Transportation

Junior Seminar

All juniors will participate in a week-long Junior Seminar, May 8-12. Students will attend either a morning (8-9:50 am) or afternoon (11:30 am-1:20 pm) session. The seminar introduces students to career exploration, college exploration, financial aid, ACT/SAT testing, AK Performance Scholarship, and career opportunities. Over the summer, students should register to take the ACT/SAT, research their top colleges, identify funding, investigate scholarships, visit colleges, explore workforce opportunities, etc. Come fall, students will enroll in a Senior Seminar and begin applying to their top colleges, submitting applications for scholarships, and/or applying for jobs. Students need to self-enroll in the am or afternoon session, for more details please see your AMCS advisory teacher for more information.

Registrar's Range

<u>Grade changes:</u> If a course grade changed after grades appeared in your student account in Q, or you repeated a class to replace a prior grade, <u>you must notify Mrs. Sherwood</u>. If the grade is for a college course, contact your UAA advisor once the grade has been posted on your UAA transcript. Your advisor will share the updated grade information with AMCS. Please note, grade changes/replacements are a manual process, and we will not know if your grade changes unless you tell us.

<u>Transcript Requests:</u> The Anchorage School District uses <u>ScribOrder</u> for all educational records requests. If you are under the age of 18, a parent/guardian must be the one to submit the request. Be sure to have them legibly signed. We can send e-documents to most post-secondary institutions, so please enter this information in your request. Sending e-documents gets your transcripts to the schools much sooner than mailing them, and it saves everybody time!

<u>Withdrawing from AMCS</u>: AMCS has a formal process to transfer out of the program that ensures the student is in good standing with UAA and AMCS. AMCS needs students to speak with their UAA advisor AND AMCS counselor before withdrawing from the program. The electronic <u>Withdrawal form</u> ensures textbooks are returned and no balances are on the student account. Please note, the form requires signatures from the advisor, counselor, student, and parent.

Withdrawal Deadline

If an AMCS student is in jeopardy of not passing a UAA class, and they have <u>exhausted all possible options</u> to complete the class successfully, they have the option to withdraw from the class by the UAA withdrawal deadline, **November 4, 2022**.

AMCS students who choose to withdraw from a UAA course <u>must</u> complete the College Course Grade Change Form with their UAA advisor before they can withdraw from the UAA class in UAOnline. The withdrawal form helps to ensure that the AMCS high school staff and UAA Middle College staff are aware of this decision and provide feedback to the student if necessary.

Required Title IX Training for all AMCS students

AMCS student's TITLE IX training must be completed to schedule an SP23 advising appointment. If you still need to access your TITLE IX training, log in to UAOnline and go to Student Services & Account Information, and then Student Training. On the Student Training page, click on UA Safe Title IX Training to access the TITLE IX training in BlackBoard. Once you are in BlackBoard, select Training to launch the modules. You will get a Certificate of Completion once you are done which you will need to email to your UAA Middle College advisor. If you were at the AMCS Zoom TITLE IX training, you do not need to complete the modules in UAOnline/BlackBoard.

SP23 Middle College Advising

SP23 Middle College advising appointments started on October 31, 2022, when the SP23 UAA schedule went live. Middle College students will have an advising hold on their account until they have met with their advisor. **Registration for SP23 non-degree-seeking Middle College students begins on Monday, November 28, 2022, @ 12:01 AM.**
