## **Activity Reports**

### **Peer Mediator Training**

#### **Brief Description**

For the 2008-09 school year Campbell Elementary selected 31 students to take part in the Mediation Training Program. This mediator training lasted three days and was located at a local neighborhood church several blocks from the school. The skills taught included "active listening, understanding the feelings of others, paraphrasing, creative questioning, and finding "win-win" solutions to conflicts. The new mediators were partnered with previously trained mediators to resolve conflicts on the playground during recess and in the lunchroom as well as in classrooms when needed throughout the 2008-09 school year. Staff members involved were Brian Burke, Gretchen Hopkins, Daniel Buitrago, and Marie Hare (Lead play ground supervisor).

We currently have an approximate total of 62 trained mediators enrolled at Campbell Elementary. This represents that about 16% of the student population K-6 are trained mediators.
