Because there are a limited number of spaces in each class, it is necessary to fill out <u>3 different choices</u>, as <u>prompted in the registration form</u>. All registrations received by March 10th will be given equal consideration. The deadline for all Intensive requests is March 10th, 2023.

Intensive confirmations will be available on March 23, 2023 in Secondary Student Connect \rightarrow Schedule (Period: AM+PM, Days: N, Term: Q3), via Elementary Family Group communication, or Parent Connect.
