C. Administrator's Report

* Winterberry has officially filled all 3 open teacher assistant positions. Please welcome Kim Spillane our new SPED TA, Michelle Wilson our new Kindergarten/1st grade TA, and Jenna Coats our new Handwork TA. We are very fortunate to have Teacher's assistants with such strong experience in the education field.

* Our current enrollment numbers are at 241. This puts us 23 students below last year's projected numbers with 72 on the waiting list at this time.

* Finally, we have formed our team for our Foundations behavior management system. Our team attended an ASD Foundations training September 6th. There, we were trained in the basic structure of Foundations and started the process of moving forward. We will be meeting periodically through the months to collect data and create a priority list of areas within the school that need attention. It is our goal to refine what we already have in place, look for areas that have not been addressed, correct those, and then include it in our Faculty Handbook.

VI. Business

A. Contracting/purchasing/budgeting requests and approval

-container for secure outdoor storage

(Eric Andersen) He recommends a 20-foot new container (\$3000), which comes in a choice of colors. They are very bright inside. They won't be lighted (no electricity). Along with the container comes a nice lockbox which is fully covered and encased. 2 sets of keys for the lockbox. They have not had anyone break into it. Additionally, 2 railroad ties (with \$200 delivery fee) would be needed. This falls under outdoor equipment, so grant money could be used. Goal- before the ground freezes. Jessie made a motion to approve up to \$4000, Claire 2nd. Approved unanimously.

B. Charter renewal work

1. **Review**: Need to add: paper/pencil waiver when appropriate. Need to clarify leaseholders. Property is owned by C5. WPG has another 10 years on the lease with MH. Two T.A.'s are missing and need to be added. Specialty teachers will teach classes on the first day (different than AEA contract.)

2. Other questions/concerns

Should we add more information about what Winterberry is doing to address the lower scores in math in comparison to the district? (Darrell suggests letting it go to the admin committee as is.)

Why is there no cap on the class size? (There are many variables regarding class size ie funding. Not having a specific cap leaves it up to the principal and charter council to decide.) Darrel: Make sure to include page numbers. He sent an ASD checklist to Meggan to make sure our application contains all of the required sections.

The administrative review will include feedback from many departments

3. Vote to approve Charter/amendments

Marya Pilifant moved to approve the renewal, with the changes as discussed (leaseholder, TA's added, paper/pencil waiver, specialty teachers teaching 1st day of school) Jessie Menkens 2nd Approved unanimously
