***One of Those Hideous Books Where the Mother Dies* by Sonya Sones SON**

Fifteen-year-old Ruby Milliken leaves her best friend, her boyfriend, her aunt, and her mother's grave in Boston and reluctantly flies to Los Angeles to live with her father, a famous movie star who divorced her mother before Ruby was born.

***Pop Princess* by Rachel Cohn COH**

Yearning to escape the small Massachusetts town where her family retreated after her sister's death, Wonder Blake gets her chance when her sister's manager offers Wonder a record contract on her sixteenth birthday.

***Salem Witch Try-Outs* by Kelly McClymer MCC**

Uprooted from her happy life in Beverly Hills, Pru is furious when her parents move her to Salem, a witching community, and tell her that she can't use her witch skills when she attends Agatha's Day School for Witches, especially when all the others are using them freely - even during the cheerleading try-outs!

***The Secret Language of Girls* by Frances O'Roark Dowell DOW**

Marylin and Kate have been friends since nursery school, but when Marylin becomes a middle school cheerleader and Kate begins to develop other interests, their relationship is put to the test.

***The Sisterhood of the Traveling Pants* by Ann Brashares BRA**

Four best girlfriends spend the biggest summer of their lives enchanted by a magical pair of pants. Book one.

***Teen Idol* by Meg Cabot CAB**

When teenage heartthrob Luke Stryker shows up at a small-town Indiana high school to do research for a movie role, he persuades junior Jenny Greenley to use her considerable talents to try to change things at school for the better.

***Teens, Queens, and Has-Beens* by Cathy Hopkins HOP**

When Lia gains the interest of the school heartthrob she thereby alienates "teen queen" Kaylie, who then launches a campaign of bullying against Lia. Book one.

***This Lullaby* by Sarah Dessen DES**

Raised by a mother who's had five husbands, eighteen-year-old Remy believes in short-term, no-commitment relationships until she meets Dexter, a rock band musician. Read other books by this author.

***Top Ten Uses for an Unworn Prom Dress* by Tina Ferraro FER**

Having been stood up for the prom the previous year, high school junior Nicolette works on a top ten list of things to do with her unworn dress while also trying to help her divorced parents and take care of her relationships with her best friend and with potential boyfriends.

***The Wish* by Gail Carson Levine LEV**

When granted her wish to be the most popular girl in school, Wilma, an eighth grader, forgets that she will graduate in three weeks and her popularity will vanish.

***Define Normal* by Julie Anne Peters PET**

When she agrees to meet with Jasmine as a peer counselor at their middle school, Antonia never dreams that this girl with the black lipstick and pierced eyebrow will end up helping her deal with the serious problems she faces at home and become a good friend.

***Diva* by Alex Flinn FLI**

Despite her mother's objections, sixteen-year-old Caitlin determines to pursue her dream of becoming an opera singer by attending a performing arts school in Miami.

***Does My Head Look Fat in This?* By Randa Abdel-Fattah ABD**

Year Eleven at an exclusive prep school in the suburbs of Melbourne, Australia, would be tough enough, but it is further complicated for Amal when she decides to wear the hijab, the Muslim head scarf, full-time as a badge of her faith—without losing her identity or sense of style.

***Good Enough* by Paula Yoo YOO**

A Korean American teenager tries to please her parents by getting into an Ivy League school, but a new guy in school and her love of the violin tempt her in new directions.

***Hazing Meri Sugarman* by M. Apostolina APO**

Cindy's life is transformed when she arrives at college and is invited to join a sorority, but when Meri, one of its most popular sisters, becomes jealous of her, bad things soon start happening for the new-and-improved Cindy. Book one.

***How Not to Be Popular* by Jennifer Ziegler ZIE**

Seventeen-year-old Sugar Magnolia Dempsey is tired of leaving friends behind every time her hippie parents decide to move, but her plan to be unpopular at her new Austin, Texas, school backfires when other students join her on the path to "supreme dorkdom."

***The Luxe* by Anna Godberson GOD**
