With Covid numbers increasing daily, it is imperative that if your child is sick that they stay home. Please let us know if they are sick so our nurse can be in touch with you. We are proud of our Covid safety history as last year only one class had to close due to Covid cases and close contacts.

As we approach our third week of school for our 1st-8th grade students, I'd like to remind you that we focus on students being independent. At this stage, we encourage students to be able to walk themselves to breakfast and to their classrooms without parents. Traveling Into Great Exciting Reading

2021-2022 Parent Information

The goal of Northern Lights ABC's T.I.G.E.R. Reading Club is to encourage young readers to become avid, consistent, and recreational readers.

Dear Parents/Guardians of Northern Lights ABC Students,

NLABC K-6 students are invited to participate in T.I.G.E.R. Reading, and they are recognized/rewarded for meeting pre-determined goals during Red, White, & Blue assemblies. Cumulative reading records are maintained for students throughout the year. Monthly reading logs, Double-Goal logs, Student Reading Log Due Dates, and a Leveled Prize List (based on cumulative pages read) are posted on the T.I.G.E.R. Reading page of our NLABC website under the "Library" tab.



#### Guidelines for the program:

- 1. Completed and signed reading logs/online submission are due monthly on the first school day of the month. Late submissions will be entered with the following month. Please submit all logs, even if the monthly goal is not met.
- 2. T.I.G.E.R. Reading Logs While it is NOT necessary to use the T.R. Log form, all submitted pages must include
  - a. Student's first and last name
  - b. Student's grade level
  - c. Classroom teacher's name
  - d. Month the reading was done
  - e. An accurate total of pages read
  - f. Parent/Guardian initials & signature
- 3. Monthly Reading Goals
  - a. Kindergartners & 1st Graders 500 pages a month
  - b. 2nd 6th graders 700 pages a month
- 4. Inclusions to pages-read counts on reading logs
  - a. Side-by-Side read-togethers (tracking words as the book is read) may be included in K-1st reading logs
  - b. Audiobooks with accompanying text may be included in reading logs
  - c. All books are eligible
  - d. Books may be counted for Tiger Reading one time per month.

\*\*Honor System: T.I.G.E.R. Reading is based on students/families accurately recording the number of pages read. Thank you for helping us to maintain this important NLABC program by checking your child's log carefully prior to submitting it. Mrs. Duff, NLABC Principal
