Making Smart Phones less 'Smart' | Family Help Session

Algorithm got you down? Concerned that the infinite scroll might have a down side? You're not alone, and you have options. Several students have asked for help managing their interactions with their devices, particularly with their smartphones. To this end, Bryan has arranged to host Geoff and Oliver Wright after school during our next half-day, April 30, at 11:45, in room 149. Geoff is a semi-retired local tech entrepreneur and will discuss the why and how of making our smartphones a little less interesting and addictive. Oliver is Geoff's youngest son and a recent Polaris graduate, and he'll be able to provide a more youthful perspective on how life is different in the absence of social media and a device that directs his attention. We anticipate a short introduction followed by a question-and-answer session that could extend as long as people are interested. Students and parents are encouraged to attend together. We're trying to arrange for a group of around 5-8 families to have a good variety of experiences and concerns while still maintaining a personal small group discussion in a classroom. Mt. Spurr | Preparing for a 'Likely' Eruption

ASD will be sending out communications to families on Friday, including a link to access a new webpage resource they are putting together with information on the district's safety plans. However, I wanted to be sure to give our community information that I currently have to help ease any fears and to help with your families planning and preparation. Please note, if/when Mt. Spurr does erupt, swift communication will be given to families with information on the district's/indpendent school's action plans and how to respond. Here is information we currently have:

If Mount Spurr Erupts

- If school is NOT in session and ashfall is imminent, ASD will close schools.
- If school IS in session and ashfall is imminent, expect early dismissal.

 Communication will come from the individual school on the dismissal protocol.

How to Make Sure You Are Ready

- Have 3-5 days of food, water, and medications at home in case of disruptions.
- Have spare air filters for your vehicles and homes to prevent damage from ash buildup.

Parking Lot Safety Reminders:

- To help with the flow of traffic at drop-off and pick-up, please plan to make a right turn only off Ashwood and onto 64th heading to Brayton Drive. This helps to avoid left turns towards Meadow and Rilke and helps get more vehicles into our parking lot to drop-off/pick up students.
- Safety, kindness, and respect are not only important qualities to live by, but they are also essential components of our school community. At no time is it acceptable to speed, drive aggressively, disrespect another parent, or use profanity around our students. Community members displaying this behavior will be reported to APD.
- Pull all the way around the building to load/unload and be mindful not to block the flow of entry into our parking lot. At no time should cars be left unattended when positioned at the sidewalk; if you need to come into the building, please park in a designated parking lot space.
- Please refrain from using cell phones (texting or making calls) will driving or queuing in our pick-up/drop-off line. If you need to make a call or use your personal device, please be parked in a marked parking space.
