1. Administrative Committees (answers to principal)

a. Safety (Julie Pepe-Phelps)

There was a fire inspection Jan 15. Everything that needed to be corrected has been corrected, with the exception of repair of our emergency lighting. An extension was granted and bids are being gathered. .

The committee consists of Julie, Shana, Colleen, and nurse Katrina. They would gladly include a teacher and student in the future.

We have emergency analog phones.

We had a CPR testing session for staff.

There will be fire and earthquake drills soon.

HVAC filters have been replaced and all air seals are completed to make the system as efficient as possible.

2. WCC subcommittee

a. Legislative Policy Committee (Jessie Menkens)

Madam Speaker Stutes was just elected and is presiding over the house. Committee meetings will start next week. Many bills were verbally introduced earlier today and have been dispersed to committee. There are some pieces of legislature in both bodies speaking to the social and emotional well-being of students and supporting districts with same. House bill 67 requests special funding in response to needs that have arisen due to Covid. The Public Community Health emergency declaration order lapsed on Monday. Some urged the governor to extend it, but it did not happen. The senate subcommittee meeting tomorrow at 7am will be looking at reports describing potential ramifications of the lapse of the emergency declaration order.

c. Grant Committee (Alex Schutz)

Several have committed their skills to the grant writing trying to apply for \$30,000 in state funding for gardens in the NE corner of the lot. The grant is for \$10,000/year for 3 years for the creation of an apple orchard and perennial berry patches.

Several people are up for re-election. Susannah wanted to make sure that she is eligible to be on the election committee-as someone who is up for re-election (but is not seeking re-election).

They need to find a community member to join the committee. Eric Judge volunteered to serve as the community member.

VI. **Business**

A: School Re-opening Committee follow-up (Jessie Menkens, Nick Perry, Jeremy Crawford, Paula Dobbyn, Julie Pepe-Phelps)

The WCC Back to School Committee recommends that the WCC authorize Principal Pepe-Phelps to pursue a return to school plan following a cohort model, with classes divided into two groups, with details to be determined by the Principal, and dependent on staffing levels. Winterberry will follow ASD's protocol for health and safety measures and will adhere to Winterberry's safety plan. Specialty Teachers would continue to teach virtually.



Peter Host moved to authorize Principal Pepe-Phelps to follow the recommendations for a return to inperson learning in cohorts on March 22 as recommended by the special committee. Paula Dobbyn 2nd. Approved unanimously by voice vote.
