Kicking Off 2022-23 School Year

Welcome to Alaska Middle College School. The start of the school year is just a few weeks away, and it is time to start planning to head back into the classrooms. Students' first day of school is August 18. AMCS' New Student Orientation is on August 18, 19, and 22. All new full-time students must attend each day to learn more about the program, get a photo ID, tour the UAA campus, and meet other classmates. Returning students are required to attend Monday, August 22. All Health Programs students follow their home high school and AMCS schedules. Orientation will occur during your advisory class.

AMCS (high school schedule) starts Tuesday, August 23 with Monday classes meeting Friday, August 26.

Orientation Week

<u>August 18,19, and 22</u>: Students will <u>not</u> report to KTHS but UAA campus, see the full schedule on the <u>AMCS</u> website.

<u>Transportation and Technology Need</u>: In planning for the school's start-up, we need to know what the student's needs are for transportation or technology. The following survey will allow students to identify their needs to begin to finalize schedules and prepare Chromebooks for distribution during orientation. <u>Please complete the survey by August 15.</u>

Students can drive to KTHS and UAA during orientation week, and no parking permits are required for either campus. KTHS student parking is behind the building.

<u>Food and Supplies</u>: AMCS will only provide a small snack on the first day. **Please plan to bring your food and water with you each day during orientation**. You may snack throughout the day as long you are not disruptive to others. Please bring notetaking supplies or a laptop to take notes.

Lunch Service

KTHS does not qualify for a lunch program under the National School Lunch Program; therefore, there is no food service program on campus. Students are encouraged to bring food and water when attending classes at KTHS. KTHS offers a lunch break from 10:55 am – 11:30 am. If a student qualifies for a free or reduced lunch, a snack pack is available in the main office.

Communications and Student Expectations

AMCS is a hybrid program in which students do not report to KTHS or UAA campus every day. The flexibility of the schedule requires students to communicate differently with their teachers, professors, advisor, and counselor. AMCS and UAA's primary communications are to email you. AMCS requires students to check their inboxes every day. Please note, that email addresses used for ASD Canvas courses do not work outside the program. You will need to update your ASD student information with another email address to receive AMCS communications. Also, we ask parents to review their contact information on their student's account as we are encountering disconnected phone numbers or receiving emails back as undeliverable, Parent Connection.

Commuting between KTHS and UAA

Students will be moving between KTHS and UAA campuses. Students are <u>prohibited</u> from walking between campuses as no sidewalks allow **safe** crossings between the two properties. Please plan to use your transportation or the ASD buses.

Registrar's Range


<u>Transcript Requests:</u> The Anchorage School District uses <u>ScribOrder</u> for all educational records requests. If you are under the age of 18, a parent/guardian must be the one to submit the request. Be sure to have them legibly signed. We can send e-documents to most post-secondary institutions, so please enter this information in your request. Sending e-documents gets your transcripts to the schools much sooner than mailing, and it saves everybody time!

<u>Register Now:</u> The Anchorage School District **requires** all students to be registered every year through <u>ASD Parent Connection</u>: Once you have logged in, look for QuickLinks on the left and click on your student's picture. Information on how to reset your PIN and password is found here also.

In ParentConnect you can **update your contact information**, view your student's unofficial transcripts, demographic data, class schedule, attendance, pay for lunches and activities, and much more!

ASD must verify address changes, please send proof of residency to Jane Todd, AMCS Registrar at todd jane@asdk12.org.

<u>Single Course Enrollment:</u> Students wishing to take a class at their affiliate school must complete the <u>Part-Time Enrollment Form</u> and email it to Mrs. Sherwood. You must be in good academic standing and it can't conflict with AMCS or UAA courses.

• <u>Schedules:</u> The plan is to email students a screenshot of their schedule before the first day of school. You can check out the AMCS advisory class schedule on the AMCS website. For returning students, if you would like to have an advisory class this semester, please email me with your request.

- All new AMCS students will be scheduled into Math, Language Arts, and Science Advisory courses. Advisory classes are scheduled around your UAA class schedule. If we need to make changes or adjustments, we can do this during the first week of classes (August 22-26).
- Schedules will be emailed out to students the week of August 15th.
- Credit by choice programs must have approval before starting the course. Please see the ASD Credit By Choice guidelines about the program. <u>Graduation Requirements / Credit By Choice</u>.
- Would you like to take a PE Course? Here is a link to the PE course options through ASDvirtual. <u>PE Options / Course Options</u> Email me with your choices and I'll get you scheduled.
- o If you need a letter of recommendation, please fill out a <u>Letter of Recommendation</u> form and email it to me. It's best if you change the name of the document to match your name.

Mandatory Senior and Junior Post-Secondary Transition Seminars: AMCS requires junior and senior post-secondary transition seminars this academic year. Seniors must complete a fall seminar that will cover college/trade school/other post-secondary programs' applications, essays, scholarships, recommendation letters, financial aid, etc. Each junior must complete a seminar during the spring semester that will focus on career and academic planning. Students will begin narrowing or finalizing their career/academic pathway. Areas of study are career planning, researching colleges/trade schools/other post-secondary options, analysis program/degree requirements, financial planning, Alaska Performance Scholarship (and others), etc.

<u>ACT and SAT:</u> Students planning to take the <u>ACT</u> and/or the <u>SAT</u> should sign-up soon. It is important to note that some universities may have either altered or waived their testing requirements. If you know which schools you want to apply to, make sure you check their admissions criteria.

Fee waivers for the ACT/SAT are available for students who qualify for free or reduced lunch. Additional criteria are listed at College Waiver Information. The waivers are available from Mrs. Sherwood.
