

### Wonder Park Elementary School Overview

#### Statement of Program

Wonder Park Elementary is a culturally diverse school located in a melting pot community in east Anchorage. The student population is 29 percent Caucasian, 18 percent African-American, 22 percent Alaska Native, 1 percent American Indian, 11 percent Asian, 6 percent Hispanic, 2 percent Filipino, and 11 percent biracial. Eighteen different languages are spoken at Wonder Park. About 25 percent of our students are bilingual and receive bilingual services. The bilingual staff speaks Arabic, French, Thai, Lao, Tagalog and Spanish.

Approximately 75 percent of the students qualify for free or reduced breakfast and lunch. Wonder Park also experiences a transient and mobility rate of more than 30 percent. Wonder Park currently has 16 students that qualify for the Child in Transition/Homeless program. Indian Education supports 27 percent of our students, offering one-on-one learning about their culture and other Alaska Native cultures.

Wonder Park is dedicated to student achievement, as evidenced by rising test results, a welcoming environment and high scores on the annual climate survey filled out by our parents, students and staff.

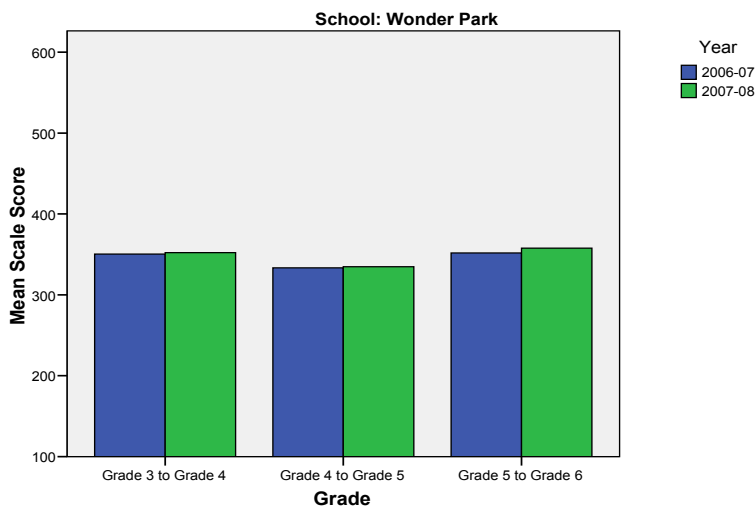

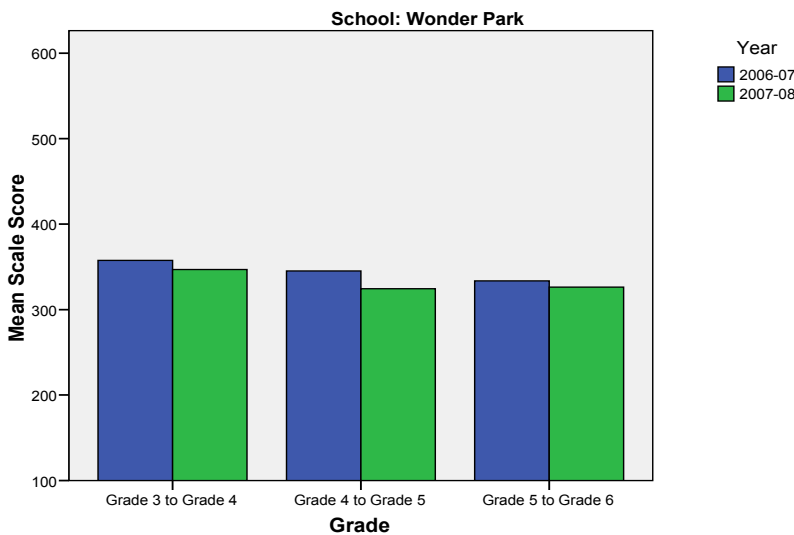
Change in Mean Scale Score in SBA Reading by Grade Between 2006-07 and 2007-08

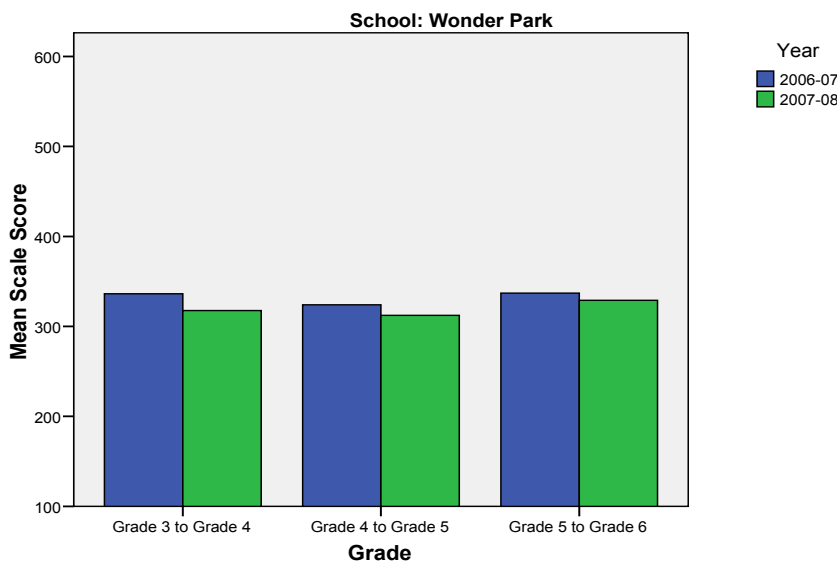
**Change in Mean Scale Score in SBA Writing by Grade between 2006-07 and 2007-08**

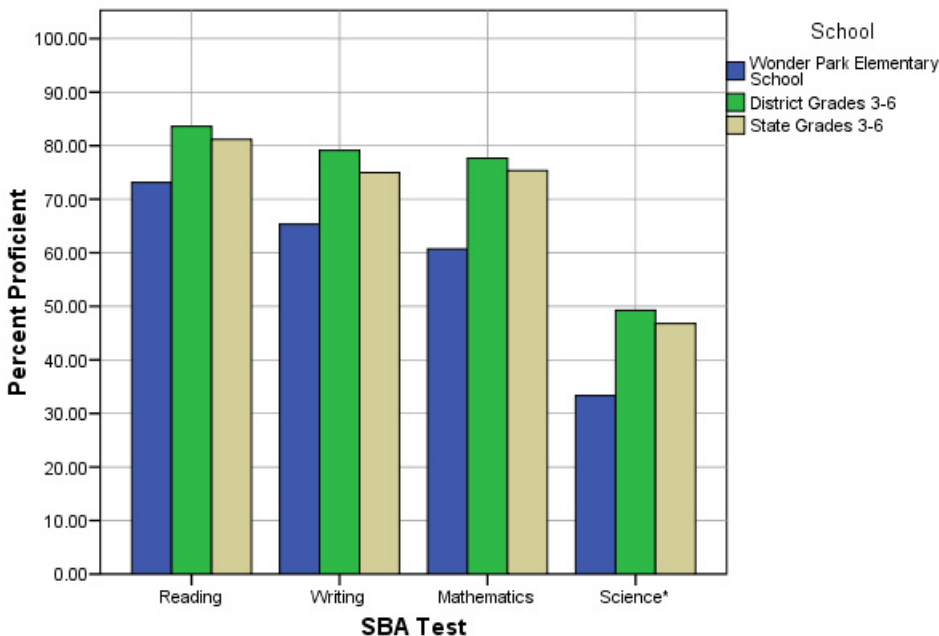

**Climate Survey Results for Wonder Park Elementary School**

The Anchorage School District administered the School Climate and Connectedness Surveys in spring 2008 to students in grades 5-12, all school staff and parents/guardians of students in grades K-12. The surveys were done to provide schools with information about perceptions and experiences related to school climate for use in setting school goals and redirecting resources. In the spring of 2008 grades 3 and 4 students were involved in a pilot survey for measuring school climate and connectedness. The results are currently under review by the American Institutes for Research.

Respondents were asked to answer a series of questions that were related to a certain concept. For each item, there were five options from which to choose a response. The answer options ranged from strongly disagree (1) to strongly agree (5).

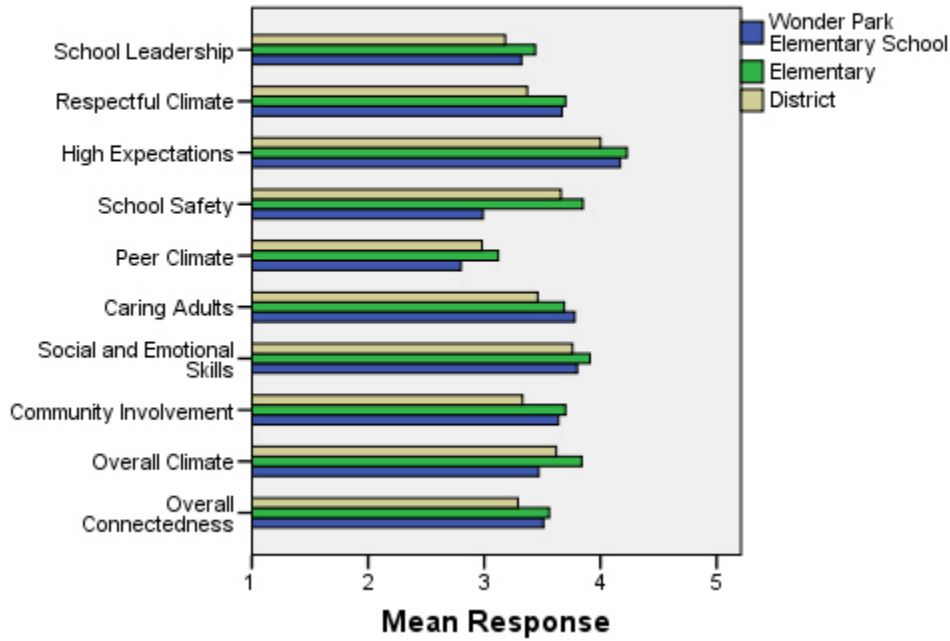

Each question in the survey related to a factor or concept, and a score was calculated based on the mean response for the questions related to each factor. The factors measured in the survey were:

- **School Leadership and Student Involvement:** This factor reflects students' feelings about the decision making of school leaders as well as student participation in the school governance. Students selected responses between 1 and 5 where 1 indicates a low level of school leadership and student involvement and 5 indicates a high level of school leadership and student involvement.
- **Respectful Climate:** This factor reflects students' feelings about fairness of rules and respect for students' contributions. Students selected responses between 1 and 5 where 1 indicates a lack of a respectful climate and 5 indicates a highly respectful climate for students.
- **High Expectations:** This factor reflects students' feelings about their own expectations as well as those of adults in their school and community. Students selected responses between 1 and 5 where 1 indicates a lack of high expectations and 5 indicates a high level of high expectations.
- **School Safety:** This factor reflects students' feelings about bullies and gangs at school as well as general crime and violence in the community. Students selected responses between 1 and 5 where 1 indicates a low level of school safety and 5 indicates a high level of school safety.
- **Peer Climate:** This factor reflects students' feelings about how respectful students are to one another and how helpful students are to other students. Students selected responses between 1 and 5 where 1 indicates a more negative peer climate and 5 indicates a very positive peer climate at the school.
- **Caring Adults:** This factor reflects students' feelings about how close they feel to adults in the school. Students selected responses between 1 and 5 where 1 indicates a lack of caring adult relationships and 5 indicates strong caring adult relationships at the school.
- **Social and Emotional Learning:** This factor reflects students' ability to think about the consequences of their actions and to empathize with others. Students selected responses between 1 and 5 where 1 indicates that students at the school perceive themselves as having poorer social and emotional learning, and 5 indicates higher levels of social and emotional learning.
- **Community Involvement:** This factor reflects students' feelings about how supportive and welcoming the school is with parents and the community. Students selected responses between 1 and 5 where 1 indicates a less supportive and welcoming environment and 5 indicates a more supportive and welcoming environment.
- **Overall Climate:** The overall climate score was computed as the mean of three scales: school leadership, high expectations and school safety.
- **Overall Connectedness:** Overall connectedness score was computed as a mean of three scales: respectful climate, peer climate and caring adults.

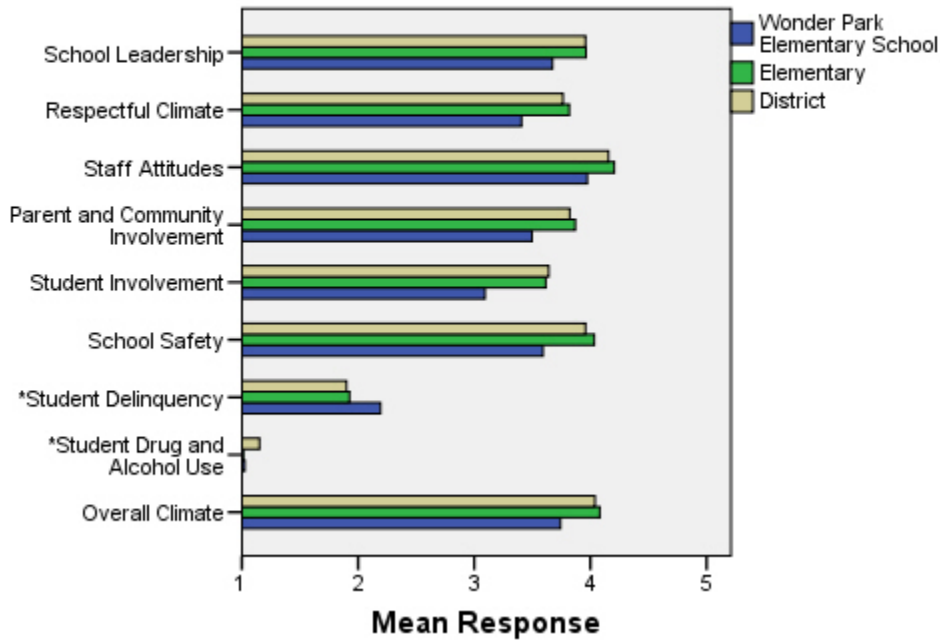

Each question in the survey related to a factor or concept, and a score was calculated based on the mean response for the questions related to each factor. The factors were:

- **School Leadership:** This factor reflects staff members' feelings about the decision making of school leaders as well as the fairness of school rules. Staff members selected responses between 1 and 5 where 1 indicates a low level of school leadership and 5 indicates a high level of school leadership.
- **Respectful Climate:** This factor reflects staff members' feelings about how students treat each other and how well students and staff members treat one another. Staff members selected responses between 1 and 5 where 1 indicates a low level of respect and 5 indicates a high level.
- **Staff Attitudes:** This scale reflects staff members' feelings about the competence of teachers as well as how positive their attitudes are towards their jobs. Staff members selected responses between 1 and 5 where 1 indicates more negative staff attitudes and 5 indicates highly positive staff attitudes.
- **Parent and Community Involvement:** This factor reflects staff members' feelings about how accessible the school is for parents as well as how connected adults in the community are to the school. Staff members selected responses between 1 and 5 where 1 indicates a low level of parent and community involvement and 5 indicates a high level of parent and community involvement.
- **Student Involvement:** This factor reflects staff members' feeling about how involved students are in the decision making process. Staff members selected responses between 1 and 5 where 1 indicates a low level of student involvement and 5 indicates a high level of student involvement.
- **School Safety:** This factor reflects staff members' feelings about the impact of gangs and bullies as well as general crime and violence in the community. Staff members selected responses between 1 and 5 where 1 indicates a low level school safety and 5 indicates a high level of school safety.
- **Student Delinquency:** This factor uses staff members' reports of observing students getting into fights, stealing and bullying. The student delinquency and student drug and alcohol use scales differ from the other factors since the higher the score is the more negative the response. Staff members selected responses between 1 and 5 where 1 indicates a low level of student delinquency and 5 indicates a high level of student delinquency.
- **Student Drug and Alcohol Use:** This factor uses staff members' reports of observing students under the influence of drugs or alcohol. The student delinquency and student drug and alcohol use scales differ from the other factors since the higher the score is the more negative the response. Staff members selected responses between 1 and 5 where 1 indicates a low level of student drug and alcohol use and 5 indicates a high level of student drug and alcohol use.
- **Overall Climate:** Computed as the mean of 8 scales: school leadership, respectful climate, staff attitudes, parent and community involvement, student involvement, school safety, student delinquency, and drug and alcohol use scores.
