Annual Vocational Education Scholarship

The Purpose of this scholarship is to further the Object of Rotary through vocational development by supporting the post secondary education of graduating Anchorage area high school students to develop business, professional, and community leaders and Rotarians.

Attendance Area

Applicants must be graduating high school students within the Municipality of Anchorage including students from the Anchorage School District, any accredited private school, or any accredited home school program. Schoolarships are limited to residents of Alaska. Applicants must be able to demonstrate high school graduation prior to distribution of funds.

Scholarships will not be granted to anyone related a Trustee or related to any member of the Application Review Committee or the Interview Committee.

Post Secondary Field of Study

The award has been established to assist and encourage worthy students in pursuing post-secondary vocational education skills either in a trade school, apprenticeship, or in college. A scholarship may be awarded to a student pursuing any area of study which will purposefully and directly result in a useful employable vocation that advances the Purpose of the scholarship. **Preferential consideration will be given to students pursuing a vocational/technical or college field relating to courses offered at King Career Center and to students pursuing the "healing arts".** Scholarships will be awarded at the discretion of the scholarship Interview Committee.

Amount of Award

The amount and number of awards varies annually at the discretion of the Interview Committee.

All applicants shall submit a bound Student Portfolio that includes the following:

- Applicant name & contact information including mailing address for direct communication by Anchorage International Rotary Memorial Scholarship Fund.
- A legible handwritten essay on future career goals, plans to meet those goals, and why your field was chosen. Use black ink to optimize the quality of copies. (250 words or less.)
- Complete high school transcript including grade point average and ranking if attending an Anchorage District or Private School.
- Student ID number.
- Resume of on-the-job training in an area related to King Career Center courses (if applicable).
- Student Portfolio including noteworthy activities and accomplishments
- Detailed funding plan for achieving the educational goal.
- Three References with contact information. Include employer if applicable.

Vocational Education Scholarship

- 1. Submit the Student Portfolio and Application Form at the same time on or before the deadline date. Portfolio shall be 8-1/2 x 11 size with a protective binder. Required contents must be written in English and easily legible.
- 2. Finalists will be interviewed personally.
- 3. Student's class attendance record, essay, and ability to follow instructions will be strongly considered.
- 4. Award Payments

Prior to distribution of funds the student must provide the following information to Anchorage International Rotary Memorial Scholarship Fund not later than December 15th of the year of the scholarship award:

- Proof of registration as a full time student (12 credit hours or more, or its equivalent)
- The name of the school's proper contact person, mailing address, email address and phone number and
 the school's complete instructions for the transfer of funds.. The proper contact person is typically the
 school Registrar or financial aid office.
- The student's phone number, email address and mailing address for correspondence.
 Awards are for a full academic year with funds divided among the academic periods. Funds shall be paid directly to the school in equal installments per period for credit to the student's account. In no case will funds be distributed directly to the student.
