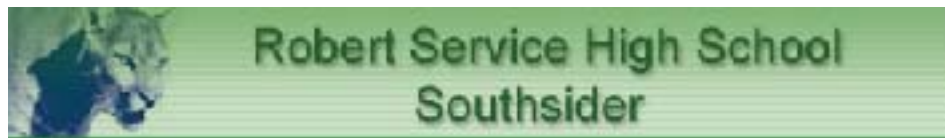

In the DECA news, students enrolled in any business, marketing or economisc course are invited to see Ms. Hockema to become a member in this distinguished co-curriclual and extra-curricular activity. The opportunities to work with area business and to partiipate in fun and educational workshop, conferences and trips are available for all student members.

We hope to see many of you during registration for further information and to participate in the first fundraising event of the year.

Notes From the Nurse . .

Medication

No medication shall be administered without proper written consent/permission by the parent/guardian and/or physician . The school nurse will provide you with the proper form for the type of medication . All medications must be brought to the nurse in their original container, labeled with the students' name and accompanied by the proper form . Instructions for administering medication will include identification, quantity, purpose and possible side effects . All medications must be delivered to the nurse by the parent/guardian unless approved by the nurse or school administration . *Students are prohibited from carrying any medications on school grounds except for certain emergency medications by prearrangement with the nurse and physician.* The school nurse will dispense all prescription and non-prescription medications . If the nurse is absent or not available, a responsible trained alternate may dispense as allowed by the Alaska Nurse Practice Act . Certain medications may not be delegated and alternate accommodations will be arranged . Medication administration is dependent upon the nurse's discretion and observation of possible adverse reactions or interactions and may be referred to the physician as needed to insure the safety of the student during school hours . Expired medications and/or medical supplies will not be used by ASD; parent/guardian must supply current medications and supplies at all times.

Nurse . . .

Students becoming ill during the school day must report to the Nurse. If it is necessary to go home or to a doctor, the nurse will inform the parent/guardian and the student will be released from school . (If you have any questions regarding your health, feel free to see the school nurse .) Students leaving due to illness without properly checking out will be counted as truant from those classes missed . *Any student needing to take medication during the school day must have the medication administered by the school nurse.* Medication forms are available from your doctor or the school Nurse's Office.

BYE BYE BIRDIE

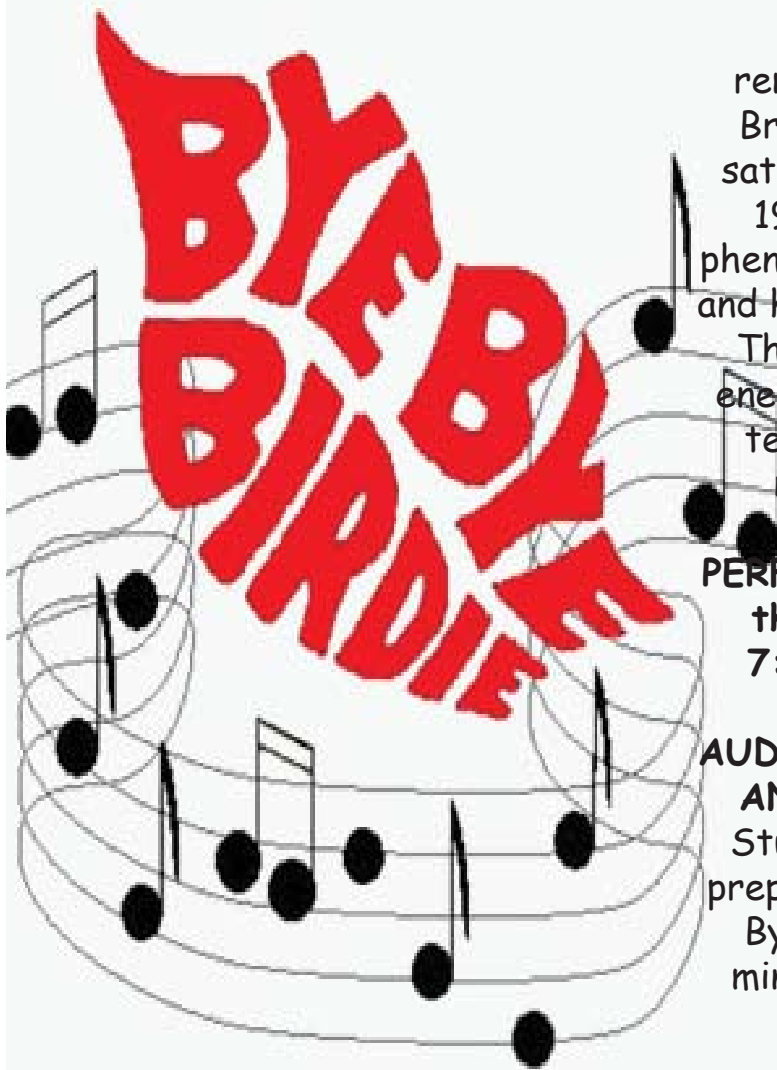

WHAT IS AP STATISTICS AND WHO SHOULD TAKE IT?

Reasoning based on probability and statistics gives modern society the ability to cope with uncertainty. It deals with the design of how data is collected, the analysis of the data, and the drawing of conclusions from the data.

Statistics has astonishing power to improve decision-making accuracy and test new ideas. It's a key analytical tool used in education, the social sciences, and business administration and is often a required college subject for majors in those areas. Statistics is frequently used for data analysis in the sciences and forms the mathematical basis for quality control in manufacturing.

Who Should Take This Class: Students with the desire to spend a very entertaining hour a day with Mrs. Knock and/or those that have an interest in careers related to: medicine, computer science, genetics, business, mathematics, architecture, engineering, any of the sciences, or the social sciences including psychology, sociology, political science, and education. In college, statistics is required for most majors.

Prerequisites: AP Statistics is a college level class for students who have been successful in Algebra II. It covers the topics needed for the American College Board AP Statistics exam. Students passing this test may receive college credit. Surprisingly, a score of 3 or higher on the AP World History and/or the AP U.S. History exam is also a strong indication of future success in AP Statistics.

NEW TO THE DISTRICT & IN-DISTRICT TRANSFERS (Grades 9 – 12)

New to Service students may register July 19-30. THIS DOES NOT INCLUDE 9TH GRADERS ROLLED OVER FROM FEEDER SCHOOLS OF GOLDENVIEW, HANSHEW & MEARS. All students will receive their schedules on the appointed registration date and time for their class.

NEW TO SERVICE HIGH SCHOOL - Bring to Registration:

1. According to Alaska State law, all students must present a CURRENT RECORD of IMMUNIZATION. Students will be allowed to select courses but will not be able to attend classes until an up to date Immunization Record is on file in the school. (not required for transfers, it is already in our computer system.)
2. Bring 2 utility bills to verify your residence address in our attendance area.
3. Please bring a TRANSCRIPT from your previous school to help your counselor schedule classes correctly. (not required for ASD transfers, it is already in our computer system.)

SCHOOL TRANSFER

- a. A student-athlete who transfers enrollment shall be immediately eligible if the transfer includes a Bona Fide Change of Residence into the new school's boundary/zone as established by the local school district, in accordance with ASAA policy. (see definition of a Bona Fide Change of Residence)
- b. A student athlete who transfers enrollment shall not be eligible for one hundred eighty (180) school days if the transfer did not include a Bona Fide Change of Residence into the new school's boundary/zone, as established by the local school district in accordance with ASAA policy.

BONA FIDE CHANGE OF RESIDENCE

Transfer As a Result of a Move of Parents states:

A student who transfers from one school's attendance area to another's with a Bona Fide Change of Residence of the parents, legal guardian (or other person with whom the student has resided for a period of time to be determined by the Association) shall be eligible for interscholastic competition at the new school as soon as properly certified.

DEFINITION OF A BONA FIDE CHANGE OF RESIDENCE

For Purposes of this section, a Bona Fide Change of Residence means, "the moving of permanent residence of the entire family of the student and his/her parents, guardians (or other person with whom the student has resided for a period of time approved by the Association) from one school's attendance area to another school's attendance area prior to a change in enrollment of the student." Schools must verify that a Bona Fide Change of Residence has occurred and must report this to the Association on the Bona Fide Change of Residence form, before the student is allowed to participate.

A student attending a non-member charter school, alternative school, or program (including district correspondence) who wishes to change his/her School of Eligibility during the school year, will be ineligible for interscholastic competition at the new school of Eligibility for one hundred eighty (180) school days, including state approved in-service, after first attendance. (see Article 12, section 9,3).

A student enrolled in a program as specified above may request a change of School of Eligibility within a district by asking both the sending and receiving schools to complete the form and send it to ASAA. By signing the form and sending it to ASAA, both schools are acknowledging their agreement with the request. ASAA must receive this form prior to any change in the School of Eligibility. The form will stipulate the one hundred eighty (180) day window of ineligibility and the date which the student athlete may begin eligible participation at the receiving school.

To locate the forms go to asdk12.org, click on Back to School Section at the top of the home page. On the Back to School page see Registration Forms on the left side of the page and "click here to go to the registration forms page" as indicated. The forms you will need as a returning student or student coming from middle school are: "Release of student directory information", "Survey Permission", "Media release" (please write in Year-round Events on the top line), and "Internet agreement for students" (everyone needs to fill out a new Internet Agreement form this year and parent and student must sign it).



CONCUSSION IN SPORTS

A FACT SHEET FOR ANCHORAGE SCHOOL DISTRICT ATHLETES AND PARENTS¹

What is a concussion?

A concussion is a brain injury that:

- Is caused by a bump, blow, or jolt to the head or body.
- Is always serious and can change the way your brain normally works.
- Can occur during practices or games in any sport or recreational activity.
- Can happen even if you haven't been knocked out.
- Can be serious even if you've just been "dinged" or "had your bell rung."

What are the signs and symptoms?

Signs Observed by Parents or Guardians	Symptoms Reported by Athlete
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Appears dazed or stunned • Is confused about assignment or position • Forgets an instruction • Is unsure of game, score, or opponents • Moves clumsily • Loses consciousness (even briefly) • Shows mood, behavior, or personality changes • Can't recall events prior to hit or fall • Can't recall events after hit or fall 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Headache or "pressure" in head • Nausea or vomiting • Balance problems or dizziness • Double or blurry vision • Sensitivity to light or noise • Feeling sluggish, hazy, foggy, or groggy • Concentration or memory problems • Confusion • Just not "feeling right" or "feeling down"

What to do if you suspect a concussion:

- **Tell the coach and school nurse.** They need to know if you suspect a concussion. They also need to know if there has been a previous concussion.
- **Seek medical attention.** A health care professional experienced in evaluating concussions will be able to diagnose and treat a concussion and determine when it is safe to return to play. **You cannot return to an Anchorage School District activity until a qualified medical provider indicates it is safe to do so.**
- **Stay out of play and recover.** A brain with a concussion needs time to heal. While a brain is still healing, there is a much greater chance of another concussion. Repeat concussions can slow recovery and increase the likelihood of long-term problems. In rare cases, repeat concussions can result in edema (brain swelling), permanent brain damage, and even death.
- **Tell your principal and teachers.** A concussion can impact a student's ability to do school work and other activities, such as computer use, studying, driving, or exercising. If needed, your teachers and school nurse can help adjust school activities during the recovery period.

Preventing Concussion:

While each sport is different, there are steps every athlete can take.

- Use the proper sports equipment. Wear the right equipment for the game or position, make sure it fits and wear it correctly.
- Follow the coach's rules for safety and the rules of the sport.
- Practice good sportsmanship at all times.

BASELINE TESTING – AN IMPORTANT FIRST STEP: As part of ASD's efforts to minimize concussion related injuries, every school athlete is required to participate in ImPACT baseline screening. ImPACT is a computerized exam utilized in sports programs across the country to diagnose and manage concussions. This is a non-invasive, simple test set up in "video-game" format and takes 20 minutes to complete on an ASD computer. The test records individual reaction time, memory, speed, and concentration. It is not an IQ test and is not utilized for any purpose other than to establish a baseline measure for comparison should a student later be suspected of having a concussion. The test data will enable health professionals to determine when return-to-play is appropriate and safe for the injured athlete. You may obtain further information online at <http://impacttest.com>, or from your coach or school nurse.

The ImPACT baseline test is required of all students participating in any ASD activity that requires a sports physical. A single test is required for middle school athletes and again for high school athletes. The test will be administered prior to the first sports activity in which a student participates. The cost of the baseline assessment is \$5 and will be the responsibility of the student and parent/guardian.

These Guidelines are available at the ASD website, www.asdk12.org, from your coach, and at your school office.

Parents and athletes need to annually acknowledge receipt of "CONCUSSION IN SPORTS, A FACT SHEET FOR ANCHORAGE SCHOOL DISTRICT ATHLETES AND PARENTS."

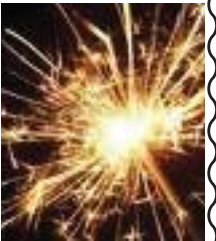

Service High School Attendance Procedures

Attendance is taken each class period.

An automated phone call/email will be sent to the parent of any student with an unexcused absence. Students are allowed a maximum of 15 absences per semester. Additional absences may result in withdraw/fail for nonattendance.

Unexcused absences may result in disciplinary action.

Blue passes or admit slips are available from Attendance office (lower G) or Student Services (lower D). See student handbook for complete attendance policy information.

WHAT TO DO WHEN...

Your student will be absent the entire day:

- Call the automated line, 566-8100, and identify yourself.
- Please leave first and last name (include spelling) and student ID number.
- Call in by 10:00am.



Your student will be late:

- Late arriving students should have an excuse note from parents.
- If student arrives at school before 7:45am send him/her directly to class with a note.
- If a student is arriving after 7:45am he/she goes directly to the Attendance office (lower G) or Student Services office (lower D) with a note.
- If a student does not have a note or admit slip with him/her in the hallway, a detention will be issued.

Your student needs to leave school during school hours:

- Write a note for your student to take to the attendance office or student services in the morning on the day he/she needs to leave. A blue pass will be issued and your student will be able to leave his/her class at the appointed time.
- If student does not get a blue pass, the absence will be unexcused.

You receive a call or email:

- If your student has been absent with your permission and you did not call the school, the best solution is to send a note to school with your student the next morning. He/she should bring this note to the attendance office upon arriving at school. The attendance secretary can then change the unexcused absence to an excused absence on the computer and print out a corrected attendance record for your student to take to each of his/her teachers.
- If you receive the call or email and your student says he/she was in class, please call 742-8102 and the attendance secretary will contact to the teacher regarding the absence. Errors will be corrected by the attendance office. If the student was not present in class, you will be contacted.
- **Deadline for ALL corrections is one week's time.**

Your student becomes ill at school:

- He/She should go to the nurse's office and the nurse will contact you.

You want to arrange an absence for vacation or trip:

- Get a prearranged absence form from the office.
- Prearranged absences do count towards the 15 total allowed per semester.
