Hola 3rd - 6th Parents! Our next cultural celebration in Spanish class is coming up. Day of the Dead (Dia de los Muertos) is a two day (Nov 1-2) celebration for remembering and honoring the dead. Each class will learn about this holiday from a cultural perspective. The traditional foods associated with this holiday are pan de muerto (Bread of the Dead - a sweet bread) and horchata (a vanilla, cinnamon rice drink). I'm looking for bakers and horchata makers! This is NOT an easy baking project (unless you're an experienced bread maker). It takes time and effort to allow the dough to rise and to shape it in the traditional shape.
