

***Hunger Games* by Suzanne Collins COL**

In a future North America, where the rulers of Panem maintain control through an annual televised survival competition pitting young people from each of the twelve districts against one another, sixteen-year-old Katniss's skills are put to the test when she voluntarily takes her younger sister's place.

***The Last Book in the Universe* by WR Philbrick**

A thousand years in the future, an earthquake destroys much of the planet, and an epileptic teenager nicknamed Spaz begins the heroic fight to bring human intelligence back to Earth.

***Life as We Knew It* by Susan Pfeffer PFE**

Through journal entries sixteen-year-old Miranda describes her family's struggle to survive after a meteor hits the moon, causing worldwide tsunamis, earthquakes, and volcanic eruptions. Book one

***Maximum Ride* by James Patterson PAT**

Six American kids are pretty normal in most ways—except that they're 98% human, 2% bird. They are the result of genetic experimentation and grew up in cages, living like rats, but now they're free, and are pursuing mutant kidnappers. Book one

***The Power of Un* by Nancy Etchemendy ETC**

When he is given a device that will allow him to "undo" what has happened in the past, Gib Finney is not sure what event from the worst day in his life he should change in order to keep his sister from being hit by a truck.

***The Rudest Alien on Earth* by Jane Conly CON**

Having landed on a dairy farm in Vermont, an alien from another galaxy befriends two human children and uses her ability to change into animals to learn about Earth society.

***The Secret Under My Skin* by Jane McNaughton**

In the year 2368, humans exist under dire environmental conditions and one young woman, rescued from a work camp and chosen for a special duty, uses her love of learning to discover the truth about the planet's future and her own dark past.

***Shade's Children* by Garth Nix NIX**

In a savage postnuclear world, four young fugitives attempt to overthrow the bloodthirsty rule of the Overlords with the help of Shade, their mysterious mentor.

***The Softwire* by PJ Haarsma HAA**

When twelve-year-old Johnny and his sister arrive on Orbits in a space ship of orphans, he finds he has a unique ability to communicate with computers. Book one

***Tomorrow Code* by Brian Falkner FAL**

Two New Zealand teenagers receive a desperate SOS from their future selves and set out on a quest to stop an impending ecological disaster that could mean the end of humanity.

***The True Meaning of Smekday* by Adam Rex REX**

When her mother is abducted by aliens on Christmas Eve (or "Smekday" Eve since the Boov invasion), 11 year-old Tip hops in the family car and heads south to find her and meets an alien Boov mechanic named J-Lo who agrees to help her and save the planet from disaster.

***Truesight* by David Stahler STA**

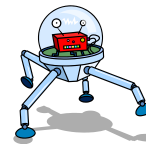
On a distant planet, in a utopian community of the blind, one young man discovers he can see, but is reluctant to reveal this truth. Book one

***Uglies* by Scott Westerfeld WES**

In Tally's world, your sixteenth birthday brings an operation that turns you from a repellent ugly into a stunningly attractive pretty and catapults you into a high-tech paradise where your only job is to have a really great time. In just a few weeks Tally will be there, but is the operation all it's cracked up to be?

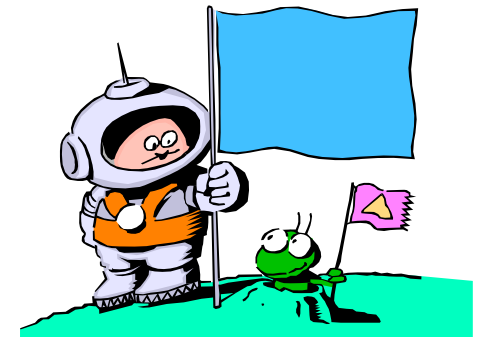
***Unwind* by Neal Shusterman SHU**

***Adoration of Jenna Fox* by Mary Pearson PEA**

In the not-too-distant future, when biotechnological advances have made synthetic bodies and brains possible but illegal, a seventeen-year-old girl, recovering from a serious accident and suffering from memory lapses, learns a startling secret about her existence.

***Among the Hidden* by Margaret Haddix HAD**

In a future where the Population Police enforce the law limiting a family to only two children, Luke has lived all his twelve years in isolation and fear on his family's farm, until another "third" convinces him that the government is wrong. Book one

***Bunker 10* by Jan-Andrew Henderson HEN**

Something is going terribly wrong at the top secret Pinewood Military Installation, and the teenage geniuses who study and work there are about to discover a horrible truth as they lead a small military force trying to retrieve data and escape before the compound self-destructs.



***The City of Ember* by Jeanne DuPrau DUP**

In the year 2341, twelve-year-old Lina trades jobs on Assignment Day to be a Messenger to run to new places in her decaying but beloved city, perhaps even to glimpse Unknown Regions.

***Declaration* by Gemma Malley MAL**

In 2140 England, where drugs enable people to live forever and children are illegal, teenaged Anna, an obedient "Surplus" training to become a house servant, discovers that her birth parents are trying to find her. Book one

***Enchantress from the Stars* by Louise Engdahl**

When young Elana unexpectedly joins the team leaving the spaceship to study the planet Andrecia, she becomes an integral part of an adventure involving three very different civilizations, each one centered on the third planet from the star in its own solar system.

***Epic* by Conor Kostick KOS**

On New Earth, a world based on a video role-playing game, fourteen-year-old Erik persuades his friends to aid him in some unusual gambits in order to save Erik's father from exile and safeguard the futures of each of their families. Book one

***Feed* by M.T. Anderson AND**

In the future most people have computer implants in their heads to control their environment. Titus, a teenager whose ability to read, write, and even think for himself has been almost completely obliterated by his "feed," a transmitter implanted directly into his brain, meets Violet, a girl who decides to fight the feed.

***Ender's Game* by Orson Scott Card CAR**

Aliens had attacked earth twice and nearly wiped out humanity. To ensure survival in the next encounter, the world government began breeding military geniuses and training them from childhood. Book one

***Exodus* by Julie Bertagna BER**

In the year 2100, as the island of Wing is about to be covered by water, fifteen-year-old Mara discovers the existence of New World sky cities that are safe from the storms and rising waters, and convinces her people to travel to one of these cities in order to save themselves.

***Firestorm* by David Klass KLA**

After centuries of abuse, the earth is dying, and it's up to Jack to reverse the decline before the Turning Point. When he learns he has been sent from the future to help, Jack receives help from an unusual dog and a shape-shifting female fighter. Book one

***Found* by Margaret Haddix HAD**

When thirteen-year-olds Jonah and Chip, who are both adopted, learn they were discovered on a plane that appeared out of nowhere, full of babies with no adults on board, they realize that they have uncovered a mystery involving time travel and two opposing forces, each trying to repair the fabric of time.



***GemX* by Nicky Singer SIN**

Sixteen-year-old Maxo Strang, the most perfect human ever made, suddenly discovers a "crack" in his face, which leads him to expose his community's dark underworld of secret scientific research and the city's corrupt supreme leader.

***The Giver* by Lois Lowery LOW**

Given his lifetime assignment at the Ceremony of Twelve, Jonas becomes the receiver of memories shared by only one other in his community and discovers the terrible truth about the society in which he lives.

***The Glitch in Sleep* by John Hulme HUL**

When twelve-year-old Becker Drane is recruited by The Seems, a parallel universe that runs everything in The World, he must fix a disastrous glitch in the Department of Sleep that threatens everyone's ability to ever fall asleep again.

***The Hitchhiker's Guide to the Galaxy* by Douglas Adams ADD**

Seconds before Earth is demolished to make way for a galactic freeway, Arthur Dent is plucked off the planet by his friend, Ford Prefect, who has been posing as an out-of-work actor for the last fifteen years but is really a researcher for the revised edition of The Hitchhiker's Guide to the Galaxy. Book one

***Hole in the Sky* by Pete Hautman HAU**

In a future world ravaged by a mutant virus, sixteen-year-old Ceej and three other teenagers seek to save the Grand Canyon from being flooded, while trying to avoid capture by a band of renegade Survivors.

***The House of the Scorpion* by Nancy Farmer FAR**

In a future where humans despise clones, Matt enjoys special status as the young clone of El Patrón, the 142-year-old leader of a corrupt drug empire nestled between Mexico and the United States.
