Data Summary

According to the pre/post data collected from the mediator training there was a 69% increase in scores 29/42. 4/42 got all 4 steps of mediation right on the pre test equalling 9%, however it increased to 9/42 got all 4 steps of mediation right on the post test totaling an increase to 12%. The mean of the pre was 45.71 and the mean of the post was 61.90. Pre test scores total 1920 and post total 2600 for an increase of 680 points.

Other Comments

I believe that the hands on training provided hands on knowledge and a way to get experience with problem solving and conflict resolution skills. I think that doing and off-site training provides the means to bring a group together and to add more cohesiveness to the students.
