Meeting Minutes



a. Safety (Julie Pepe-Phelps)

The safety team met recently. There was a fire inspection and there are several minor items on a to-do list. There is an ASD back-to-school plan (subject to change) on the asdk12 website, written by Principal Pepe-Phelps. Nurse Katrina is assisting teachers in receiving their CPR renewals.

2. WCC subcommittee

a. Legislative Policy Committee (Jessie Menkens)

The Alaska State Legislature came back into session 2 days ago. They are meeting in person in Juneau at this point in time. Members of the public will not be allowed in the building due to covid precautions. Visiting the LIO offices could still happen potentially depending on transmission rates. There has been a shift in leadership. Senator Geisel is no longer serving. The Republican majority/Democrat minority senate is organized and has set up their committee structure. A bill was introduced focused on early education. Changes are expected at the state level, since the inauguration of President Biden. President Biden has already signed an Executive Order that will provide financial support to schools to support safe, in-person learning.

b. Budget (Shana Garrels)

There may be more CARES Act funding coming to Winterberry, but details are not yet known. It is estimated that the funding will be 3 times as much as the original funding. Winterberry has \$34,000 left out of the original \$53,000.

c. Grant Committee (Alex Schutz)
