



#### Registrar's Range

<u>Grade changes:</u> If a course grade changed after grades appeared in your student account in Q, or you repeated a class to replace a prior grade, <u>you must notify Mrs. Sherwood</u>. If the grade is for a college course, contact your UAA advisor once the grade has been posted on your UAA transcript. Your advisor will share the updated grade information with AMCS. Please note that grade changes/replacements are a manual process, and we will only know if your grade changes if you tell us.

<u>Transcript Requests:</u> The Anchorage School District uses <u>ScribOrder</u> for all educational records requests. If you are under the age of 18, a parent/guardian must be the one to submit the request. Be sure to have them legibly signed. We can send e-documents to most post-secondary institutions, so please enter this information in your request. Sending e-documents gets your transcripts to the schools much sooner than mailing them, saving everybody time!

<u>Withdrawing from AMCS</u>: AMCS has a formal process to transfer out of the program that ensures the student is in good standing with UAA and AMCS. AMCS needs students to speak with their UAA advisor AND AMCS counselor before withdrawing from the program. The electronic <u>Withdrawal form</u> ensures returned textbooks and no balances are on the student account. Please note that the form requires signatures from the advisor, counselor, student, and parent.

#### Counselor's Cave

<u>Valedictorian/Salutatorian Selection Criteria</u>: The Valedictorian and Salutatorian are selected each year from the graduating class. The Valedictorian ranks first in scholarship and is considered the top student of their class; the salutatorian ranks second in scholarship and is considered the second highest student in their class. Criteria are based primarily on weighted cumulative GPA. Thus, more than one student may qualify for the valedictorian and salutatorian distinctions. GPAs are calculated in the spring semester of their senior year, and students will be notified of their honor status by the end of March.

#### **Teacher's Terrain**

<u>Junior Seminar</u>: All juniors will participate in a week-long Junior Seminar, May 8-12. Students will attend either a morning (8-9:50 am) or afternoon (11:30 am-1:20 pm) session. The seminar introduces students to career exploration, college exploration, financial aid, ACT/SAT testing, AK Performance Scholarship, and career opportunities. Over the summer, students should register to take the ACT/SAT, research their top colleges, identify funding, investigate scholarships, visit colleges, explore workforce opportunities, etc. Come fall, students will enroll in a Senior Seminar and begin applying to their top colleges, submitting applications for scholarships, and/or applying for jobs. Students need to self-enroll in the am or afternoon session; for more details, please see your AMCS advisory teacher for more information.

#### Middle College JUNIOR Progress Report & FA23 Advising Instructions

It is the time when we check on your progress in your UAA courses. Midterm grades should be available in UAOnline and/or BlackBoard between March 3 and March 19, 2023.

In order to schedule your FA23 advising appointment, you need to submit your midterm grades, your high school graduation requirements, and your proposed college courses for fall 2023.

**SUBMIT MIDTERM PROGRESS REPORT HERE.** Once you turn in your midterm grades, schedule your advising appointment by going to <a href="https://uaa.campus.eab.com/">https://uaa.campus.eab.com/</a>. Middle College advising appointments begin March 20 when the UAA FA23 schedule goes live. Registration for FA23 begins on April 3, at which point we start seeing the new fall cohort of AMCS students.

#### Middle College SENIOR Midterm Progress & Exit Survey

It is important for us to know how you are doing in your classes and to help you prepare for your next steps after high school. Seniors, please take a few minutes to complete the <u>Senior Progress & Exit Survey</u>.

Seniors do not need to submit midterm grades, although you should be aware of how you are doing in your UAA courses, and if you can pass with a C or better. Grades should be available in UAOnline and/or BlackBoard between March 3 -20, 2023.

If you have applied to UAA for fall 2023, you should meet with your advisor. To find your UAA advisor, go to <a href="https://www.uaa.alaska.edu/myuaa">https://www.uaa.alaska.edu/myuaa</a>.

Seniors DO NOT need to meet with me for fall advising. All SENIOR Middle College advising holds will be removed once the Withdrawal period is over on March 31, 2023@4PM.

#### **UAA Transcripts**

For seniors going elsewhere, official UAA transcripts can be ordered through the UAOnline Official Transcript Ordering Service (Parchment Exchange). Login to UAOnline, choose "Student Services and Account Information," select "Official Transcript Request Service," and follow the instructions.

<u>Electronic Transcripts</u>: The fastest delivery - Processed and delivered by the next business day. University of Alaska official transcript delivered by email in a secure electronic PDF. \*Before ordering an electronic transcript, please confirm with the recipient that they will accept an electronic transcript and check your unofficial transcript at UAOnline to ensure it is up-to-date.

<u>Paper Transcript</u>: Official University of Alaska paper transcript processed the next business day and mailed by the carrier of the student's choice (USPS or FedEx).
