Northern Lights Library

Wishing for those good old fashioned library days? You know the ones...a relaxing read aloud followed by time to browse the shelves and talk with your friends to find out what they are reading???

While the pandemic has made life challenging, Ms. Collins and Ms. Kelly would like to help you restore some of those times to your schedule. **Join us each Wednesday for a read-aloud time. K-2nd** topics will change each week, and are accompanied by a storyboard with suggestions for further reading and an activity. **3rd/4th and 5th/6th** graders hear a chapter each week from a Battle of the Books title. **6th - 8th** (6th have choices!) hear a survival story from *Accidental Adventures: Alaska True Tales of Ordinary People Facing Danger in the Wilderness* by Chris Lundgren. This is an adult book in which Ms. Collins' grown children hold the all important (to her) final chapter and nearly die while kayaking in Prince William Sound. Each week is a new chapter, and all are excellent true stories of survival in our beautiful home state. These 4 half-hour read-aloud periods are primarily focused on tuning out our stressful lives and enjoying the time with a great story. 
Fur Rondy Invites You to Design the 2020 Booster Button
