



### Strategies for a Successful School Year...

As a teacher, parent, or administrator our top priority is helping kids be successful.

<u>Sleep</u> - Processing information and releasing stress during sleep allows us to be attentive learners the next day. How much? *TEN hours of sleep for elementary aged students*.

<u>Eat Breakfast</u> — Protein for breakfast allows energy to burn slowly and keeps hunger pains away. What kinds? Eggs, meat, peanut butter, and yogurt.

**Eat Together**— A great opportunity to stay connected (teens consistently say this is an important time for them) and to discuss events, offer opinions, and "discuss" — all ways for children to discern who they are and what they value.

**Read. Read** — Read with your children everyday, model good reading habits, explain to them when you read and why you read — recipes, maps, etc. Try for 20 minutes per day. Whether you read to them or they read to you.

**Tech-Free** - Create technology-free zones and times. Park your cell phones at the door (this includes adults, too) and especially no technology at meal times.

\*School rules are that all phones be turned off upon entering the building and remain out of sight until 3:30pm when your child can turn the device on and be tech active.

## Wonder Park is primarily a walking school. We want all our students and families to be safe while walking and/or driving. Below are some safety tips.

Please review these school zone safety tips:

- Wear reflective tape/clothing while walking to/from school, especially in the winter when it is dark.
- Carpool when possible.
- Cell phone use in school zones is prohibited, with a \$500 fine.
- Pull vehicle all the way forward to accommodate more vehicles in the loop, and a timely dismissal.
- Have your vehicle seats clear so your student can easily enter the vehicle.
- Drop your student off as close to the school as possible so they do not have to cross streets.
- Make sure your student enters and leaves the vehicle on the curb side.
- Merge from the drop-off/pick-up zone as quickly as possible.
- In loop please remain in your vehicle and a staff member will assist your child to your vehicle.
- Avoid using handicapped parking spaces to pick up your student unless you have a designated permit. We have a lot of vehicles with hanging permits and handicapped license plates.
- Do not double park or stop on crosswalks or in the flow of traffic.
- Do not pull into the bus loop area in the back parking lot to drop off or pick up children.
- Please speak with your child's teacher and let them know the plan at dismissal, Kindergarteners are picked up at their classroom doors, grades 1-5 are they picked up by a sibling, classroom door, in the drop-off/pick-up loop, back parking lot, front parking lot, at one of the exits from school campus?

#### Welcome!

The Anchorage School District is committed to keeping our school communities safe. We know that students learn best when they feel protected, so we have developed measures to safeguard our students and staff and to respond competently in the event of an emergency at our schools.

### What to Expect

Visitors to our elementary schools will need to be granted access through a video intercom system. All visitors at our schools are required to sign in at the front office and wear a visitor's badge.

ASD is piloting a new Visitor Management System during School Year 2022-2023. If your child's school is piloting the new system, please be prepared to sign in using an ID or your full name and date of birth. We hope to deploy this new system district-wide soon.

We thank our community for their generous support of **bond projects** that contribute to secure vestibules at elementary schools, security cameras, and other physical security measures.

### See Something? Say Something!

It takes our community working together to keep our students safe.

We encourage everyone to be alert and vigilant. If you hear of a possible threat or see something out of the ordinary, immediately contact your school administrator or local law enforcement.

Don't forget to talk with your children about school safety.

### **Emergency Plans**

ASD has a plan in place that covers all five phases of emergency preparedness.

The Emergency Operations Plan is the overarching district-level emergency plan. Each school annually updates a site-specific Emergency Action Plan.

We also update and maintain ten other emergency plans to target the full scope of possibilities and to keep the district functioning effectively in the event of an incident.

The district works closely with our partners in local and federal law enforcement, first responders, and emergency management agencies to implement best practices, detect potential threats, and prepare our students and staff to react appropriately when an emergency occurs.

### **Emergency Drills**

Each school conducts 20 emergency drills during the school year. Please download this emergency response page to familiarize yourself with actions taken during emergencies.

### What Families Should Do During An Emergency

The natural instinct for parents or guardians is to come to the school during an emergency to protect their children. However, by doing so, they may endanger themselves and their children. Law enforcement and school personnel are busy responding to the situation. Your arrival or calls may distract them from their work. Please help by following the steps below.



#### Stay Home

Do not come to the school during an emergency. The campus may not be safe and your vehicle may block emergency crews. Information will be released through district communication tools.



#### **Stay Informed**

It is vital that parents and guardians keep their information updated in **ASDConnect**. Information will be shared with families as soon as possible. Please know, in some situations, accurate information may take some time to verify and share. We will utilize email, text messaging, phone calls, and social media to communicate with you.



#### Be Ready

Be prepared to follow instructions from the District or your children's school.
