School Nurse



Dear Parents and Families,

Has your family experienced nausea and vomiting recently?

Yes, there is a "bug" going around. I have seen quite a number of children in my office recently with nausea and vomiting.

One likely culprit could be a norovirus. This is a group of viruses that are known to cause gastrointestinal illness. The symptoms are nausea, vomiting, abdominal cramps

and diarrhea. Some people also experience headache, fever, chills, muscle aches and general tiredness. Onset of illness is generally within 12-24 hours of exposure and symptoms can last for at least 1-3 days. Infected persons can be contagious for up to 2 weeks after they recover.

Food and drinks can easily become contaminated by direct contact with hands or work surfaces that are contaminated with stool or vomit, or by tiny droplets from nearby vomit that lands on food. People can be infected by eating food or drinking liquids that are contaminated, by touching contaminated items then placing their hands in their mouths, and by having direct contact with an infected person.

Thorough **HANDWASHING** with soap and water for at least 20 seconds after going to the bathroom and before you prepare/eat food is the **BEST** way to prevent the spread of illnesses like these. Another way to prevent spreading illness is to **STAY HOME** if you are ill. Please don't send sick children to school.

Students may return to school after the following:

- **24 hours without temperature** (and without taking fever reducing medications such as Tylenol or Advil/Motrin)
- 24 hours without nausea, vomiting, diarrhea (and tolerating a normal diet)
- 24 hours of receiving medication (such as antibiotics, eye ointments)

Greetings from the music room!

Kindergarten is beginning their first introduction to string instruments as they learn the basics of the Ukulele (posture, holding the instrument, simple chords, parts of the instrument). Musical elements discovered in the next few months will be steady beat, (about and long, high and low) through simple gap as and music

rhythm, and comparatives (short and long, high and low) through simple songs and music games.

1st and 2nd grade is continuing with their practice of the Ukulele as they review previous technique and begin learning the 3 major chords of focus. I IV V (C, F, and G7). Musical elements to be discovered are: 1st grade - solfa syllables so and mi, 2 meter, la, and repeat sign. 2nd grade - solfa syllable re, staff, 4/4 meter, ties, and first and second ending. Strong emphasis on movement, singing games, and listening to great music.

3rd grade began the year by learning about instrument families. We learned to sing and dance to a Russian folk song in partners, prepared to sing several songs in a school performance, learned to play hand bells together, and we are learning to read music on the treble staff. We learned about tempo and dynamics while playing group games and dances.

4th and 5th grade is preparing for the Young People's concert on February 12th as they listen and study the music/composers that will be presented by the Anchorage Symphony Orchestra. We will also be perfecting our chord progressions on the ukulele, and starting back up on the recorders during the final quarter. Musical elements to be discovered: 4th grade - fa, anacrusis, triplet rhythm, simple versus compound meter. 5th grade - melodic sequence, I - V chords, I IV V chords, solfa syllables fi si and ta, and intervals.

Band, Orchestra, and Choir is off and running preparing for the upcoming solo and ensemble festival on Friday, **February the 1st**. Students prepare a solo or small ensemble piece to perform for a panel of local adjudicators. This is a highlight event of the year as students get to work on their own personal piece of quality music. The middle school festivals (band, orchestra, and choir) will also be taking place mid semester along with our spring concert at the end of the year,

Honor Choir (district wide) rehearsals have started and the participating students are excited about rehearsals and their upcoming concert on March 7th 7:00 pm at West High. This is an auditioned vocal ensemble open to all 5th and 6th grade students. (auditions have already taken place for this year's choir)

Thanks to all of you who share the joy of music with your kids outside of the classroom. I look forward to our musical exploration and education this second semester.
