Community

Spanning almost 2,000 square miles, the Anchorage School District serves the educational needs of a student populace surrounding the city of Anchorage. The Anchorage School District educates almost 47.624 students and has more than 100 schools and programs. Located in the largest city in Alaska, the district enjoys a diversified economic base. The student body is culturally diverse as well with minority students comprising of 58.20 percent of the student population. This diverse student population provides students the ability to interact with peers backgrounds. different from many expanding their knowledge of other cultures and preparing for life in a global society. A 2013 study has shown that Anchorage has the most diverse high schools in the U.S. Students in the ASD English Language Learners Program speak an amazing 99 different languages at home.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Four credits of Language Arts

• One year of each English I, II, III, and English IV or their equivalents

Three credits of Math

• Six semesters of Mathematics elective. Algebra requirement must be fulfilled through Classes or examination

Four credits of Social Studies

- World History 1 and 2
- United States History 1 and 2
- One semester of History/Social Science
- One semester of Alaska Studies
- One semester of Economics
- One semester of U.S. Government

Three credits of Science

- Two semesters of Life Science
- Two semesters of Physical Science
- Two semesters of additional Science

Three semesters of Physical/Health Education are required. Elective credit must be earned to replace a Physical Education/Health Education requirement that is waived.

Fourteen semesters of Elective courses are required, allowing students an opportunity to pursue individual educational goals.

Students must complete the above 22.5 credits to graduate.

Grading System

Most grades are based on a 4-point system, the exception being Advanced Placement classes which are based on a 5-point system. The following is used in classes based on a 4-point system.

A = 4.0	90 – 100
B = 3.0	80 – 89
C = 2.0	70 – 79
D = 1.0	60 – 69
F = 0	59 or below

Advanced Placement & Honors Programs

Advanced Placement courses are offered in English, US History, Economics, American Government, Chemistry, Physics, Biology, Calculus, and Spanish. Honors courses in English, World History, and U.S. History are available in grades 9, and 10. Advanced courses such as Biology II and Chemistry II round out the program.
