### **Tiger Reading Overview**

We are excited about the MANY new students we have at Northern Lights and can't wait to meet them in person or AT LEAST in zoom! Whether you are new to NLABC or a veteran, we hope your children are reading voraciously in print / electronically and recording their pages on the Tiger Reading Log (or recording the information needed for a Tiger Reading Log on a piece of paper). The log is linked on the T.I.G.E.R. Reading Club page of the Northern Lights Website @ https://www.asdk12.org/Page/11563. You can find LOTS of Tiger Reading and library Information there.

Since we have so many new students and are learning remotely, I hoped to review some key points about the T.I.G.E.R. Reading Club. First, the program is volunteer run, and Covid-19 makes data collection/management a bit more challenging and time consuming. Please be kind to our volunteer team. Next, the Tiger Reading program is for optional reading, not classwork reading, and is described in detail on the T.I.G.E.R. Reading Club page. Students read voluntarily, and track their pages-read for parent verification. During school closure, we will accept pages-read totals electronically each month via a form which will be found on the T.I.G.E.R. Reading Club page @ https://www.asdk12.org/Page/11563, and available ONLY from the 1st to the 5th of each month. When possible, the form will open early, but it will always close on the 5th of the month.

Students pages are accumulated during their years at Northern Lights up to 6th grade. Pages read are recognized and rewarded TWO ways: 1) When the monthly pages-read goal is met, students are rewarded with a Tiger Buck, which can be redeemed at the Tiger Store. Because the Tiger Store is currently closed along with the school, Ms. Collins has banked Tiger Bucks that are earned by students. 2) The second way pages-read are rewarded and recognized is by levels as shown on the Prize Leveled Chart from Beginning Reader prize levels of 1,000 pages to 100,000 pages. The yellow coded levels on the chart are special in that individual students will be invited to come forward and shake hands with Mrs. Duff. No contract is required to begin participating in T.I.G.E.R. Reading Club - just page tracking with parent verification. I hope to see MANY students reading when the September Pages are submitted electronically!





#### Visible Friendship

4th graders listened to *The Invisible Boy* by Ludwig, then thought about how to make sure others are "visible" - included, respected, and befriended - by the things we say, do, and show with our body language. Here are some 4th grade thoughts.

- ~~ Friendship looks like people playing together and having fun.
- ~~ I can help someone be visible by including them in the games I play with my friends.
- ~~ Friendship feels like not being alone and having fun.
- ~~ My idea is to go up to someone and say, "Hi!"
- ~~ Friendship sounds like me saying, "Do you want to sit with us?"
- ~~ One way to help someone be visible is by spending time with them and introducing them to your friends!
- ~~ Friendship feels like sharing with each other.
- ~~ I can make someone feel included by treating them the way I want to be treated.
- ~~ My idea is always to include everyone.
- ~~ Friendship sometimes feels like a warm feeling or feeling comfortable because you are feeling happy that you are not alone.
- ~~ One way to make someone visible is to stand up for them.
- ~~ Friendship feel like having someone's back.
- ~~ Friendship feels like sharing with each other.
- ~~My idea is kids don't get left out and we can all play together.

~~ A way to make people feel visible is to get to know them and hang out with them , even if you just say, "Hi" and chat for a minute then that will make them feel visible. It would make me feel visible.

## Nurse's Note

Dear NLABC Families,

Good morning. As per Dr. Bishop's email, face to face learning begins **October 19th** and my goal as the School Nurse is to take every possible precaution to ensure that every child is healthy and safe. Please read this email carefully if your child is scheduled to resume school.

#### **CURRENT ASD GUIDELINES:**

- ALL STUDENTS WILL BE REQUIRED TO WEAR MASKS. For Parents with younger kids, you can start practicing proper mask wearing with the children at home. *If your child is unable to wear a mask to school, consider the virtual or homeschool option.* 

- **Parents are required to do a daily temperature check before school.** Do not send your child to school if he/she has the following symptoms: Fever greater than 100.4F, chills or presumed fever, onset of new cough and loss of taste/smell, nausea, vomiting/diarrhea, sore throat, runny nose/congestion, exposure to someone with known COVID-19, muscle/ body aches, fatigue, skin lesions or rash. If your child has traveled outside the state of Alaska, they will need to follow the state guidelines on testing/quarantine before returning to school (see attachment below).

- Action Plans -Action plans for asthma, diabetes, allergy and seizure are usually updated every year. If you haven't sent me the forms, I highly recommend parents use this time to contact their health care providers and have the forms completed before the start of school.

- Immunizations – Alaska State Law is "NO SHOTS, NO SCHOOL". If your child is not up to date with their shots, please call your clinic to schedule an appointment to update their vaccination records or you can complete the religious exemption form which is renewed yearly. Students who are non-compliant will not be allowed to attend school. I have reached out to families whose kids have incomplete shot records via telephone or email.

- Flu Clinic- A curbside Flu Clinic is scheduled for 10/14 from 10-1pm. Email me if your family plans on attending so I have an estimate on the number of vaccines needed. It is imperative you read the attached documents so you have an idea on how suspected COVID cases will be handled at school if the situation arises.

Don't hesitate to email me if you have any questions at njoku\_ngozi@asdk12.org. I try to respond to all emails within the hour. Let's not forget this a brand-new process, so let's all work together as a team and make this a stress-free transition for everyone. Parents will be notified via email if any changes are made.
