***Bearwalker* by Joseph Bruchac BRU**

Although the littlest student in his class, thirteen-year-old Baron Braun calls upon the strength and wisdom of his Mohawk ancestors to face both man and beast when he tries to get help for his classmates, who are being terrorized during a school field trip in the Adirondacks. Also try *Skeleton Man*.

***Being Dead* by Vivian Vande Velde VAN**

They may be dead, but they're certainly not gone. They may not even be dead. They have unfinished business with the living. Seven deliciously creepy stories about seven haunted souls.

***Bloodline* by Kate Cary CAR**

In this story told primarily through journal entries, a British soldier in World War I makes the horrifying discovery that his regiment commander is descended from Count Dracula. Book one.

***The Book of Dead Days* by Marcus Sedgwick SED**

With the help of his servant and an orphan girl, a magician named Valerian searches graveyards, churches, and underground waterways for a book he hopes will save him from a pact he has made with evil. Book one

***City of Bones* by Cassandra Clare CLA**

Suddenly able to see demons and the Darkhunters who are dedicated to returning them to their own dimension, fifteen-year-old Clary Fray is drawn into this bizarre world when her mother disappears and Clary herself is almost killed by a monster. Book one



***Clay* by David Almond ALM**

The developing relationship between teenager Davie and Stephen, a mysterious new boy in town, morphs into something darker and more sinister when Davie learns firsthand of the boy's supernatural powers. Davie allows Stephen to convince him to help bring a life-size figure to life. What has Davie helped to unleash on the world?

***Coraline* by Neil Gaimon GAI**

Looking for excitement, Coraline ventures through a mysterious door into a world that is similar, yet disturbingly different from her own, where she must challenge a gruesome entity in order to save herself, her parents, and the souls of three others.

***Daemon Hall* by Andrew Nance NAN**

Famous horror story writer R. U. Tremblin comes to the town of Maplewood to hold a short story writing contest, offering the five finalists the chance to spend what turns out to be a terrifying--and deadly--night with him in a haunted house.

***Deep and Dark and Dangerous* by Mary Downing Hahn HAH**

When thirteen-year-old Ali spends the summer with her aunt and cousin at the family's vacation home, she stumbles upon a secret that her mother and aunt have been hiding for over thirty years. Just before summer begins, 13-year-old Ali finds an odd photograph in the attic. She knows the two children in it are her mother, Claire, and her aunt Dulcie. But who's the third person, the one who's been torn out of the picture?

***The Graveyard Book* by Neil Gaiman GAI**

An orphaned baby, whose family is killed by a serial murderer, is raised by ghosts and other denizens of the graveyard, while the killer tries to find him.

***Horseman* by Christopher Golden GOL**

When a string of grisly decapitation murders occurs in the famed village of Sleepy Hollow, newcomers Aimee and Shane Lancaster suspect a supernatural killer. Book one.

***The Invisible* by Mats Wahl WAH**

A Swedish teenager is assaulted and killed, but returns as a ghost to find his killer.

***London, 1850* by Sebastian Rook ROO**

An enormous ship has just reached port. From its hull, a flock of bats ascends and disappears into the streets. Jack Harkett intends to board the ship, in search of food or money. Instead, he encounters a boy his own age running for his life! The boy recounts horrific tales about a vampire plague that's killed the entire crew. Book one.

***My Swordhand is Singing* by Marcus Sedgwick SED**

In the dangerous dark of winter in an Eastern European village during the early seventeenth century, Peter learns from a gypsy girl that the Shadow Queen is behind the recent murders and reanimations, and his father's secret past may hold the key to stopping her.

***Scorpion Shards* by Neal Shusterman SHU**

Six teenagers, each tormented by what seems to be an exaggerated adolescent affliction, come together to try to stop the "beasts" that threaten to destroy them and the world.

***Sweet Miss Honeywell's Revenge: a Ghost Story* by Kathryn Reiss REI**

Just before her mother is to remarry and her stepfamily is set to move in, twelve-year-old Zibby gradually realizes that her antique dollhouse is haunted by ghosts, one of whom is out for revenge.
