# What is **Alaska Middle College School?** (AMCS)

- Dual enrollment with UAA and ASD
- Goals - Transition support for students completing college credit while still in high school & meeting graduation requirements
- Outcomes
  - Completion of high school diploma requirements
  - Completion of college course credits
  - **Potential** to earn a UAA Associate of Arts Degree



# Who Covers the Cost?

Anchorage School District pays for

- UAA Tuition & Fees
- Books
- Bus Transportation
- High School Staff

\*Summer courses and certain elective courses are not covered by ASD.



# Who should consider applying?

ASD Sophomores and Juniors who are:

- Ready to step into a college environment
- Ready to accept college-level independence
- Qualify to take college-level math *and/or* English

What does *ready* mean?

- Shows academic preparedness
- Maintains strong attendance record
- Demonstrates maturity, responsibility & independence



# High School Primary v. Affiliate Enrollment

- AMCS is primary enrollment for student:
  - Diploma issued from AMCS
  - Honor Grad status through AMCS
  - Assigned counselor through AMCS
- Students can maintain involvement with affiliate school (some limitations):
  - Social activities
  - Athletics
  - Prom
  - Yearbook
  - Graduation ceremony





# Can students still play sports?



- Students can participate in athletics at their affiliate high school
- All ASAA athletic eligibility rules apply
- Athletic eligibility is only determined on a semester basis through AMCS
  - Student cannot regain athletic eligibility at the quarter because UAA does not issue quarter grades

## Testing Opportunities

### UAA Placement Assess Accuplacer

UAA uses Accuplacer, a computerized placement test, to determine if students are only permitted to register for English courses at the level indicated by the student's Accuplacer, ACT or SAT scores.

Opportunities to take Accuplacer:

- Students will need to bring their high school ID or a government issued ID, such as a driver's license.
- Students will need to be prepared to use their ASD ID numbers.
- The Anchorage School District covers the fee for AMCS applicants to take the Accuplacer. Applicants will **not** be required to pay the testing fee.

# Transfer Credits & The AA Degree

  - Middle College advisor works with students to align courses
- Important to keep a copy of all UAA course syllabi for your records
- Associate of Arts is 60 credits
  - (34-37 GER credits)

# What are the LA & Math **Advisories**?

- High school support for college enrollment
- Attendance is required first semester, subsequently may be required based on college grades
- Credit class – .5 elective credit
- Expectations for passing advisory classes are laid out in the syllabi
- Pass/fail
- Dedicated space to complete college work
- Academic support by certificated ASD teacher

# Single Course Enrollment

- AMCS Students may request to take one course at their affiliate school.
- Single course enrollments can be difficult to schedule and are often not possible.
- College courses and advisories will take scheduling priority over single course enrollments.
- To be approved, the requested course must not conflict with any other scheduled courses on any day of the week.
- If a student Withdraws from or earns a grade of D or F in a college class, a single course enrollment will not be permitted the following semester.
- AMCS students are encouraged to take foreign languages, music, art, and other elective classes through UAA rather than as single course enrollments.



## PE Options

- Apex - PE and health
- PE waivers from sports and ROTC
- Single course enrollment at affiliate school
- Self-pay for UAA PE class or First Aid class
- Summer school



# How do we determine full-time status?

A student is considered a full time high school student when enrolled in

- **Six** semester-long high school classes (3 HS credits)

or

- **Three** 3-credit college classes (3 HS credits)

Credit issued by college	Credit equivalency for ASD
1-2 college credit course	.5 ASD credit
3-4 college credit course ( <i>most courses</i> )	1.0 ASD credit
5-6 college credit course	1.5 ASD credit

\*Full time status is required to attend AMCS

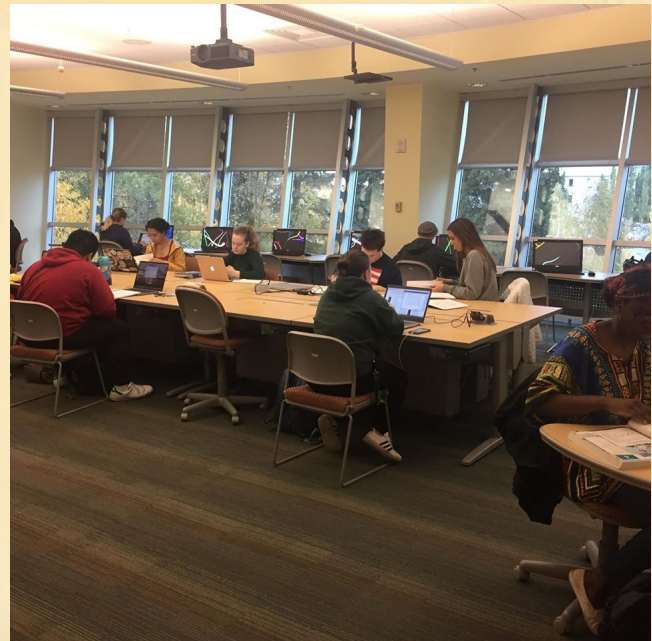

- Make sure your student has a Release of Information on file at UAA so you can speak with the advisors

# Activities at UAA

- Middle College students are not permitted to participate in university clubs, sports, and certain activities until they are 18
- Middle College students are not permitted to work as student worker on campus until they are 18

## Campus Safety

- AMCS students are in classes with the normal university population
- Students should report any unwanted, inappropriate, or questionable behaviors to a Middle College staff member
- Study groups should take place on campus





# FAQs

**Can AMCS students walk in the graduation ceremony at their affiliate school?**

Yes. Students will earn an ASD high school diploma from AMCS. Students will commence in the AMCS graduation and may also participate in their affiliate high school graduation as per ASD specifications.

**Can AMCS students participate in the athletics programs at their affiliate school?**

Yes. Students can participate in a sports program with their affiliate school. All ASAA eligibility requirements still apply. If a student is interested in participating in athletics, they should discuss their intent during the meeting with their AMCS UAA academic advisor and their affiliate school counselor so they are not scheduled in late afternoon classes.

**Can AMCS students attend dances at their affiliate school?**

Yes. AMCS students are allowed to participate in extracurricular activities at their affiliate school. In addition to being issued a Wolf Card, each AMCS student will be issued an ID card for their affiliate school.

**Can AMCS students attend sports competitions at their affiliate school?**

Yes. AMCS students should also be allowed to purchase an activity sticker from their affiliate school.

**Can AMCS students receive academic awards or honor grad recognition from their affiliate school?**

No. These recognitions will be awarded through AMCS. Similarly, AMCS students should not be included in the running for valedictorian or salutatorian at their affiliate school.

**Can AMCS students qualify for the UA Scholars program at their affiliate school?**

It depends. If they attend their affiliate school as a junior and fall within the top 10% of their class, they should be included when reporting to the UA Scholars program at the end of the school year. If they attend AMCS as a junior and they qualify amongst their AMCS cohort, they will be included in the submission from AMCS.

**Do AMCS students have to pay for the college tuition or textbooks?**

It depends. These costs are covered by ASD for most General Education Requirements (GERs). A list of approved UAA courses will be provided to students prior to registering for classes. Students can meet all ASD graduation requirements and potentially earn an Associates degree through courses on the approved list.

Students can opt to register for classes not on the approved list; however, the student will be responsible for the course tuition and any associated textbooks. Registering for non-approved courses must be done in consultation with the AMCS counselor and the UAA Academic Advisor.

**Can AMCS students take evening classes?**

Yes, if they meet the minimum placement requirements. Please note, if the evening course uses a textbook different than the one for the daytime course, the student may have to cover the cost of the book.

**Is bus transportation provided?**

Yes. Students can take their regular bus route to their affiliate high school and catch the bus to the King Tech High School (formerly KCC). Students enrolled on Main Campus can catch a campus shuttle from KTHS. A more detailed description of the bus service, including departure and arrival times is available on the website.
