# **New in This Issue:**

# Change in Early Pick-Up Policy | Effective August 14, 2025

Many schools in the Anchorage School District have moved, or are now deciding to shift, to a move regulated early pick-up policy— and Polaris is following suit. To reduce the disruption to instructional learning time, no students will be called down from classes during the last 30

minutes of the school day, unless a pre-arrangement has been made with the office no less than 1 hour before the end of the school day. In addition, we request that a minimum of 1 hour notice be given to the office prior to all early pick ups (at any time during the school day) so that teachers can be notified without interrupting the classes in progress.

Parents are able to notify the office of early pick up needs by calling the attendance line or by entering a notification in <u>Parent Connect</u>.

#### **School Start and Dismissal Times**

Our first day of school for all K-12 students is August 14th. Unlike the rest of ASD, we will not be staggering our start date. Elementary students will join their family groups and become acquainted (or reacquainted) with their teacher and peers. Our secondary students will enter into their fall intensives. Family group assignments and secondary intensive placements, along with secondary fall class schedules, will be available on Parent and StudentConnect on August 8th.

As a School of Choice here in ASD, Polaris operates on a different schedule. This affects our school start/end times, our PLC days, and our Conference Days. Please take time to read the

information outlined below and <u>download our school calendar</u> to keep track of our unique differences

- School starts at 8:30 for all K-12 students. Our doors will open at 8:10. Elementary students arriving before 8:30 will report to either the gym or the library.
- Dismissal is as follows:
  - Standard Day Schedule (beginning 8/25/25), all K-12 students are dismissed at 3:00PM
  - Intensive Schedule (beginning 8/14/25 8/22/25) all K-12 students are dismissed at 2:00PM.
  - PLC ½ Day Schedule- all K-12 students are dismissed at 11:30AM. Please see the Polaris School Calendar for exact dates.

# **School Supplies**

For both elementary and secondary students— we recommend holding off on buying any/all school supplies. We understand the draw to buy that fresh box of crayons or new mechanical pencils— however, our elementary teachers take care of all that for you, and our secondary students will receive course requirements from their teachers once regular semester classes begin on August 25. #### **Class Placements & Course Schedules**

Elementary Class Placements & Secondary Course Schedules, including Fall Intensive Placements, will be available on <u>Parent and StudentConnect</u> on August 8th.

#### **Secondary Master Schedule**

The Secondary Master Schedule is available to view on our <u>website</u>. A notable change from previous years is a move from a block schedule for our middle school classes. Middle School classes will now follow a 6-period day, attending each class every day. For High School, we will keep with 4th and 5th period on a block schedule, alternating the days on which those two classes meet.

# **Secondary Fall Intensives | Payments Due**

Secondary students will start the school year in Fall Intensives, and payment is now due! In order for our secondary teachers to have materials on hand in time, we appreciate prompt payment. #### A Last Few Important Need-to-Knows:

#### **ASD Registration**

Online registration is now open for returning students. All students need to register before the start of every school year. Please log in to <u>ParentConnect</u> to complete your child's registration. You can also complete student registration in-person by coming into the front office.

As a lottery school, Polaris relies on early registration of all our students to ensure that we are only offering lottery seats when available. With a waitlist surpassing 1,000 students, we appreciate your assistance with this process. If you know you will not be returning to Polaris this school year, please contact the front office as soon as possible.

#### **Attendance Policy**

In accordance with Alaska State Statute, the Anchorage School District and the schools within it are required to adhere to specific attendance policies and procedures. At Polaris, we stick closely to this policy as attendance is of paramount importance to student success, especially here in a

program that offers unique opportunities for accelerated and rigorous learning. <u>Please see our website for more information</u>.

#### **Technology Policy**

At Polaris, we believe that technology can, and should, be used to enhance students' education without distracting or limiting their access to academic engagement and social interaction. Adopted in the Fall of 2024, Polaris has moved to a Cell Phone Free Campus. Students, families, and staff will be asked to enter the building technology-free. All cell phones, smart watches, and personal laptops should be silenced and stored out of sight. Only with direct permissions from a teacher or staff member can students access their personal devices for educational purposes throughout the school day. We request that families help support us in this initiative that proved extremely beneficial last school year by following the same guidelines while on campus that we ask of our students. #### The Polaris Parking Lot

Polaris is a pick-up/drop-off-only school. No district bus transportation is available at any time. During peak drop-off and pick-up times, the parking lot is a busy place with many students and families with small children. **Extreme care, caution, and courtesy are expected to be exercised by everyone at all times.** Safety is always the highest priority. Please take time to review our parking safety rules and etiquette outlined on our <u>website</u>, but a few essential components are listed below:

- The speed limit while on Ashwood and within the parking lot is 5 m.p.h.
- The use of cell phones or other distracting devices while driving is prohibited.
- The crosswalks are designated for pedestrians; They have the right-of-way!
- When dropping off, please pull all the way around the side of the building before allowing your child to exit the car.
- When picking up, K-3 families are encouraged to park in the parking lot and enter the building to pick up their child from their classroom at dismissal time. This is mandatory for Kindergarten students.
- No queuing at the front doors—pull all the way around the side of the building, or park in a designated parking space.
- When exiting our parking lot, please make a right turn towards Brayton Drive. This helps the flow of traffic in and out of our parking lot.
- Respect the handicap spaces. If you do not have a handicap sticker or plate, you can not park there, even to wait for your child.
- Be patient and use common courtesy, and give yourself extra time in the morning and afternoon.

#### **Volunteers in our School**

We want YOU to help in classrooms, on field trips, and during community events. Please ensure you have your ASD volunteer application completed. Additionally, if you are able and willing to drive on field trips, a driver application form needs to be submitted each school year. Please see the <u>ASD website</u> for more information.

#### **Immunizations**

Alaska State Law requires that all students are up-to-date on their vaccinations in order to attend public school. Over the next few days, Nurse Patty will be reviewing records to ensure compliance and reminders will be sent to families if records are missing. Please be sure all required immunizations are completed and turned in to Nurse Patty by 8:30AM on August 14. If we do not have your child's vaccination records on file, they will be sent home. For religious exemption, you must complete the <u>Religious Exemption Form</u> and turn it into Nurse Patty no later than the first day of school. This form must be dated July 1 or later. #### **Health Screening**

Health screens will begin right away, and this includes hearing, vision, height and weight for students in K, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 7, and 10. You will be notified if there are any concerns. If you have concerns regarding hearing and vision for your child and they are in a grade not mentioned, please contact the nurse.

#### Illness

Per ASD Policy, students becoming ill during the school day **must report to the nurse.** If it is necessary to go home or to a doctor, the nurse will inform the parent/guardian and the student will be released from school. Students leaving due to illness without properly checking out will be counted as truant from those classes missed.

#### Medication

If your child requires medication during the school day, or if they have emergency medications, the appropriate medication forms and/or care plans must be on file. This includes over-the-counter medications.
