ELL Summer Enrichment, ASD/UAA Summer Bridge Program, Summer graduates

Students had a variety of opportunities to continue learning over the summer. At Chugach Optional, an enrichment program for English Language Learners wove together lessons in science, math, art, and language which bolstered learning in all academic areas. Developing relationships with teachers and each other built their confidence and developed their language skills along with other foundational tools that will help them succeed in school and life.

The Summer Bridge Program between ASD and UAA held a three-week "Reacting to the Past" session that boosted critical thinking, speaking, reading, writing, research, and experimentation skills. A highlight of the session was a role-playing game based on the U.S. Constitutional Convention of 1787 where students dressed up and acted out the part of delegates for a hands-on civics lesson.

And for 45 students - almost double last year's number - this summer saw the culmination of all their hard work as they walked the stage at East High for graduation. We're proud of them for their dedication to meeting the graduation requirements and joining the class of 2018. Congratulations!



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ADA improvements underway at Gruening Middle School

With only about 100 days over the summer to complete construction jobs, ASD's Capital Planning and Construction Department hits the ground running once schools empty out at the end of the school year. This year, they're working on 28 projects totaling over \$44 million which includes roof replacements, HVAC upgrades, new generators, and a variety of other improvements made possible through bond funds approved by voters in 2017. West High School is the site of the largest project as it receives \$10 million in roof and seismic upgrades. All facilities are expected to be available for students when classes resume on Aug. 20, however some projects will continue into the fall.
