



After that, we will head out into the world to practice our art lesson, write using the prompts, and then have free time to write and draw whatever inspires us. Possible locations will be areas around Chester Creek and the Coastal Trail, areas in and around Loussac Library, the museum, and our own Peace Garden. Each day will bring us to a new location and everyday will have time outside.

Investigate scenarios that turn everything upside down, both plausible and fantastic. We will study catastrophes from the past and our fascination with world-ending events. Plan how you are going to survive. We'll do practical things (earthquake preparedness, go bags and first aid kits) but mostly we will have a lot of fun analyzing what could go wrong and what to do about it. This will involve prolonged outdoor activities and some intense simulations.

Creature Creation:

Introduction to sculptural arts to bring imaginary creatures to life.

Credit Count: Art Elective credit

Class Fee: approximately \$70.00 TBD. Cost may be \$0 if funded by parent group.



Come and learn the basics of sculpture through creating creatures. You will learn the basics of how to go from a sketch to a full creature. The skills we will be practicing include the following:

- 1. Basic sculptural techniques and assemblage
- 2. Introduction to sculpture using oil clays and epoxy clays.
- 3. Basic needle felting techniques
- 4. Character design
- 5. Armature building
- 6. Painting techniques for miniatures and clay creations



In this intensive, it's everything PAPER! We will make our own homemade stationery from recyclables, learn the art of paper quilling, pop-up cards, paper lanterns, paper layering, create artistic origami, cardboard miniature structures/houses/bookshelves, and anything else you can imagine. This intensive will have a low cost or be free.

Hunting and Gathering (and hunter safety certification)

Hunting and Gathering is an excellent way to eat healthy, be more connected to our food, and live close to the earth. If you're interested in future hunts, interested in spring greens and interested in living in sync with Alaska's bounty, this intensive is for you.

The Hunting: We'll take the ADF&G (Alaska Department of Fish and Game) online Hunter Safety course for certification and then have our Field Training Day (4-5hours) at the Rabbit Creek Shooting Range. We'll work with the archery pros and get a lesson shooting with bows. And we'll hear from elders and invite in multi-cultural perspectives about subsistence, hunting issues, and land use/governance in Alaska.

The Gathering: We'll learn about local foods that can be gathered in the spring, for food or medicinal use, and we'll go out to gather. Depending on our finds, we'll prepare and eat together. This will likely happen with daily afternoon outings, so be ready to walk to Chester Creek and our surrounding green spaces.

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

POTTERY INTENSIVE



This class will be an introductory course to pottery. Students will learn and explore

throwing pots on a wheel as well as sculptural techniques such as coil pottery, pinch pot and slab building. Each technique will be taught in an introductory lesson and then students will have time throughout the intensive to practice each skill. The course will include other skills needed to achieve a final product, such as trimming, glazing, and surface design.

Due to the nature of pottery and the kiln firing timetable, students may not have time to glaze all their pieces of work during intensive hours, and some pieces will need to be glazed after intensives end, during the last week of school.

The course fee covers clay, glazes, and other materials needed for the class. Students will keep all their pieces, except at least one that will be sold during a fundraiser for the school.














To Muppet or Not to Muppet
