### Sticks & Stones, Paper & Wire, 3D Sculpture Projects




#### Chess

Strategic Simulations is a board games intensive with a slight twist. We will be playing several board games that are based upon the use of strategy to win. Students will be in teams and each team will field a captain to play a game. We will do a brief amount of research on each game and see if there are historical comparisons that we can apply. This is easy for games such as Axis & Allies, but more challenging for Settlers of Catan. Teams will compete through playing a variety of strategy games, with everyone vying for the penultimate prize of Top General.

#### Layers of Light and Shadow: A Study in Watercolor

Veil painting is a watercolor technique that uses thin layers of color to almost sculpt a picture. This is an organic and meditative style of painting perfect for deep winter as we explore the play of light and dark in color and shape. We will also be taking a chance to explore Goethe's color theory, part of which is still used as a basis for the color wheel.

Due to the nature of the painting style, we will be working on multiple pieces simultaneously, and end up producing several 'practice' pieces, as well as at least 2 more complex ones.

#### Juggle, Juggle, Juggle!

Each student will set learning goals based on what experience they have with each prop and what they would like to achieve. Then, students will work with Christian to accomplish those goals. #### **Model United Nations**

There will be multiple writing assignments ranging from personal reactions to critical analyses. In addition to this, you will be expected to research and present on a topic ranging from an actor/director biography or an element of motion picture.
