Counselor Comments

We are so thrilled that everyone is safe after last week's earthquake. We are looking forward to having our students back at PAIDEIA and returning to sense of routine in all of our lives. Traumatic events can affect everyone differently, and I wanted to make sure parents and students are aware of how to handle stress and look for triggers in both ourselves and in our children.

Take care of ourselves first. In order to be healthy parents, caregivers and teachers, we need to make sure we are emotionally sound and ready to help our children. Take some time for yourself, reground yourself as needed so you are better prepared to deal with your child's emotional needs. It is okay to model positive self-care and teach children how to regulate their own emotions and needs.

It is also crucial to let children talk. No matter the age, have them discuss the earthquake, their triumphs, their fears, their anxieties and all their emotions. This may recreate fears and tears, but remind them of the positives. Assure your children that they are safe and how they respectively handled the situation worked well for them. Children are looking for reassurance that the chaos makes some sense to them.

As we prepare for your student to return to PAIDEIA, it is important to return to routine as soon as possible. We anticipate that students will want to discuss the earthquake and their personal stories with our staff and we are ready to hear them. Rest assured, our staff will welcome them to our school with open arms and ready to provide any needed support. If you, your family and/or loved ones need any additional outside resources including counseling, basic care needs or just another adult to touch base to, please do not hesitate to contact Doug or Michelle at any time.
