Project Lead the Way Engineering Pathway

The Project Lead the Way Pathway to Engineering program is a sequence of courses, which follows a proven hands-on, real world problem solving approach to learning. Students learn and apply the design process, acquire strong teamwork and communication proficiency and develop organizational, critical-thinking and problem solving skills. PTE courses complement traditional mathematics and science courses and is designed to prepare students to pursue a post-secondary education and careers in STEM-related fields. (Lottery Program)

Service Biomedical Career Academy (BCA)

Elitnaurvik (EWE):

Eltinaurvik-Within-East is designed specifically for Alaska Native and American Indian students. Eltinaurvik in Yupik means "a place to learn." EWE incorporates Native values and issues, and successfully addresses different learning styles in its activities, course offerings, and work components. EWE enjoys widespread support in the community. The primary emphasis is on building leadership through group participation, volunteerism, and empowering students to embrace their cultural heritage. Elitnaurvik provides culturally-based education counseling tutoring, and after-school activities.
