### NEWS FROM OUR SPECIALITY CLASSES:

#### Handwork Teacher, Ms. Robicheaux

The first and second graders have been making wool felted eggs for Springtime, while the 5th and 6th graders have been making felted chicks to go inside the eggs. Today (March 28th), the "Firsties" went to the woods to hunt for their eggs and discover that they had all "hatched out". It is a fun and delightful surprise for the young students to hunt for their eggs and to find the chicks inside. The upper grades students enjoy a chance to help make the surprise happen for the lower grades, with many of them making a chick for a sibling or reading buddy. The current 5th graders were all first graders when I became the handwork teacher at Winterberry. I enjoyed listening to them reminisce about the chicks they received when they were in first grade.



As my mother used to say: The Spring time is the time for eggs and the time for eggs is the Spring-y time!

#### Music Teacher, Mr. Lind

April is testing month, and due to the layout of our building our music classes have less singing and instrument playing, but more theory and history.

The upper grades (4-7, 8th grade is next) have recently completed a timeline of musical gestures, ranging from the Renaissance to the Romantic Period.

Mr. Lind featured Michael Praetorius in a recent lesson, where students created a portrait of Praetorius with Mr. Lind (by step), and while they finished the details he shared the significance Praetorius had regarding the modern recorder.

Lower grades (1, 3) are working on reading rhythms, solfege, and spoken word/steady beat ("Will You Be My Friend" feat. maraca and "What To Do" feat. triangle). 3rd grade mastered "Apple Tree" complete with correct solfege assignments.
