Intensive Information

Intensives are a pillar within the Polaris Academic program—they offer a unique opportunity for teachers and students to learn and engage in new experiences, lessons, and activities while also providing a chance to dive deeper into content than our traditional core classes allow.

Our upcoming Winter Intensives will take the place of regular classes from Monday, January 6th to Friday, January 17th. Secondary Students—If you are interested in taking an Intensive that is not in your grade-level range, you may write a letter to the Intensive Course Teacher explaining why you want to take that particular course offering and why you feel you are qualified. If there is room in the course, the teacher will work with you and your family to accommodate your request.

Registration Information

The deadline for all intensive registration requests is November 10th, 2024.

All students & families <u>must</u> submit their registration requests via the <u>Intensive Registration</u> <u>Google Doc</u>. Due to the limited number of seats available in each class, it is necessary for all students to select three (3) different choices, as prompted in the registration form. All requests received by the deadline will be given equal consideration. Any student who does not have a request in by the deadline will be automatically placed in an intensive that has an open seat. No exceptions will be made.

Intensive confirmations will be available to view on November 14th via Parent/Student Connect. All elementary students will also receive a paper confirmation in their family group.

Payment Information

Once you receive your Intensive confirmation, associated fees can be paid online via **ParentConnect.**

Fees must be paid by Friday, December 13th to reserve your child's spot in their confirmed intensive.

Any student without intensive payment as of the first day of intensives will not be able to attend their intensive class until payment is received.

If your family needs financial assistance to cover or offset the cost associated with a given intensive, please fill out the Intensive Scholarship Application [Linked here]. Our school and our Polaris PTA works hard to raise scholarship money to provide equal access for all students to any given intensive. Please note, for intensives with large monetary costs, partial scholarships will be considered, but full scholarships are unlikely to be available in order to help support as many students/families as possible.



It's time to get to the lanes and throw some strikes! We will be spending multiple days learning rules, scoring, and technique while we bowl countless games at Center Bowl. Alcohol Ink Art (6-12)

This intensive will introduce students to alcohol inks through a series of tutorials and guided projects. Alcohol ink is a fluid art technique that uses isopropyl alcohol to move pigments around on non-porous (waterproof) media such as ceramic tiles, Yupo paper, and glass. The alcohol dries quickly when exposed to the air, leaving highly saturated pigments. The inks are layered and blended by the artist creating a unique design. Each student will receive a supply unique with their materials for the intensive which will be theirs to keep.

Breakout EDU: Unlocking Learning Through Puzzles and Simulations (6-12)

Dive into the exciting world of Breakout EDU, where students engage in interactive learning experiences through logic puzzles, simulation escape rooms, and lock box challenges where they must solve a series of clues to unlock locks to get to the next clue. This course is designed to foster the 4 C's: critical thinking, collaboration, communication, and creativity as participants work together to solve puzzles and escape from immersive scenarios. Various logic puzzles will be taught including verbal (word) quantitative (math) and nonverbal (puzzles or games without numbers or words. These will be adapted to different



levels for all students to be challenged, but also enjoy no matter their strengths! The cost associated with this intensive pays for the BreakoutEDU subscription, which students will be able to continue to access after the intensive, as well as various other materials to engage students with in-person/hands-on simulations we will be engaging in.

Under the guidance of the renowned Mellor family Ice Sculptors, you'll work with a small team to design and create sculptures out of snow here on the Polaris campus! Much of our time will be spent outside, working hard to build large blocks of snow then carve away at them to reveal your masterpieces. Students will need to dress warmly and in layers to avoid overheating as they work. We'll introduce you to a wide variety of carving techniques and tools, and leave you with skills and inspiration to create Polaris' own Fur Rondezvous snow sculpture. Carving snow can use muscles that you didn't know you had, so you can savor the soreness of days well-spent.

*This intensive is open to students in grades 6-12, however, the use of sharp, potentially hazardous hand tools will require students to remain consistently vigilant and

well-behaved; students who display irresponsibleness at any time and in any form will be immediately removed from the intensive without the possibility of course fee reimbursement.

On Alyeska days, the bus will leave Polaris at 8:45 AM and travel to Alyeska Day Lodge for morning lessons and free ski/board afternoons. We will leave Alyeska at 4:30 PM and return to Polaris by 5:30 PM. Students need to be picked up promptly at 5:30 PM each evening. Students will receive a registration packet after the class roster has been created in early November. Payment in full is due Friday, December 6. Students must take a minimum of four lessons to earn the ASD .25 PE/Winter Sport credit.
