Today we spent a significant portion of the faculty meeting discussing the new Covid policies put forth by ASD and where Winterberry is at in our managing Covid mitigation.

- · ASD is changing policies rapidly and constantly so the following is based on information available to staff and faculty as of 9/16.
- · Staff safety concerns with the changing protocols:
- § Close contacts are no longer required to quarantine
- § As long as masks are worn inside then students aren't classified as close contacts

- § We aren't even sure what constitutes a close contact
- § Tightening our practices within the framework that we can control to make things safer for our students specifically outside
- · Maintaining a relationship of trust and transparency with our families
- § We're working on defining our recess and outdoor agreements and will be communicating them with families striving for as much standardization as possible across the grades
- § Requesting what information can be shared with families so that they may make informed decisions for their family
- § Honoring all student's individual needs for safety
- · Despite having these safety concerns we also are concerned with the idea of breaking with the district and paving our own path with policy
- · constant change, continual task
- · large and varied community, split in opinions causes a lot of strife
- * Currently room for differing levels of comfort

Additionally, teachers are managing a lot more this year and are feeling very stretched. ASD currently has little to no sub pool. Staff and faculty are being called to step in and fill in for holes and gaps in addition to their regular duties.
