Graduation

Graduation 2022 is Friday, May 13 at 7 pm at the Alaska Airline Center. **Graduation Practice:** Graduation practice will be held in person on **Monday, May 2nd, Time: 1:30-2:30 pm, Location: King Tech High School, Meeting Room 1**. If you are walking with AMCS, it is expected that you attend practice.

Honors Ceremony: During graduation practice, we will be honoring seniors who have earned their Seal of Biliteracy, Academic Letter Awards, and distributing honor cords. All seniors are invited to participate in this ceremony, not just those walking with AMCS. We will have pizza and cupcakes to celebrate after our formal practice. If you are not walking with AMCS and choose to not attend practice, you may collect your cords from Ms. Sherwood after May 2.

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End of Spring Semester

<u>Juniors:</u> All juniors will participate in a week-long Junior Seminar, May 2-6. Students will attend either a morning (8:00 AM-9:50 AM) or afternoon (11:30 AM-1:20 PM) session, which coincides with our ASD busing schedule. The seminar introduces students to career exploration, college exploration, financial aid, ACT/SAT testing, AK Performance Scholarship, and career opportunities. Over the summer, students should register to take the ACT/SAT, research their top colleges, identify funding, investigate scholarships, visit colleges, explore workforce opportunities, etc. Come fall, students will enroll in a Senior Seminar and begin applying to their top colleges, submitting applications for scholarships, and/or applying for jobs.

<u>ASD AMCS Classes</u>: As a reminder, you are **required to attend** all ASD AMCS classes until May 19 this includes advisories.

<u>Final Exams</u>: UAA final exams are on April 26-30 ASDVirtual (seniors) final exams are due by 3 pm May 6. ASDVirtual (juniors) final exams are due by May 18.

Registrar's Range

<u>Grade changes:</u> If a course grade changed after grades appeared in your student account in Q, or your repeated a class to replace a prior grade, <u>you must notify Mrs. Sherwood</u>. If the grade is for a college course, contact your UAA advisor once the grade has been posted on your UAA transcript. Your advisor will share the updated grade information with AMCS. Please note that grade changes/replacements are manual, and we will not know when your grade changes.

<u>Transcript Requests:</u> The Anchorage School District uses <u>ScribOrder</u> to request educational records.

- If you are under the age of 18, a parent/guardian must be the one to submit the request. Be sure to have requests legibly signed.
- All ScribOrders will be sent by e-delivery unless a specific request for a mailed copy is entered in the "Special Instructions" box.
- Most post-secondary institutions can receive transcripts electronically so please enter their information. Sending e-documents gets your transcripts to the schools much sooner than mailing, and it saves everybody time.
- Transcripts cannot be emailed to a 3rd party through ScribOrder. They must be mailed. Mailing information can be entered in the "Delivery Address" section.
- Remember, your school is Alaska Middle College!

UAA Makes Buildings More Accessible

Chancellor Parnell shared UAA's efforts to provide more accessibility to UAA buildings. In an email to students, starting April 4, students will no longer need their WolfCard during the day to access most buildings on the Anchorage Campus. Please see specific details below.

- Students and staff attending evening classes will continue to use WolfCards to access campus buildings.
- Buildings on the Anchorage campus that are not connected to the east-west Spine will be open and unlocked (accessible without a WolfCard) from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.
- Buildings and parking garages on campus that are connected to the east-west Spine will be open and unlocked from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.
- UAA facilities that will remain locked and restricted to WolfCard access, unless opened to accommodate an event or lecture, include Residence Life facilities, ANSEP buildings, the Ecosystem-Biomedical Health Laboratory, the Wendy Williamson Auditorium, the Native Arts studio, and various non-academic facilities support buildings.

In addition, students can continue to use their WolfCards to enter general access buildings seven days a week, 7 a.m. to 11 p.m. With their WolfCards, employees can enter general access facilities 24/7, including the building in which they work. Find out what buildings qualify as general access and more information here.

UAA Advising

Current Juniors will have until April 15th to complete their advising for fall 2022 classes. After April 15th, priority advising is reserved for new AMCS students. If you are a junior and have not submitted your midterm progress report form and/or schedule your advising appointment, please do so immediately. Registration opens on April 18, and you will not be able to register for classes unless you have completed both of those steps.

UAA Financial Aid Award

Seniors attending UAA in the fall and completed their Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) can receive an estimate of their award amount by contacting the UAA Financial Aid office (907-786-1480). The exact award amount will not be available on UAOnline until seniors complete their UAA admissions application by sending in their final transcript to UAA. However, seniors can receive an estimate by calling the Financial Aid office to begin planning their classes for fall 2022 now.
