The heart of the Socratic Method begins with recognizing our own biases and assumptions. While students are expected to fully engage with the text through "coaching" or annotating, they are not expected to fully understand; sincere effort through defining words, making connections, and asking questions are the crux to developing understanding. Along with small group discussions, students participate in a full-class discussion to further their understanding.
