#### Registrar's Range

<u>Grade changes:</u> If a course grade changed after grades appeared in your student account in Q, or your repeated a class to replace a prior grade, <u>you must notify Mrs. Sherwood</u>. If the grade is for a college course, contact your UAA advisor once the grade has posted your UAA transcript. Your advisor will share the updated grade information with AMCS. Please note, grade changes/replacements are a manual process, and we will not know when your grade changes.

<u>Transcript Requests:</u> The Anchorage School District uses <u>ScribOrder</u> for all educational records requests. If you are under the age of 18, a parent/guardian must be the one to submit the request. Be sure to have them legibly sign. We can send e-documents to most post-secondary institutions, so please enter this information in your request. Sending e-documents gets your transcripts to the schools much sooner than mailing, and it saves everybody time!

#### College Applications:

- Apply as a first-year student when applying to college or university. Do not apply as a transfer student.
- If you plan on continuing your education at UAA after graduation from AMCS, you must reapply as a first year student.
- o If you plan on applying to UAF, please contact me for a fee waiver for Alaska Middle College Students before applying.
- If you are requesting a recommendation from your counselor or a teacher through your college application, it is a common courtesy that you contact the recommenders and ask if they would be willing to write a recommendation. The more lead time the better. <u>Letter of Recommendation / Recommendations</u>
- When applying for college, you should put Beth Sherwood as your high school counselor (not your affiliated school counselor). I am the person who has access to your records at AMCS.

FAFSA is an important first step in attending college. You must complete it to qualify for any financial aid at university, including loans, grants, and scholarships from universities. Even if you feel like your family's income is too high, you should still fill out the FAFSA. https://studentaid.gov/

 Any questions about the college application process? Feel free to contact me through email, or telephone, or set up a meeting in person or over zoom.

<u>Planning to graduate in December?</u> If you plan on graduating in December 2021, you need to contact Ms. Sherwood as soon as possible.

<u>Withdrawal and Advisory:</u> If you withdrew from a Fall class at UAA, you will be placed in an advisory class next semester.

<u>Part-Time school enrollments</u>: If you plan on taking a class at your affiliated high school, please fill out the <u>Part time Course Enrollment Form</u> and return it to me. I will then process it and send it to your affiliated high school. If you are in the same class all year, you don't need to resubmit the form. This is only for new classes. **Part time course enrollment forms are due by December 14th.** 

<u>Credit by Choice:</u> Credit by Choice Applications have to be filled out prior to or at the beginning of the semester. They will not be accepted after you have completed the course. <u>Credit By Choice</u>

<u>Alaska Performance Scholarship:</u> I strongly recommend that ALL of you go through the steps to ensure that you will qualify for the Alaska Performance Scholarship. Even if you have no intention of attending college in Alaska, or want to take a gap year, this is a "safety net" that if secured could help you out down the road. There are a few things that you need to do while you are still in high school.

- 1. Check with me to make sure the classes you are scheduled into this year will qualify for Alaska Performance Scholarship
- 2. Take one of these tests: ACT, SAT, WorkKeys BEFORE YOU GRADUATE. As far as we know, this is still a requirement for 2022 graduates.
- 3. Apply to and Alaskan college (UAA, UAF, UAS) or Alaskan training program
- 4. Complete the FAFSA, and send your completed FAFSA to the Alaskan college where you applied


