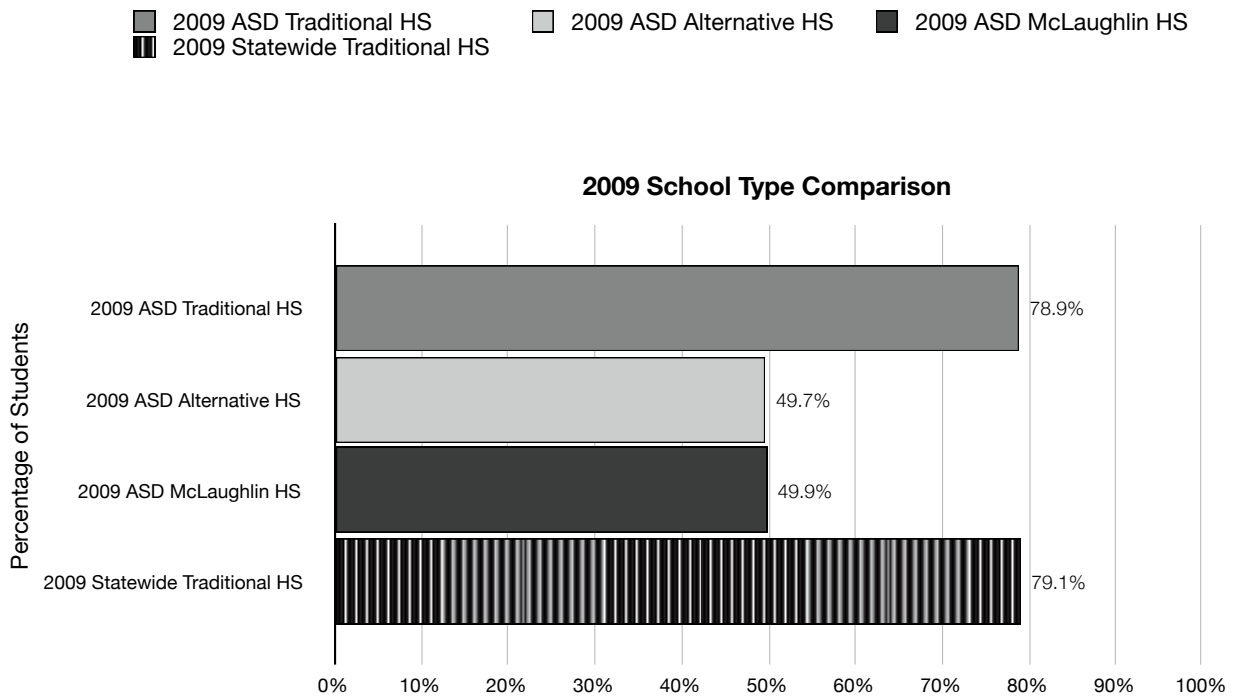

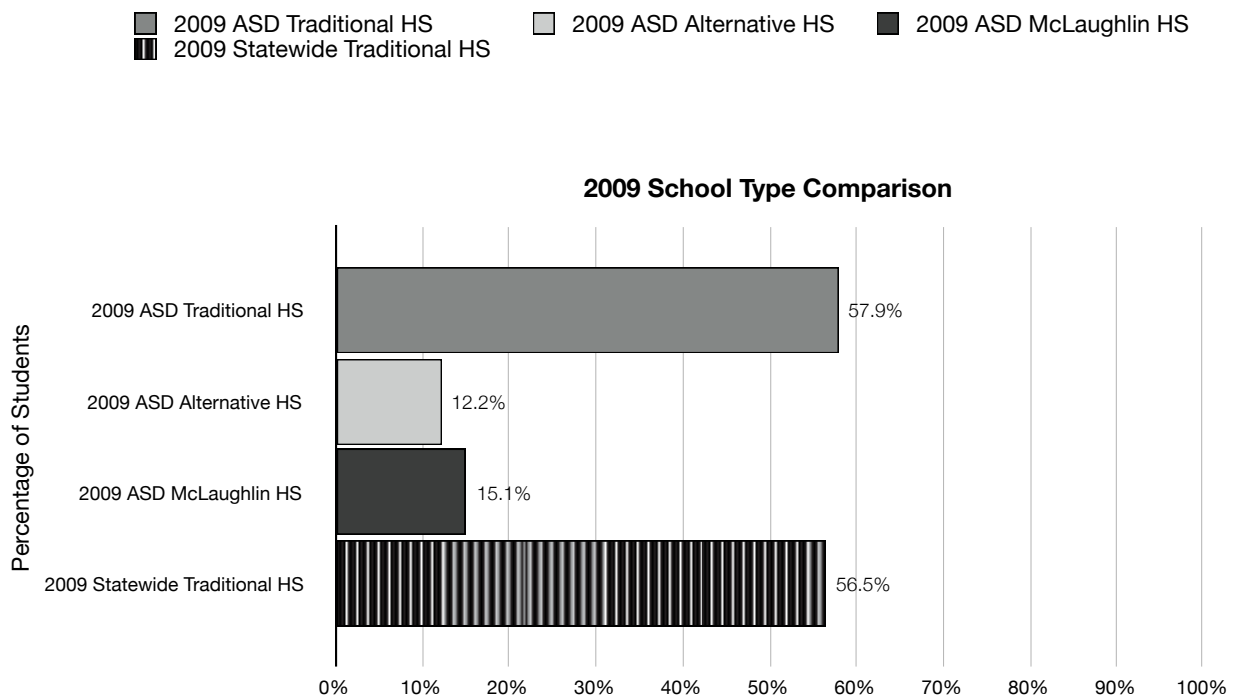

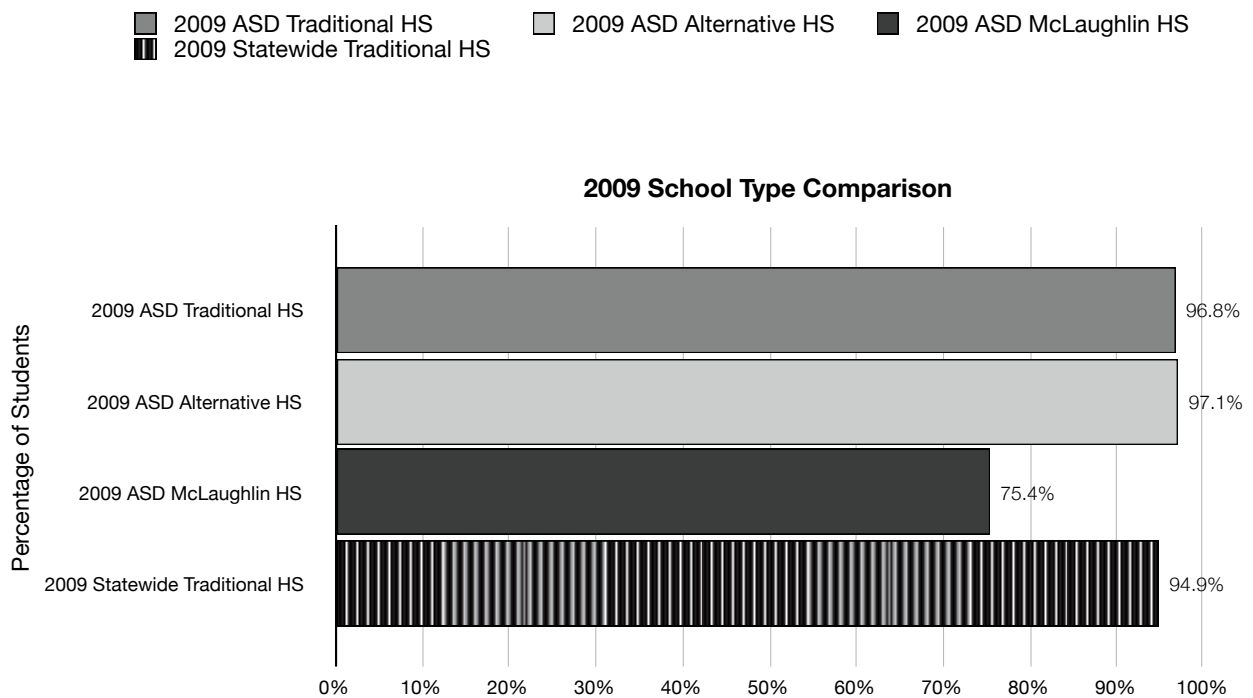

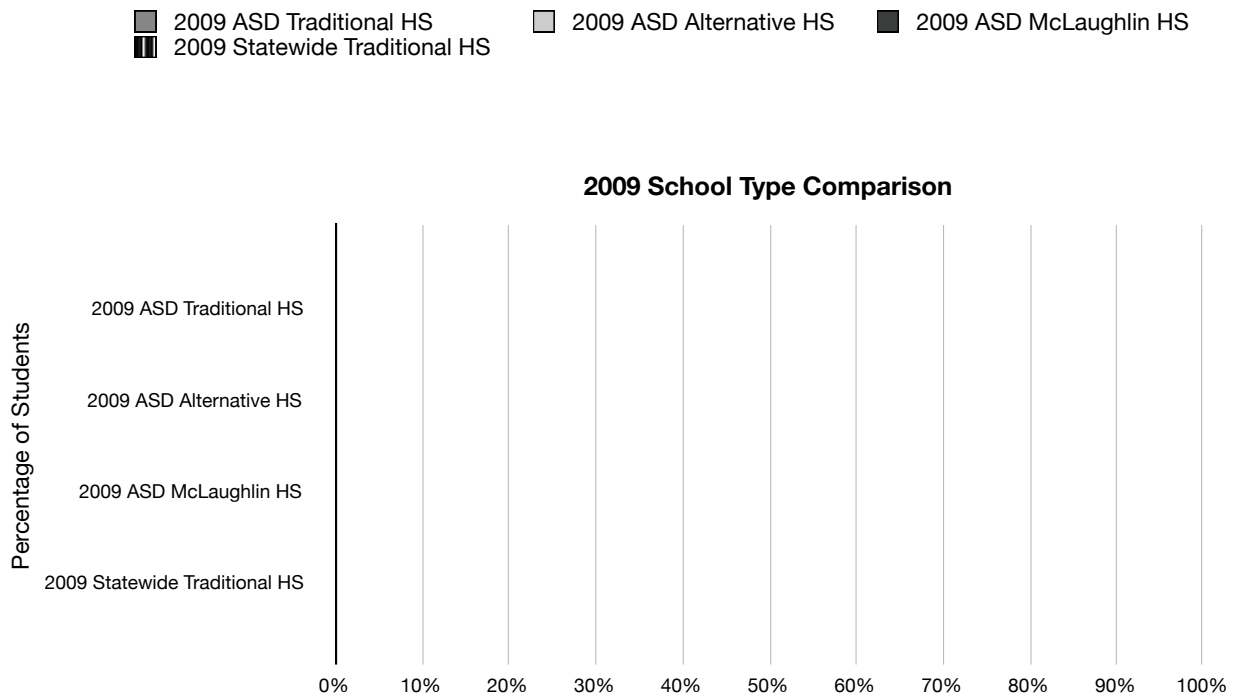
Question 65: During your life, with how many people have you had sexual intercourse?

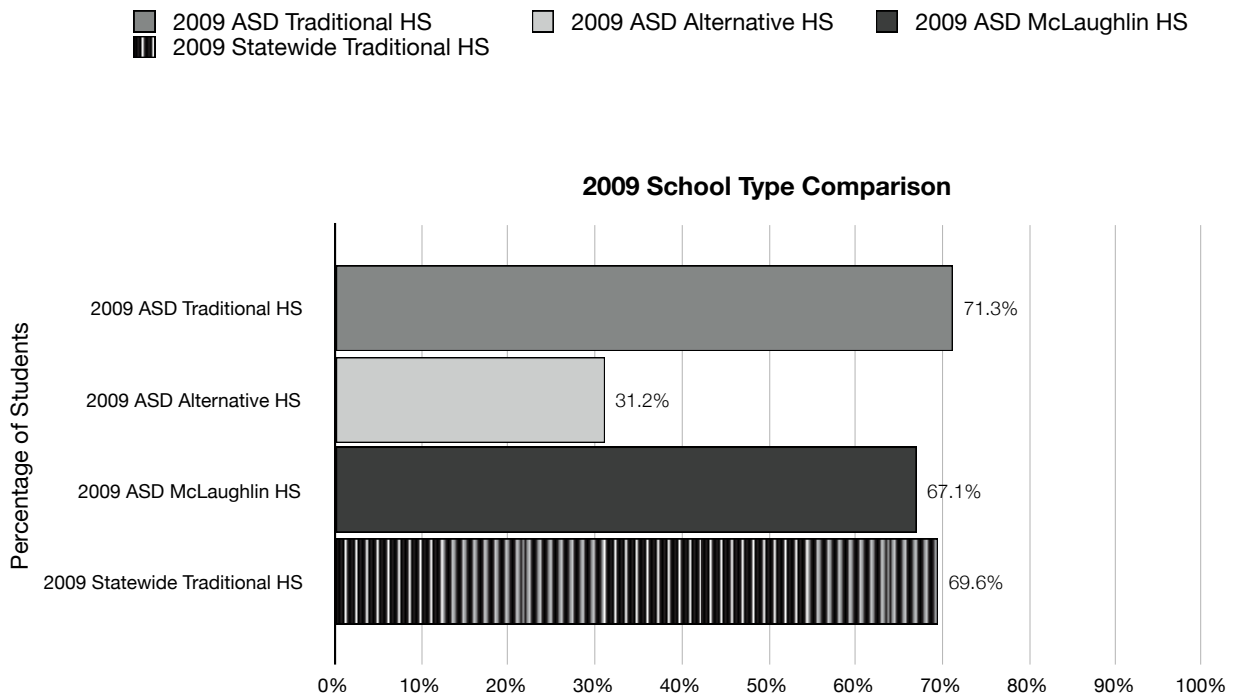

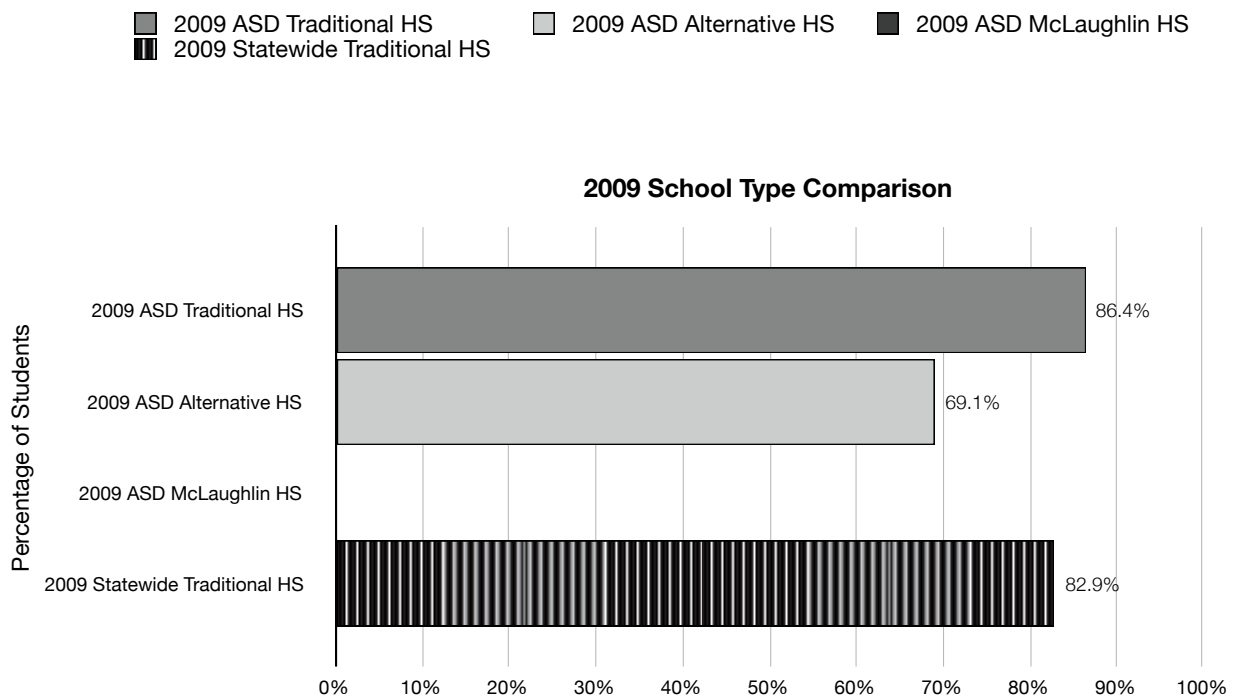

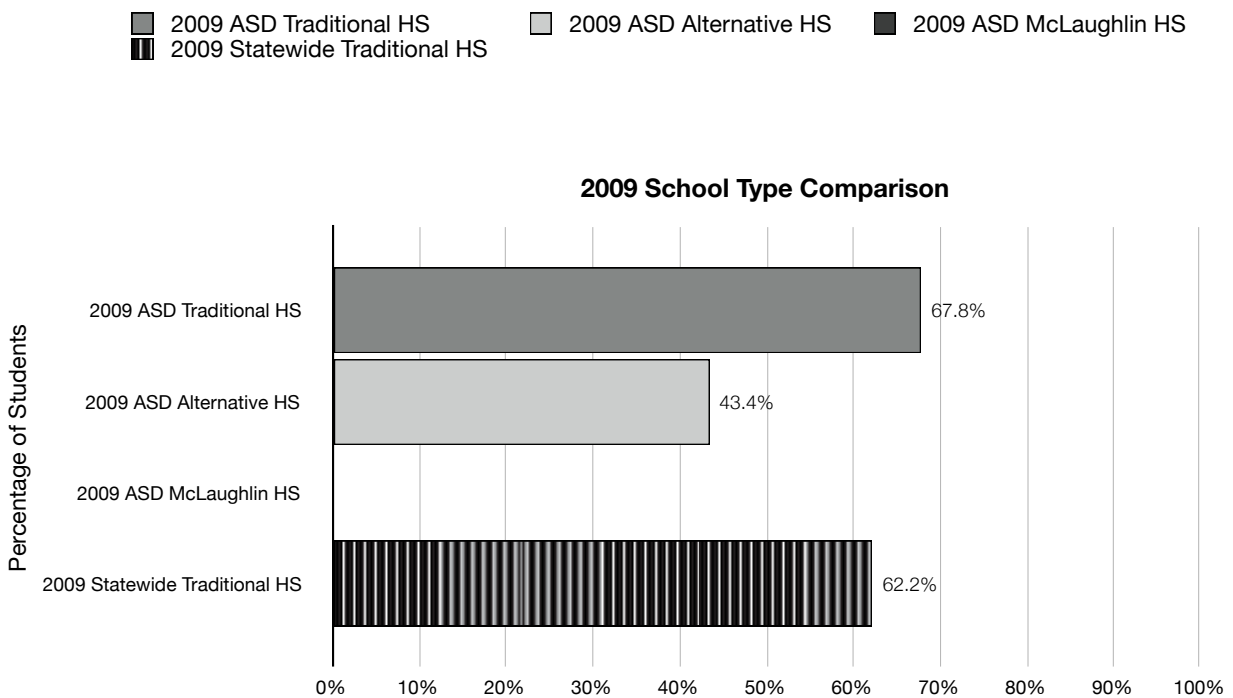

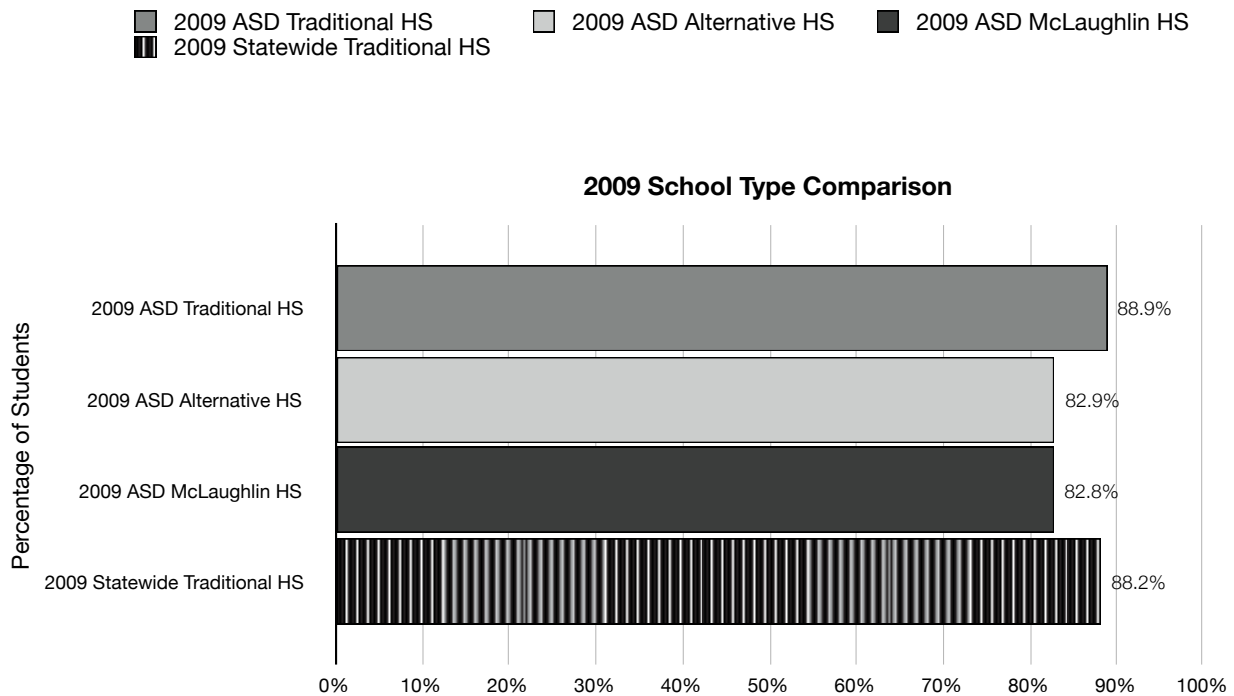

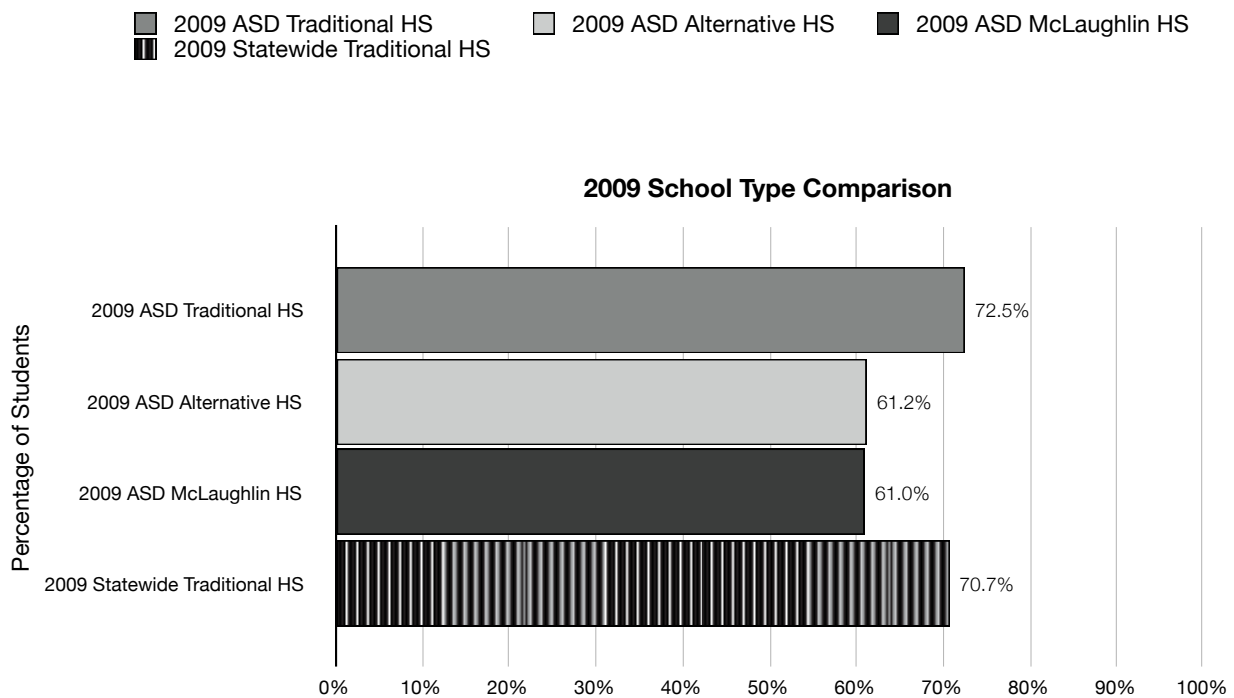

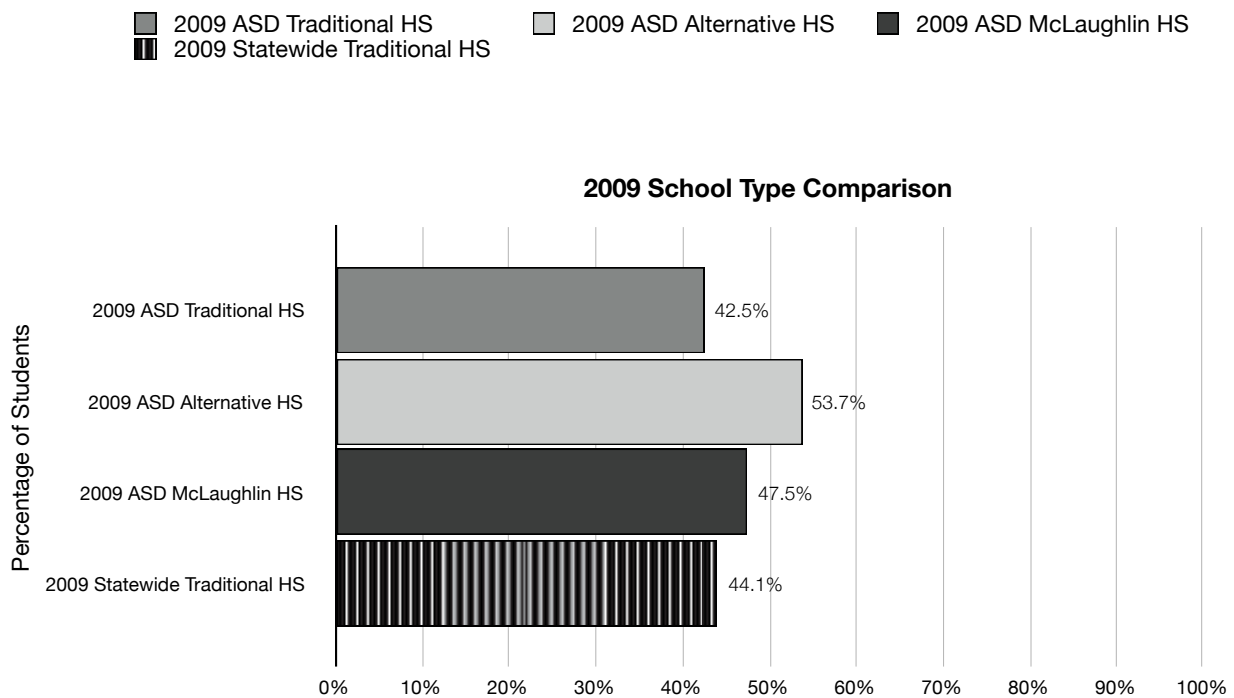

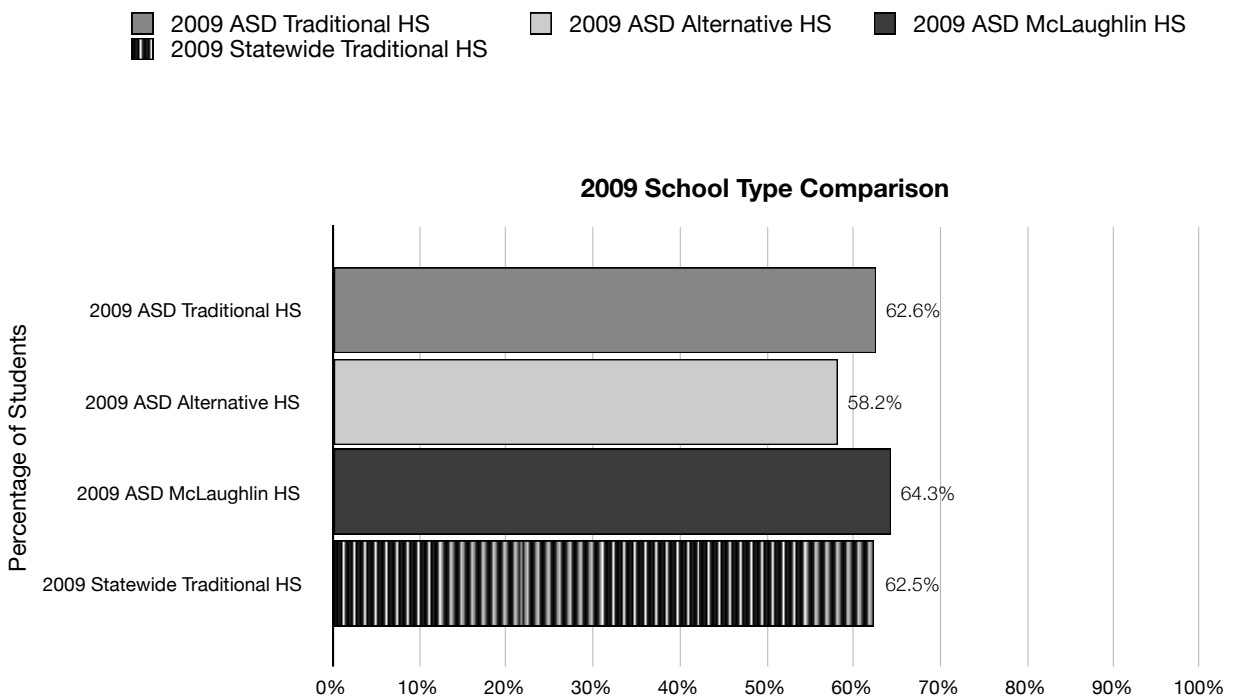

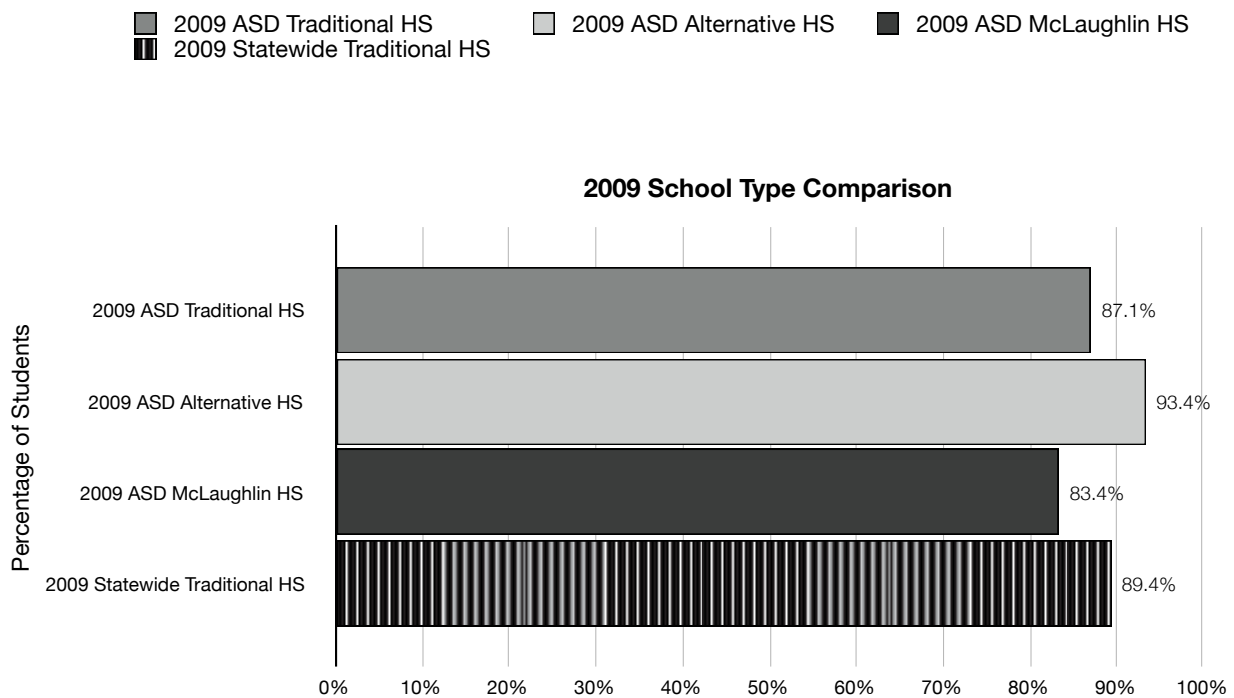

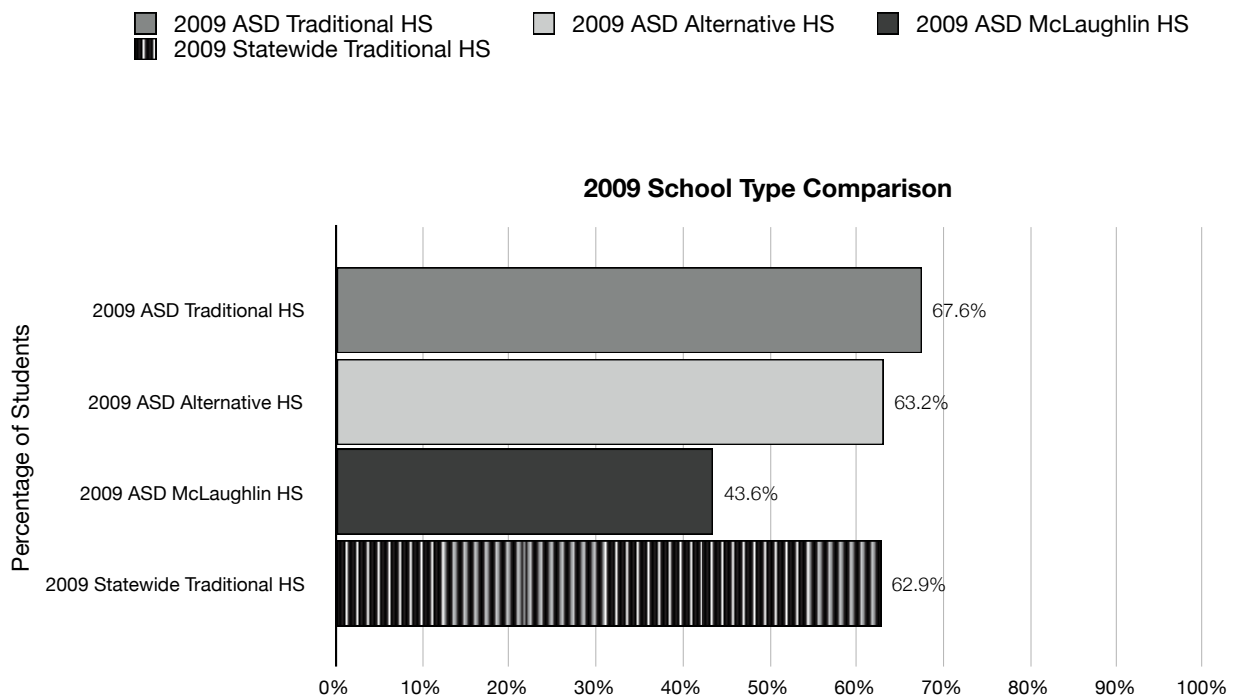

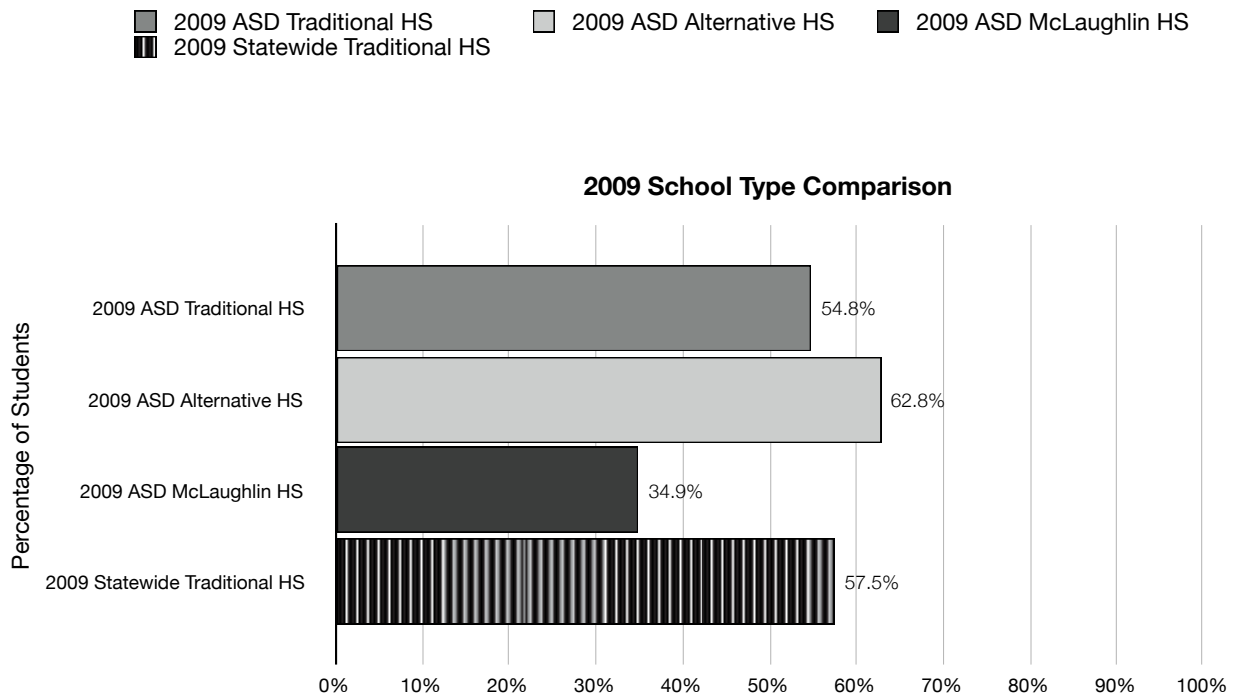

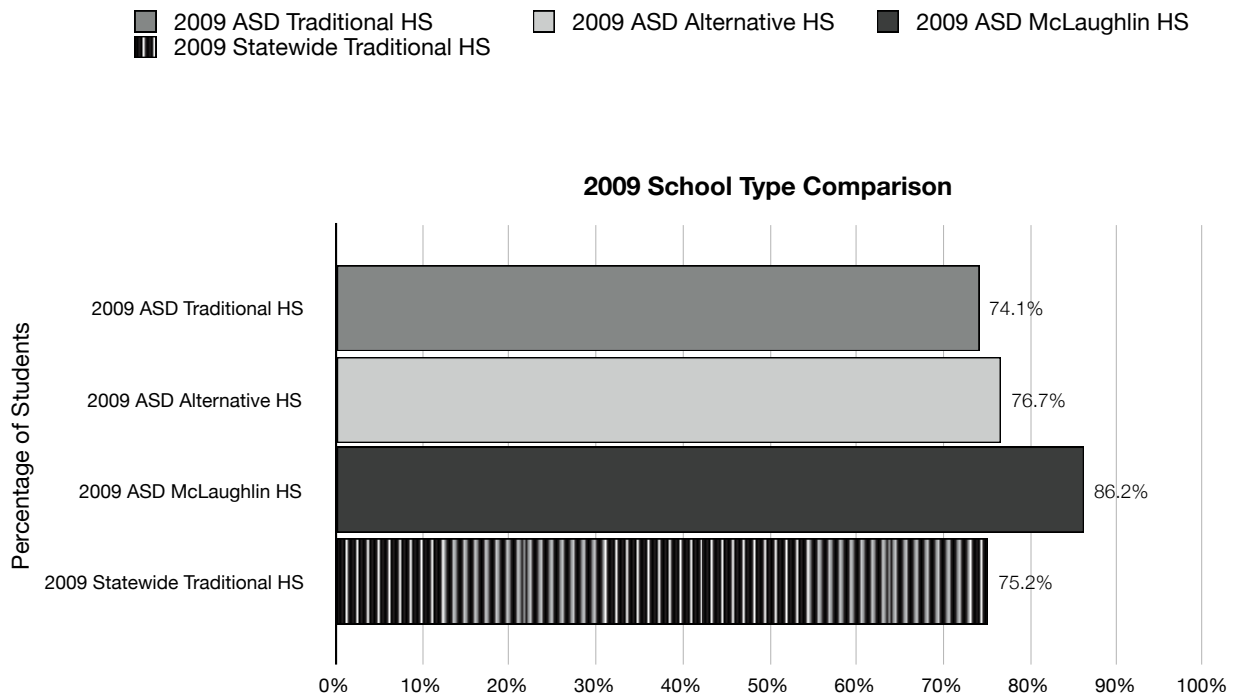

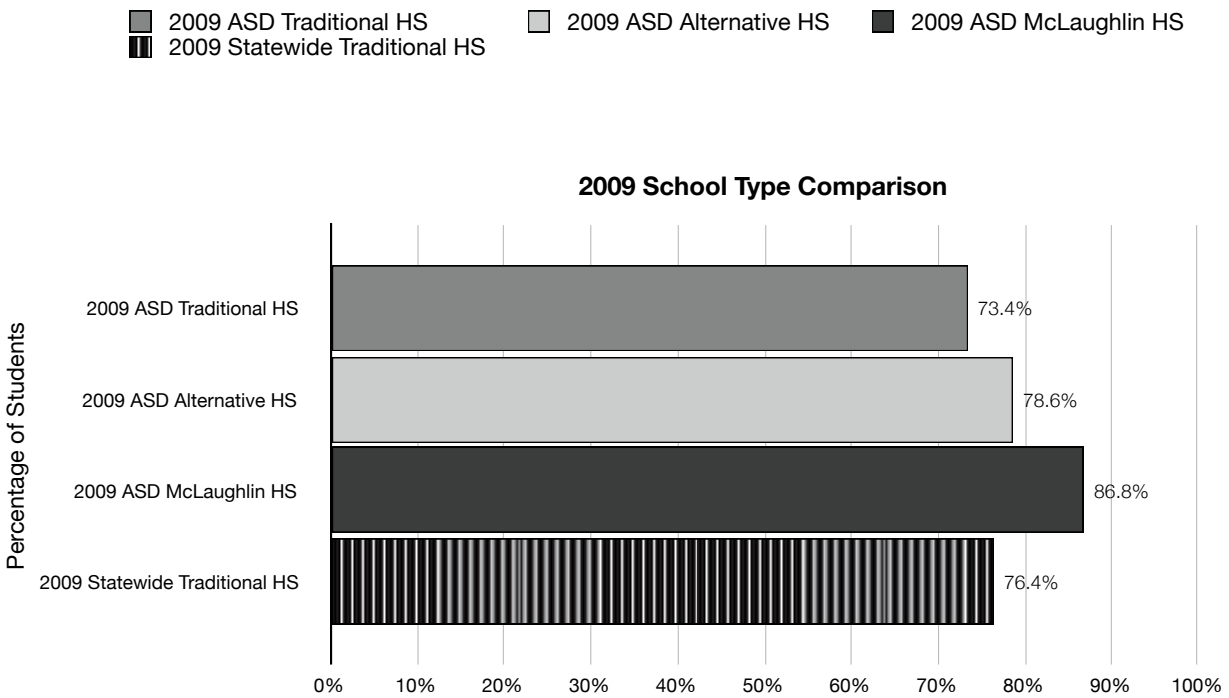

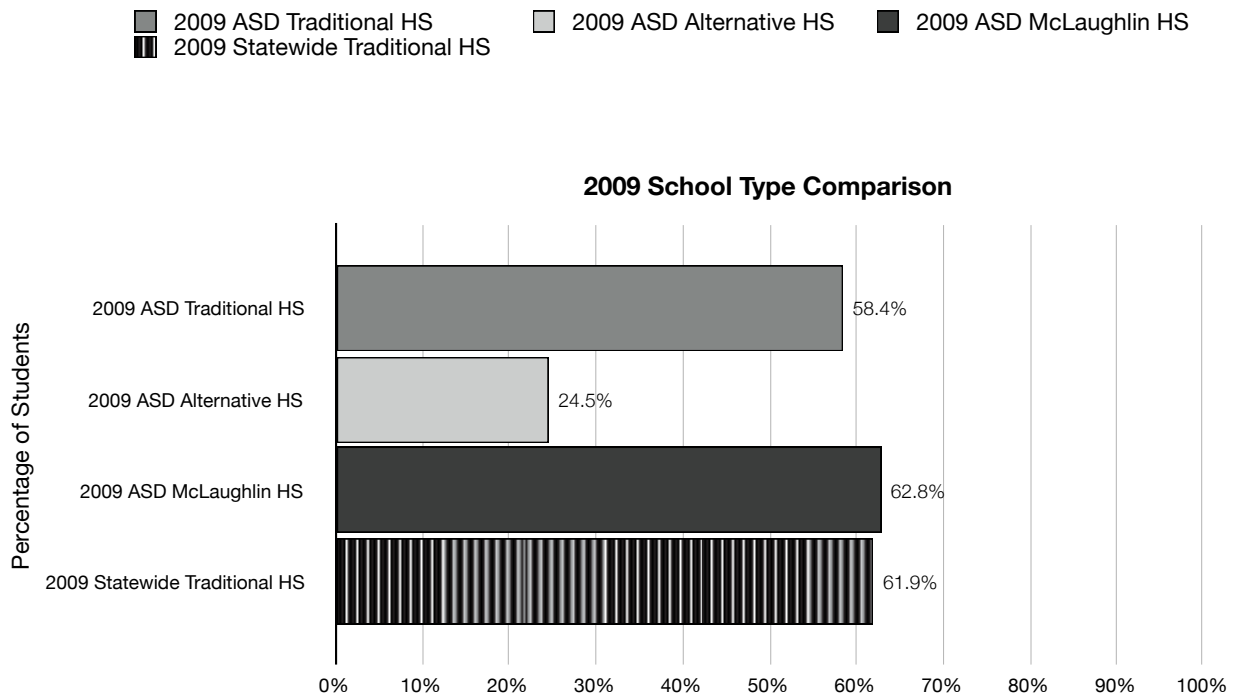

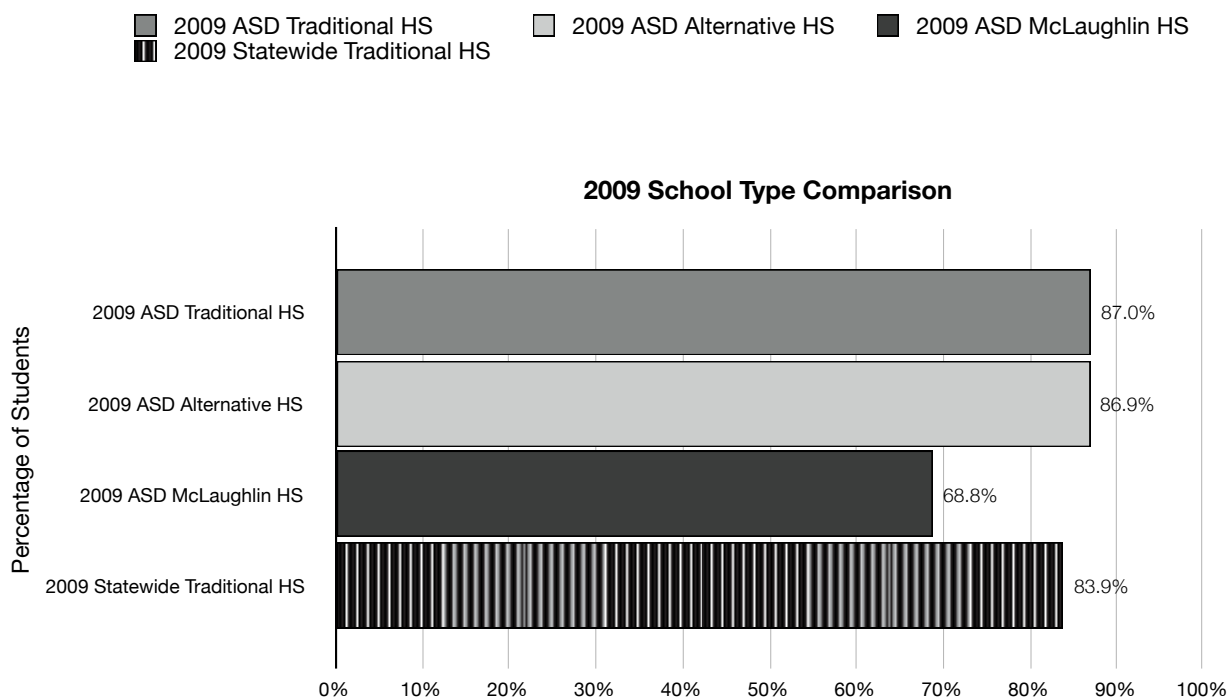

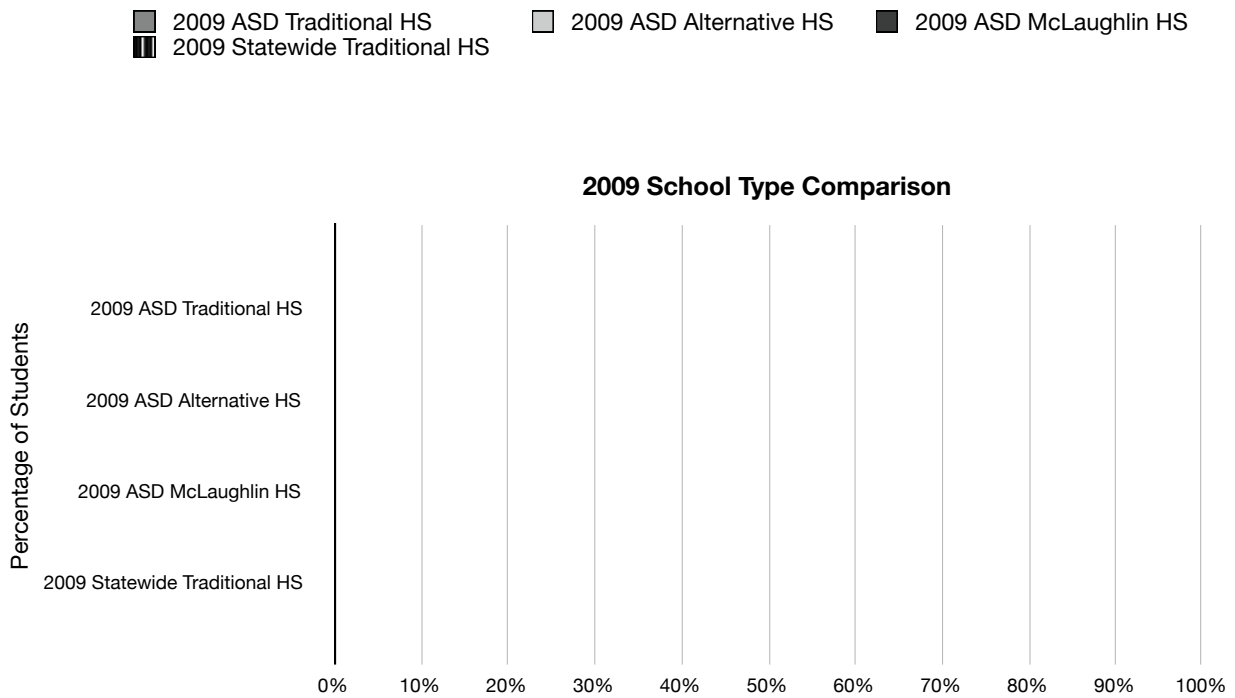

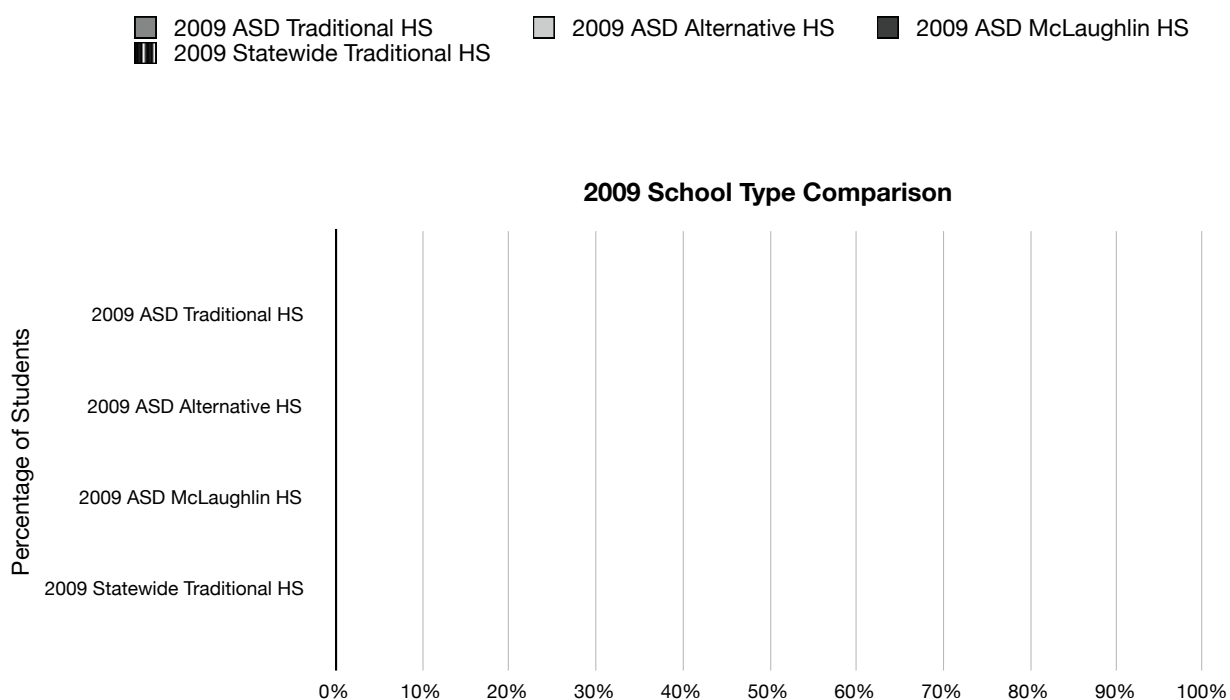

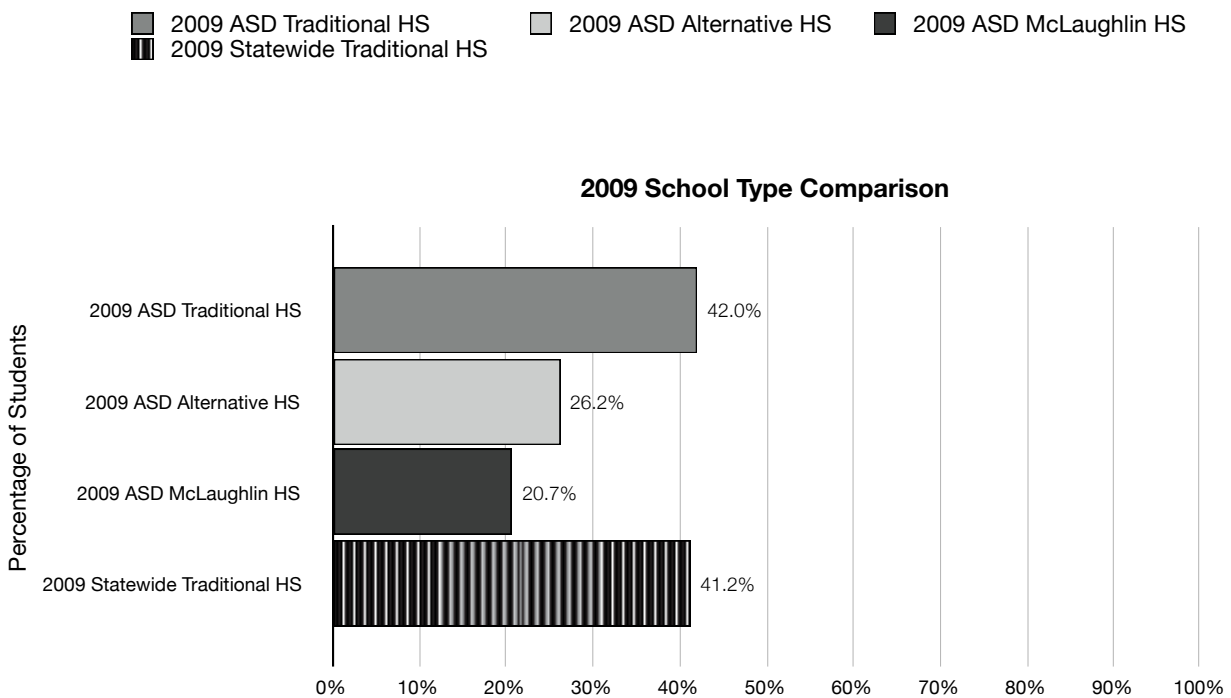

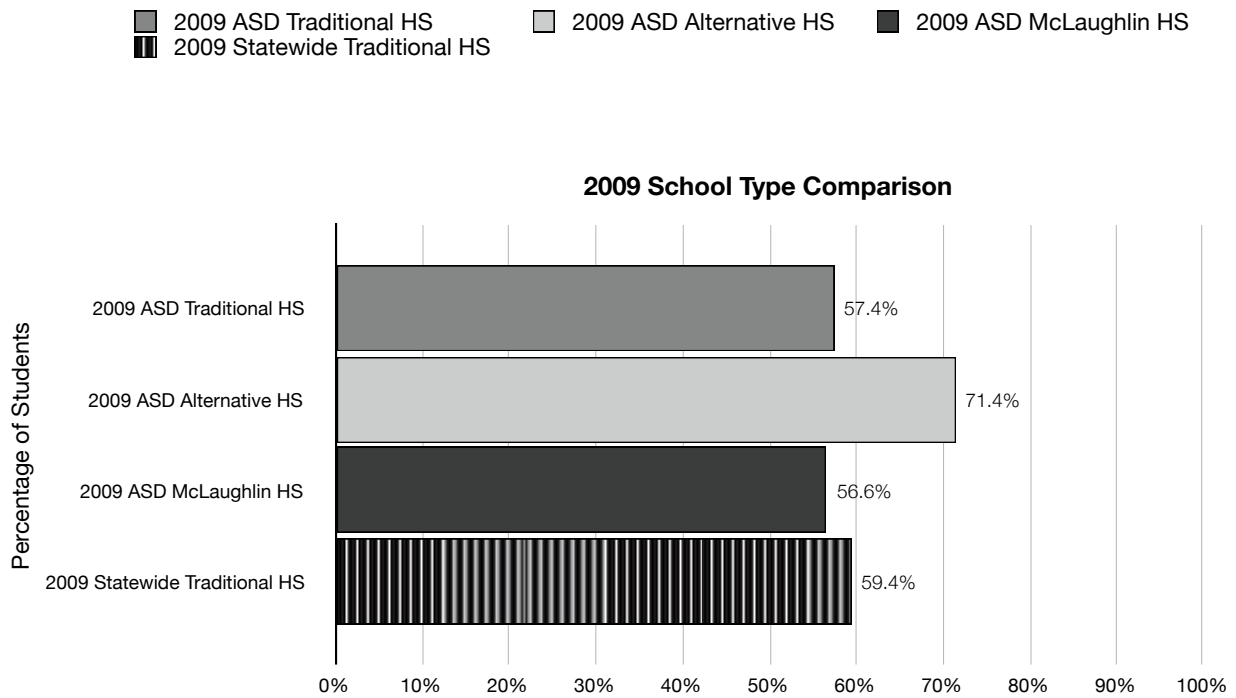

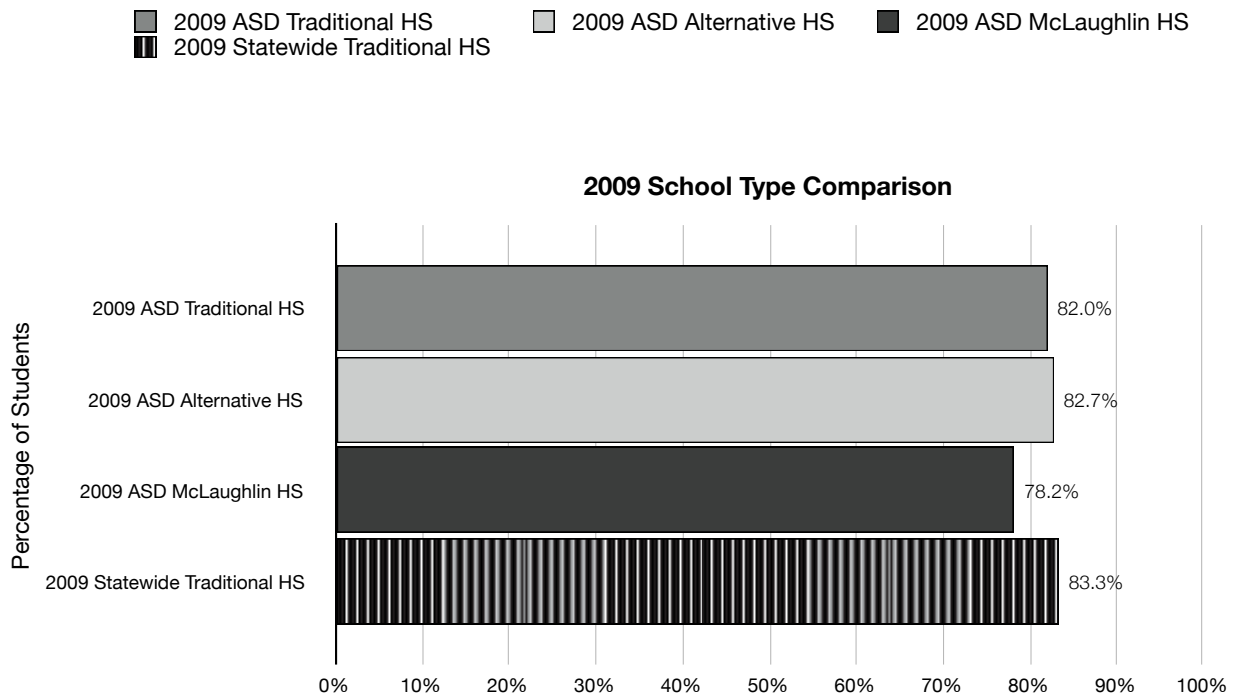

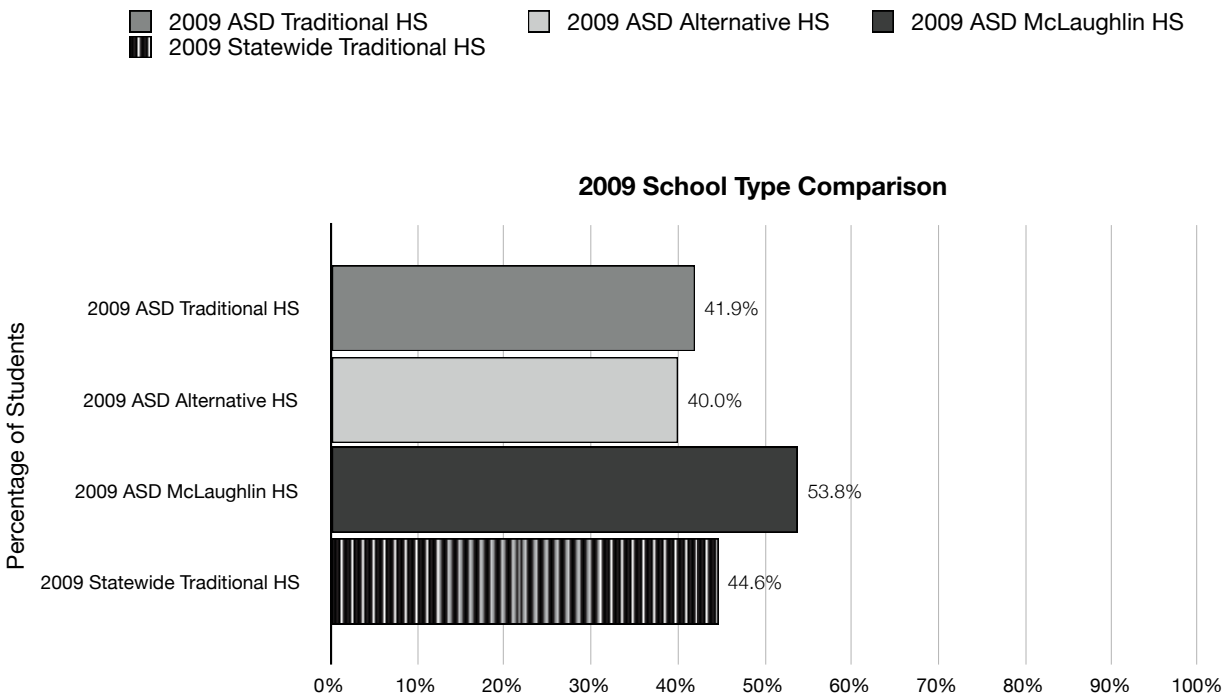

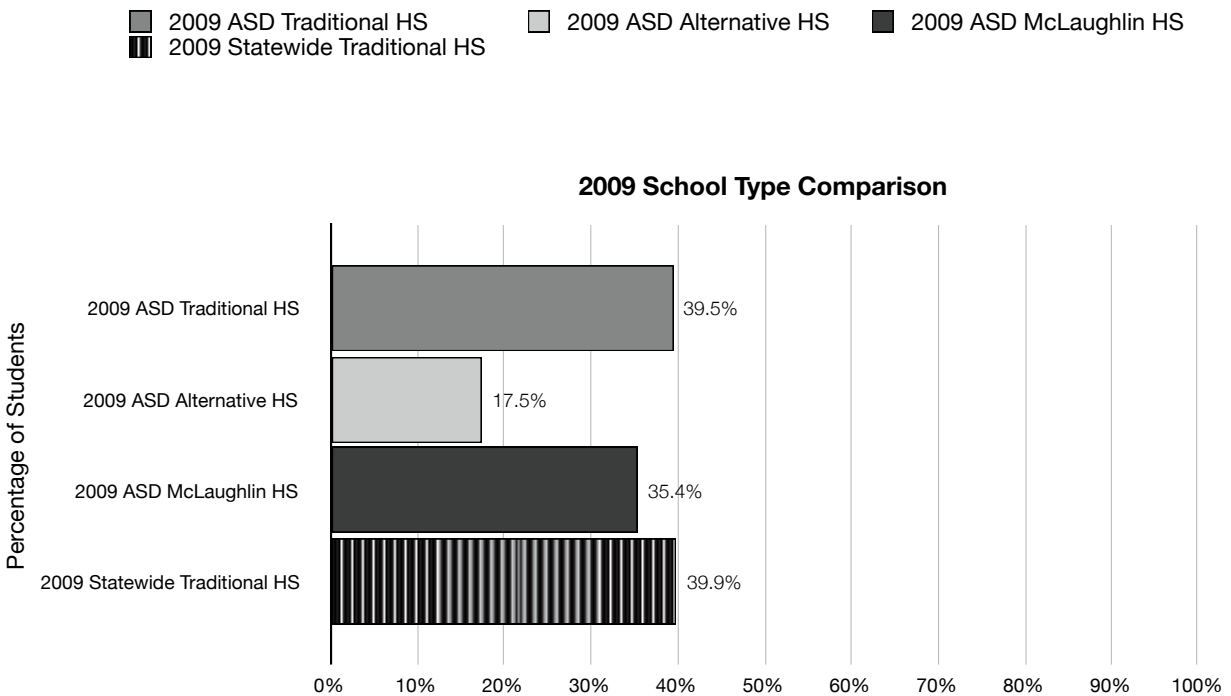

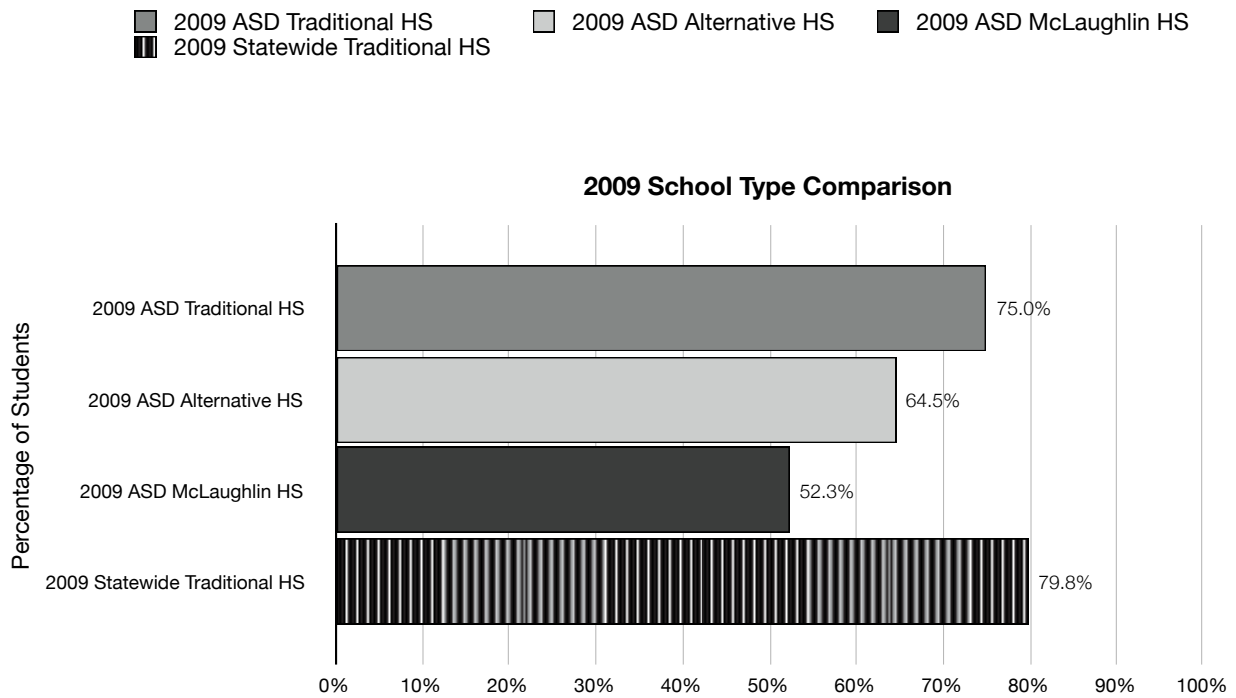
Question 97: Do you agree or disagree that you feel alone in your life?

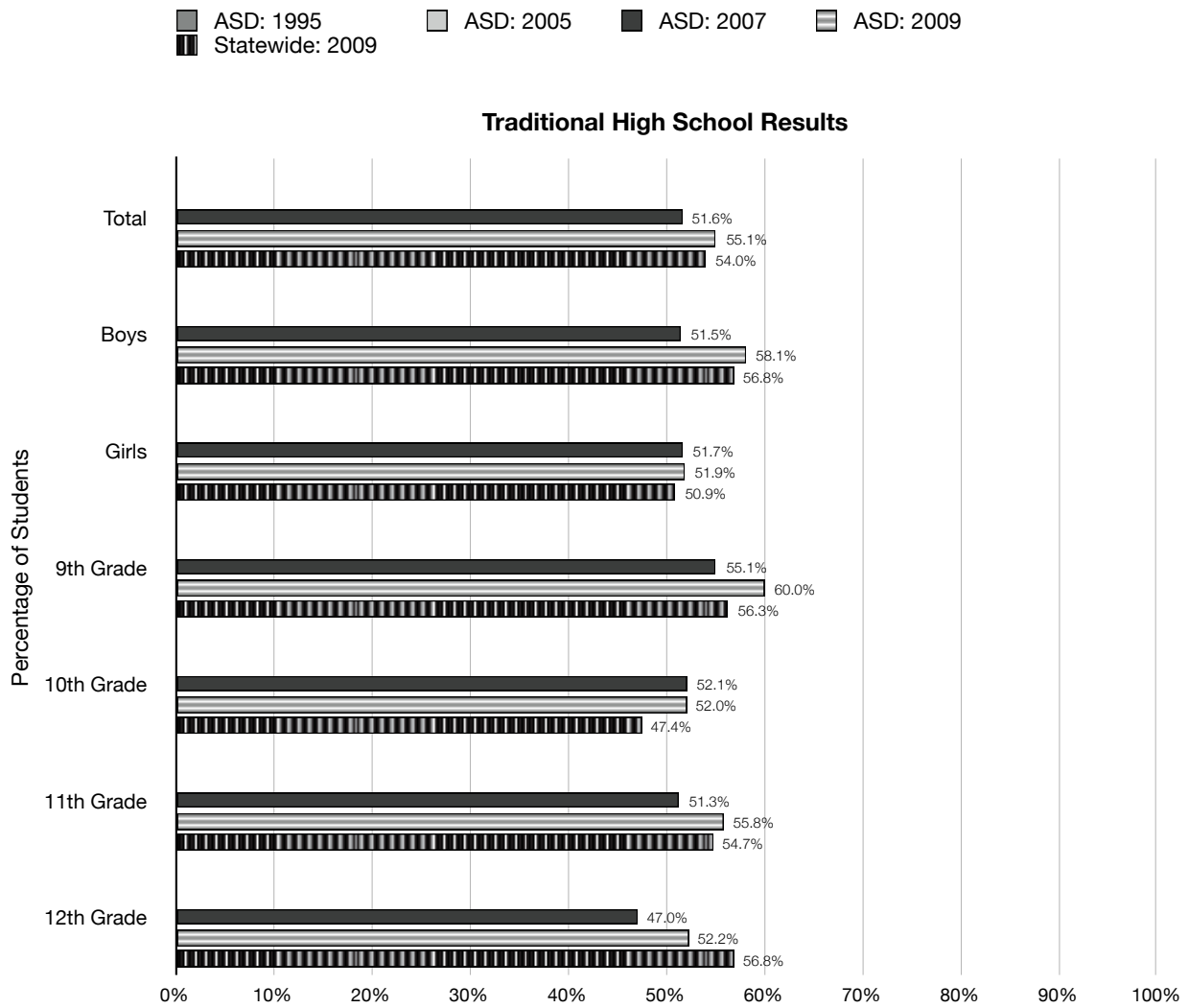

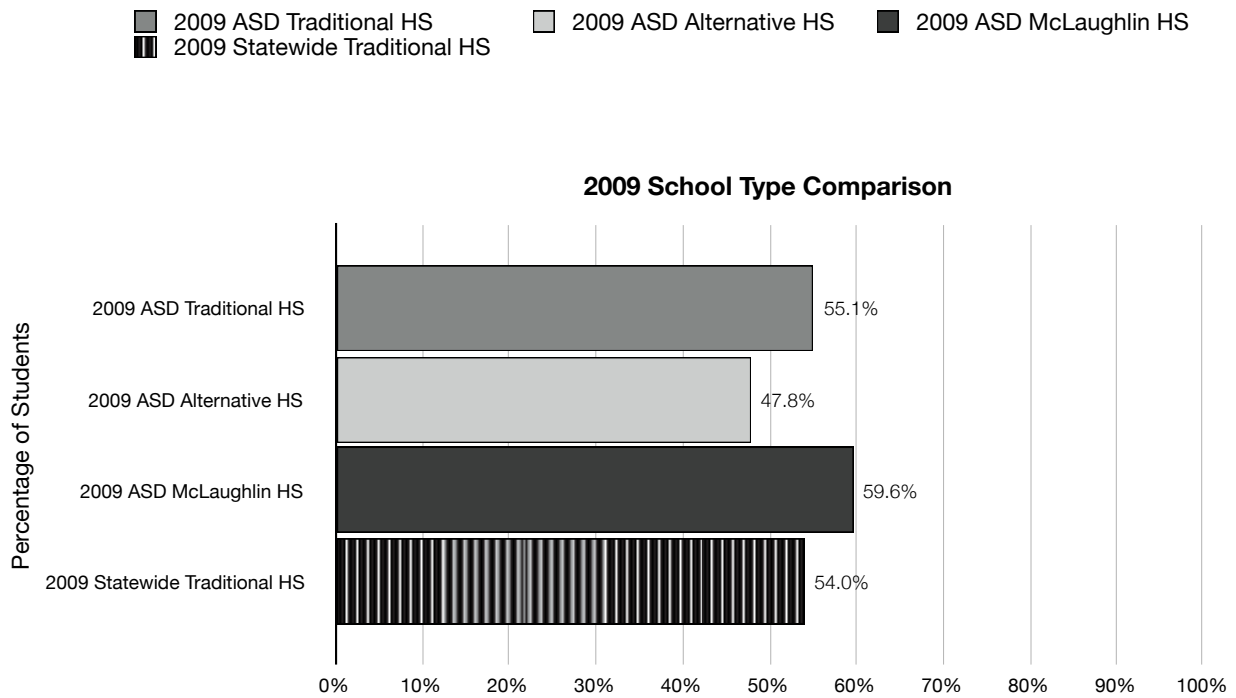
Question 98: Do you agree or disagree that in your community you feel like you matter to people?

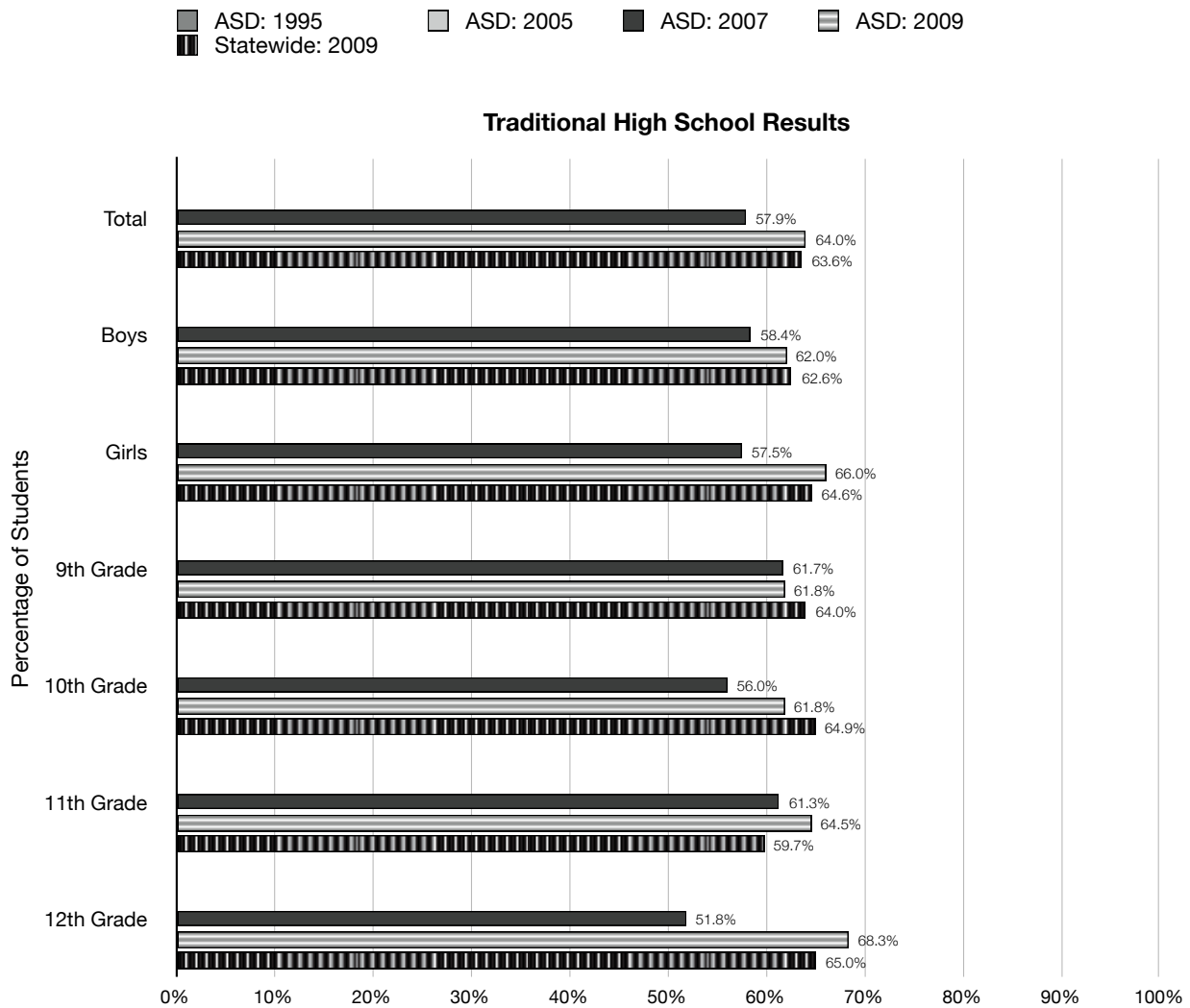

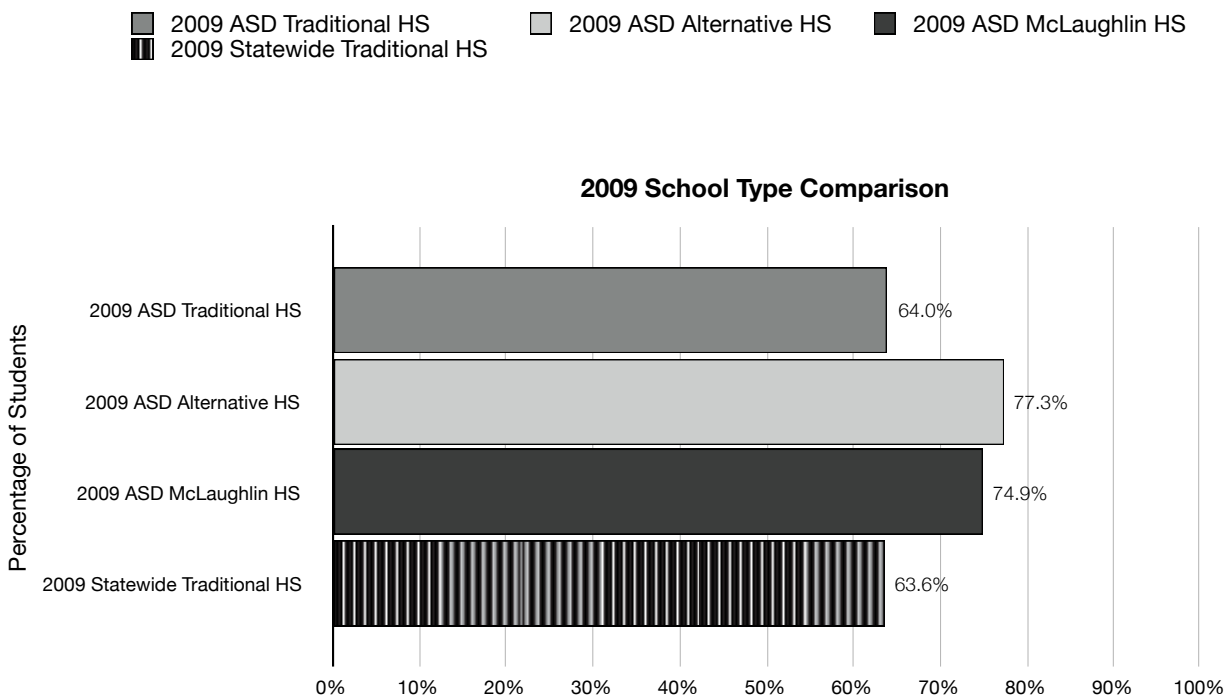
Question 99: Do you agree or disagree that your school has clear rules and consequences for behavior?

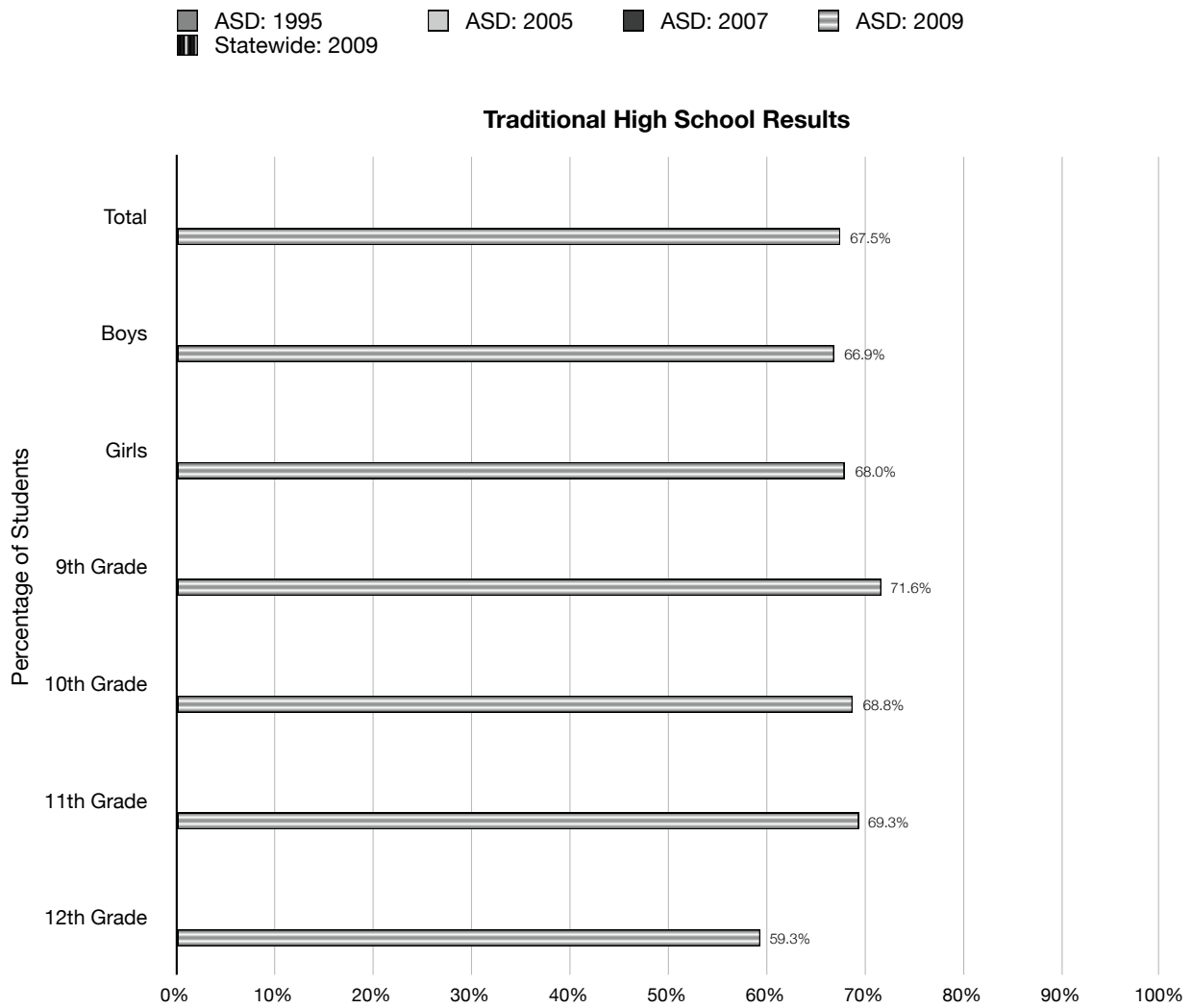

98. Percentage of students whose parents consider it very wrong for them to smoke marijuana

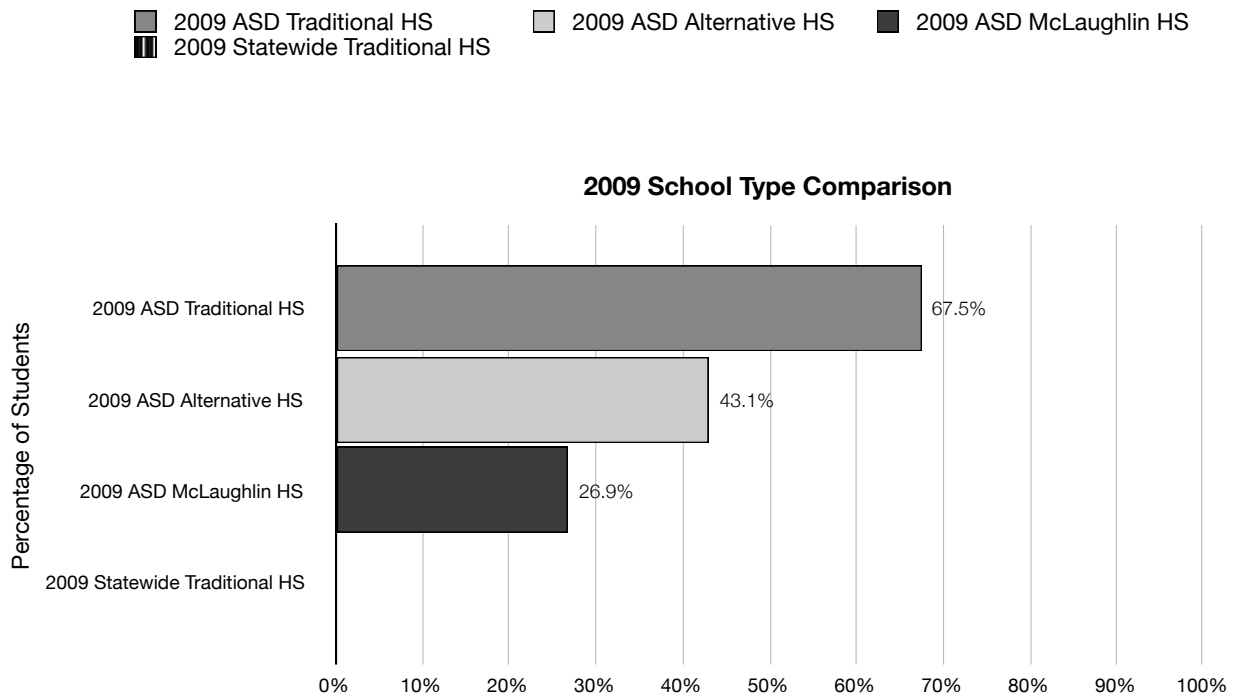
Question 100: How wrong do your parents feel it would be for you to smoke marijuana?

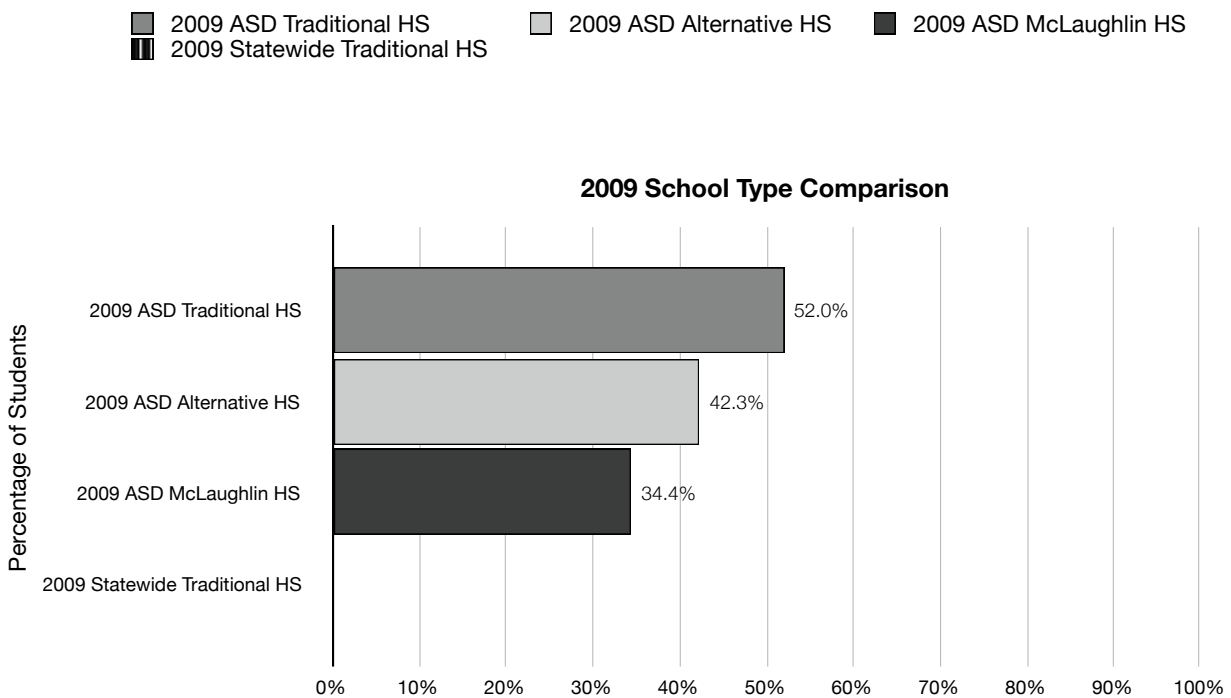

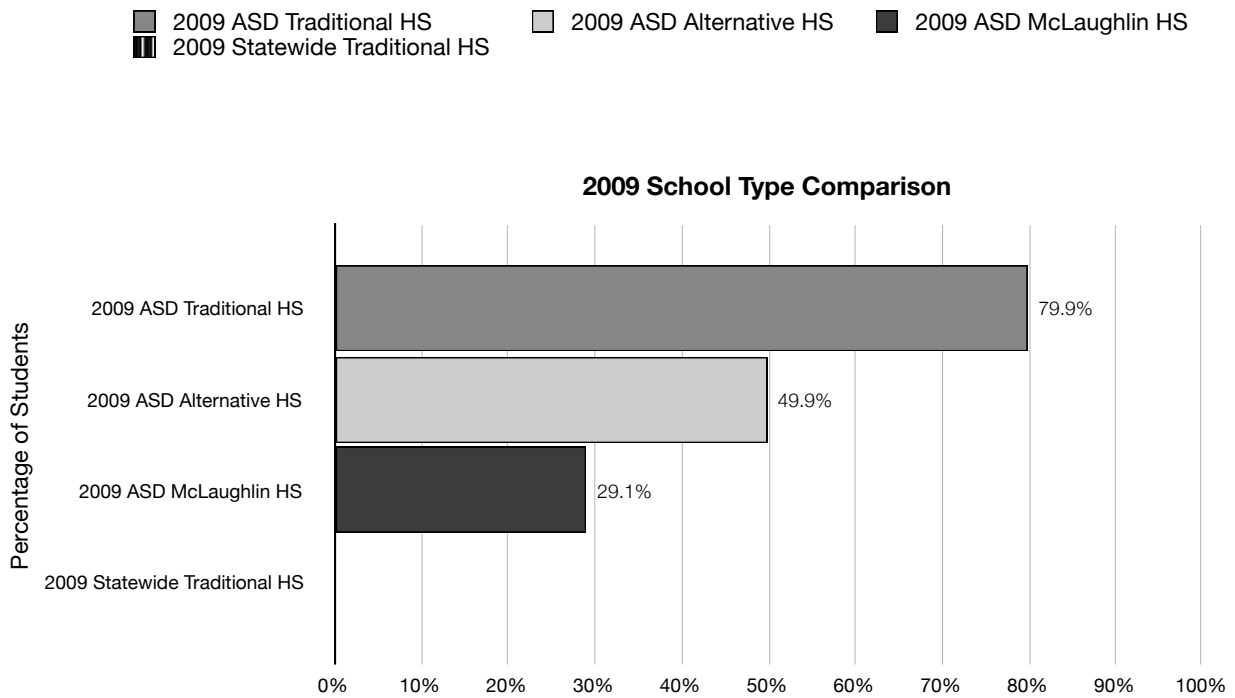

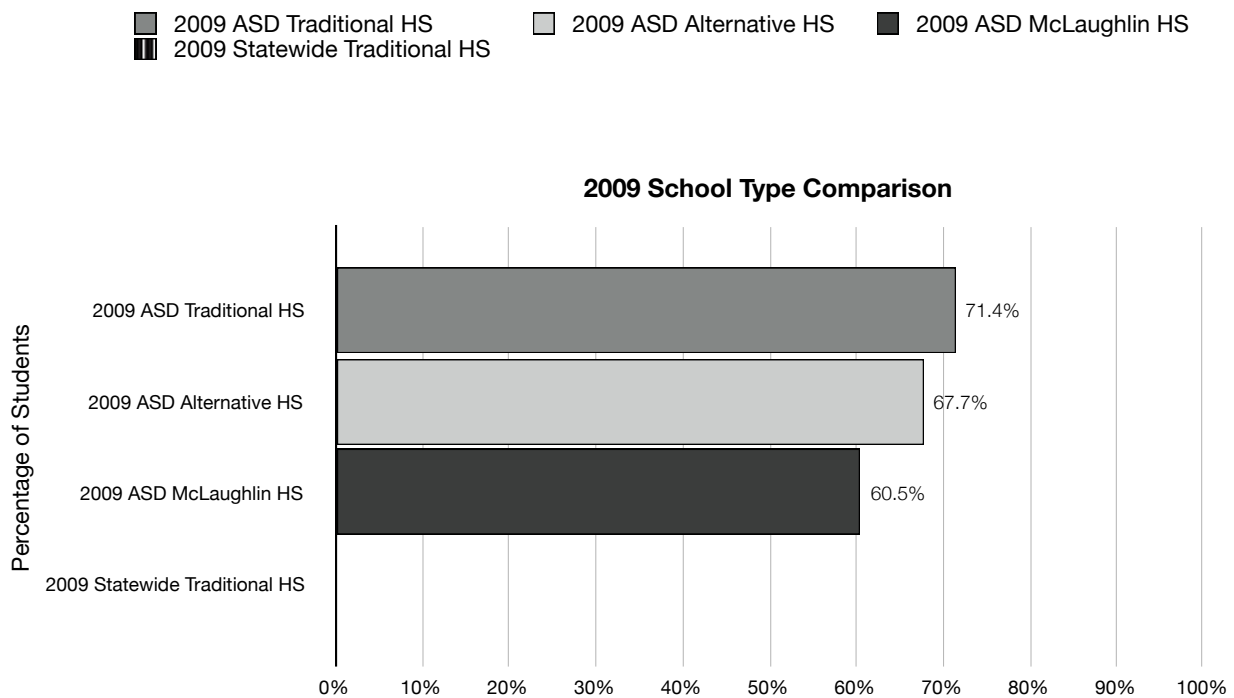
Question 103: What are the chances you would be seen as cool if you smoked cigarettes?

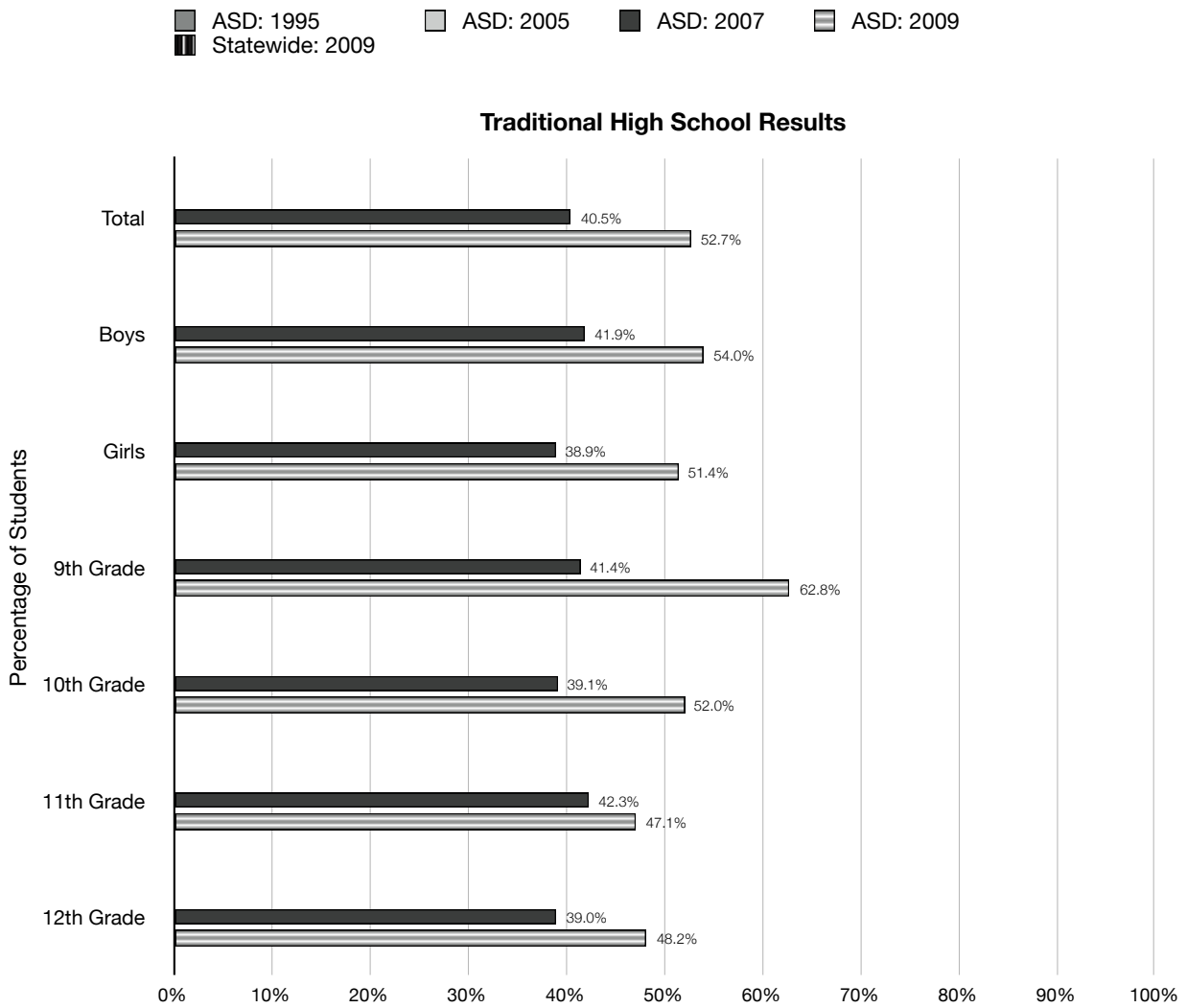

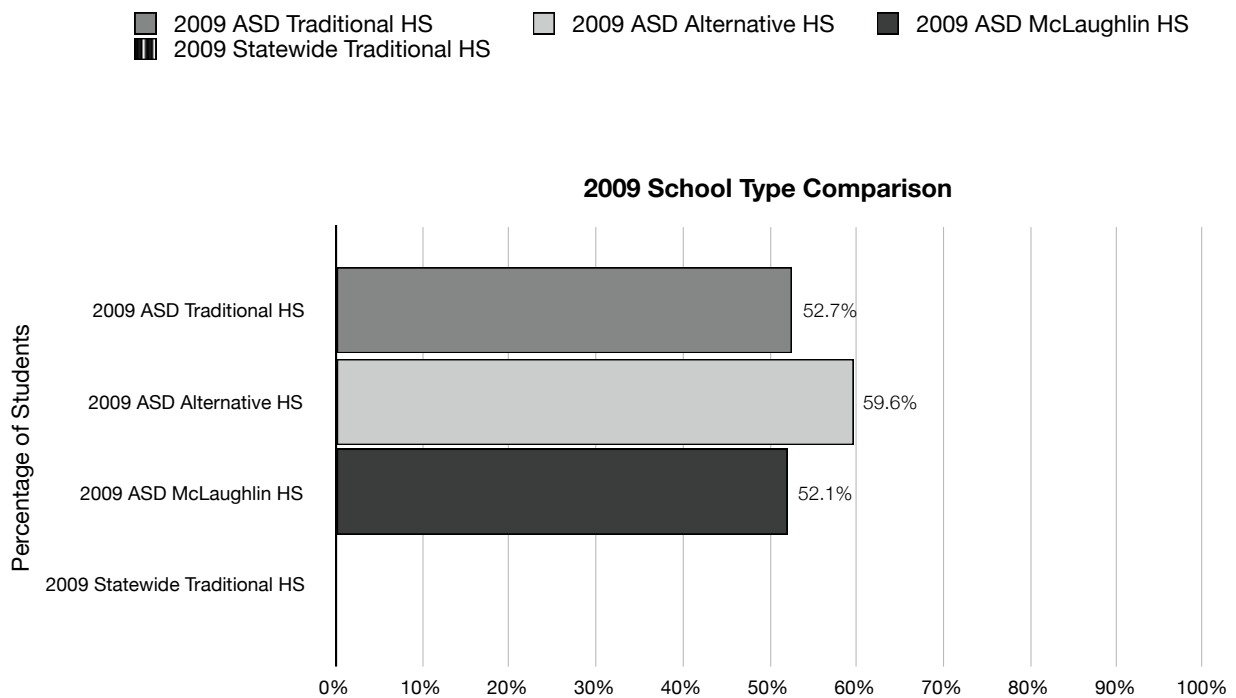
Question 104: What are the chances you would be seen as cool if you began drinking alcoholic beverages regularly, that is, at least once or twice a month?

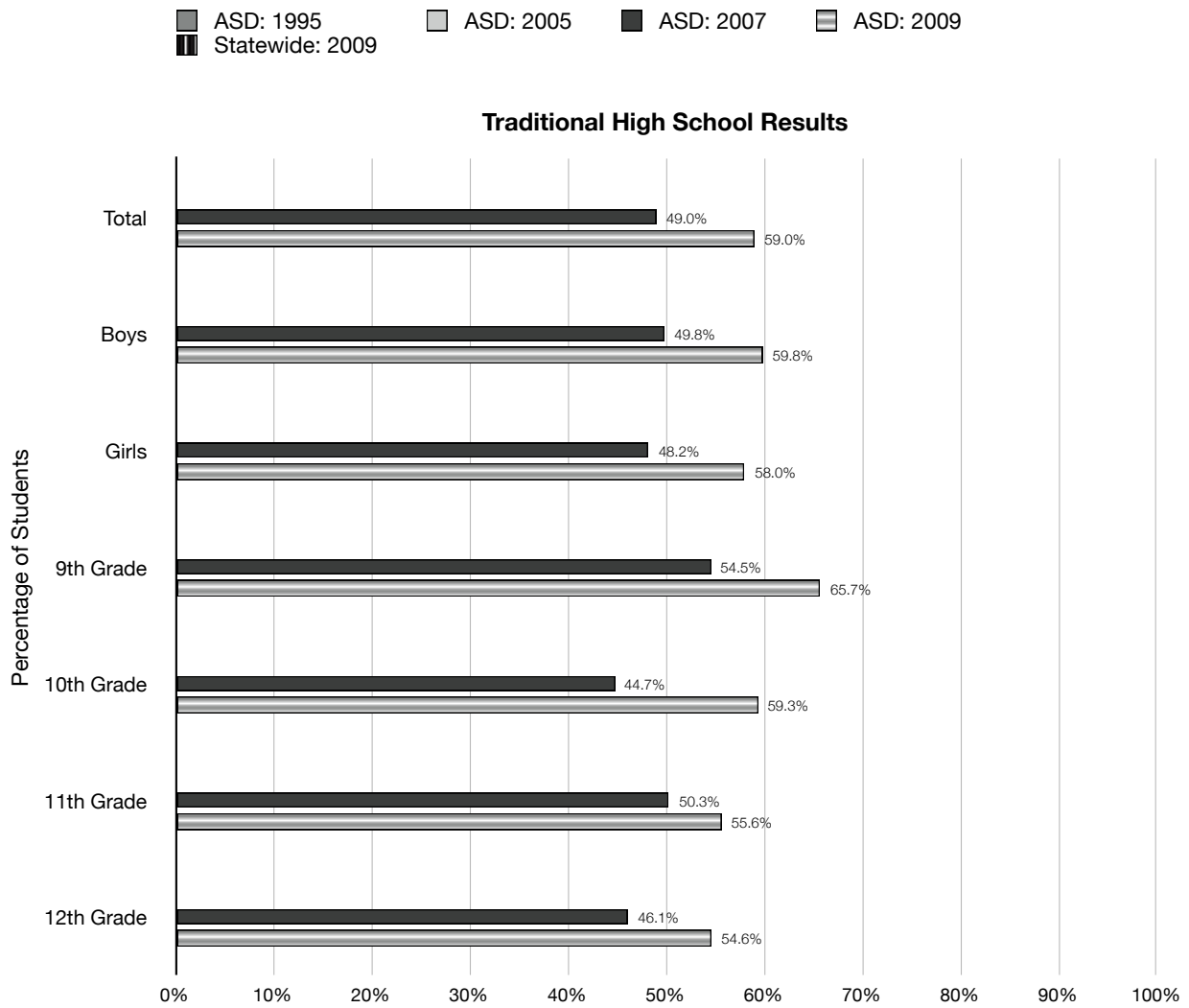

103. Percentage of students who think there is no or very little chance of smoking marijuana as being seen as cool

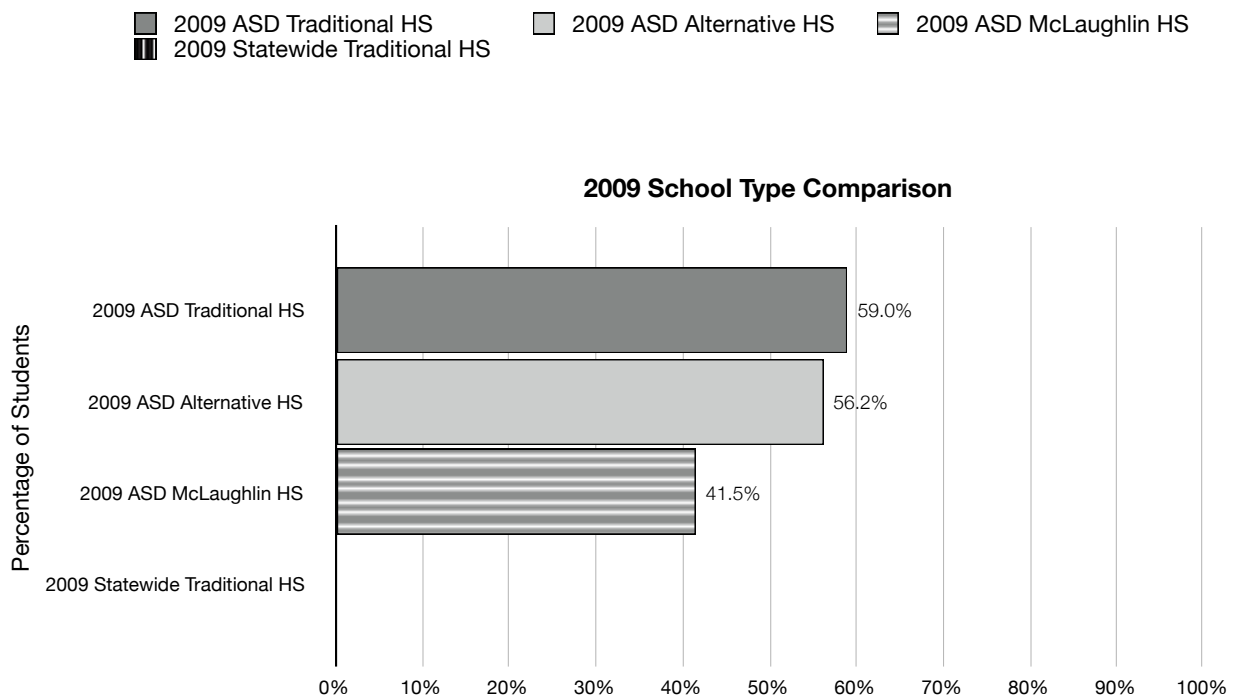
Question 105: What are the chances you would be seen as cool if you smoked marijuana?
